



# 'WOW:' \$1.45-MILLION GUN RUNNER LEADS MILLION-DOLLAR PARADE AT OBS WEDNESDAY

OCALA, FL - It was mid-morning Wednesday when Kerri Radcliffe made the first seven-figure purchase of the day, going to \$1.05 million for a son of Nyquist, and, by the time the bloodstock agent made a session-topping bid of \$1.45 million for a colt by Gun Runner just three hips from the end of the day, a total of six juveniles had sold for seven figures during the second session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training Wednesday. Through two sessions of the auction, seven 2-year-olds have sold for \$1 million or more, smashing the previous Spring record of five to hit that mark with a full two days of selling to come.

Asked to describe the day, OBS Director of Sales Tod Wojciechowski said succinctly, "Wow."

He continued, "It was a great day. It was a lot of fun. I said before the sale started that I am always amazed that the consignors continuously up the quality of the horses that they bring. I think that was in evidence today having six horses bring \$1 million or more."



At the halfway point of the four-day auction, 325 horses have sold for \$46,393,500. The average of \$142,749 is down just slightly from last year's corresponding figure of \$143,298, while the median of \$60,000 is down 25% from last year's midway figure of \$80,000.

"It's the same cliche," Steve Venosa, who consigned the session topper under his SGV Thoroughbreds banner, said. "The

ones they want, they find and they pay for, and the rest struggle. So we just try to come over here with a good product and hopefully other people realize that as well and we get rewarded for our effort."

From a catalogue of 604, 406 juveniles have gone through the sales ring with 81 failing to meet their reserves for a buy-back rate of 20%.

Through two days, 19 juveniles have sold for \$500,000 or more, compared to 13 a year ago.


Mahmud Mouni, who signed for two of the six million-dollar babies Wednesday, is the leading buyer at the sale so far, with three head purchased for \$2.69 million.

Through two sessions, de Meric Sales is the leading consignor with 16 sold for \$4.19 million.

The OBS Spring sale continues through Friday with sessions beginning daily at 10:30 a.m.

FILLY SESSION TOPPER \$1,050,000

RAUL REYES (c) (352) 216-1856 The bloodstock agent was still at it late in the day, making a session-topping \$1.45 million bid to secure a son of Gun Runner (hip 601) from Steve Venosa's SGV Thoroughbreds consignment. Both were purchased on behalf of the newly formed American-based partnership Memo Racing.

"He's a Gun Runner," Radcliffe said of the session topper's appeal. "It's hard to get away from that. He was a gorgeous horse who breezed really well. Physically, he is lovely. He is going to take a bit more time probably than the Nyquist, but we came here to buy nice colts. And we got two. We got outbid on the [\$1.3-million] Yaupon, which I loved, but we got two out of three. So it's not bad."

The colt, bred by Capital Bloodstock, is out of Vanquished (Empire Maker) and is a half-brother to multiple graded stakes winner Takeover Target (Harlan's Holiday). He RNA'd for \$475,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

Of the session-topping result, Venosa said, "You never know any time you lead one up here, a horse like that with a stallion's pedigree and a Breeders' Cup horse under the first dam. He came up here and did everything he needed to do on the racetrack and showed well all week. I have a great team behind me that was able to help me get him here. And he was rewarded for his effort today. He went to a person who has a great eye for a horse. We are happy all the way around."

## \$1.4-Million Into Mischief Colt to Tagermeen Racing


Mahmud Mouni purchased two seven-figure juveniles from Raul Reyes's Kings Equine consignment during Wednesday's second session of the OBS Spring sale, first going to \$1.4 million to acquire a colt by Into Mischief (hip 416) and later in the session making a \$1.05-million bid to secure a daughter of Tiz the Law (hip 578). The purchases were made on behalf of the newly formed Tagermeen Racing partnership.

Mouni admitted he had missed out on the record-setting colt who topped the OBS March sale, but the Libyan bloodstock agent was determined to get his horse this time, going to \$1.4 million to acquire the son of Into Mischief.

"I was specifically focused on buying this one," Mouni said after signing the ticket on hip 416. "I was unlucky at the last sale with the \$3-million Gun Runner colt, so I came specifically to get this horse. We are happy to get him."

The colt, who worked a furlong last week in :9 4/5, is out of Silk Route (Empire Maker) and is a full-brother to unbeaten multiple stakes winner Taraz.

"We haven't decided on a trainer yet," Mouni said. "We will see. The horse was purchased by a syndicate of three people. Some of them are in England, but all from the Middle East. *Cont.*

"All of the horses that we purchase in the future will be purchased under this name," he said. "Each one has a share and maybe more owners will come in the future."

