



## FIRST MISSION MAKES A STATEMENT IN OAKLAWN HANDICAP

Despite a frustrating conclusion to **'TDN Rising Star' First Mission** (Street Sense)'s 4-year-old season last year, trainer Brad Cox never lost any confidence in the Godolphin homebred.

"Look, we've always thought he was a Grade I talent," Cox said in these pages earlier this week.

You can certainly see why now.

Pounded late into 7-5 favoritism, First Mission sat the trip of the race beneath Flavien Prat in Saturday's \$1.25-million GII Oaklawn Handicap and powered clear to a two-length victory over the in-form **Banishing** (Ghostzapper). The final time of 1:49.09 was the fastest clocking for 1 1/8 miles of the current Oaklawn stand that began Dec. 6.

"I feel like maybe this could be his year," Godolphin's Michael Banahan said en route to the winner's circle on *FanDuel TV*. "We were looking forward to keeping him in training and seeing if we could win a Grade I down the road with him. It was his best race that he's run up to this point."

Away in good order from post three, First Mission was positioned in an inside fourth as **Go West Go** (Twirling Candy) and the race's defending winner **Skippylongstocking** (Exaggerator) traded blows through fast fractions of :22.83 and :46.67. *Cont. p6* 

# BURNHAM SQUARE & SIMPLY JOKING AMONG MULTIPLE DERBY AND OAKS HOPEFULS DRILLING ON BUSY CHURCHILL SATURDAY; DERBY FAVORITE JOURNALISM WORKS AT SANTA ANITA

Under what was described as "perfect conditions" by analyst Kaitlin Free, a busy Saturday morning at Churchill Downs ensued as seven GI Kentucky Derby contenders logged published workouts for the "Run for the Roses" and a pair of GI Kentucky Oaks contenders also drilled for their connections, according to a press release from the track on Saturday morning.

The tab included top Derby point getter **Burnham Square** (Liam's Map), who went a half-mile in :49.40 under pilot Brian Hernandez, Jr. Trained by Ian Wilkes, the GI Toyota Blue Grass Stakes hero clipped through fractions of :24.40 and :37 and galloped out five furlongs in a composed 1:02. **Cont. p3**

"It was just a maintenance work this morning since he just ran 11 days ago," Wilkes said. "If I don't do something with him, he'll get too upset. I know I needed to run him more because he was making too many mistakes, and I thought I needed to educate him more so he doesn't make those mistakes in the Derby."

Putting in their own licks were **Publisher** (American Pharoah) and Tiztastic (Tiz the Law), who worked in company for their trainer Steve Asmussen. They completed their penultimate work for the Derby with a five-furlong move in :59.60. The former, with exercise rider Carlos Rosas aboard, and the latter, with jockey Joel Rosario in the saddle, began their move with an eighth-mile clocking of :12.80. Publisher briefly took advantage over his stablemate, working a quarter-mile in :24.20 and three-eighths in :36. Tiztastic's splits were :24.40 and :36.40. The colts galloped out six furlongs in 1:11.80.

Also making moves were: 'TDN Rising Star' East Avenue (Medaglia d'Oro) (four furlongs, :47.60); Final Gambit (Not This Time) (five furlongs, 1:00.80); Flying Mohawk (Karakontie {Jpn}) (five furlongs, 1:00); and Sovereignty (Into Mischief) (five furlongs, 1:00.60).


At Turfway Park, GII Twinspires.com Louisiana Derby runner-up Chunk of Gold (Preservationist) worked a half-mile in :50 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:02.

Also of note, likely Kentucky Derby favorite **Journalism** breezed a half-mile in :47 flat alongside stablemate Feel the Magic (Good Magic) at Santa Anita on Saturday morning. The Michael McCarthy trainee is scheduled to arrive at Churchill Downs on Tuesday.

"We're just keeping him in his routine," said McCarthy. "He's really been training well and this was kind of maintenance. He looked relaxed out there. We just let him stretch his legs a little bit." Cont.

As for the Oaks hopefuls, trainer Whit Beckman's duo of **Simply Joking** (Practical Joke) and **Drexel Hill** (Bolt d'Oro) lit up the Saturday work tab--cruising five furlongs in :58.40. That time was the fastest of 56 works at the distance.

Simply Joking, with Florent Geroux aboard, and Drexel Hill, with Ben Curtis up, posted a sharp opening quarter-mile of :22.60 while continuing three furlongs in :34. The pair galloped out six furlongs in 1:11.60, according to Churchill clocker John Nichols.

Easter Sunday is expected to be a quiet morning at Churchill Downs. The next group of Derby contenders is scheduled to breeze Tuesday, led by **Admire Daytona (Jpn)** (Drefong) and **Coal Battle** (Coal Front).

#### UPDATE FROM BELMONT: BALLERINA D'ORO WORKS FOR OAKS, BROWN OFFERS PLANS FOR HILL ROAD, SIERRA LEONE

Rodeo Creek Racing's GIII Gazelle winner **Ballerina d'Oro** (Medaglia d'Oro) worked a half-mile on Saturday over the Belmont Park training track in preparation for the GI Kentucky Oaks, NYRA said in a Saturday press release.

Trained by Chad Brown, Ballerina d'Oro breezed under jockey Dylan Davis and was caught by NYRA clockers covering the distance in :48 seconds flat outside of 'TDN Rising Star' and GISP Hill Road (Quality Road), who the conditioner said is pointing to the GIII Peter Pan Stakes during the Belmont at the Big A meet May 10. Hill Road was forced to miss the GII Wood Memorial Stakes in early April after he spiked a fever on the Thursday before the race.

"She [Ballerina d'Oro] worked super and is cooling out good, so she'll ship over to Churchill and leave tomorrow," said Brown, who added he was also pleased with the way Hill Road galloped out. "She's been pretty uncomplicated in her races, so I'm not sure she what happened coming off the turn in the last race."



