



HILL ROAD OVERCOMES SLOW START TO WIN PETER PAN, STAMPS TICKET TO THE BELMONT

Closing relentlessly after a slow start, **Hill Road** (Quality Road) ran down the Rick Dutrow Jr. pair on the lead to win the GIII Peter Pan Stakes and stamp his ticket for a date with the final jewel of the Triple Crown in June.

First profiled by our colleagues in TDN Europe after a sparkling debut in Ireland for trainer Adrian Murray last year, which snagged him 'TDN Rising Star' honors, the connections stepped him up into elite company in mid-September when his next start came in the G1 Vincent O'Brien National Stakes at the Curragh. While it wasn't his day, he would finish seventh behind a salty field which included the likes of 'TDN Rising Star' GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Henri Matisse (Ire) (Wootton Bassett {GB}); G1SW-Ire Scorthy Champ (Ire) (Mehmas {Ire}); G1SP-Ire Seagulls Eleven (Ire) (Galileo Gold {GB}); and GSW-HK & GISP Aomori City (Fr) (Oasis Dream {Ire}). In his first start on the dirt track in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, he put forward a strong rally to snag third behind champion juvenile, 'Rising Star' MGISW Citizen Bull (Into Mischief) and GISW Gaming (Game Winner). ARKANSAS DERBY CHAMP SANDMAN ENTERS PREAKNESS FRAY

The winner of the GI Arkansas Derby and seventh place finisher in the GI Kentucky Derby, **Sandman** (Tapit--Distorted Music, by Distorted Humor) will enter next Saturday's GI Preakness Stakes at Pimlico, according to a press release sent out by 1/ST Racing.

Co-owned by D. J. Stable LLC, St. Elias Stable, West Point Thoroughbreds, CJ Stables and influencer Griffin Johnson, the 3-year-old has remained at Churchill Downs where he took a spin over the main track on Friday.

"We wanted to see how he came back. He's an extremely happy horse right now. It looks like the race might set up nice for him. It looks like there's a fair amount of speed," said trainer Mark Casse, who saddled eventual victor War of Will in 2019.

With those efforts under his belt, he was moved to the barn of Chad Brown for a 2025 campaign and ran a credible third in his first jump for the operation in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby behind Owen Almighty (Speightstown)--who recently ran fifth in the GI Kentucky Derby--and 'TDN Rising Star' MGISW Chancer McPatrick (McKinzie). He finished ahead of 'Rising Star' Patch Adams (Into Mischief) in that race, who decisively won an allowance on the Derby undercard, and GISP Filoso (City of Light).

Made the 2-1 second choice here, Hill Road wasn't the fastest off the blocks and was outkicked early by the speed to his outside. Captain Cook was intent on the lead and so he got it, rolling through :23.36, :47.26, and 1:11.57 splits as **McAfee** (Cloud Computing) eventually overtook **Vassimo** (Nyquist) to stalk him from second. Not in any rush to join the fray, Hill Road watched it all unfold near the rear of the field going up the backstretch and was asked to improve his position through the far bend. Four wide and with a full head of steam entering the lane, he set his sights on McAfee and Captain Cook as those two were locked in battle entering the final furlong. Up in time, Hill Road overhauled Thorpedo Anna's little brother for the win by three-quarters of a length as that one finally got the best of Captain Cook, who had to settle for third.

"I was concerned about the pace on paper, but a little bit of pace developed, and the horse ran great," said Chad Brown. "He wasn't out the back; he had a few horses beat early and then down the backside he seemed pretty tractable. He made a middle move and kind of moved up into a tight spot and paused and then came again."

"I know he didn't switch leads, so we have some work to do there." **Cont.**



"Flavien [Prat] had him running fairly straight the last part of the race, so that was good. It's something we can work with, and he [Prat] said it's something we can work on and isn't a big deal."

When asked about a start in the final jewel of the Triple Crown, the GI Belmont Stakes June 7, Brown said, "Absolutely. This horse really wants to go a mile and a quarter--we felt that after the Tampa race [3rd, GII Tampa Bay Derby]. Tyler Gaffalione rode him and was quite excited about the horse in the days after, checking in on him because he considered [Hill Road] as one of his Derby mounts and he wasn't quite sure who he wanted to go with. He was considering coming to the Wood, that's how much Tyler thought of him."

Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. was pleased with his duo but did believe that he had some figuring out to do with Captain Cook while his other runner, McAfee, put in a huge effort.

"They both ran big. There wasn't much other speed in the race, our horse [No. 8, Captain Cook] broke good and he was right there. Manny [Franco] could have sat off Irad [Ortiz, Jr., aboard No. 1, Vassimo] on the inside but I don't know that the outcome would have been any different."

"I can't complain about anything with the race. It looks like Captain Cook doesn't want to go quite this far with the better ones and McAfee ran huge. We need to find Captain Cook's best game. I'm not saying this might not be it at the end of the day, but he ran big."


Pedigree Notes:

Hill Road is the first winner for his dam--an Argentinian-campaigned, stakes-placed half-sister to MGISW City of Light (Quality Road). Exotic Notion has had back-to-back colts by Uncle Mo since this winner, a juvenile and a yearling, and is due to Practical Joke for 2025.

In addition to her supremely talented brother, who has become a strong sire in his second career, the dam is also a half-sister to Lough Derg (Lemon Drop Kid), who claims GSP Liam's Journey (Liam's Map) to her credit.

This is the immediate family of GISW Fabulously Fast (Deputy Minister), who produced French stakes-placed Humungosaur (GB) (Red Ransom), and her half-sister Paris Rose (Accelerator), the dam of GSW Decelerator (Dehere). Through that daughter, she's the granddam of GSW Stoltz (Aus) (More Than Ready) and MGSW & MG1SP-SAf Nafaayes (Aus) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}). Her line also yielded 2024 Australian Group-placed Hedged (Aus) (Capitalist {Aus}).



"I always quote Allen Jerkens, 'Run 'em when they're good,' and he's good right now. We were planning on waiting for the Belmont, but a lot of things can happen in between. He's telling us he's happy so we're going to go with it."

Casse continued, "I knew when he went by us the first time that we were in big trouble. He obviously wasn't handling the track very well, and you just don't know how that affects them late in the race. He made a middle run but did flatten out a little bit. I think War of Will ran seventh in the Derby and won the Preakness, so we're going with that."

Returning to the scene of his victory in last year's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic, LSU Stables' 'TDN Rising Star' Far Bridge stamped his authority on Saturday's GII Man o' War Stakes at Aqueduct, defeating his chief market rival Anglophile by a deceptively easy margin.

The prohibitive favorite was given a dig away from the stalls by Joel Rosario to open up his early options, but when longshot Decanter (Kitten's Joy) and Capture the Flag (Quality Road) elected to go on with it, Far Bridge was able to slot in from a midfield third to enjoy the shortest way around.

Continuing to stalk the top two in hand from a few lengths in arrears down the back of the track, Far Bridge was asked for an early run to take a gap at the fence four furlongs out and make the Man o' War a test of stamina. Held together on the swing for home as Anglophile was finding his best stride from the back, Far Bridge responded when asked, pinched a break and was never in danger as Anglophile closed inches to complete a middle-distance 1-2 for the late English Channel.

"Very tactical, short field. Joel [Rosario] rode a great race," said trainer Christophe Clement, winning the Man o' War for the first time since Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) successfully defended his title in 2010. "The plan was the two [horses] on the inside were slow and the speed was on the outside--work it out, field of five, it can't be that difficult. He did it, well done.

"To train, he has never been an issue, but in his races, he seems to be more mature [this year]. Going up the inside, he has the rail and if he has the rail to help him, he's always good. It's when he's in the middle of something [there can be an issue], but when he's on the rail, no problem."

Clement said that the GI Resorts World Casino Manhattan Stakes on the Belmont undercard at Saratoga June 7 would be next on the agenda for Far Bridge, who could be joined by stablemates Carson's Run (Cupid) and/or fellow 'Rising Star' Deterministic (Liam's Map).