Bidding for the same partnership, Mouni purchased another colt by Into Mischief (hip 855) for \$450,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October sale.

"Maybe two or three horses. Maybe this is the last one," Mouni said when asked how many horses the group might be looking to buy. "As you know, this is very competitive."

The \$1.4-million juvenile was consigned by Raul Reyes's Kings Equine on behalf of his breeders, Scott and Evan Dilworth and Randy Andrews. The Dilworths purchased Silk Route for \$175,000 at the 2021 Keeneland November sale, some nine months after running second to her daughter Taraz with O Seraphina (Congrats) in the 2020 Martha Washington Stakes.

"We had a great plan that worked out perfectly," Scott Dilworth said. "We ran second to Taraz in the Martha Washington down at Oaklawn. My partner Randy fell in love with Taraz and then when we found out that the mamma was for sale at Keeneland, we bought her, saying we are going to breed to Into Mischief and we are going to get one just like her. And it worked out perfectly."

The mare's Into Mischief colt failed to meet his reserve at \$375,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale last August.

"He just wasn't ready," Dilworth said of that result. "He was ready today. He has just grown into himself and just made a nice horse. We have always been on the bubble about keeping him ourselves or selling him. [But with a \$1.4-million price tag] that's pretty easy. You don't come back from that."

Mouni had already acquired the juvenile's dam, paying \$10,000 for Silk Route, in foal to Maximus Mischief, at last year's Keeneland November. The mare was exported to Libya. *Cont.*

Late in the day, Mouni went back to the Kings Equine consignment to acquire a filly by Tiz the Law for \$1.05 million. The juvenile is out of stakes winner Tulsa Queen (Cactus Ridge).

With the pair of million-dollar juveniles, Reyes was jubilant while accepting congratulations all the way from the sales pavilion back to his barn.

"It feels great," Reyes said. "I had a bad year last year and I worked hard this year to be where I am."

Of the two results, Reyes admitted, 'It didn't surprise me. The filly worked fantastic. And the colt, he was so popular."

Also Wednesday in Ocala, Mouni purchased a colt by Charlatan (hip 305) for \$240,000. @JessMartiniTDN

#### **Career Score for Sanchez Family**

Leonardo Sanchez, who has been pinhooking for 10 years, had his biggest score to date Wednesday when selling a filly by Tiz The Law (hip 578) for \$1.05 million to Mahmud Mouni. Sanchez had purchased the filly for \$70,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October sale.

"He was a very strong, correct horse and we liked his sire," Sanchez said of the colt's appeal. "Tiz the Law is very hot right now. And the mother's pedigree was very good. It looks like we might the right decision."

Sanchez and his son Jhonardo who will pinhook 12 horses this year, prepared the colt at the Oak Ridge Training Center.

Asked what it was like to watch the colt bring seven figures in

the sales ring Wednesday, Sanchez had one word. "Incredible," he said.

The younger Sanchez added, "It's the realization of a dream that we've had for 10 years, since we started doing this. It's the fruit of all the hard work that we have done. My grandfather is not with us anymore, but my dad and I love horses and it's always been something that unites us. It's amazing. And it's a tribute to the team that we have built here."

As for the father-son team's plan for the upcoming yearling sales, "We will keep trying. We will keep trying very hard to achieve once more this dream that we had today."

#### K S I Adds Yaupon Colt for \$1.3m

K S I and trainer Steve Asmussen went to \$1,300,000 late in the day Wednesday to secure a son of first-crop stallion Yaupon (hip 585). Consigned by de Meric Sales, the colt worked his eighth in :9 4.5.

"You walk up on him and he has so many characteristics of his dad temperament wise," Asmussen said. "We went back and looked at him multiple time and I liked him more every time I saw him. Obviously, we paid more than retail for him but we loved who he is compared to a lot of other good horses."

Purchased as a yearling by de Meric for \$275,000 at FTKJUL, the colt is out of a full-sister to GISW Stormy Lucy (Stormy Atlantic) and to the dam of GSW Big Runner (Stormy Atlantic). Twitterpated sold for just \$10,000 at KEEJAN in 2021 and this Yaupon colt is her first foal.

"It seemed like the stars were definitely aligning for the horse," said Tristan de Meric of the pinhook. "He is a special horse and definitely one we had high expectations for. I'm very happy with the result, we're tickled to death. Best of luck to Kaleem and Steve. We're just lucky to be in the right place at the right time and have a horse like him."