Brown said the talented gray reminds him of champion 3-year-old colt and 'TDN Rising Star' Sierra Leone (Gun Runner), who has been working at Payson Park throughout April and is expected to arrive at Belmont Park soon to train toward the GI Stephen Foster Stakes at Churchill Downs June 28.

"I'm not going to react to that. It was such an isolated thing for me," Brown said of the Gazelle stretch run. "She has enough steering equipment on her between her bit and a small blinker. I'm not going to overreact here.

"She cruised around there with Hill Road and Dylan gave us good feedback and said, 'Chad, I don't know where that came from, because she was straight for me today.' She might hold her head in a little bit, but she's a lot like Sierra the way she trains. He [Sierra Leone] might cock his head a little bit, but in the mornings, we have never seen him on one line or had a rider complain about him--same as her.

"I think with more going on in a full field of the Oaks, she's not going to come off the turn six-wide with no one in either five lanes of her," Brown said. "That's kind of the way she was [in the Gazelle], and she's going to have horses near wherever she is in this race."

Go West Go was the first to blink and Banishing made his move to press Skippylongstocking heading into the turn. Still racing in fourth and patiently awaiting racing room while locked and loaded, Prat threaded the needle beautifully between Banishing and Skippylongstocking down the lane and First Mission ran to daylight from there to win with authority.

First Mission was on the cusp last spring, but never took the next step following powerful wins in the GIII Essex Handicap at Oaklawn Mar. 23 and GII Alysheba Stakes at Churchill Downs May 3. The latter was good for a career-high 106 Beyer Speed Figure.

Fourth as the 4-5 favorite in the GI Stephen Foster Stakes at Churchill Downs June 29, First Mission was given plenty of time to regroup following a well-beaten seventh in the GI Whitney Stakes over a muddy track at Saratoga Aug. 3. He returned from the bench with a fantastic third going against the track while launching his 5-year-old season in the GIII Razorback Handicap Feb. 23.



#### Elkhorn Stakes, cont.

Idratherbeblessed (Unified), who walked the dog en route to an 86-1 upset of the GII Muniz Memorial Stakes Mar. 22, was ridden forward yet again by Ben Curtis and made an easy lead as Utah Beach settled in about mid-division for Vincent Cheminaud. Limited Liability landed in the latter third of the field underneath Frankie Dettori, who tried to shake things up passing the stands for the first time by allowing the veteran to stride forward outside of horses, and by the time they passed under the wire for the first time, Limited Liability was in front, with Dettori making the Elkhorn a test of stamina.

Cheminaud made a crucial decision 4 1/2 furlongs from the wire, asking Utah Beach to improve his position and entering the turn, the gelding was up into fifth, within about four lengths of the front-running Limited Liability. Driven along inside of favored Missed the Cut (Quality Road) at the midpoint of the final turn, Utah Beach popped off the fence to deliver his challenge in upper stretch, and although Limited Liability proved stubborn, Utah Beach nosed in front inside the final furlong and won the sprint to the line.




Utah Beach (left) takes the battle of the greys in the Elkhorn

"To be honest, I wasn't confident from the beginning because the pace was very slow, and I didn't travel good into the first turn," Cheminaud commented. "But after that, when the favorite moved outside, the rest was much better. That's why I was easier on the bit with my horse. Then I was confident."

A longshot third in last year's GIII Sycamore Stakes over this track and trip, Utah Beach led late, but was chinned on the wire as the favorite in the two-mile H. Allen Jerkens Handicap at Gulstream Dec. 6. An even ninth in the GIII W.L. McKnight Stakes in Hallandale Jan. 25, he was a latest eighth in the GIII Kentucky Cup Classic at Turfway Mar. 22.



#### **Pedigree Notes:**

Utah Beach is the 74th worldwide stakes winner and 39th graded/group winner for the late English Channel, whose champion son Channel Maker took the 2022 Elkhorn.

One of seven winners from 10 to the races out of a winning half-sister to Voy Por Uno Mas (Mazel Trick), Utah Beach has a 3-year-old half-brother by Twirling Candy (\$240,000 Ylg '23 FTSAUG), a juvenile half-brother by Blame (\$160,000 Ylg '24 FTSAUG) and Liam's Map half-sister foaled Mar. 15.

He may have been passed in the stretch, but Calumet homebred Tennessee Lamb belied his name and fought like a lion to get back up, capturing his first career stakes victory in his first try Saturday in Keeneland's GIII Ben Ali Stakes. Although the winner left the gate unbothered, GISP Piroli (Battle of Midway) was not so fortunate, squeezed hard for several strides between horses due to a rank Duke of Love (Cupid)--a graded winner who sported the field's highest previous Beyer Figure with a 99--and was left to trail the field. Up front, Prince of Power (Runhappy), the lone runner in the field with a previous start at this Keeneland meet, assumed the lead with Tennessee Lamb to his outside and an eager Duke of Love a joint third with San Siro. While positions remained unchanged throughout a :23.40 first quarter and :47.70 half, things were about to get interesting.

Moving easily on the outside, Tennessee Lamb poked his head in front as Prince of Power retreated at the five-sixteenth pole. Not home free coming off the turn, Tennessee Lamb had to contend with Uno Mas Bourbon, third in the GII Fayette Stakes here last fall, who ranged up to his outside as San Siro threatened to his inside. Uno Mas Bourbon actually passed Tennessee Lamb and briefly looked the winner, but he switched to his wrong lead once he made the front and idled, allowing Tennessee Lamb to re-rally and take command with a flourish. San Siro, a winner two back at Fair Grounds before a fourth-place finish in the GII New Orleans Classic, slightly checked along the rail as the gap narrowed, but he passed Uno Mas Bourbon for the place despite finishing 1 1/2 lengths behind the winner.

