



\$1-MILLION TAPIT COLT PACES OBS SPRING OPENER

OCALA, FL - A colt by Tapit brought the high price of \$1 million during a day which featured lively trade at the top of the market at the opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training Tuesday in Central Florida.

A total of 153 juveniles had sold by the end of Tuesday's session for a gross of \$19,615,000. The average was \$128,203 and the median was \$60,000.

During last year's opening session, 145 horses had sold by the close of business for \$19,725,000. The session average was \$136,034 and the median was \$87,000. Last year's four-day Spring sale concluded with a record average of \$130,149 and a record median of \$70,000.

Bloodstock agent Gayle Van Leer, bidding on behalf of an unnamed racing partnership, made the 2025 auction's first seven-figure bid when acquiring a colt by Tapit for \$1 million from the Top Line Sales consignment.

The session topper was one of nine to sell for \$500,000 or more Tuesday, compared to four at the opening session in 2024.

With eight horses sold for \$2,257,000, de Meric Sales was the session's leading consignor. The operation sold the day's highest-priced filly, a daughter of Curlin, for \$900,000.

"It was a very good opening day for us," said Tristan de Meric.

"The market is there for the right horses that jump through the hoops."

ONE DECOUPLING BILL POSTPONED IN THE FLORIDA SENATE, ANOTHER BORN IN THE

HOUSE by Dan Ross

Legislative efforts in Florida to decouple the live racing requirement for Gulfstream Park and Tampa Bay Downs to operate their respective casino and card rooms—efforts that industry stakeholders largely see as a death knell to the future of horse racing in South Florida--took a few twists and turns in the state legislature Tuesday.


A standalone bill that had already passed out of one legislative committee was temporarily postponed in the state Senate. But similar language was inserted as an amendment into a separate and much larger gambling bill (HB 1467) heard that same afternoon during a House Commerce Committee hearing.

This large gambling bill was successfully voted out of that committee, 17 to 9. *Cont. p10*

De Meric continuedL "We've got more nice horses to come, but I feel good about the opening day. It feels pretty good up here, I have to say."

From a catalogue of 302 head, 199 juveniles went through the ring Tuesday with 46 failing to meet their reserves for a buyback rate of 23.1%.

"[The market] has been a little more of the same," said Nick Sallusto of Thorostock. "It feels like it's just going to continue in that way. It's really an unbelievable market at the top and I think that we continue to have to work really hard to get the middle market where it's sold."

Case Clay Thoroughbred Management was the session's leading buyer, with three head purchased for \$1,185,000.

The OBS Spring sale continues through Friday with sessions beginning each day at 10:30 a.m.

'Caught My Eye Immediately:' Tapit Colt **Brings \$1 Million at OBS**

A colt by Tapit (hip 249) was first to reach seven figures at the OBS Spring sale when selling for \$1 million to the bid of bloodstock agent Gayle Van Leer Tuesday.

"I bought the horse for a partnership that is just forming, so they will remain anonymous at this point. Trainer to be decided," Van Leer said.

Van Leer said the colt reminded her of another seven-figure son of Tapit, GI Arkansas Derby winner Sandman, who sold for \$1.2 million at OBS last March.

"He reminded me an awful lot of Sandman, who I fell in love with and he's my Derby horse," Van Leer said. Cont.

"He is just a smooth-moving horse and he just caught my eye immediately during the under-tack show."

The colt, who worked a furlong in :10 flat during last week's under-tack preview, is out of Grade I-placed Palacio de Amor (Dixieland Band). He was consigned by Top Line Sales on behalf of Luis Gavignano's Lugamo Racing.

"It feels very good," Gavignano said of his first seven-figure result. "He's a very special horse. We knew from the first time that we started training him that he was going to be a very special horse. I have to give credit to Servando [Espinoza]. He was the one in charge of the training and everything. And he did a good job. And also Torie and Jimbo [Gladwell] at Top Line. They are very good."

Lugamo purchased the gray colt for \$300,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. *Cont.*

"I love Tapits," Gavignano said of the colt's appeal last fall. "That's one of my favorites. It is [a lot to pay for a pinhook prospect], but I don't mind keeping horses. I knew this horse was special, so if he didn't bring what I thought he would, I would be happy to race him."

Gavignano, a native of Venezuela, owns a string of restaurants in Virginia and has recently acquired a farm in Ocala. He sold subsequent GII Jessamine Stakes winner May Day Ready (Tapit) for \$325,000 at last year's OBS April sale after purchasing the filly for \$60,000 at the 2023 Fasig-Tipton October sale.

Baoma Corp Gets \$900,000 Curlin Filly

Agent Donato Lanni and trainer Bob Baffert went to \$900,000 to purchase a daughter of Curlin (hip 190) for Susan and Charlie Chu's Baoma Corp two-thirds of the way through the opening session of the OBS Spring 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale Tuesday. The filly, who recorded one of the sale's co-fastest furlong times in :9 4/5, is a daughter of the winning track record-setting mare Motivated Seller who blitzed 5 1/2 furlongs at Saratoga in 1:02 2/5 and placed in the Qatar Fort Springs Stakes at Keeneland in her own racing career. The family also includes Australian G1SP French Lady (NZ).



"She's an obvious type of horse," said Baffert, who will assume training responsibilities for the filly. "She's athletic, well-bred, Curlin's hot and [she] breezed really well. We're blessed to have clients to be able to buy horses like this."

Baffert admitted that her price tag was right within his team's expected range.

"We thought she'd probably be something like this," he said of the \$900,000 winning bid. *Cont.*

Vekoma Colt Leads Strong Results for Thorostock Team

A colt from the second crop of successful young sire Vekoma (hip 246) continued a day of strong results for Thorostock LLC when bringing a final bid of \$600,000 from Case Clay Thoroughbred Management. The duo of Nick Sallusto and John Kimmel purchased the colt as a Keeneland September Yearling grad for \$275,000 after he first brought \$75,000 as a weanling the November before. Sallusto was quick to acknowledge the team's success on a day which saw him sell three of four hips offered including two for six figures.

"I'm just really grateful for all the great team that I have that works tirelessly day in and day out to get these kinds of results," said Sallusto.

Of the Vekoma colt who worked a quarter in :20 3/5, Sallusto said, "He was incredibly apparent for buyers and by a really hot sire. He's a beautiful individual on the end of a shank. A great moving horse. Checked all the proverbial boxes."

Sallusto noted that, as with his \$500,000 Tacitus colt (hip 102), that the eyes of the industry backed him up.