Asmussen was willing to risk the high price on the reward potential of the horse.

"Of course you would have been more comfortable getting him for less but the question was, do you think he's the right horse," he said. "And I believe that he is."

The result continued a strong run for Spendthrift stallion Yaupon who now has five six-figure horses in addition to this get. **Cont.**

"I'm unbelievably excited (about the Yaupon's) because they look as athletic as he was," Asmussen continued. "And obviously at the training sales, they're showing the same sort of speed that he did. What is comforting for me is the first time I ever saw Yaupon, was working at an in training sale so it's easy to recollect that's what your dad looked like, and it worked out beautifully for us." @SGrimmTDN

#### Tiz the Law Colt to Zedan for \$1.15m

One month after striking a sales-topping \$3 million dollar-bid for a Gun Runner colt at OBS March, Amr Zedan went to \$1,150,000 to secure a colt from the second crop of GI Belmont Stakes winner Tiz the Law (hip 508). Consigned by Tom McCrocklin, the colt breezed a quarter in :20 3/5.

"He had a great work and came back really good," said agent Donato Lanni who signed the ticket on Zedan's behalf. "[He] vetted really good. We're really happy with him. He was a horse who [Zedan] really wanted to bring home with him."

Out of a winning mare, the colt is a half to stakes winner Let My People Go (Pioneerof the Nile) and to GSP Der Lu (Orb). Another half-sister, Smartly Agree (Smart Strike), was also stakes placed and produced MSP Towhead (Malbu Moon). Second dam, GISW Dream of Summer, is responsible for GISW and sire Creative Cause (Giant's Causeway), MGSW/GISP Destin (Giant's Causeway) and GISW Vexatious (Giant's Causeway).

"It's a deep family," Lanni continued. "He's a cool dude. Real quiet and really, really fast."

Wednesday was the colt's second trip through the ring having brought \$150,000 when selling to McCrocklin as a yearling at Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Sale last summer.

## 'Man Among Boys:' Nyquist Colt Brings \$1.05 Million

Hip 378 bred by Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings, is out of Saucy Dame (Distorted Humor), who is a daughter of Storm Beauty (Storm Cat) and a half-sister to graded winner Buffum (Bernardini).

"He was just gorgeous," Radcliffe said of the colt. "Pure class, by a great stallion, Nyquist, out of a Distorted Humor mare. Bred by Stonestreet, which it doesn't get much better than that. As they say, he ticked all the boxes."

Hip 378 was consigned by Harris Training Center and had been purchased by Robbie Harris and Eric Sparks for \$135,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton October sale.

"We loved him," Harris said of the colt. "I was ecstatic to get the horse. The stallion has done so well, he had a winner at Keeneland last week. And this colt was a man among boys at my farm. I break 100 head a year and you'd know where he was at any time on the track."

Of the colt's seven-figure price tag, Harris said, "I had a \$249,000 reserve on him, but I knew he was going to sell well. People were telling me there was a lot of chatter about him that he was one of the top-end colts. Glad it worked out. This felt pretty good." *Cont.*

Radcliffe's acquisitions on behalf of Memo also include a €190,000 daughter of Starspangledbanner (Aus) purchased at the Goffs October sale last year.

"It's a new fund that we put together," Radcliffe said of Memo Racing. "It's American-based, but we also have a filly in U.K. that we just bought. This horse will stay here. Don't know about a trainer yet." @JessMartiniTDN



#### **NEXT LEVEL THOROUGHBREDS FINDS** SUCCESS WITH FIRST CONSIGNMENT

In his very first consignment, Abraham Gardea's Next Level Thoroughbreds pinhooked a colt from the first crop of the Uncle Mo stallion Galilean (hip 356) for \$250,000 during Wednesday's second session of the OBS Spring Sale. The colt was making his third trip through the OBS ring having sold first for \$15,000 at the Winter Mixed Sale and then \$24,000 post-sale at the OBS Yearling Sale in October.

"I was working right across the barn from where he was [last year]", said Gardea. "And I liked the way he looked. After seeing him walk through the ring, I called my owner right away because he was an RNA. I told him we had a nice opportunity to buy a horse so we got it done."

The colt is out of a successful producer in Royale Michele who won the GII Barbara Fritchie Handicap on the track and has produced seven winners from nine to race in her broodmare career including Royale Paradise (Unbridled's Song), herself the dam of both GSP Queen of Thorns (Violence) and SW Bano Solo (Ghostzapper).