With the Ben Ali victory, trainer Rusty Arnold tied Bill Mott as the winningest trainers in Keeneland history, both with 307 wins. Tennessee Lamb also gave Calumet a graded double, as Friday's GIII Baird Doubledogdare Stakes winner Gin Gin (Hightail) also races for the farm. Brendan Walsh trains that Calumet homebred.

"I felt like going into the first turn [Tennessee Lamb] was too keen," said winning rider Jose Ortiz after the Ben Ali. "I wanted to get him to settle, but he didn't settle until we got to the backside... I was a little bit worried on the backside but approaching the half-mile he took a deep breath, whoosh, and then I was very happy to feel that underneath me. After that, he did the rest. He was very resilient and we are very happy to get the win. He's a barn favorite, so I'm very happy for the guys back in the barn."

Alternating frequently between turf and dirt starts throughout his career, Tennessee Lamb was slow to break his maiden, but finally did in his eighth try at Churchill last November while in the slop. *Cont.*

He opened his 2025 campaign on the lawn at Gulfstream, finishing well off the board, but returned to the dirt Mar. 14 in Hallandale with a bang-up optional allowance victory by more than five lengths. When discarding that non-effort on the turf, Tennessee Lamb has finished no worse than second in his last five dirt starts and has three consecutive main track wins, including the Ben Ali.

#### **Pedigree Notes:**

Tennessee Lamb is one of four graded winners for Tonalist, a four-time Grade I winner by Tapit. A Lane's End's sire, Tonalist has 14 other black-type winners in additional to the Ben Ali victor. Tennessee Lamb's late broodmare sire, Smart Strike, who has 202 black-type winners out of his daughters, also stood at Lane's End.

Calumet Farm bought the Ben Ali winner's dam at Keeneland November in 2016 for \$160,000 while she was carrying Dack Janiel's, a full-brother to Tennessee Lamb. Like his full-brother, Dack Janiel's raced as a homebred for the operation and had his biggest day at Keeneland, placing third in the GII Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance Stakes in 2020. Another sibling, Tennessee Moon (Ransom the Moon) was the winningest horse in America in 2024 when recording 13 visits to the winner's circle.

Calumet resold the mare, Tennessee Whiskey, at Keeneland in 2022 for \$10,000 to Whiskey Partnership while she was in foal to Calumet stallion Hightail. The resulting filly, a 2-year-old named Whiskey High, is already a winner in 2025, having broken her maiden on debut at Turf Paradise Apr. 10 for trainer Justin Evans. The mare, who hails from the extended family of 1998 Horse of the Year Skip Away, produced a colt by Mystic Guide in 2024 and was bred to Gunite for 2025.

Santa Anita's field for the GII Santa Maria Stakes finished in order of the odds Saturday, with Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert filling out the exacta with his pair of entrants. Richi (Chi), second last out in the GI Beholder Mile Stakes, captured her second graded win of 2025 in a 4 1/2-length tour de force.

From her rail gate, Richi immediately went to the lead while on the fence as 21-1 Fayette Fox (Sharp Azteca) pestered her from the outside. Undaunted as the class of the field, Richi held firm through :22.78 and :46.61 fractions, finally shaking off Fayette Fox a half-mile from home and kicking clear as her stablemate Splendora--second and fourth in the GI La Brea Stakes and GII

Santa Monica Stakes, respectively, in her last two--chased her home. In front gate to wire, Richi was a much-the-best, easy winner, cantering under the wire under a hand ride. Ultimate Authority, a Jan. 19 optional allowance winner before a sixth in the Beholder Mile Mar. 8, finished an even third.

"I didn't think she could be beat today," jockey Antonio Fresu, who was winning his first stakes for the Baffert team, said of the winner. "I kept things simple. I took the lead, tried to do my thing and she won very easily. You could see she wasn't even tired. I never asked her. She was so much the best. That was a nice performance."

A two-time Group 1 winner in her native Chile and the champion 2-year-old filly there in 2023, Richi has not been worse than third in five starts in North America. Now campaigning for Hill n' Dale Equine Holdings Inc. and Stud Vendaval, Inc., she kicked off 2025 with a GIII Las Flores Stakes win before a third in the Santa Monica and that second in the Beholder. The Beholder's final time--1:34.96--was the fastest mile in Arcadia during a race since 2019, flattering Richi's three-quarters of a length second.

"Richi, she is like 'been there, done that,' and she is just getting better," said Baffert. "I really think that she is getting acclimated now to the United States. It takes them about a year to get them acclimated to the States, but she just gets stronger and stronger and has just developed into a really nice filly."

#### **Pedigree Notes:**

Richi is one of 29 graded winners and 46 black-type winners for her Ashford Stud-based sire, Practical Joke. The son of Into Mischief currently ranks fourth on the U.S. sire list of 2025 by earnings with seven stakes winners to date, putting him in a joint third in that category. He's got a live shot for the GI Kentucky Oaks with last-out GII Fantasy Stakes runner-up Simply Joking.

Daughters of Scat Daddy, the late Ashford Stud stallion who, like Practical Joke, shuttled to Chile, have proved a potent cross for Richi's sire. Eight of Practical Joke's Chilean group winners and three of his four champions in that country are out of mares by Scat Daddy. The latter has 64 stakes winners out of his daughters, including GI Kentucky Derby contender Burnham Square (Liam's Map).

#### GOOD NEWS IN MARYLAND AS HANDLE RECORD **SET**

With a handle of \$5,536,944 wagered on the 12-race "Preakness Preview Day" program at Laurel Park, the new Maryland Jockey Club (MJC) set a handle record Saturday, according to a release from the organization.

Two "Win Today, See You in May events" were contested Saturday, as well as the first stakes races on turf in the state of Maryland for the year.

The \$150,000 Federico Tesio Stakes offered a fees-paid guaranteed spot in the starting gate for the GI Preakness Stakes, while the Weber City Miss Stakes offered the same for the GII Black-Eyed Susan Stakes. They were won by Pay Billy (Improbable) and Complexity Jane (Complexity), respectively.