"The best judges in the game liked him," he said. "This is great affirmation for what we're doing. And we're really, really appreciative that the market's responding to us the way that they are." -@SGrimmTDN

Nick Sallusto's Thorostock LLC earned a strong pinhooking result early in the day Tuesday when a colt from the first crop of Tacitus (hip 102) sold for \$500,000 to Justin Casse. Purchased for just \$60,000 as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale, the colt is out of a Gun Runner first dam who herself is a half to MGSP Moraz (Empire Maker). "He was really athletic," Sallusto said of what initially drew him to the colt in Kentucky last year. "It's a first-year sire and a Gun Runner mare. [Gun Runner] is a great sire and it's a great family, the family of Malibu Moon."

Sallusto noted that the colt had gotten significantly more popular in the lead up to the sale.

"He got pretty popular in the last 48 hours," Sallusto said. "I thought [the price] was definitely in the realm of probability. Makes me feel really good that I think some of the best judges in the racing game saw [him] the way I did. That's super rewarding."

Of the colt's prep for the sale, Sallusto added, "He's a horse that's changed inside and out in just the last 30 days. He sort of went from a boy to a man here in the last month. And when he came around, he really came around. I think the sky is the limit for him." -@SGrimmTDN

- A diverse buying bench was present for the opening session with the top 10 hips all going to different buyers. Consigners were also diversified as of the same 10 hips, only Tom McCrocklin and de Meric Sales had more than one sold (two hips apiece).
- De Meric Sales sold two of the top five hips to end the day as the leading consigner. In total, they sold eight hips for \$2,257,000. Case Clay Thoroughbred Management wound up as the day's leading buyer, purchasing three hips for \$1,185,000.
- Hip 249 was only the third colt to hit seven figures during the opening session of OBS April dating back to 2017.
- Tuesday's top two hips both eclipsed the high-water mark of \$775,000 set during the same session one year ago.
- 153 hips sold Tuesday totaling \$19,615,000, down from 159 sold for \$20,958,500 during the same session last year. The median was \$60,000 while the average was \$128,203.



As part of the bill's amendment pushing decoupling, Gulfstream Park--owned by The Stronach Group (TSG)--would be required to conduct live racing for a minimum of five years (or at least until July 1, 2030). This is a slightly shorter timeframe than the seven-year live racing requirement written into the bill temporarily shelved in the Senate.

What this means is that there are now two separate decoupling bills in the House now eligible to go to the chamber floor for a vote.

The Senate's decoupling bill has only passed through one Senate committee so far. Typically, it would pass through at least two before going for a vote on that chamber's floor.

A bill can only be signed into law if both the House and Senate pass identically worded legislation.


In the debate portion of Tuesday's hearing, several committee members voiced serious concerns about the potential impacts from the decoupling portion of the bill.

Democrat Felicia Simone Robinson discussed how Gulfstream Park's casino license first came about through public approval, and that any step to reverse that decision should once again come about through public referendum.

"If this is to go any further with the decoupling, it needs to go back to the people," said Robinson. "We should not be doing that here, because anything to do with what the people voted on is going against their vote."

Republican David Smith said that, after the committee's initial hearing on the house's standalone decoupling bill, he visited Tampa Bay Downs to learn more.

"I spent a beautiful day at the races. The stands were full. I got to talk to a lot of people--folks that have boots on the ground perspective of Thoroughbred racing in Florida. Not a single person was for decoupling," said Smith. *Cont.*

Republican Adam Anderson, from the Tampa Bay area, is a co-sponsor of the bigger bill with Republican John Snyder.

Anderson also sponsored the original decoupling legislation in the house.

Anderson attempted to play down the impacts of the bill on the Florida Thoroughbred industry, arguing that the five-year minimum sunset clause for live racing comes with a requirement that a track provides a three-year notice of any intention to end live racing.

Another new provision added to the language of the bill, said Anderson, is that a license holder can transfer their license in a way that is not currently permissible.

"They can move their license to another facility. They can move their license to another individual. Under current law, if a track wanted to stop racing, it would not be able to do that, so racing would discontinue," said Anderson. "If this bill passes, there's an opportunity for someone else to pick up that license, or an opportunity for that permit holder to move it to another location."

Damon Thayer, senior advisor to the Thoroughbred Racing

Initiative (TRI), an industry collaboration created to fight for live horse racing in Florida and elsewhere in the U.S., took the Senate stalling its version of the decoupling legislation as a positive.

"It was a very good day for us. The fight is not over. The Senate delaying the bill was a significant step in the right direction. However, the House attaching the bill to another piece of gaming legislation shows how desperate Gulfstream Park is to pass decoupling. We will

continue to be wary during the waning weeks of the session," wrote Thayer, in a statement.

Of the two chambers, the Senate is more favorable to the industry's arguments than the House, said Thayer. **Cont.**

Despite the decoupling legislation's "skids" being "greased in the House," wrote Thayer, he and other industry representatives decided to testify before the commerce committee in order to demonstrate their opposition.

"We decided to call an audible," Thayer added. "A good quarterback knows when to make in-game changes, and that's what we decided to do. We decided to go with a smaller lineup and hit some different points to make but not have the full array of speakers. We'll keep our powder dry just in case this bill gets heard in a Senate committee next week."

Lonny Powell, CEO of the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association, wrote in a statement that the Senate's postponement of SB 408 indicates a commitment to "thoughtful consideration of how decoupling would impact" the state's Thoroughbred industry.

"In contrast, the House Commerce Committee's approval of HB 1467 is nothing short of an assault on our industry, driven by foreign interests. The eleventh-hour amendment that sustains toxic decoupling language attempts to circumvent the potential absence of a Senate companion bill," wrote Powell.

"We urge lawmakers to stand with Florida families. Reject decoupling. Reject the unraveling of rural investment and agricultural growth," he added.

As with recent prior committee hearings on decoupling legislation, industry stakeholders showed up in person to voice their opposition to efforts that are being spearheaded by TSG.


The owners of Gulfstream Park say that decoupling is needed to attract redevelopment investors to the vast property. However, TSG advisor Keith Brackpool also warned industry stakeholders earlier this year that even if the legislation passed, he could only guarantee the track would remain open for racing until 2028.

Longtime breeder Mandy Pope urged the committee to defeat the bill, or to table it until a later date to give the state's Thoroughbred industry time to figure out another way forward.

"We are now pursuing America first. That's what our country is about. In Florida, we have elected officers or committee members to put the Floridians first. And that's what we believe in. Decoupling we believe does the exact opposite. It puts Floridians last," said Pope.

Chester Bishop, vice president of the state's chapter of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, discussed how pivotal Florida was to the country's broader Thoroughbred industry.

"The Kentucky Derby is just around the corner. The favorite for the Kentucky Derby, Journalism, got his early start here in Ocala," said Bishop. "That puts us on the world stage. Don't take that away from us."



Bishop also discussed the particulars of the original public vote to give Gulfstream Park a casino license. He quoted certain provisions of the law requiring parties to "work cooperatively" to ensure both successful slot machine operations and live Thoroughbred racing.

"This decoupling will cripple us," Bishop said. "We ask that you vote no."