"I had an owner who trusted me," Gardea said of opening his first consignment. "Feeling really happy now, really excited."

The Florida-bred worked his furlong in the sale's co-fastest time of :9 4/5.

"He prepped really well," Gardea continued. "He's been working good all year for us."

Of the six-figure winning bid, Gardea admitted he was pleasantly surprised.

"I was kind of worried actually," he said. "Just because of the way the market is. But it's very exciting."

Next Level Thoroughbreds has one other hip who will sell late in the day during the third session Thursday and Gardea has no intention of stopping there.

"We're going to hopefully go up to Kentucky this year [for yearlings] to bring back to [OBS] March next year," he said. -@SGrimmTDN

- Even with 16 fewer hips sold Wednesday compared to the same session a year ago, gross was higher at \$25,988,500 while both the average and median were also up at \$160,175 and \$70,000 respectively.
- Wednesday's session broke the OBS April Sale's record for cumulative million-dollar horses which previously stood at five. Six horses brought seven figures Wednesday in addition to Tuesday's session topper to bring the two-day total to seven.
- Gun Runner, whose \$3m 2-year-old topped the OBS March Sale last month, also topped Wednesday's session with the last hip through the ring. Yaupon was one of two freshman sires to break into the top ten priciest hips sold, joining Horse of the Year Knicks Go. Gun Runner and Tiz the Law each had two of the top ten hips by price.

Morales positioned him in the rail pocket behind the Bill Mott-trained 5-2 favorite Bright Skittle (Twirling Candy) and Flavien Prat, slid beautifully outside that one into the stretch and gradually edged past him. His pedigree doesn't scream turf and he had no published turf workouts, but he was bet down from 20-1 morning line to 7-2 third favorite, so perhaps his training was good enough to indicate that he'll be just as effective on either surface.

He was bet down to 3-5 on the basis of his debut fourth in January at Santa Anita behind talented runners Santarena (Omaha Beach) and Extensive (City of Light), and was given a beautiful solo stalking trip here by Prat. He swung four wide into the lane and ran down pacesetter Chaching Chaching (Munnings) while bumping up his debut Beyer a couple lengths.



He might be even better than his number, too--his Beyer figure here was projected downward on the basis of a track surface that appeared to be faster for this first race than for the later dirt races, so stay tuned.

Last year's unbeaten champion 2-year-old filly **Immersive** (Nyquist) is back in training with Brad Cox at Churchill Downs. It was announced earlier this year that the Godolphin homebred would be given some time off due to bone bruising.

"Immersive is back in the barn, training and moving fantastic," Cox said. "Looking forward to getting her back later in the season."

Immersive capped a four-for-four season with a dominating

victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Del Mar Nov. 1. Her resume also includes wins in the GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga and GI Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland.

Cox also trains fellow unbeaten Godolphin homebred **Good Cheer** (Medaglia d'Oro), who further solidified her status as the horse to beat on the first Friday in May in the GI Kentucky Oaks with a win in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 22.

"She's definitely filled the gap--short term--for Immersive," Cox said. "They're two great fillies."

#### **OWEN ALMIGHTY BACK IN DERBY**

Despite their horse running sixth in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S., the connections of **Owen Almighty** (Speightstown) have informed Churchill Downs that their colt will be pointed to the GI Kentucky Derby, after all.

"Owen Almighty has re-entered the Kentucky Derby picture, according to trainer Brian Lynch," Darren Rogers, the senior director, communications and media services wrote within an email that he sends out regularly updating the points standings for the Derby. With 65 points, Owen Almighty is in 12th place in the standings.

At deadline for this story, trainer Brian Lynch had not returned a phone call seeking comment.

After the sixth-place finish in the Blue Grass, Lynch told the Keeneland media team that Owen Almighty would be pointed to the GII Pat Day Mile S. at Churchill, instead of the Derby.

"He did everything he was supposed to do," Lynch said. "He got up with the leader (East Avenue) at the top of the stretch, but he just doesn't want to go that far."

This is not the first time the connections have apparently changed their minds. *Cont.*

Owned by Travis Boersma and family's Flying Dutchmen Breeding and Racing, Owen Almighty entered the Derby picture after his win in the GIII Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby at a mile-and-a-sixteenth. Though the race is normally a steppingstone to the Derby, Lynch was already voicing doubts about running in the Derby.

"There will be conversation (about perhaps targeting the Kentucky Derby)," he said following the Tampa race. "But if I was to have my way I'd still stick to the plan and go to the Pat Day Mile," he said.