The new MJC offered other encouraging statistics:

- 105 entrants on Saturday gave an average of 8.8 starters per race, with a comparative 72 horses in the 11-race Federico Tesio card in 2024, or an average of 6.5 runners per race
- This year's "Preakness Preview Day" card averaged \$461,412 per race with a handle of \$5,536,944, while last year's comparative card handled \$2,889,322, for an average of \$262,666 per race

Professor Gordon Jones passed only four days after his 95th birthday.

Jones was a pioneer of speed and pace handicapping. His best-selling book, "Gordon Jones to Win" (1976), inspired his popular pre-race handicapping seminars that were attended by legions of race goers. He brought his numbers to the track at a time when people would laugh at him, and he would hide his spiral notebook. Speed numbers are now a common barometer.

He graduated from Whittier College, where his father had been president for several years. He went on to get his Master's Degree from the University of Oregon.

Jones taught journalism at USC and Arizona State. He was awarded the "Top Banana Award" several times by his students at USC, which was awarded to their favorite professor. Many of his students went on to say that he was the reason they went on to successful careers as journalists. Renowned sportscaster Al Michaels has said numerous times that Gordon Jones was his favorite professor! He talked about how they used to go to the racetrack together at Turf Paradise while Michaels was a student at ASU.

Later in life, Jones was hired by former students to be the turf columnist and handicapper for the Los Angeles Herald Examiner. When the 1984 Olympics came to Los Angeles, it was all hands on deck in the sports department and Jones was sent to cover some of the more obscure events. Jones laughed about it for years because each event they sent him to turned out to be a gold medal for the USA, and he continued to get the front page story in the paper.

His popularity transcended the sport. Jones was given a small role in the Ryan O'Neal movie Fever Pitch. Cont.

He also did voiceover work on the award-winning Indie film George B. He even had a big write up in *Los Angeles Magazine*.

His devotion to his students, both on college and university campuses and the racetrack, was lifelong. Jones continued to receive correspondence from students as far back as the 1960s. His words and teachings were impactful, and his articles resonated with so many, bringing in many new fans to the sport. Oaklawn Park was always a favorite track for him. He applied his speed and pace method and called it a "berry patch." He wrote about Oaklawn Park in the *Herald Examiner* and that article was framed and hung in the Oaklawn executive offices.

Jones was a highly intelligent man. During the draft for the Korean War, he placed first in math and third in science in the required draft testing. They would not allow him to fight but put him instead in an office at Fort Monmouth in New Jersey.

Jones taught his daughter, Joanne, how to handicap and so began a long career for her in television and radio covering the races from Coast to Coast. He is survived by his daughter, Joanne Jones; grandson, Ethan Jones; his longtime partner, Margaret Davis; his former wife and close friend, Kathy Jones; his brother, Dr. Alfred Jones; sister-in-law, Dr. Elyane Jones; niece, Elizabeth Jones; and daughter, Brienna Jones.

Plans for a memorial service honoring his life will be announced at a later date.

## GUN RUNNER FIRSTER BESTS ELDERS STYLISHLY, BECOMES A 'RISING STAR'

Part of a favored Klaravich Stable entry favored at 70 cents on the dollar, **Strategic Focus (c, 3, Gun Runner--Curlin's Mistress, by Curlin)** turned in a highly polished debut effort, outfinishing a pair of older rivals to become the newest **'TDN Rising Star'** for his boom sire.

Drawn widest in a field of eight, the \$500,000 Keeneland September purchase broke fractionally to his right and was taken in hand by Dylan Davis to race in the second half of the field behind fractions of :23.38 for the opening quarter and :46.23 for the half.

Kept out in about the six path passing the half-mile marker, the clean chestnut was asked to go a bit on the turn and tracked into it nicely three wide, following the move of his more-experienced entrymate **Duration** (Mitole). Steered out to the grandstand side in upper stretch, Strategic Focus sustained his run to hit the front five off the inside at the entrance to the final furlong and edged clear late to best the well-backed 4-year-old **Hop Sing** (Curlin), a big-figure second at Gulfstream Park Feb. 27 where he was more or less on even terms at the wire with Duration, who was officially fourth.

Strategic Focus is a full-brother to Klaravich's Headline Numbers, a \$325,000 KEESEP grad who earned the first stakes victory of her career in the Top Flight Stakes at Aqueduct on Apr. 12. The winner's dam is a full-sister to three-time graded winner Curlin's Approval, the dam of the Brown-conditioned Praetor (Into Mischief), recently third in the GIII Stonestreet Lexington Stakes. Curlin's Mistress is also a half-sister to one-time MGSP 'TDN Rising Star' Apologynotaccepted (Fusaichi Pegasus).

Bred on a similar cross to GI Churchill Downs Stakes winner Gun Pilot, Strategic Focus has a yearling half-brother by Authentic and Curlin's Mistress is also the dam of a filly foal by Authentic foaled Feb. 14 already named Valentine Mistress.

Complexity Jane faced her toughest test to date in the Weber City Miss Stakes, and she gamely turned away all challenges to claim her first black type win.

A winner at first asking Feb. 1 against local maidens, she was elevated to the win last out Mar. 2 when tackling optional claimers when the horse across the wire first, Rosieontheriver (Kantharos), was disqualified from purse money by the Maryland Racing Commission due to a crop violation by her jockey. On a nontraditional win streak of sorts, Complexity Jane was sent away by the betting public with 8-1 odds, and rewarded her backers here.

A touch high-strung behind the gate to where jockey Jevian Toledo had to dismount, she overcame her early antics to step out for the front. Controlling the tempo through :24.36, :48.88, and 1:14.01 splits, she opened up her advantage on the field in midstretch as Reply desperately tried to close the distance via a determined rally from last. The margin got tighter at the end with Moon Cache finding a second wind as well, but the victress had just enough to hold on by three-quarters of a length despite drifting late. Reply got the best of the bob over the third-place filly.