SANTA ANITA TO HOST EQUESTRIAN ARM OF 2028 OLYMPICS by Dan Ross

The equestrian portion of the 2028 Los Angeles Olympics will be conducted at Santa Anita Park.

The decision brings a sense of continuity to the Olympics, as the track also hosted the equestrian disciplines when the event was last in Los Angeles, in 1984. The decision also caught many off guard.

The Los Angeles City Council voted in March to approve the sprawling Galway Downs equestrian facility, nearly 100 miles south of LA, as the appropriate venue. *Cont.*

But according to the *LA Times*, Galway Downs was taken out of consideration a day after LA28, the organizing committee for the games, received approval for its master plan by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) in a closed-door session on April 9.

The announcement about Santa Anita came as part of a broader unveiling Tuesday of different venues for the various sporting disciplines.

"The 2028 Olympics will be held July 14-30, at a time when Santa Anita Park is traditionally closed for racing and training," said Nate Newby, Senior Vice President and General Manager of Santa Anita, when asked about possible disruptions to the regular horse population. "Our goal as we work with the LA28 team over the coming months and years is to minimize any potential disruption to racing operations while maximizing exposure for Santa Anita Park."

"The return of the Summer Olympic Games in 2028 represents a thrilling and prestigious moment, underscoring Santa Anita Park's versatility as a world-class sport and entertainment venue, and as a vital pillar of Southern California's horse sport culture," Newby continued. "We are excited by the opportunity to again showcase SAP on a global scale. We will be able to share more details as event plans are finalized."

"The 2028 Olympic venue plan invites communities from across the region to celebrate the Games coming to their backyard with the most exciting sports staged at some of the world's top-tier existing stadiums and arenas, famous beaches and purpose-built temporary structures," said LA28 chief executive officer Reynold Hoover, in a statement. *Cont.*

ATTORNEYS FOR DISMISSED NYRA STARTER **SOLER FILE DISCRIMINATION SUIT** by Sue Finley

Attorneys for former New York Racing Association head starter Hector Soler have filed suit against NYRA in the United States District Court, Eastern District of New York, alleging discrimination, retaliation in the workplace, and misclassification as an employee exempt from earning overtime.

The suit was filed Tuesday by attorneys Nadia Prevez, Aneeba Rehman, and Andrew Mollica, and seeks compensatory damages, back pay, and punitive damages.

Soler worked at NYRA for 25 years, starting as a part-time assistant starter and working his way up to the role of head starter in 2020. The suits says that he was the first-ever Hispanic or Puerto Rican head starter in the company's history. "Despite attaining a reputation as one of the preeminent starters in New York horse racing, Mr. Soler faced unlawful discrimination and retaliation in the workplace (and) was mis-classified as an exempt employee who was ineligible for overtime, when in fact, his duties were manual in nature and he routinely worked over 40 hours in a given work week."

The suit says that Soler typically worked 52.5 to 62.5 hours per week and should have been due time and a half for the overtime.

The suit charges that in addition to violating the Fair Labor Standards Act, under which he was due overtime pay, NYRA fired him after he filed for workmen's compensation after being injured in the starting gate at Saratoga in 2024. Prior to that incident, the suit says that Soler had suffered a dislocated shoulder which required surgical intervention; had torn his right hip; suffered abrasions to his L4 and L5 vertebrae; shattered his right elbow, requiring surgery, which led to permanent nerve damage; broke his index finger; suffered nerve damage when he was kicked in the head by a horse; tore his ACL, requiring a total replacement; and finally, on Aug. 4, 2024, injured his meniscus, leading to a complete transplant.

The suit alleges that Soler's direct supervisor, Juan Dominguez, was notified about the injury and asked him to continue working despite it, because no one else could replace him. Soler sought medical attention and was given a cortisone injection and prescribed pain medication, but on Sept. 11, 2024, took protected medical leave and eventually filed a workers compensation claim.

The suit goes on to allege that on Dec. 8, while he was still on leave, he received his first-ever negative performance review. The suit claims that NYRA began looking for Soler's replacement while he was still on leave, seeking to replace him with a white male. Soler was fired on March 2, 2025.

"The complaint speaks for itself," said Mollica. "Hector Soler was an exemplary, beloved employee with a spectacular record of employment. He worked through numerous injuries and literally left body parts on the field to do his job in an outstanding manner. We are fully prepared to litigate every aspect of this matter, but, of course, remain hopeful that a resolution can be achieved."

Patrick McKenna, NYRA's Vice President of Communications, said that NYRA would decline comment on the matter.

RIVER THAMES OUT OF DERBY, WILL POINT FOR PREAKNESS by Bill Finley

River Thames (Macleans's Music), who was most recently third in the GI Blue Grass Stakes, will not go in the GI Kentucky Derby and will instead use the extra two weeks off to prepare for the GI Preakness Stakes.

The story was first reported by the Daily Racing Form's David Grening.

"We just felt like the Preakness gave him a little more time and it felt like that was a better spot," said Elliott Walden, the president of WinStar Farm, which co-owns the colt along with the China Horse Club. "I think it was the right decision for the horse and that's what we try to do."

Walden is bullish on the colt's chances in the Preakness. Cont.

"I feel good about his chances in the Preakness," he said. "We've seen horses that skip the Derby run very well in the Preakness. Not all of them. Usually the Derby winner runs well in the Preakness, as well. But there are a lot of horses that skip the Preakness after they run in the Derby. We think he'll have a good shot."

With the defection, trainer Todd Pletcher will have just one starter in this year's Derby, GII Wood Memorial runner-up Grande (Curlin). The WinStar-China Horse Club team will be represented by GI Florida Derby winner Tappan Street (Into Mischief).

The defection of River Thames means that Built (Hard Spun) has moved into 20th place in the point standings. His connections have yet to confirm that they will start in the Derby.

THOUGH 23TH ON POINTS LIST, BAEZA WILL SHIP TO CHURCHILL IN HOPES OF DRAWING **INTO THE DERBY** by Bill Finley

The connections of Baeza (McKinzie) have had a change of heart and will ship him to Churchill Downs after all. Though some believe Baeza, the runner-up in the GI Santa Anita Derby, is among the best 3-year-olds in the sport, he has only 37.5 Derby points. That puts him at 23rd on the list. Only 20 horses can start in the race.

Had this been last year, Baeza would have made it in no problem. His second-place finish in the Santa Anita Derby would have earned him 50 points, which, this year, would have tied him for 15th place. But this year, Churchill reduced the number of points awarded in any prep race that had fewer than six horses. There were five in the Santa Anita Derby, including the maiden Westwood (Authentic), whom Shirreffs put in the race

to guarantee that the points allotment didn't get even smaller.

"There was a little change of mind," Shirreffs said. "You know how rumors are on the racetrack...but from some of the rumors we've been hearing it seems like there is a possibility that he will get in. We are making arrangements now to go. If he doesn't get in, I don't know what we will do but we are optimistic he will make it in. Obviously, there's the Preakness a couple weeks away, so we'd probably go there."