After the Tampa win, Lynch told the *Daily Racing Form* that the ownership expressed a desire to point to the Derby.

That led to speculation that the Blue Grass would be an experiment. If Owen Almighty ran well in the mile-and-an-eighth race he would head to the Derby. If he fared poorly and showed that the distance was out of his reach, the Pat Day Mile would be next. Owen Almighty prompted the pace until mid-stretch when he began to tire and lost by four lengths. He did not look like a mile-and-a-quarter horse.

With Owen Almighty back in the Derby picture, Built (Hard Spun) is now 21st on the list and will need a defection to get in. Late Wednesday, *DRF* reported Javier Castellano would ride.

Attractive investment incentives continue for those in the horse racing industry preparing to purchase two-year-olds in training and other depreciable assets. The NTRA encourages buyers to speak with a tax professional to learn how these incentives can help maximize their buying power.

#### **Bonus Depreciation**

- 40% bonus depreciation for qualifying horse, farm equipment and farm depreciable asset (land improvements, fencing, barns) purchases through 2025
- Property must be purchased and placed in service before January 1, 2026
- Property may be new or used
- Bonus depreciation is phased down by 20% per calendar year and will be fully phased out after 2026



- Expense allowance for horse, farm equipment and farm depreciable asset (land improvements, fencing, barns) purchases is permanent at \$1.25 million for 2025 (having started at \$1 million and indexed for inflation beginning after December 31, 2018)
- Limited to taxable income
- Property must be purchased and placed in service to qualify
- Applies to new or used property
- Reduced by \$1 dollar for each dollar of eligible property purchased that exceeds \$3.13 million in 2025 (having started at \$2.5 million and indexed for inflation beginning after December 31, 2018)





So, when Bastard, who ought to consider changing his first name to Jammy, sent out lot 143 to breeze faster than anything up the Rowley Mile on Monday, tongues were rightly sent wagging.

Alex Elliott, who signed for the colt on behalf of Amo Racing, explained, "When one of Malcolm's rocks up there number one, we all had to get a time slot to go and see his horse! The queue was out the door." Cont. p3

He added, "Malcolm has been doing this a long time and he is brilliant at his job. He has pre-trained some of the best horses in Europe. This horse was produced beautifully and, for it to do

what it did for Malcolm, who doesn't put the gun to their heads, it tells you that you've got a good horse."

It was just 24 hours previously when Willie Browne's
Acclamation (GB) colt set a new record for the Craven when selling to Godolphin for 1.4 million gns. Godolphin had to settle for second-best behind Amo Racing in what is now becoming a regular tug of war for the top bloodstock at Park Paddocks between the two powerhouse operations.

"Havana Grey needs no

explanation," Elliott continued. "If you were to have asked me last night what the best horse in the sale was, I'd have said the Acclamation and this fella, but I didn't have them [valued]

anywhere near that. This is a performance-based sale and, when those horses perform, you get that premium."

He added, "The market has become quite like America. After the Acclamation made 1.4 million last night, we had to realign

and say, 'what could this horse make?' Acclamation is a superstar stallion but he is not with us anymore. Havana Grey is new and he's fresh. I didn't think he could make what the horse made last night because the market got very strong. But it's just happened again. The whole breeze-up community has put this product on and, when the horses perform, the guys get well paid.

## Yulong Spends Over 1 Million Under Dullingham Banner

Fresh from taking out the opening race at Newmarket on Wednesday through homebred Double Rush (Ire) (Blue Point {Ire}), Yulong's Yuesheng Zhang made a short but significant visit to Park Paddocks by signing for two colts by elite stallions Too Darn Hot (GB) and Mehmas (Ire) for a combined 1.05 million gns within the space of about 10 minutes.

The Too Darn Hot, who fetched 550,000gns, was consigned by

Johnny Collins's Brown Island Stables while Tally-Ho Stud consigned the Mehmas colt that sold for 500,000gns. Both horses were bought under the banner of Dullingham, of which Yulong recently purchased resident stallions Shaquille (GB) and Soldier's Call (GB). However, it has yet to be confirmed whether the Chinese businessman has bought the farm itself from Dullingham's Steve Parkin.

Yulong's European representative, Paul Curran, said, "Very happy. Mr Zhang came here hoping to pick up

one or two and we have fulfilled that, which is good. Two nice, early and precocious types, which is always the plan when you come here. The Too Darn Hot will go into training with Jessica Harrington, which makes sense after Hotazhell last year. We're going to wait and see what Mr Zhang wants to do with the Mehmas."