Third to the late Measured Time (GB) (Frankel {GB}) in last year's Manhattan, Far Bridge was a disappointing ninth in the GII United Nations Stakes, then was enterprisingly ridden to make all the running en route to an 8-1 surprise in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational Stakes back at the Spa in August. Up by a half-length to defeat two-time defending champion War Like Goddess (English Channel) in last year's Turf Classic, the bay was ninth to Rebel's Romance (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and returned to action with a neck success in the 12-furlong GIII Pan American Stakes at Gulfstream Mar. 29.

Pedigree Notes:

The late English Channel has now sired the winners of three of the last six runnings of the Man o' War--Channel Maker in 2019 and Channel Cat in 2021. Far Bridge is one of just two winners from three to race from Fitpitcher, a granddaughter of the talented Pleasant Temper, whose 12 victories included a front-running score in the 1999 GIII Ballston Spa Breeders' Cup Handicap at Saratoga. Fitpitcher sadly passed away in 2021.

The cross of champion turf horses English Channel and Kitten's Joy has resulted in 35 individual winners, six of those at the black-type level, including the aforementioned Channel Cat and fellow graded stakes winners Spooky Channel, English Bee and Admiralty Pier. --ALC

JODY'S PRIDE RETURNS TO NEW YORK FOR RUFFIAN VICTORY

Having largely run on appointment only for the last three years, **Jody's Pride** (American Pharoah) stepped up gamely to return to the winner's circle in the GII Ruffian Stakes.

Grade I-placed as a juvenile when she missed winning the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies by a neck to Just F Y I (Justify), the daughter of the 2015 Triple Crown winner had not won a race since 2024 when she took home the Busher Invitational Stakes at this track by 2 1/4 lengths.

That field included names such as MSW Carmelina (Maximus Mischief); GSW Gin Gin (Hightail); MSW Aoife's Magic (Smarty Jones); GI Kentucky Oaks placed Regulatory Risk (Omaha Beach); and SP Princess Mayfair (West Coast). She kicked off her 2025 campaign Jan. 25 running third in the GII Inside Information Stakes at Gulfstream and finished fifth last out Mar. 8 at Oaklawn Park in the GII Azeri Stakes behind 2024 Horse of the Year MGISW Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna).

Sent away here at 7-1 odds, she recovered well after brief contact after the jump and was taken in hand early to race from midpack as the frontrunner clicked off:23.62,:46.40, and 1:10.43 splits. Racing in cover through the final bend, she made herself some running room passing the quarter pole and was on the march entering the lane. Taking the lead inside the furlong grounds, she safely kept **Sterling Silver** (Cupid) at bay on the wire as **My Mane Squeeze** (Audible) held on for third.

"Good trip. I was inside there for a little bit," said Joel Rosario. "I was enjoying when it opened up turning for home, but she looked like she wanted to be up there. She liked to fight and that showed at the end."

"She jumped really well and I could go to the lead, but [trainer] Jorge [Abreu] told me just sit second or third. I was just trying to play it out like he told me."

When asked about a next start for his filly, Abreu said, "I want to keep her one-turn, so probably the [seven-furlong, GII] Bed o' Roses at Saratoga [during the Belmont Stakes Racing Festival June 6].

Pedigree Notes:

The second winner for her dam, Jody's Pride is Jody's Song's only offspring to garner black-type of any kind. She has two full-brothers--unplaced 3-year-old Moreperfectunion and juvenile Democracy Defender. The mare did not produce a foal after a 2024 visit to Epicenter and has no breeding on record for 2025.

Jody's Song is a half-sister to MSW & GISP Make Mischief (Into Mischief) as well as SP Speightful Lily (Union Rags). Her full-sister Crescent Lady is the dam of MSP Surfside Moon (Malibu Moon). This is the immediate female family of MSW & MGSP Five Star Momma (Five Star Day).

SHISOSPICY STAYS PERFECT ON THE LAWN IN THE MAMZELLE by Alan Carasso

Morplay Racing's **'TDN Rising Star'** Shisospicy remained unbeaten in three starts in turf sprints, streaking away through the final sixteenth of a mile to post a decisive and impressive victory in Saturday's GIII Mamzelle Stakes at Churchill Downs, her first success at the graded level.