Baeza is highly regarded for a number of reasons. He is a halfbrother to 2023 Derby winner Mage (Good Magic) and 2024 GI Belmont Stakes winner Dornoch (Good Magic). Not as precocious as his famous siblings, he took three starts to break his maiden. From there Shirreffs put him in the Santa Anita Derby, where he finished second, losing by only three-quarters of a length to Kentucky Derby favorite Journalism (Curlin). That he is seemingly getting better with every race bodes well for him in the Derby, that is if he gets in the race. Many consider him a serious threat to win.

"He's night and day difference from when he first ran," Shirreffs said. "He's a lot different. He's more tactical. When he first ran he didn't know anything about it and he didn't show the kind of speed that he has. Now he's become a lot more practical and he more understands about the company in the race. He's good around other horses now."

Shirreffs said he was disappointed that Churchill Downs changed the point system for this year, but knows there's nothing he can do about it.

"It's too bad," he said. "The year we had Honor A.P. was the Covid year and this year they adjusted the point system," he said. "I know what they were trying to do, but in this particular instance the point system wasn't good at all. But I don't make those decisions and nobody asked my opinion. So to worry about it is waste of energy."

RINGING THE BELL FOR ARKANSAS THOROUGHBRED AFTERCARE SPREADS

HOT SPRINGS, Ark.--The idea was a simple one. Place a bell in the Larry Snyder Winner's Circle at Oaklawn and any winning owner, trainer or jockey who wants to make a \$100 donation to the Arkansas Thoroughbred Retirement Program and Rehabilitation Foundation gets to ring it.

The 'Ring the Bell' seed was planted at an Arkansas Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA) meeting over four years ago when trainer and board member Ron Moquett posed the idea as he is prone to do.

"Ron [Moquett] has about 10 ideas every meeting and you can never write any of them off because they all have something in them," said Jeanette Milligan, executive director of the Arkansas HBPA. "But this one was special and everyone knew that we could come together to make it happen, especially when Oaklawn's management got on board."

In support of the Arkansas Thoroughbred Retirement Program and Rehabilitation Foundation, which places Off The Track Thoroughbreds (OTTB) at Oaklawn into permanent homes, the bell plan has grown by leaps and bounds into a full-fledged ecosystem.

"This is a way to pay it forward and everything that is raised goes right back into doing what's right for these horses through the foundation," said Moquett. "We want to see this program branch out because this isn't about just Oaklawn. It's about a positive move by all the hard-working people involved in this industry. There's no way this can be done by one person."

The Bell Privilege

Relying on word of mouth and some gentle encouragement from a 'ringmaster'--who is currently being filled by former conditioner Paul Holthus--the program has banked on both the desire to help horses along with some good old-fashioned competition. When you get to ring the bell at Oaklawn as connections have come to realize, it's a privilege.

"For me, this is about the horses and their future more than it is about mine," said rider Francisco Arrieta. "When I win and ring that bell, I know what I am doing is for them. We wouldn't be here without them, so this gift is important."

High atop the grandstand, Oaklawn track announcer Matt Dinerman said that he has immensely enjoyed watching the aftercare initiative blossom.

"I think this is a phenomenal program and it's grown so much over the past year," said Dinerman. "They give us everything out there on the track and it's always on full display, so what is so great to see is the mass participation when out-of-town horses ship in from like California. Those connections give also and that's how we all win."

Strength In Numbers

News of the bell's success is continuing to spread as Tampa Bay and Sam Houston have already adopted the model. Lone Star Park, Prairie Meadows and Horseshoe Indianapolis are up next.

"What we have done is set this program up as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization," said Milligan. "Right now, we are teaching other tracks how to implement the bell and to keep the finances straight. You can set the gift at whatever is appropriate based on a track's purse structure. We really think this can make a major impact in the here and now, and each year what we have raised has increased beyond our targets." *Cont.*

'Ring the Bell' for Thoroughbred Aftercare | JN Campbell

The program debuted at the 2021-2022 Oaklawn meeting when \$14,000 was raised during the final six days of the season. It was officially launched with Oaklawn President Louis Cella and Bill Walmsley, a longtime Thoroughbred owner and president of the Arkansas division of the HBPA, each donating \$5,000 on behalf of their respective groups. The program then tallied \$68,000 during the 2022-2023 meeting and \$71,590 last season. With three weeks left of racing, the fund has eclipsed \$80,000 and has the chance to eclipse \$100,000.

What Oaklawn has inaugurated might be a 'win' in Hot Springs, but getting other circuits to take notice and adopt their approach has been a challenge. Of course, no one in the sport of Thoroughbred racing would argue against aftercare--the creation of a healthy, re-purposed life for each and every horse once the rigors of a career around an oval are done.

However, aftercare remains one of the most hot-button issues across the North American Thoroughbred landscape because there are so many ways to approach it. Moquett says that from where he stands all programs can coexist, but giving has to have regularity. Otherwise, expenses can rack up and that is not going to work for the equine athletes who need care 365 days a year.

"Taking care of a horse is so expensive when you consider feed, hay, paying the farrier, the veterinarian and for supplies," the trainer said. "What Jan Pettinger has done for this program is just tremendous at her foster farm."

No Ms. Hannigans Here

On the program's website you will find Shooters Shoot (Competitive Edge), Tirico (Twirling Candy) and Baltoro (Bolt d'Oro), who were all once around the local strip. Now, they are looking for new homes.

When Jan Pettinger isn't ponying at Oaklawn, she is at her OTTB foster farm that currently holds about 25 to 30 retired racehorses. This is a safe landing spot for any equine athlete who may need to rehabilitate or just the chance to run around in a field. If they need any medical attention, then vets can visit onsite. Milligan estimates that it costs about \$25 a day to keep an individual horse at the foster farm, which can add up quickly. Pettinger is the lynchpin in the whole program because she interviews potential owners and spends time getting to know them.

"I think of myself like a foster parent and this work is a passion of mine," said Pettinger. "It all pays off when you get the pictures of the kids with the blue ribbon from the fair and hear the stories about what that Thoroughbred did for their family. When potential owners come to see their horse on the farm, you can see them light up and that is such a match when it is made."

The process that the foundation has developed has several intricate stages. No one can just turn up and adopt a Thoroughbred. There is a thorough vetting process which leads up to an interview at the farm. Maybe what is most important of all, the program follows each horse once it is placed in a permanent home and Milligan said they take check-ins very seriously.

"We want every placement to be the best experience possible," she said. "So, we make sure that all involved are happy and that it is a healthy situation for the horses."