Collins sourced the Too Darn Hot colt from Blue Diamond Studwho also bred Group 1 winner and poster boy for this sale Hotazhell--for just 90,000gns at Book 2 of the October Yearling Sale last year.

He said, "This lad has a fair bit of Shamardal about him as well and he came well prepared from Blue Diamond Stud out of Book 2. He's been straightforward all the way through, he's very sound, hasn't missed a day and has a great mind on him. I'm delighted he's going to such a good home and I wish them all the best with him."

#### **Talking Points**

 Jim and Claire Bryce enjoyed notable success with their breeze-up purchases from last year, highlighted by narrow UAE Derby runner-up Heart Of Honor (GB) (Honor A.P.), and the husband-and-wife team made their first signing from this sphere in 2025 in the shape of lot 105, a Union Rags colt for 220,000gns. It was Heart Of Honor's trainer Jamie Osborne who signed the docket on behalf of the owners. The Union Rags colt represented a shrewd piece of business for Ballybush Stables, who sourced the juvenile for just \$30,000 at the Keeneland September Sale last year. Osborne said, "The route will be much the same as Heart Of Honor. We will look to run in a maiden here in the autumn before shipping to Dubai. He can learn his trade at Meydan through December into the early part of the year. Then hopefully we can run in the Derby and go a nose better!"

- Of this year's crop of first-season sires, Starman (GB) has been quickest out of the blocks with maiden winners Lady Iman (Ire) and Green Sense (Ire) creating particularly good impressions. It is obviously early days when it comes to judging the stallion but the market reacted favourably to the progeny of the Tally-Ho Stud-based sire with seven lots selling for an average of 115,571gns. They included a colt and a filly that sold for 360,000gns and 260,000gns to Blandford Bloodstock and Highflyer Bloodstock on behalf of Phil Cunningham respectively. Both horses were consigned by Tally-Ho.
- When it comes to sourcing Royal Ascot runners, buyers really honed in on the progeny of Havana Grey this week with nine lots by Whitsbury Stud's stallion selling for an average of 421,111gns. On top of that, four Havana Grey juveniles featured among the top 10 most expensive lots sold at Tattersalls during the two-day sale.
- There was no sign of the money drying up deep into the sale when lot 170, a Too Darn Hot colt consigned by Anna Calder of Leamore Horses, sold to Jamie McCalmont for 500,000gns. The 90,000gns yearling [sourced at Book 2 of the October Yearling Sale] hails from American Grade III winner Valiant Girl (GB) (Lemon Drop Kid) and represented a massive result for Calder given it was her only horse in the sale. "I am a massive fan of the stallion," McCalmont said. "The horse did a very nice breeze but it was the last part of the breeze that was particularly good--he galloped out very strong."

 It is hard to draw too many conclusions from the Craven Sale but one thing is for sure, the ceiling has never been higher on what the elite horses in any given sale can make. When two major outfits go head-to-head, as we have seen time and time again with Amo and Godolphin, there is no telling how high the figures will go.

#### Thought for the Day

It was not for a lack of trying, but Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock struggled to get in on the action at the top end of the market. Few bloodstock agents have enjoyed a better track record at sourcing top-class runners from this sphere. One would imagine that Brown still has a lot of business to carry out, particularly at the Goffs Breeze-Up Sale, which has been particularly fruitful for the agent down through the years.

Shoemark was blown away. "He got me out of trouble, but I had so much horse underneath me," he said. "He's got an incredible amount of ability. He's pretty special."

Over the last week, Juddmonte colts Jonquil (GB) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) and Cosmic Year (GB) (Kingman {GB}) have both made a triumphant return to action to leave the team with some decisions to be made about which of the Guineas to target with which horse.

Barry Mahon, Juddmonte's racing manager, said of Field Of Gold, "It's probably a big plus that this horse has shown that he is handling Newmarket. Jonquil hasn't been here, and Cosmic Year had a gallop here at the back end of last year and he handled the track well. I think we'll sit down in a week's time with the owners and see what the ground is going to be like, and see what the owners want to do - that's what's most important.

"I'd like to think we probably wouldn't run more than two, but you've Ireland and there's France - there is more than one Guineas. If the races pan out and we can separate them then we will, but I'm sure we wouldn't be afraid of running two."

A victory in the 2,000 Guineas at Newmarket for Field Of Gold would complete John Gosden's set of British Classic wins.