An all-the-way winner of the Limestone Stakes at Keeneland on Apr. 11, Shisospicy was one of the first to break the line, but Dreamaway (Flameaway), who ran on nicely to round out the exacta over ground that was still retaining some moisture after those heavy early-April rains in Fayette County, was ridden aggressively by Joe Bravo and outfooted the favorite to the front, covering the first couple of furlongs in :21.72 over this much sounder surface.

The gray filly was working hard to stay on top, with Shisospicy hounding her every move, and when Jose Ortiz said go, the response was instantaneous, as she widened at will to solidify her position at the top of this specialist division.

Kilwin, a good fourth after covering stacks of ground from the outside post in the Limestone, closed stoutly at the fence for second on Saturday, while Mechaya flew home down the center to round out the triple on her seasonal debut.

"In her last start the ground was soft and today the track was a lot better for her," said winning trainer Jose D'Angelo, who ruled out a shot at the G1 Commonwealth Cup at Royal Ascot. "In her last workout, I tried to relax her a little bit and close. She was able to do that today--relax and close hard. Our plan now is to go to Saratoga with her."

Added Morplay's Rich Mendez: "Our goal is always to have fun and this was a lot of fun. We knew after the Limestone we had a lot of confidence with her moving forward. She's run so well in all of her starts. Her performance today really solidified that."

Having graduated by better than 16 lengths on debut to earn 'Rising Star' honors at Gulfstream Park last October, Shisospicy was placed in the Nov. 30 Fern Creek Stakes at Churchill and in the Jan. 4 Mockingbird Stakes at Oaklawn before trying her hand on the turf. A wire-to-wire winner back at Gulfstream Feb. 5, she made all the running in the Limestone, holding off Dreamaway by a half-length, with a similar margin back to Abientot (Not This Time) in third. WHATCHATALKINABOUT FENDS OFF CHALLENGES ON ALL SIDES, TAKES JOHN A. NERUD

There come some lofty expectations when you win a six-furlong race by eight lengths and garner a 106 Beyer figure to start your year, but **Whatchatalkinabout** (Dialed In) proved they were warranted when he fought off simultaneous challenges to win the GIII John A. Nerud Stakes.

A stakes winner as a juvenile, he was gone over a year from that New York Breeders' Futurity and resurfaced last October to run second against optional claimers at this venue. He was denied by a neck Nov. 30 at that condition, but broke through last out Jan. 16 when he rolled away from the field to return to the winner's enclosure in style.

On the back of that effort, the betting public hammered him down to even-money favoritism and right from the jump, the race was on. Pushing along **Silver Slugger** (Cairo Prince) as they dueled through splits of :21.89, and four furlongs in :44.84, the pair was clear of the traffic when 2-1 second choice **Anarchist** (Distorted Humor) went wrong passing the half-mile marker. As that one was guided to the outside fence to be attended by the veterinary team, **Surveillance** (Constitution) had inched up through the bend to make it three in a line as they swung for home and the race was on. As they challenged him from both sides, Whatchatalkinabout refused to yield and got his head down on the bob over Silver Slugger on the rail. Surveillance was a neck back in third.

In regards to Anarchist, trainer Doug O'Neill released a statement which read, "Anarchist injured his right front while racing in the GIII John A Nerud Stakes today at Aqueduct. He will have surgery at Cornell Ruffian Equine Specialists tomorrow morning. Currently, the prognosis for a long and happy life off the racetrack is good." **Cont.**

The statement continued, "We are extremely grateful for Joel Rosario. He displayed incredible horsemanship in getting Anarchist pulled up so quickly. We also greatly appreciate the NYRA veterinary staff for their immediate response. We're grateful to Anarchist's owner Angelo Freda for always putting the health and safety of the horse, first."

"He's a good horse, talented," said trainer Wesley Ward. "He ran a gutsy race. I was proud of him. That horse on the inside [No. 2, Silver Slugger] ran a big one and also the grey horse on the outside [No. 4, Surveillance]--to be in the middle of those two and for him to gut through it really showed something."