Built for Chukkers

Since placing a Thoroughbred is such serious business for the Arkansas Retirement Program and Rehabilitation Foundation, finding the right spot takes time. *Cont.*

South of the Metroplex, the Dallas Polo Club has put a pair of Thoroughbreds from the foundation's program into service, and both Blowout Mountain (Mark Valeski) and Towing (Uncle Mo) have performed admirably in their new positions.

Polo is a tactical and movement-specific type of sport, which tests a horse's strength, stamina and acumen. Will Walton, a third-generation polo player who runs the club, said he has been impressed with how both geldings have handled themselves during what normally is a three-year training period.

"Good prospects take time to develop and we know they respond when we approach them this way," said Walton from his barn area which houses about 40 head. "We cultivate being cool, calm and easy with them, and we have found that Thoroughbreds do so well because they are interested in everything that is going on."

Around a racetrack, running fast is a primary focal point, but when it comes to training to compete in a chukker--a period during a polo match--there are all sorts of movements and cues that take place. (Click here for a video of Walton in action).

"We have been happy to take part in such a valuable program and I can't say enough about the work that is being done up in Arkansas," Walton said. "We are hoping to bring some more Thoroughbreds on because we sure do enjoy training them."

A Match

Whether it is providing Thoroughbreds for polo or for another match, the Arkansas Thoroughbred Retirement Program and Rehabilitation Foundation's 'Ring the Bell' plan has become a viable funding source in a short amount of time as everyone pulls together. With the addition of some key sponsors throughout the meet, matching pledges have raised even more

attention in the winner's circle. Some of those organizations that have participated include Spendthrift Farm, OBS and Machmer Hall.

"We have set down a rigorous approach here and it's such a great outlet for the horsemen to participate in," said Thoroughbred owner and Arkansas HBPA board director Staton Flurry. "The jockey response has been huge; we've gotten the word out about what we do here through matching sponsors and I think the expansion to other places continues to be bright."

The bell is set to offer its final toll from the Larry Snyder Winner's Circle when the meet ends in early May. Already, there is much to celebrate after a banner year. With more tracks adopting the program, the privilege of getting to ring the bell is spreading.

UMBERTO RISPOLI JOINS THE TDN WRITERS' ROOM PODCAST PRESENTED BY KEENELAND

It didn't take Rispoli long to establish himself as one of the best riders in California and now top trainers are after his services. Michael McCarthy belongs on the list as has he has given the assignment to the 31-year-old jockey on GI Kentucky Derby favorite and GI Santa Anita Derby winner Journalism (Curlin).

Rispoli on TDN Writers' Room, cont.

Rispoli joined this week's TDN Writers' Room Podcast presented by Keeneland to talk about the Derby and how he has established himself as one of the best jockeys in the country in such a short period of time, Rispoli was this week's Gainesway Guest of the Week.

Rispoli admitted he didn't have a good trip when winning the Santa Anita Derby, the race that solidified Journalism's status at the Derby favorite.

"Well, not really," he answered when asked if that was the trip he was expecting. "Obviously, as I already said in my other interview, I wish I could have drawn wide. But it seems that when we saw the draw, we knew that it was supposed to be a dogfight. So I'm happy then. The good thing is when you ride a brave horse like him, an intelligent horse like him, things can change and they could put you in a better spot. I've been saying that for the last six months; he's improving race by race. Definitely going to the half-mile pole, I knew that this wasn't the trip I wanted and I had to figure it out how to get out from the rail. It wasn't easy, but as I said, we got it done."

That Rispoli could win the Kentucky Derby is something that hasn't sunken in yet. He's more worried about his next mount.

"I'm extremely, extremely happy, excited," he said. "Honestly, Joe Talamo interviewed me the other day and he asked me, 'how do you feel right now?' I said, 'listen, so far I have just been focused about the rides I have right now because, you know, it would be disrespectful just to focus your mind like three weeks from now to Churchill Downs and not be focused about what happened race by race right now."

He know he'll start feeling differently as the Derby draws nearer.

"I just feel happy because I have found a great horse in my life," Rispoli said. "He is the best dirt horse I've ever ridden. No doubt about it. I know I've only been riding on the dirt in the U.S. for a short time. But I've had some experience in Japan, in Hong Kong, in Italy, where we have dirt racing, but it's obviously not as good as American races. I'm happy, I'm calm, I'm relaxed, I'm quiet. The adrenaline is gonna come in. You can't hide this."

He respects McCarthy because he knows he's all business.

"Michael goes to the work, he doesn't care about anybody," Rispoli said. "He wakes up in the morning and he knows that he has to do that job from that time, from five o'clock in the morning until 11, 10:30, until the time he's leaving the barn. It's all about work. But out of that, he's one of the funniest persons I've ever met in my life. He has his own sense of humor. We understand each other a lot. Don't take me wrong, we clash sometimes, but I think this is why we work so well together. Our relationship is good, because I work a lot of horses for him, and I like to tell him the truth.

"Sometimes when I think a horse doesn't work well, I feel then I have to tell him the truth. It's not that I'm always right. But you know, we like to share the opinion and we have one thing in common. We want to really win races. We're really hungry for it. So it's good to have a relationship with the trainer who supports you like that and gives you full confidence."

In our "Fastest Horse of the Week," segment, which is sponsored by WinStar, we went over the many reasons there are breed to WinStar stallion Timberlake. The fastest horse of the week was Skelly (Practical Joke), who won an allowance race at Oaklawn, earning a figure of 107.

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' Association, West Point Thoroughbreds, Darley America, the KTOB, 1/ST Racing and 1/ST TV, the team of Randy Moss and Zoe Cadman took a look at last week's big performances by Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna), Carl Spackler (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}), and Choisya (GB) (Night of Thunder ({Ire}). They also talked about the improving business numbers at Santa Anita and the two foreign horses aiming for the Derby, Luxor Café (American Pharoah) and Admire Daytona (Jpn) (Drefong).

Sandman, winner of the GI Arkansas Derby for D.J. Stable, St. Elias Stable, West Point Thoroughbreds and CJ Stables, breezed at 7:15 a.m. ET with trainer Mark Casse's longtime exercise rider Froylan Garcia in the irons. The grey began his work with eighth-mile splits of :13.60 and :26.40 before registering an official final time of :49.60 for four furlongs. The colt galloped out five furlongs in 1:01.80 and six furlongs in 1:15, according to Churchill Downs clocker John Nichols.

"It looked perfect," Casse said from his Ocala, Fla. base. "I asked the rider to go between :49 and :50 [seconds] and he did just that."

Casse's local assistant, Allen Hardy, was on-site for the workout.

"That's Froy for you--always doing exactly what you ask," Hardy said. "He's a great horseman and rider.

"I think we saw in the Arkansas Derby that when Sandman got to stretch his legs going further in distance, it was much better. We're going to do our best to keep him happy and healthy while enjoying the ride he's taking us on."