"I told Toledo in the paddock not to take anything away from her," trainer Brittany Russell explained. "Use [her speed] if you can. It worked out awesome. This was a big step."

With her victory here, Complexity Jane has earned an automatic berth into the GII Black-Eyed Susan Stakes at Pimlico, run the day before the second jewel of the Triple Crown, but Russell won't commit to sending her filly just yet.

"We won't go just to go. We'll see how she's training and go from there."

Complexity Jane is the second black type earner for three winning siblings to the races for their dam behind Roman Giant. Pay Billy continued his excellent run of form over the Laurel Park main track in recent months with a second straight convincing stakes win and his fourth victory in his last five tries over this surface. Handled by his regular pilot Raul Mena, he had his heels clipped by Sacred Thunder (Holy Boss) in the early going before establishing a stalking position in fourth, three lengths behind Right Wing Runner (Preservationist)'s even pace set in :24.13, :48.60 and 1:13.38. The 2-1 favorite in the field of 10 commenced his bid on the far turn and gained a narrow lead over Bold Diversion (Blofeld) entering the stretch. He responded well to steady pressure thereafter and prevailed by 1 1/2 lengths over Just a Fair Shake's late bid.

There was a general stewards' inquiry after the race, but no changes were made. Pay Billy exited the winner's enclosure with a cut on his left rear hock, and the early trouble with Sacred Thunder was concluded as the likely cause.

"He's a very classy horse," Mena said. "When he comes behind horses, he's just very relaxed, and he scares me sometimes because he drops the bit. I had to pop him on the shoulder at the half-mile pole because he was too relaxed. But I know if he goes to the lead, he gets too aggressive. When [Just a Fair Shake] came to me, my horse grabbed the bit and came fighting with him."

With his victory here, Pay Billy has earned a spot in the gate for the GI Preakness Stakes at Pimlico May 17.

"Win, and You're In here; the fees are paid. If he's doing well, it's a good possibility," trainer Michael Gorham said about a potential Preakness start.

Dam Harlington's Rose won the 2015 GIII Las Flores Stakes at Santa Anita as a 4-year-old. Rick Higgins and Howard Read's colt Mo Plex graduated on debut by an eye-catching 10 lengths against state breds during the Belmont at the Big A meet last June. The bay then won the six-furlong GIII Sanford Stakes at the Spa in mid-July and the Funny Cide Stakes over course and distance for New York-breds at the end of August.

After running third in the GI Champagne Stakes at the Big A in early October, Mo Plex was the runner-up in the state bred Sleepy Hollow Stakes at Aqueduct Oct. 27. Taking a winter break, the Jeremiah Englehart trainee returned to finish third in the Gander Stakes for locals at the Ozone Park oval Mar. 8.

Backed as the 6-5 favorite here, the chalk shadowed just to the outside of Faster Gator as the field set a stern pace of :45.55 for the first half-mile. By the time the quarter pole arrived, the match race between the two was on. It was only in the final jump that Mo Plex dug down, which was enough to secure the prize.

"That was great," said trainer Jeremiah Englehart. "The whole team did a great job. He looked great in the paddock. His groom, and Harlem [Johnson] and Dana [Saul, assistants] did really well with him. It was nice to get him back in winning fashion. The three horse [Faster Gator] ran a hell of a race and so did the West Point colt [No. 1, Pascaline]. They both look like horses

with bright futures so hopefully he moves onward and upward from here."

Nineteenamendment, last seen Mar. 20 winning comfortably by 2 1/4 lengths over the Gulfstream Park Tapeta course versus five allowance foes, returned to the turf and prevailed in her initial foray into stakes competition.

"It's not unusual for Shug to have a later-developing horse for our partnership," said Dawn Lenert, West Point's chief marketing officer and Mid-Atlantic rep. "[Signator] is a horse that is enjoying his job right now. I think his natural talents are now showing on the turf."

JUST A TOUCH (c, 4, Justify--Touching Beauty {GSW, \$183,166}, by Tapit) was runner-up in last year's GIII Gotham Stakes and this track's GI Toyota Blue Grass Stakes and was as short as 11-1 for the GI Kentucky Derby. Very little went right on that occasion, but he bounced back to just miss in the July 6 lowa Derby before going missing. The bay could not have been more impressive in bossing a first-level Fair Grounds allowance from the front Mar. 1, bolting up by 10 1/2 lengths, and he was just shy of 1-2 to repeat the dose on Saturday. Suffice to say he'll not be seeing allowance company again anytime soon. The \$300,000 OBS April breezer won the break and carried the lead into the first turn, but Florent Geroux took a tug and was content to lay second while maintaining a foothold at the fence, as Passing Game (Medaglia d'Oro)--ostensibly there to help set things up for the more accomplished Skinner (Curlin)--was intent on making the lead. Geroux sat against Just a Touch before giving him his head with better than a half-mile to race and the colt was firmly in front entering the turn. They lined up to try to take a crack at him nearing the stretch, but Just a Touch continued to go through his gears, opening up at will and easing home a very good-looking winner, earning himself the right to return to some of the top races on offer over the coming months.



# AT TATTERSALLS POINTS TO MORE OF THE SAME AT GOFFS

Never in the history of the breeze-up game have the top horses been worth more. That was evident at the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-Up Sale last week when the record for the most expensive horse ever sold at the sale was broken not once but twice and top agents Richard Brown and Billy Jackson-Stops admitted to finding it hard to land a blow.

Malcolm Bastard's 1.75 million gns record-breaking Havana Grey (GB) colt played a pretty significant role in the turnover reaching an all-time high of nearly 20 million gns. On top of that, the clearance rate rested at an extremely healthy 83%, suggesting there was a real depth to the market. Another encouraging sign for vendors going forward.