"I was supposed to ride him last time and we scratched at the gate [Grade 3 Commonwealth on April 8 at Keeneland]," said jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. "He was much better at the gate. That helped, we broke so good, he put me right in the race, and after that I was closer than I thought, and I go from there."

"He was game at the end. He felt the outside horse [No. 4, Surveillance] and fought. Then the inside horse [No. 2, Silver Slugger] came back, and he fights back and by the time we hit the wire, he had his head in front. He was game, he was fighting."

Pedigree Notes:

Whatchatalkinabout is the most accomplished for his dam by far, and is Super Savvy's second multiple winner behind elder brother Prince James (Tiznow), who has 10 pictures on his wall. They have an unraced 3-year-old half-brother Super McKinzie (McKinzie) as well as a juvenile half-brother named Hamilton's Reason (Sharp Azteca). The mare, a daughter of GSW & GISP Don't Forget Gil (Kafwain), has a 2025 colt by Maxfield at foot.

Said second dam is not only placed at the elite level, but is a half-sister to a multiple Grade I winner as Sweet Reason (Street Sense) appears beneath the third dam as well.

That sister was purchased by Japanese interests and claims SW & MGSP-Jpn Diastima (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) as her first offspring. She has two active runners in 2025 as daughter Sympatheia (Jpn) (Lord Kanaloa {Jpn}) is on a four-race win streak and 3-year-old Ho O Atman (Jpn) (Duramente {Jpn}) recently ran fifth in a Group 3 contest.

This is the immediate female family of G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen victor Zenden (Fed Biz).

PREAKNESS UPDATES: RIVER THAMES BREEZES AT BELMONT, BRENDAN WALSH GREEN LIGHTS GOSGER

Breezing Saturday morning over the Belmont Park training track, 'TDN Rising Star' GISP River Thames (Maclean's Music) put in another half-mile move in advance of his anticipated start in the GI Preakness Stakes May 17 at Pimlico.

In company with MSP Trust Fund (Practical Joke), the New York-bred went a half-mile in :48.25 (9/37) with exercise rider Fernando Rivera in the irons. He began the work to the outside and just off of his workmate and ended it along the rail and at least a length in front. Trainer Todd Pletcher said he clocked the gallop out in 1:01 and 1:15, and was happy with what he saw from his charge.

"He went very well, in hand throughout," said Pletcher. "He put in a nice half-mile in 48 [seconds] and change. He galloped out around the turn strongly and looked good. They followed the instructions perfectly."

He continued, "We are happy with his condition. He has bounced out of the Blue Grass well. He has been training consistently here. He has put on a few pounds, so we are happy with the way he is coming into [The Preakness]."

River Thames will be looking to claim Pletcher's first victory in the middle jewel of the Triple Crown. The conditioner is a twotime Derby and four-time Belmont Stakes winner.

"I'd love to check that box, we will give it a try."

Gosger gets the Green Light for Preakness after Keeneland Work

Working in company with Godolphin's Paris Lily (City of Light), who is being pointed to Friday's GII Black-Eyed Susan Stakes, Gosger (Nyquist) and the filly breezed five furlongs in 1:00.60,

making the pair's move the fastest of 14 at the distance at Keeneland that morning. Carrying the colors of the late Harvey A. Clarke, the grey will attempt to collect his third straight win after he claimed the GIII Stonestreet Lexington Stakes Apr. 12 at the venue.

"He worked really well," Walsh said. "He worked good; so, we're a go. I think he's ready to take a step forward again off the last race."

Walsh will be trying for his first Preakness win with Gosger's entry.

Heart of Honor Set to Clear Quarantine Earlier, On Track Tuesday

G2 UAE Derby runner-up **Heart of Honor (GB)** (Honor A.P.) is now set to clear quarantine at Churchill Downs Sunday and will make his first appearance on track at Pimlico Tuesday after vanning over the day prior.

Trainer Jamie Osborne has earlier confirmed his daughter Saffie Osborne will have the Preakness mount. The elder Osborne has sent prior runners who competed in the UAE Derby to the States and enjoyed great success, but a win on the Triple Crown trail would be a first for Heart of Honor's connections.