Shortly after Sandman completed his move, Norman Stables's Coal Battle breezed under assistant trainer Bethany Taylor. The duo worked eighth-mile splits of :12.20, :23.80 and :36.40, according to Churchill Downs clocker Adam Wallace.

In related Derby news, trainer Brad Cox reported that GI Florida Derby winner **Tappan Street** (Into Mischief) will have one more workout at Payson Park in South Florida before vanning to Churchill Downs for his final move beneath the Twin Spires.

Training hours at Churchill Downs remain 5:30-10 a.m. with renovation breaks from 6:45-7:15 a.m. and 8:30-9 a.m. Beginning Friday, training will shift to 5:15-10 a.m., with a special 7:15-7:30 a.m. window designated exclusively for Kentucky Derby and Oaks contenders.



Turf specialist Phil D'Amato switches her back to dirt. Her best U.S. race so far was her one start on the dirt, when she ran fourth in the GIII Bayakoa S. --Bill Finley

GODOLPHIN GOES TO 1.4 MILLION FOR ACCLAMATION COLT AT THE CRAVEN SALE

Legendary handler Willie Browne lit the touch paper for a barnstorming Tattersalls Craven Breeze-Up Sale by netting a cool 1.4 million gns from Godolphin for an Acclamation (GB) colt that he sourced for just €70,000 the previous autumn.

That sale was the headline act on a day where 15 horses sold for 200,000gns or more and all of the key figures were dramatically up on last year's corresponding day of trade.

Arguably the most encouraging metric to jump was the clearance rate, up 18% on last year to 84%. The turnover climbed a whopping 69% to 9,454,000gns, the average was up 40% to 147,719gns and the median climbed 18% to 91,000gns.

The Acclamation was sourced at last year's Goffs Orby Sale and Browne, who has sold his share of top-class horses at the breeze-up sales down through the years, admitted to being astounded by the sum the colt fetched.

He beamed, "Oh my God! I thought it would be good but I can't believe it was anything like that. Listen, he is a special horse. I believed he'd breeze very well and he didn't let me down. He's never been in the stable over the past two days-he'd 14 vets. I still thought [he'd make] 500,000 or 600,000. It's crazy!" Cont. p3

"She enjoyed the ground, settled early which was pleasing and travelled very well," John Gosden said of the Southwell maiden winner, whose dam Franconia (GB) (Frankel {GB}) was a listed winner for this stable. The sale represented the best-ever result for Browne in the ring. His previous best came for a War Front colt who sold to Jamie McCalmont for 1,150,000gns at this sale a decade back.

Browne added, "From February 1, when we started to do a bit of work, straight away [he showed ability]. For such a big, heavy horse, that ground yesterday was probably quick enough for him. But he has been so sound and so easy to train--he's got a great mind. I do believe that he's a very special horse."

The Acclamation was one of two colts that Stroud signed for on behalf of Godolphin and he was confirmed to be joining trainer Charlie Appleby, who was present at the sale and labelled as the best in the business by Stroud.

Stroud said, "I did not think we'd have to go to that--I definitely did not. He did a very good breeze, he did a very good gallop out and he is a lovely horse. It just shows how vibrant the breeze-up sales are. There were so many people on him--not just two. I think there were four or five. It just shows the appetite to buy horses at this sale."

He added, "I thought this sale would be strong but I did not think this horse would be so expensive. We have a few on the list and he was one of them. It also shows the appetite Godolphin has for wanting horses. He goes to Charlie Appleby and no one does a better job--he is the best."

Amo Racing Makes Healthy Contribution To The Market

Amo Racing picked up from where it left off at the yearling and breeding stock sales by spending 1.4 million gns on four lots, headed by the Grangeclare-consigned St Mark's Basilica (Fr) colt at 750,000gns.

The Amo contribution to the market didn't end there, as Kia Joorabchian, standing alongside Alex Elliott, tried hard to buy the day one sale-topper by Acclamation. Elliott admitted to being 'blown away' by the strength of the market on the whole and revealed that the St Mark's Basilica would be put into training with Raphael Freire.

Elliott said, "He is a horse we honed in on very early. Robson Aguiar actually rode him in his breeze and he breezed very well. He carried his speed very evenly throughout the breeze and you'd like to think he'd probably start at seven furlongs, go a mile and maybe stay a bit further. He carried his speed very evenly, which I always like to see, and Robson was a huge fan of the horse. He was beautifully-presented by Joey Logan of Grangeclare and the word seems to be quite good on St Mark's Basilica." Cont. p4

He added, "He was an exceptional racehorse and we paid a lot of money [600,000gns] for a St Mark's Basilica filly in Book 2 along with Al Shaqab. She's doing well with Karl Burke. For us, there were a lot of fast horses here and he was the horse who could carry his speed a bit further. He's going to go to Freemason to be trained by Raphael Freire and we are keen to support the operation. Very happy."

Amo Racing's spend was completed by a pair of Invincible Spirit (Ire) fillies for 170,000gns and 120,000 respectively and a Havana Grey (GB) filly for 55,000gns.

On the market, Elliott concluded, "In a nutshell, I thought there was a lot of money. I didn't see some horses make what they have made and I think it's a great sign. Everyone is ready to go for the new breeze-up season and the breeze-up results speak for themselves. I think it's carrying over from where we were in the autumn and it's a hell of a sign. It has blown me away a bit. We underbid the Acclamation. It's been a fantastic sale."

Mighty Day For The Marnanes With 650k Havana Grey

A pretty frenetic tempo was set from the outset with Con Marnane's Havana Grey colt [lot 5] going the way of Anthony Stroud on behalf of Godolphin for 650,000gns. It was a fitting result given Stroud can lay claim to buying Vandeek (GB), the best son of Havana Grey, at this very sale two years ago and Marnane was left in little doubt that the leading agent had bagged himself a potential top-notcher.

He said, "I think Anthony has bought six individual Group 1 winners off me--hopefully this will be the seventh!"

The Havana Grey colt charted a pretty interesting path to the Craven. Cont. p5

"Havana Grey has been a great stallion for us with Vandeek and Arabian Dusk," Stroud said. "This is a really, really nice horse. He did a good time in his breeze and he moves very well. Con has a great track record and we are delighted to have bought him."

He added, "I think he matches up to the previous Havana Greys I have purchased before. The results from the Craven Sale have been very good and there are a lot of people here."

Best-Ever Result For Tradewinds

The big results for Havana Grey didn't end there as Tradewinds Stud was another outfit enjoying their best day ever in a sale ring courtesy of the sire when a filly went the way of Stroud for 375,000gns.

An overjoyed Shane Power said afterwards, "Anthony Stroud bought two yearlings off us last year so we are delighted to have him back and hopefully we have sold him a good one now. Obviously Havana Grey has been a very lucky sire for him and hopefully she can go on and do similar things to Arabian Dusk and Vandeek. The stallion is just phenomenal--we had two in the yard by him this year and they never missed a day's work. It's great to hit the back of the net like this in the first breeze-up sale of the season. Great start and hopefully she goes on now for connections."