Mahon added, "He came painstakingly close with Kingman and, as John said just now, Kingman didn't do a lot when he got to the front, and Kieran said that this horse, when he gets to the front, he doesn't do a lot either, so there are a lot of similarities between them."

Gosden Sr was impressed. "He showed a lot of speed today. I probably haven't had a colt win a Guineas trial like that before, he did it in splendid style," he said. "I think he'll get a mile and a quarter, I don't seem him getting a mile and a half. One day he might be good enough to run in a race like the Eclipse, we'll see. I see him more on that trajectory." ## MAKE BELIEVE'S SAJIR NOTCHES ABERNANT SUCCESS FOR ANDRE FABRE

Andre Fabre does not tilt at windmills when sending forth contenders to Newmarket's Rowley Mile venue and the veteran maestro was once again celebrating success as the four-year-old sprinter **Sajir (Ire)** (Make Believe {GB}) doubled his pattern-race tally in Wednesday's G3 Blandford Bloodstock Abernant Stakes.

Sajir, sent postward as the 2-1 joint-favourite, broke well from the stands' side stall and raced under a tight hold in third from the outset of this five-furlong test. Nudged along with a quartermile remaining, he gained an advantage passing the furlong pole and was ridden out in the closing stages to defeat **Grand Grey** (Ire) (Havana Grey {GB}) by a half-length in determined fashion.

"This is a nice start to this season for him," said owner Prince Faisal's racing adviser Ted Voute. "He started like this last year and then he got an abscess in his near hind leg. It kept opening up during the season and he kept not quite firing, although he'd run well each time.

"After he won in France last month we wanted to go to Dubai for the [G1] Al Quoz [Sprint], but we just didn't feel he was battle-hardened enough. Andre came up with the plan of coming here and it would make a bit more of a man of him. We've had our eyes set on trying to make a stallion out of him at some point, either over six or seven furlongs, and Oisin [Murphy] said he wouldn't be out of place in the six-furlong race at Ascot [G1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes]. From a stallion point of view that's maybe where we ought to aim, but it will be decided by Prince Faisal and Andre. We've also got York we can look at, as long as we can convince Andre to leave Deauville alone!"

## 'ALL SYSTEMS GO TOWARDS THE GUINEAS': GODOLPHIN STARS SHADOW OF LIGHT AND DESERT FLOWER STEP OUT

NEWMARKET, UK — Beyond the action on the racecourse at Newmarket this week, there are plenty of pointers to the first two Classics of the season to be found in the mornings and Charlie Appleby took to the Rowley Mile early on Wednesday with a team which included his two best juveniles of last year.

Desert Flower (Ire), the unbeaten G1 Fillies' Mile winner, was by far the most visually impressive of the Godolphin workers as she powered through the dip and up the hill under William Buick. Her efforts were certainly enough to leave her trainer in a bullish mood with a little over a fortnight to the Betfred 1,000 Guineas.

"You've all seen that," said Appleby of the daughter of Night Of Thunder (Ire). "You couldn't help but be impressed by that, really. So far she has just been straightforward and those good horses, they can go on any ground. That is what she is showing, that she's really versatile.

"I knew before she ran in the Fillies' Mile that she might get a little bit lost going into the dip but then she hit the rising ground and she was away. She's done that again here. When you have got those unbeaten fillies, they are always exciting – and she is definitely that."

The homebred Desert Flower currently heads the market for the 1,000 Guineas and she could then head on to the Betfred Oaks.

"I see no reason why she shouldn't stay or why she won't step up in trip," Appleby said. "With Epsom, it would be just how she handled the track because of her size. We will cross that bridge when we come to it." **Cont. p11**

#### **Godolphin Gallopers Cont.**

The European champion two-year-old of 2024, Shadow Of Light (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}), who was beaten just once into second from five starts last year, had been Buick's first mount of the morning, and Appleby was similarly upbeat about the Dewhurst winner.

He said, "The best races in the autumn are the Dewhurst and the Fillies' Mile and people may want to go against Shadow Of Light at their peril but he's a Dewhurst winner and they are often the horses that are often going to be very competitive in the Guineas.

"His preparation has gone faultlessly. He's done well physically. It was never in my mind to come for a trial. We're stepping him up to a mile, and that's a question mark of course, but I'm not worried about that because of what I saw in the Dewhurst."

Appleby added, "We have a lot of confidence in the horse on what we saw on Dewhurst day and what we're seeing physically - we think he'll see the mile out. And if he does, great, it opens his options up for the rest of the summer, and if he doesn't, then we'll drop him back to the Commonwealth. But from what we've seen we're very happy with him and it's all systems go towards the Guineas."