MOMS IN HORSE RACING: SHAPING THE SPORT ON AND OFF THE TRACK

In a sport built on speed and stamina, the people behind the scenes rarely stop moving. And for the horsewomen who are also mothers, the pace is even demanding—but so is the purpose.

They're used to remarks like, "I don't know how you do it all," "Do you ever sleep?" and "You're like superwoman!"

"I'm definitely not superwoman," Tessa Walden responded when that last one was posed to her. "Being a stay-at-home mom is probably even harder than being a working mom. But I do think moms are kind of unsung heroes. I have a new respect for mine while I'm doing this, let's put it that way."

By "doing this," Walden means raising a 2-year-old son and a 6-month-old daughter with her husband, trainer Will Walden, while also working as an assistant for Brad Cox Racing Stable. She oversees tasks like nominations and payroll and helps out during morning training. Walden also runs her own digital consignment business, Evergreen Equine.

A younger version of herself never would have imagined being where she is now.

"I did not want to be a mom at all," Walden admitted. "All I wanted to do was ride horses. I felt like I wouldn't be able to do my job with kids. It's a struggle enough without kids, so I really didn't think it would be possible to have a family and do the job at the level I was doing it. Work has just always been really important to me."

Walden knows the reality that oftentimes the racing industry is less than accommodating for new moms, but looking back now, she considers herself lucky to have had a positive experience.

"I thought that if I had a child, I would be fired, literally," she said. "But that couldn't have been further from the truth."

Still, the transition came with challenges. Walden was back at the barn about a week after having her first child and she stayed in her full-time assistant role until the birth of her daughter last year. Her role has since shifted more toward the office, but she is still on the backside at Keeneland or Turfway Park most mornings, legging up a rider or watching breezes with her daughter Hailey tucked snug in her carrier.

Walden doesn't consider herself a role model, but she hopes that her story, along with others like hers, can serve as a source of inspiration.

"Being a mom in racing to me means creating an example for other women that they can do it," she said. "They can have a family and still be involved in the industry in whatever way they want."

Sophie Doyle had always assumed that motherhood would mark the end of her career as a jockey. She found out she was pregnant just two weeks after riding in the Breeders' Cup and struggled with the thought of stepping away at the peak of her career. But a few months after having her daughter Emilie, Doyle felt the pull of being back in the saddle and she started exercise riding for her husband Chris Davis.

Together, they managed to work out a schedule for Emilie's feeding and naps around morning sets.

Last year, Doyle had the chance to return to race riding. "It was nice to be able to come back and just enjoy it and have fun and have your daughter there on the sidelines cheering for you," explained Doyle. "It was something that I can't believe that I ever said I would never do. I don't know why I ever doubted myself."

Just this week, Doyle rode Chambourcin (Copper Bullet) to a maiden win at Churchill Downs for John Ennis, one of the trainers who encouraged her return to the saddle.

Oftentimes, Doyle and her daughter hang out in between races in the women's jock's room. Since Doyle usually has the space to herself, crayons and stuffed animals are scattered amongst jockey silks and riding crops.

While Emilie enjoys the racing scene now, Doyle admitted that there was an adjustment period for both mother and daughter when she picked up her tack again.

"With most jockeys being males, kids usually want their mom the majority of the time so it's okay when they take them away from their dad so they can go and take care of their job," said Doyle. "When you've got a daughter wanting her mom who has to go into their profession, I can tell you there were a few hairy moments in the Belterra paddock. It took a few months for her to understand that her mom needs to go and do her job right now, but she got into enjoying watching me go out and ride and cheering for me on the sideline. I remember one day I was in the starting gate at Belterra and I could hear Emilie saying, 'Go Mommy! Come on Mommy! You gotta win this!' I started getting teary-eyed and said to myself, 'Alright, you've gotta be a jockey now Mom.'"

Jordan Hattaway is the owner of Hattaway Farms, a full-service boarding facility that offers foaling, breaking, prepping and rehabbing, and she is also an exercise rider for Eddie Kenneally. Two years ago, she had her son Jude.