However, Con Marnane, who sold the fifth most expensive horse in the sale--a 650,000gns Havana Grey colt to Godolphin--says there are still gaps in the market, pointing to the fact that he brought home two expensively-bought Too Darn Hot (GB) colts from the sale. Cont. p3

#### Queen Of Keeneland



She is trained by Simon and Ed Crisford.

Also a winner at listed level in Britain, the chestnut is out of Fragrancy (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}), who was placed in the Listed Severals Stakes as a 4-year-old. Choisya is the 10th of 12 foals for her dam and one of four black-type horses. Cont. p5

"Hats off to Tattersalls," Marnane said. "It was a remarkable sale--the crowds that were there and the money that was around the place was phenomenal. We enjoyed a fantastic result with the Havana Grey colt but we also took two Too Darn Hots home with us, which I was shocked about. But they are mile/mile-and-a-quarter horses who didn't do a time and, unfortunately, that's the way the thing is gone. We'll just have to race them now and, if they show something on the track, they'd sell like hot cakes to Australia."

Few agents, if any, can boast the roll of honour that Blandford Bloodstock's Brown has in recent years and, despite buying on behalf of a country, he could only come away with two horses--colts by Starman (GB) and Starspangledbanner (Aus) for a combined 590,000gns--from the Craven.

Reflecting on the trade, Brown said, "It must have been the strongest breeze-up sale ever. The top was very strong but, for me, it also felt as though there was a lot more depth to the market than normal. People say that there can be a knock-on effect to the top end of the market being strong. I don't necessarily agree with that because you are only talking about two or three very select lots that obviously made big money. I actually felt there was a lot of depth in that 50,000-200,000 range, which is so important."

He added, "Olly Tait [Wathnan Racing Manager] has been very clear that we set a value on these horses and stick to that value. We didn't value horses as highly as other operations did so we didn't buy very much last week. If that continues to be the case at Doncaster, Arqana and beyond, so be it. It may well be the case that we don't buy many breeze-up horses this year if they keep exceeding the valuations that we put on them." Cont. p4

Jackson-Stops said he found filling orders at the Craven to be "tricky". He spent 390,000gns on three horses but admitted to being surprised by the strength of Amo Racing--who spent 3.16 million gns on seven lots, ending the sale as the leading buyer--, who played a pivotal role in the sale exceeding all expectations.

He said, "It was definitely tricky. But it always is. When you are spending between 150,000-250,000, you always end up on the 400,000 and 500,000 horses and you're just hoping that it might fall into your bracket. I didn't think the Craven would be as strong as it was. I thought buyers like Amo Racing, for example, would not be as active given they had filled their boots at the yearling sales but clearly they wanted to continue. So it was difficult. But we have managed to buy nice horses out of Doncaster, France and Tattersalls Ireland, so there is no panic.

There are enough sales so patience is key."

With all of this money floating about and leading buyers openly admitting to struggling to fill orders, a case could be made that there has never been a better time to be a breeze-up handler. Not quite. Of the 133 pinhooks that went through the ring, 80 made a profit and 53 fell flat on their face. That means that 60% of the yearlings that were purchased for the sole purpose of going breezing made a profit. Another promising statistic, it

must be said, but lest we forget that the cost of production has never been higher and the Craven is very much an elite sale. For many handlers, when they have a horse that can jump through the hoops, it needs to go on and make a premium to pay for the others. A case in point being Marnane's performance last week in netting a cool 650,000gns for the Havana Grey but bringing home two horses that stood him six figures. Rest assured there were plenty of others in that boat and the handler has put forward a quirky suggestion that might help prop up the middle market in the years to come.

Marnane said, "I think that something should be done to help the sales houses, the consignors and the purchasers. A bonus scheme could work well and I've floated the idea before. Say for example if you took 2% of the turnover from the breeze-ups sales last year, there would be a million worth of bonuses. If you had, say, 100 bonuses to the value of 10,000 per bonus for

every breeze-up horse that went on to win a race, it could be a huge help. How that money was collected would need to be decided upon by the sales companies, the vendors and the buyers but it could be something that would help the middle market going forward. The prize-money in Britain and Ireland is a disgrace and there's no doubt that it's hurting the middle to lower end of the market so we need to do something."

Goffs chief Henry Beeby was far from dismissive of such an idea and, speaking ahead of his breeze-up sale next week, revealed that the sales house has gone to great lengths to attract buyers from all over the world--particularly the Middle East--to help prop up the middle to lower tiers. Regarding the top end of the market, Brown, who purchased last year's Queen Mary heroine Leovanni (Ire) (Kodi Bear {Ire}) along with many other top-notchers from the sale, warned that Wathnan's principals would not be changing. If people thought the ace

> agent was sitting on his hands at the Craven in anticipation for Doncaster, they may think again. Brown says he will only be shopping if the price is right.

> "It's very simple," he explained. "We value the horses. Olly and I sit down, he then goes to the powers that be in Qatar for approval, and they give us approval or they don't. That's it. The values are set. For me, there were a lot of horses there [at the Craven] that went a long way beyond our valuations. Like I said, it may well be that we don't buy many

breeze-up horses this year if the market continues like that. We've set out to be very disciplined and I think that will stand to us in the long run."

He added, "We'll see what's up there [at Doncaster]. But how hopeful am I? Not very given the marketplace. There will be other opportunities that will present itself if the market is very strong but we will go up there and work the sale hard and, if there are some nice horses up there, I am sure we will try. But we may only be trying. We don't feel we have to go and buy a load of breeze-up horses. We're not under pressure. We have the horses-in-training market, we have our own two-year-olds coming through from the yearling market and then we buy off the track as well. So we're not under pressure to go and buy, say, 10 breeze-up horses. We just deal with each sale, each horse and each opportunity that presents itself."