Appleby also brought the Jumeirah 2,000 Guineas winner Ruling Court (Justify) to the Rowley Mile for a spin under James Doyle. The Betfred Derby is his main Classic target, and his trainer is currently mulling options for the build-up to Epsom.

"We planned originally to go to Sandown with him and with the work this morning, once the dust has settled, we'll decide what to do. He's in the Guineas mix for sure and the Guineas is one of the best Derby trials anyway," he said.

"It might just be a race we look towards for his Derby trial. I

was pleased with what I saw out there this morning. Of course he's coming into today's gallop off a run in Meydan which was visually very impressive. He's come out of it very well. We'll look at him as a Derby horse but we feel he could be competitive in the Guineas as well."

Last year Notable Speech used a Rowley Mile gallop in lieu of a formal Classic trial and the 2,000 Guineas and Sussex Stakes winner returned with his younger stable-mates for a piece of work under Colm O'Donoghue. His first target of the year is the Lockinge Stakes on May 17.

Declaring himself to be "delighted with him", Appleby added, "The race obviously we're going to be working back from is the Queen Anne and hopefully we'll get quick ground."

## GROUP 1 WINNER SWITZERLAND TO STAND FOR A\$60.5K AT COOLMORE AUSTRALIA

Group 1 winner **Switzerland (Aus)** (Snitzel {Aus}) will stand at Coolmore Australia for A\$60,500 in his first season, Coolmore announced on Wednesday.

Bred by Arrowfield Group, the colt was an A\$1.5 million Inglis Ester yearling, and would go on to take the G2 Todman Stakes. At three, he added the G2 Roman Consul Stakes and the G1 Coolmore Stud Stakes, the same double completed by successful stallion Zoustar (Aus). Rated 125 by Timeform for his effort in the Coolmore Stud Stakes, Switzerland also eclipsed a 20-year-old record with that win, when covering the six furlongs in 1:08.03.

"Switzerland is a horse that we have been looking forward to standing at Coolmore for a long time," said Coolmore Australia's Tom Magnier. "He was always the head of his class from when he was broken-in at the farm to when he first arrived in Chris Waller's stable.

"He was a top-class 2-year-old, the fastest ever winner of the Coolmore Stud Stakes and the highest-rated spring 3-year-old ever by the great Snitzel. Physically, he is a stunning horse who we believe will be extremely easy for breeders to mate to, with a high-class American speed pedigree that lends itself to much of the Australian broodmare population. He is a very exciting addition to our roster and we will be supporting him with quality mares from the start."

Added Waller, "As his price tag suggests, he was an absolute standout at the sales. The whole team were adamant we should have him. He had so much presence, just a big, strong handsome colt with a beautiful action and what a racehorse he turned into.

"They couldn't touch him in the Todman ... and he was electric again in the Coolmore. Switzerland is a very special horse. I can't wait to see what he does in the next chapter."

Switzerland is out of the GIII Ladies Turf Stakes heroine Ms Bad Behavior (Blame), who was placed three more times at graded level in the U.S. She, in turn, is a half-sister to Queen's Plate hero One Bad Boy (Twirling Candy), as well as stakes winner Blessed Truly (Souper Speedy).

## MARQUAND HAS THE CALL ON LAKE FOREST IN FWD CHAMPIONS MILE

Jockey Tom Marquand will reunite with William Haggas's Group 2 winner Lake Forest (GB) (No Nay Never) in the G1 FWD Champions Mile in Hong Kong on April 27.

A winner of the A\$10 million Golden Eagle at Rosehill in November, the 4-year-old son of No Nay Never won the G2 Gimcrack Stakea at York as a juvenile, and placed second in both the G1 Commonwealth Cup and the G3 Hackwood Stakes in June and July, all with Marquand in the irons. Cieren Fallon was aboard for the Golden Eagle victory for Lake Forest.

Lake Forest would be the first British winner of the Champions Mile. Christophe Soumillon will partner the French-trained **Goliath (Ger)** (Adlerflug {Ger}) in the G1 QEII Cup, while James McDonald will be aboard Japanese runner **Prognosis (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in the QEII Cup.

Other international jockeys set to be in the saddle on FWD Champions Day include former four-time Hong Kong Champion Jockey Joao "Magic Man" Moreira, recent HK Derby winner Craig Williams, along with fellow Australian riders Damian Lane and Tim Clark, the Japanese duo of Yuga Kawada and Atsuya Nishimura, and leading German-based rider Adrie de Vries.