"At first my husband and I were like, 'How are we going to do all of this and have a baby?" she recalled. "But honestly, he kind of just fit into our lives. I'm not going to say it was seamless-there has been a lot of trial and error and a lot of having to get creative-- but I'm still able to do all the same things I was doing before, just with a little bundle of joy running around with me."

While Hattaway meets with the vet and checks on mares, Jude plays with his baby chicks. When she oversees an afternoon breaking session, her son hangs out with his pony Pongo or zooms around the indoor riding arena between sets.

"Ultimately I think that it's really fun to be able to bring your child around with you," she said. "I think watching a little boy love animals, love the farm and love the track and watching him have such a happy, fun childhood is really rewarding. Being able to be there with him for most of it is really cool."

Walden and Doyle often visit Hattaway at her farm, hanging out together as their children play in the green grass and open air. They say it's all part of the community that makes it work. Around every mother in racing is a web of support--fellow moms and horsewomen, barn friends, partners, mentors--who help make the impossible feel manageable.

"Yes, it's challenging," reflected Hattaway. "But it is so rewarding at the same time."

SORCERER'S SILVER UNDERGOES SUCCESSFUL SURGERY AT ROOD & RIDDLE

Sorcerer's Silver (Good Magic), a 3-year-old colt who suffered a sesamoid injury on the Kentucky Derby day undercard, is recovering from surgery at Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital, according to a story posted on the NBC Lexington affiliate website on Friday afternoon.

Pulled up by jockey Irad Ortiz, Jr. halfway through the third race, the dark bay trained by Dale Romans was transported to Rood & Riddle in Lexington.

"The problem with the sesamoid injury is, they don't show much," said Rood & Riddle's Dr. Larry Bramlage. "Sesamoids are the two little bones in the back of the horse's fetlock joint where when they move and up down, they're the bones that support their weight. They're sort of like our kneecaps only in reverse."

After a three-hour fusion surgery Monday, X-rays showed Sorcerer's Silver was doing well, even though his racing days are over.

"He's gonna live 25 years," Dr. Bramlage said.

Owned by West Point Thoroughbreds and Domeyko Taylor, the colt debuted a winner at Gulfstream Park Feb. 1 and then cleared an optional claimer over the same surface Mar. 27.

The Knights won the first heat of the three-race competition when Addy's Laddy TNT (Golden Lad) won the sixth race over Remembering Wilbur (Golden Lad), who was competing for Team Nashville Dreams. Minister for Magic (Malibu Moon), part of the Phoenix Mustangs roster, finished third.

The Dream would turn the tables in the seventh race when King's River (Irish War Cry) rallied late to win with the Knights finishing second via Kendama (Uncle Mo).

Prince Khozan (Khozan) for Team Philadelphia Stallions won the photo for third. Tied with one win and one second apiece, the Knights and the Dreams entered the final NTL race behind the betting favorite, who ultimately won the day for the Miami Thunderbolts. However, with the Knights' Boss Is a Pal (Street Boss) running second while Nashville's Monster Mason (Animal Kingdom) finished in eighth, the former claimed victory in the first league competition of the season.

Jockey Ismerio Villalobos was named the NTL MVP for winning the last two races in the competition aboard King's River and Cactus (Twirling Candy) in the eighth race.

The three NTL races, each worth \$75,000 in purse money,

featured 3-year-olds and upward who had started for a claiming price of \$8,000 or less in their last three starts or were offered for a claiming price range between \$12,500 and \$10,000. All ten teams entered one horse from their roster in each participating race. Teams competed for 3,000 points. The team with the most points on the day won the Pimlico Cup, and the team with the most points for the year wins the overall NTL Championship.