The extended family features dual top-level winner Hibaayeb (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) and her daughter Wuheida (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), a winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf and the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac.

Darley's Night Of Thunder has sired 12 winners from 20 runners in the U.S. (60%). Choisya is his best to date there, and he also has three additional graded winners and a listed winner to his credit, all fillies. He stands for €150,000 at Kildangan Stud in Ireland this year.

### Blue Point Filly Blitzes Rivals In Florida


Foxwoods-owned **Make Haste (GB)** (Blue Point {Ire}) won her second American start by 4 3/4 lengths at Gulfstream for Christophe Clement on April 13 (video).

Bred by Sheraton Bloodstock, the bay was a 40,000gns weanling acquisition by Ballymaw Bloodstock from the Tattersalls December Foal Sale before catching the eye of Byron Rogers, Diego Dias and Star Bloodstock as a 75,000gns Tattersalls October Book 2 yearling. The filly was a winner for Dias and owners Simon Chappell, Mrs. A. Frost and M Eves at Naas on debut, and LNJ Foxwoods and Gainesway had bought into the filly prior to her start in the G2 Queen Mary Stakes at

Royal Ascot last June. She was second in the Listed Marwell Stakes back at Naas for that ownership group in July and switched to the U.S. after five starts. The fourth winner from five to race out of the winner Quick March (GB) (Lawman {Fr}), Make Haste is a granddaughter of listed winner and dual Group 3-placed Strut (GB) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Her dam has a 2-year-old colt by Harry Angel (Ire). G3 Prix Chloe heroine Araminta (Ire) (Gleneagles {Ire}) is out of G3 Bengough Stakes victress Mince (GB) (Medicean {GB}), herself a half-sister to Quick March.

Priced at €100,000 at Kildangan Stud in Ireland this year,

Darley's Blue Point has 50% winners from runners (7/14). His trio of stakes winners are led by GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint victor Big Evs (Ire).

# 'TDN Rising Star' For Pinatubo

Pinatubo (Ire) filly Al Jafara (GB) was named a 'TDN Rising Star' in her third start and American debut at Keeneland for Chad Brown on April 12 (video). She now races in the colours of Madaket Stables, Michael Dubb and Richard Schermerhorn.

Bred by V. I. Araci, the 3-year-old filly was a 15,000gns Book 2 yearling out of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale to Shanaville Stables, and brought €37,000 at the Arqana May Breeze-Up Sale when selling to KGS. After a fourth for Mansour Aguel and trainer Hedi Ghabri at Chantilly, she won at second

asking at that venue over 1800 metres in September. Sold for €250,000 at Arqana's Arc Sale to Oceanic Bloodstock, she was exported Stateside for these connections. Out of the placed mare Predawn (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), herself a full-sister to G1 Oaks heroine Qualify (Ire) and four-time group-placed Shogun (Ire), the filly is her third foal and second winner. Predawn has a 2-year-old colt by Too Darn Hot (GB) and a yearling filly by Oasis Dream (GB). This is the same clan as G1 St. Leger winner Brian Boru (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Flute (Seattle Slew).

Another Darley representative, Pinatubo (Ire) has an 40% strike rate in the U.S. with two winners from five to race, including the GIII With Anticipation Stakes third Cavallo Bay (GB). His 2025 fee is £30,000 at Dalham Hall Stud.

### Lope De Vega Game At Keeneland

Farfellow Farms' **Expensive Queen (Ire)** (Lope De Vega {Ire}) made her U.S. bow a winning run, clawing out a neck victory at Keeneland for trainer Brendan Walsh on April 18 (video).

Bred by Fermoir, Ltd., the 4-year-old filly was purchased out of the Arqana August Yearling Sale for €260,000 by Rabbah Bloodstock. She broke her maiden at Haydock for Kevin Ryan and Jabber Abdullah in July of 2023, and, after five starts, made a pair of starts for James Tate before being sold and traveling to the U.S. A full-sister to G3 Prestige Stakes and G3 Princess Royal Stakes heroine Antonia De Vega (Ire) and the stakes-placed Luckin Brew (Ire), the filly is out of the multiple stakes-placed Witches Brew (Ire) (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}). The dam has a pair of full-siblings to Expensive Queen--a juvenile colt and a yearling filly--yet to race. She is kin to G1 Prix Jacques le Marois hero Al Wukair (Ire) (Dream Ahead).

Ballylinch Stud's Lope De Vega now has 46 winners from 86

runners (53%) in the U.S. His 11 U.S. stakes winners include four Grade I winners--Carl Spackler (Ire), Program Trading (GB), Newspaperofrecord (Ire) and Aunt Pearl (Ire). He stands for €175,000 in 2025.

### Third Time's The Charm For Dublin's Knight

Second in his first two starts at Gulfstream for Wells Watson and trainer Brendan Walsh, **Dublin's Knight (Ire)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) got the job done when switched to Keeneland on April 13 (video).

The Rosemont Stud-bred chestnut was picked up by Grove Stud for €180,000 out of the Goffs November Foal Sale in 2022, and was snapped up by Watson for €235,000 at the Goffs Orby Yearling Sale in 2023. Placed in the Listed UAE 1000 Guineas, Good Place (Street Cry {Ire}) has foaled seven offspring so far, of which Dublin's Knight is her fourth winner. Her latest is a filly by Starspangledbanner (Aus). The winner's female family traces to third dam Canny Lass (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}), a winner of the G1 Marlboro Cup, G1 Elders Mile, and G1 William Reid Stakes among others.

Dublin's Knight is the only colt to win in America for his sire, so far from three runners.

### Mehmas Filly Finds Minimum Trip To Her Liking

Brendan Walsh saddled **Miso Spicy (Fr)** (Mehmas {Ire}) to a 4 1/2-length tally at Gulfstream Park on April 12 (video). Bred by Haras d'Haspel, the bay is raced by Bridlewood Farm, e Five Racing Throughbreds and Michael Dubb.