The Havana Grey filly was confirmed to have been bought on behalf of KHK Racing and beat Tradewinds' previous best result by just 5,000gns.

Power continued, "Bright Diamond (Ire) (El Kabeir) came from the first crop of yearlings that we bought for this job. In fairness to Richard Brown, he bought Bright Diamond and then he came back and bought Beautiful Diamond (GB) (Twilight Son {GB}) off us. He has been a great supporter of ours. We've had a bit of luck with grey fillies!"

He added, "This is our best result by 5,000gns—we got 370,000gns for a Teofilo (Ire) from Federico Barberini on behalf of Sheikh Ahmed Al Maktoum at Book 1 here a couple of years

ago. He's [Raafedd (Ire)] entered in a good race at Newmarket on Thursday and he's entered in the 2,000 Guineas as well. The breeze-ups can be a very enjoyable process but it can also be quite ruthless as everyone knows. If you don't stack up well on the data analysis it can be a ruthless place. It's just a big relief to get one on the board and hopefully everything else stacks into place." Cont. p7



Alex Elliott summed it up perfectly. As far as starts go, nobody could have hoped for anything better than what played out at Park Paddocks on Tuesday. The figures posted--particularly the healthy clearance rate--bodes well for the breeze-up season on the whole.

He added, "Her mother was a nice filly who stayed a mile and a

quarter, but I think a mile is going to be this one's limit. I think she's more one for France [for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches] than the 1,000 Guineas."

Juddmonte's European racing manager Barry Mahon backed up that sentiment as he reflected on the winner. who had raced too freely on her second start when third over a mile at Yarmouth before opening her account at Southwell last term.

"She's a filly we thought a lot of last year, so it's not entirely a surprise and it's a

good result," he said. She's not in the Guineas, but she is in the French Guineas, so we'll speak to the trainer and the owner and see what they'd like to do. Red Letter is still a possible for the Guineas here. She's got a few more bits of work to do, but she's still on the list and we'll firm it up in the next week I'd say."

Trainer Ollie Sangster said of Celestial Orbit, "She quickened off a quickening pace, which is always nice, and Jamie [Spencer] said she'd have no problem getting a mile. The key to her is some ease in the ground, so that will dictate our next move

quite strongly. She's in the Guineas here, whether she warrants coming for that, we'll see what the weather does and how she is in the next few weeks, but she's going to take a good step

> forward from that. She's in the French Guineas as well, so that's an option. As I say, her next race will be dictated by the ground and how she's doing as she'd been off the track for a while and I'd say she's had a hard enough race there."

NEW BAY'S PERSICA POWERS TO EARL OF SEFTON TRIUMPH AT HQ

Richard Hannon trainee Persica (Ire) (New Bay {GB}), who retains an entry in next month's G1 Lockinge Stakes, continued on the upgrade with a first pattern-race triumph in Tuesday's G3 bet365 Earl Of Sefton Stakes at Newmarket.

Last term's Listed Doonside Cup victor, who hit the board in February's G3 Winter Derby when last seen, was positioned in second for most of this nine-furlong contest. Relishing the rainsoftened ground, the 3-1 chance loomed large going ominously well approaching the quarter-mile marker and powered clear up the hill to account for Godolphin duo Ottoman Fleet (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) and First Conquest (GB) (Teofilo {Ire}) by 2 1/2 lengths and the same. Last year's G1 Derby and G1 Irish Derby placegetter Ambiente Friendly (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) attempted to make all, but lacked the fitness edge of his rivals and finished 1 1/4 lengths adrift in fourth.

"He's a very good horse with a high cruising speed," said Hannon. "We wanted to take him to Saudi [Arabia], but that didn't work out, so we stayed for the mile-and-three [G3] Winter Derby and he got there very well and didn't get the trip. If it turns up soft ground, I wouldn't mind taking a chance with

him in the Lockinge and a fast-run race would suit him perfectly. He is improving and there's been a lot of interest to buy him, but these horses are hard to make and take a long time to make. It was very soft ground when he ran in the [G1] Champion Stakes last year and a mile-and-a-quarter on that ground just stretches him at the very top level, but I've no doubt he'll get to the top level. We've got a lot of nice horses and we're very hopeful for the year ahead."

PALMER FEELS 'SAME BUZZ' AS SEAGULLS ELEVEN FOLLOWS SIRE'S PATH TO THE

GUINEAS by Emma Berry

Hugo Palmer did not disguise his pleasure following a Rowley Mile racecourse gallop for his 2,000 Guineas contender Seagulls Eleven (Ire), whose sire Galileo Gold (GB) was the trainer's first Classic winner in the same race nine years ago.

Declaring himself "thrilled" after a debrief with Seagulls Eleven's rider Oisin Murphy, Palmer said, "One of the things that's new in my life, having moved [from Newmarket], is that I've had to get used to the fact that we've only got one gallop. Young horses, when you start working them, will work impressively once or twice, but then they realise that their feed's going to be in their manger whether they go five inches clear or five lengths clear. That's something that's taken me three years to accept."

He continued, "It is very nice, therefore, when you take a

horse away to see them open up and go clear - as he should do as he's a 112-rated three-year-old with a 77-rated handicapper - but we think the handicapper is a fair horse who always works well at home."

Seagulls Eleven, who won a Haydock novice contest last year before finishing second in the G2 Superlative Stakes and then third and fourth respectively in the G1 National and G1 Dewhurst Stakes, is named in honour of Brighton & Hove Albion FC, with his ownership group consisting of Brighton players past and present.

Palmer added, "The ground was a bit soft in the Dewhurst and it was probably a bit on the soft side for him there but I haven't seen a horse of mine look like that going up the hill on the Rowley Mile since his dad worked here nine years ago. I haven't watched a horse work there and got the same buzz since then."

On hand to watch the gallop was one of the horse's owners, Brighton's reserve goalkeeper Jason Steele.

"I've followed racehorses since I was a kid and I've always enjoyed it but when James Milner joined the club he twisted a few of the lads' arms to part with some money and everything that James dips his hand in turns to gold," he said.

"We're all really involved and intrigued. We're always asking questions and it's something different for us as we're so involved every day with our job but we have an elite mentality so we are always asking about how to get better, what are they doing and how they are training, what they're looking like and thinking. That transfers into different sports but it's been an amazing journey so far."

Steele continued, "We're going to miss the Guineas because we're playing Newcastle on the Sunday but we'll all be together watching it, and the lads who aren't with us now at Brighton will be with us on FaceTime watching it. It was amazing to come here today to see him work. He looked really good and everybody is pleased." Cont. p13

Her trainer Ollie Sangster said, "That was smooth. She's in good shape and has been training nicely at home. We felt that bringing her to Newmarket, although she ran here last year, would be beneficial again.