The €70,000 Arqana October yearling was purchased by Mandore International Agency and was making her fourth start. Miso Spicy is the third foal and first winner for Exceed And Excel (Aus)'s Karishma (Ire). Second dam Karasiyra (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}) won the Listed Lenebane Stakes and was placed in the G3 Noblesse Stakes, while her half-sister Kirinda (Ire) (Tiger Hill {Ire}) was second in the G3 Kilboy Estate Stakes.

Tally-Ho Stud's Mehmas, priced at €70,000 this year, is responsible for 18 winners from 32 runners (56%) in the U.S. His seven American stakes winners (22%) are anchored by top-flight winners Going Global (Ire), Chez Pierre (Fr), and Magnum Force (Ire).

### **Bungle Colt Strikes At Gulfstream**

Trainer George Weaver's Insubordination (Ire) (Bungle Inthejungle {GB}) won his third career start at Gulfstream Park on April 12 (video). A silkbearer for Two Eight Racing, Berry Family Racing and Kaleta Racing, the 3-year-old was bred by Patrick Thompson.

Placed in two Saratoga starts last August, the son of the two-time winner Chabelita (GB) (Lawman {Fr}) was originally an €11,000 buy at the Goffs November Foal Sale by Q-Cross Stables. Sent back through the Goffs ring during Book 2 of the Orby Yearling Sale in 2023, he made €62,000 when selected by Legion Bloodstock. Out of a half-sister to multiple stakes winner In Front (Fr) (Intello {Ger}) and G3 Prix Noailles second More Than A Dream (Ire) (Halling), he is followed by a 2-year-old colt by Galileo Gold (GB).

Bungle Inthejungle has sired seven winners from 10 to race in America (70%). Manhattan Jungle (Ire) won the Listed Sweet Life Stakes. The 15-year-old stands for  $\in$ 7,500 at Rathasker Stud this term.

### **Repeat Winners**

Multiple Grade I winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Carl Spackler (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) returned to this column with a 4 1/4-length victory in the GI Maker's Mark Mile Stakes at Keeneland for e Five Racing Thoroughbreds and Chad Brown on April 11 (video).

Listed winner **No Nay Hudson (Ire)** (No Nay Never) also returned to Making Waves with a half-length tally at Keeneland on April 18 (video). He is raced by Andrew Farm and For The People Racing Stable and trained by Wesley Ward.

# NEPOTISM STAMPS STALLION CREDENTIALS IN CHAMPAGNE STAKES by Tom Baddock/TTR AusNZ

In a thrilling renewal of the A\$1-million G1 Champagne Stakes at Randwick on Saturday, the beautifully-bred **Nepotism (Aus)** (Brutal {NZ}) overcame a clear on-pace bias to score a barnstorming victory that not only confirmed his immense natural talent but also secured his future as a stallion prospect.

The son of Brutal (NZ) out of Brigite (Aus) (Casino Prince {Aus}), an unraced half-sister to champion Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}), was produced late by jockey Tyler Schiller in a performance that defied the pattern of the day. Settled near the tail of the field, Nepotism looked to have the task ahead of him turning for home as leaders dominated most of the program. But in the final furlong, the Team Hawkes-trained colt let down powerfully to score by a narrow but decisive 0.13l over a determined Within The Law (Aus) (Lucky Vega {Ire}), with Tupakara (Aus) (Trapeze Artist), another 0.05l away in third.

Having made his debut in the G2 Todman Stakes, where he flashed home for third, and then going one better in the G3 Baillieu Handicap on heavy ground, Nepotism's third-up win at Group 1 level confirmed what connections had suspected all along--that this is a colt of the highest quality. His Champagne Stakes success now sees him emerge as one of the standout 2-year-olds of the season.

Co-trainer Michael Hawkes was clearly elated after the win, his excitement palpable as he reflected on the colt's victory. "He's just a proper horse," Hawkes said. "We came around the corner and I thought 'is he going to get there?', but he has an exceptional turn-of-foot.

"Last to first, unbelievable. Neil Werrett and his partners, they've been so patient. His win in the Baillieu was outstanding. We just love making colts."

Co-trainer Wayne Hawkes was just as bold in his praise, acknowledging the colt's effort and what it means to the broader family legacy; "It's very hard for any horse to come from last but for a 2-year-old having his first racing prep, wow!

"He's a special colt and he's out of that special family – Black Caviar, All Too Hard, Ole Kirk – are all his dear relations. Gilgai have bred another one, haven't they!

"He's another stallion already done now, isn't he. Brutal won a Doncaster at his seventh race start, he's the youngest horse to win a Doncaster and this is his first progeny. It's like watching your own son out there."

### **Pedigree Notes**

Bred by Gilgai Farm and purchased with an eye toward continuing the legacy of his famous family, Nepotism was secured for A\$160,000 at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale by a syndicate headed by Neil Werrett, who campaigned the incomparable Black Caviar and has since remained a major player in sourcing and racing her progeny and close relations. Werrett also raced Nepotism's close relations and Group 1-winning stallions All Too Hard (Aus) and Ole Kirk (Aus), and the latest star to emerge under his silks looks poised to follow them to a stallion career.

Another unbeaten and unexposed type shows up here in **Pinatique**, a G1 Prix de Diane entry who hails from the distinguished family of Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Magic Wand (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). While she needs to up her game on her last-out win at Bordeaux-le-Bouscat in March, with her genetics and connections it is hard to say how far she can go at this stage. The debut course-and-distance winner **Rabbit's Foot** is interesting, being by the sprinter Golden Horde but endowed with stamina from the dam who has already produced last year's G2 Prix d'Harcourt scorer and G1 Prince of Wales's Stakes runner-up Zarakem (Fr) (Zarak {Fr}).