"Oisin felt she was in a good place. We didn't need to see fireworks but we were happy with what we saw."

"Her pedigree suggests she will be one to keep improving and we feel like she has."

Flight, who was third in the G2 May Hill Stakes, is the first foal of the Amaron (GB) mare Run Wild (Ger), the impressive winner of the Listed Pretty Polly Stakes at Newmarket in 2020.

Stakes to his list of five wins in 10 starts before making the trip north to join the Ballydoyle team in December.

Kirsten Rausing's homebred Almeric stepped forward to register a career best on seasonal return in Tuesday's Listed bet365 Feilden Stakes at Newmarket.

The G2 Dante Stakes and G1 Irish Derby entry employed hold-up tactics and raced seventh of the eight runners through the initial fractions of this black-type debut. Taking closer order once past halfway, the 11-4 favourite's momentum carried him to the front approaching the final furlong and he was driven out in the latter stages to defeat King Of Cities by a length. The runner-up was 7 1/2 lengths clear of third-place finisher Nightwalker.

Trainer Andrew Balding said after the race that the [G1] Prix du Jockey Club is an option for the colt after the [G2] Dante Stakes at York. "He's a smart horse and we were pretty hopeful going into today," he said. "He seems to be at home on slow ground and it's great for Miss Rausing as he's obviously a homebred and a lovely horse going forward. Oisin [Murphy] said he was just getting tired at the end as they went very hard and he was probably running on fumes a little bit, just because it was a searching gallop and it was his first run of the year. He's got a French Derby entry I think and certainly an Irish Derby entry and a German Derby entry. We're delighted to win today and we'll just have to see how things pan out. I think the likelihood is we'll look at York and France would be the preferred option, I think."

Owner-breeder Kirsten Rausing told TDN that Almeric's dam Alvarita (GB) (Selkirk) foaled a full-sister to the Feilden winner last Monday. She said, "The mare has a two-year-old colt, so he was her foal of 2023, and we thought she'd done enough so she went into retirement with her half-sister Alta Moda. They are by Selkirk and Sadler's Wells out of Alborada. But in the spring of 2024 those two old girls looked wonderful and I said to Alastair [Watson, Lanwades manager], 'Let's just walk past with Study Of Man'. So anyway, he walked past them once each and they were both in foal. All winter long I was beset with a guilty conscience, but they both laid down to foal and within a week of each other they both had lovely fillies. They are now 21 and 23 - Alvarita is 23 and she has produced a tiptop full-sister to this horse. But I am keeping my promise this time: I am not going to ask them again, for sure."

Almeric is the 13th of 15 foals and third black-type scorer out of Listed Prix Petite Etoile victrix Alvarita (GB) (Selkirk), herself a daughter of dual G1 Champion Stakes heroine Alborada (GB) (Alzao). The April-foaled grey is full to a 2-year-old colt and a weanling filly. He is also a half-brother to G3 Kilternan Stakes winner Alla Speranza (GB) (Sir Percy {GB}), and Listed Noblesse Stakes victrix and G3 Give Thanks Stakes runner-up Altesse (GB) (Hernando {Fr}). Alla Speranza, in turn, is the dam of G2 City Of York Stakes victor Shone So Bright (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), the Group 3-placed Alla Stella (GB) (Study Of Man (Ire)) and Listed Prix Petite Etoile third Amboseli (GB) (Kingman {GB}). Almeric's dam is also the second dam of the dual Group 1-placed Listed Buckhounds Stakes victrix Albaflora (GB) (Muhaarar {GB}), G2 Park Hill Stakes winner Alyssa (GB) (Sir Percy {GB}) and G3 Prix Thomas Bryon victrix Alea Iacta (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}).

SNITZEL TO STAND FOR UNCHANGED FEE OF A\$247,500, AS ARROWFIELD UNVEILS 2025 ROSTER

Leading sire **Snitzel (Aus)** will stand for an unchanged fee of A\$247,500, Arrowfield Stud announced on Tuesday.

Responsible for his third G1 Golden Slipper winner and his career-best yearling sale results, the multiple champion sire already has 16 stakes winners this season. This year alone, he has sired Group 1 winners Lady Shenandoah (Aus), Marhoona (Aus), Return To Conquer (Aus) and Switzerland (Aus), while his total yearling sales have reached A\$45.2 million, with 11 seven-figure yearlings.

Also standing at Arrowfield for unchanged fees are Group 1 sires **Dundeel (NZ)** at A\$88,000, **The Autumn Sun (Aus)** at A\$66,000, and **Maurice (Jpn)** at A\$55,000. Third-year sire **Hitotsu (Aus)**'s fee is also static at A\$22,000. The first-named has sired eight stakes winners this season and his overall tally of top-level winners is eight, among them **Castelvecchio (Aus)**, who stands for an increased fee of A\$49,500. Dundeel's Inglis Easter average was A\$414,000. Castelvecchio has sired first-crop Group 1 winners El Castello (Aus) and Aeliana (Aus), besides three more stakes winners. **Cont. p17**

Maurice's Inglis Easter yearling average was A\$503,000 for 10 sold, with his first seven-figure Australian yearling, an A\$1.4 million filly out of Shoals (Aus). The Autumn Sun had an A\$340,000 Inglis Easter average and Arrowfield's new recruit Vandeek (GB) will stand his first season for A\$22,000.

Admire Mars (Jpn), a former roster member, will not shuttle from Japan this year. He is the sire of Sunday's G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) heroine Embroidery (Jpn).

Arrowfield chairman John Messara said, "Our unrelenting commitment to quality has helped to generate exceptional results for breeders, vendors & owners this season.

"Those results, from only five stallions, include 38 stakes winners, seven Group 1 winners, more than A\$50 million [in] prize-money and an average yearling sale price of A\$316,000."

"Our young sires Hitotsu, a history-making 3-year-old, and Vandeek, a dual Group 1 winner at two, offer complementary opportunities to breeders and are both sharply priced."



Not the same pointer it once was, due to a variety of reasons, this year's edition is a quandary with the quartet of proven performers engaged all having been upstaged after winning their group or graded stakes. Perhaps **Opera Ballo** is the answer, given that he has mainly followed the same route as Notable Speech (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and put up a significant time performance in comparison with last year's Guineas hero in Kempton's "European Road To The Kentucky Derby" Conditions Stakes in February. William Buick apparently thinks not, as he sides with the G2 Vintage Stakes winner **Aomori City** who will tell us more about one of the Newmarket Classic's leading protagonists Scorthy Champ (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}) who he trailed when fourth in The Curragh's G1 Vincent O'Brien National Stakes. Juddmonte's **TDN Rising Star Field Of Gold** also came up short in his group 1 at two, but everything about his pedigree suggests he is only just getting started and he has that killer Kingman freshness to call upon here.