Stonestreet acquired dam Si Si Teguila (Yes It's True) for \$155,000 at Fasig-Tipton July in 2017 and campaigned her to a runner-up effort in the Glorious Song Stakes during her juvenile season. A half-sister to GII Best Pal Stakes winner and GI Del Mar Futurity third Run Away (Run Away and Hide), Si Si Tequila is also responsible for a 2-year-old Street Sense colt that Spendthrift purchased for \$375,000 at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga last summer. Klaravich, of course, campaigned Maclean's Music's GI Futurity Stakes victor Complexity. Repole Stable has had a fair bit of success with the offspring of Curlin and the Siena Farm-bred Be Real looks to open his account here from the rail as the 4-5 morning-line pick. A son of GII Forward Gal Stakes runner-up Island Saint (Speightstown) and a maternal grandson of GSW & GISP Prospective Saint (Saint Ballado), the \$300,000 KEESEP acquisition is a half-brother to SP Swiftsure (Uncle Mo). A winner of his first two starts in impressive fashion at Parx, Kentucky Outlaw stepped up to contest the Federico Tesio Stakes at Laurel last time out and ran fifth behind probable GI Preakness Stakes starter Pay Billy (Improbable) Apr. 19. Stepping back down in distance from the 1 1/8-mile trip at Laurel and adding the blinkers Saturday, the 9-5 favorite returned to his winning ways. Drawn outside, he was quickly into stride to sit a close-up third behind Dear Chairman (Spun to Run). Keen to go on with it, Kentucky Outlaw tugged his way down the backstretch before hitting the front around the far turn and sustaining his drive down the lane to earn his first stakes win.

"I'm happy," said winning trainer Felicia Dunn. "He ran like he did his first two races. He broke slowly, caught up with the field and then he just wanted to go. I think his last race was a little tough for him, plus he broke poorly and then got rushed. I'm hoping he will continue to get better with time. My husband (John) will decide where we go next. That way I can focus on the other six horses I have."

The 15th stakes winner for Outwork, Kentucky Outlaw is out of a half-sister to GSW Turnerloose (Nyquist). That first dam, Fend, sold for \$200,000 at KEENOV in 2022. She has since produced a 2-year-old Not This Time colt and a yearling Nyquist filly while she was barren this year to Olympiad.

Sandal's Song booked his ticket to the Royal Meeting and earned a \$25,000 voucher for the trip with a late-running score in the Palm Juvenile Stakes at Gulfstream Park on Saturday.

Making his debut as a 7-1 shot here the colt chased a pair of pacesetters up the backstretch in favorite Squire and Beers On Me (Catalina Cruiser). The chestnut tipped off the rail around the far turn with a three-wide move. Showing plenty of zip down the lane, the 2-year-old cleared inside the final furlong and earned his keep. Squire was the runner-up. The trainer of Sandal's Song, George Weaver, won the inaugural Royal Palm Juvenile with No Nay Mets (Ire) (No Nay Never) in 2023.

"He [Sandal's Song] was able to get up in a nice position before they hit the turn," said Weaver. "I don't really hone on my first time starters. He'd done enough. I knew he was fast. Good horses go out there and do what they're supposed to do. I never worked him on the grass, but he had some turf in his pedigree. If he comes out of this race well I'd like to take him there [Ascot]. I see no reason not to. I feel comfortable he's the caliber who should go if he's doing well."

The second to the races for his dam, the winner's older half-sister is filly in-training Flip Flops (War of Will), who also got her picture taken at two. Herself a half-sister to MGISP Qurbaan (Speightstown) and UAE group stakes hero Qareeb (Speightstown), Sandal is responsible for a yearling colt by Omaha Beach and she foaled a colt by War of Will Apr. 10. "Luis loved her from the day he rode her at Keeneland. He said he wanted to ride her at Ascot and I said, 'Easy, we have to do one stop at Gulfstream first,'" said winning trainer Patrick Biancone. "She's a machine. She's very relaxed. She traveled to Keeneland, it was bad weather. She shed-rowed two days, jogged one day and ran like a monster. The plan all along was to get to Ascot. That's why so many partners joined in for that trip."

Saez added: "She's a very nice filly. She broke from there well [and] put herself in a good position. At the top of the stretch she was a little green first time on turf, but she's got a lot of ability. I had a lot of horse at the end. I was pretty confident after I rode at Keeneland. She won that race very professionally. I had a lot of horse left that day, too. Now I'm looking forward to going to Ascot. That's why we came here today."

Lennilu is one of two early season winners and the first stakes winner for her freshman sire Leinster (Majestic Warrior), who set the course record over 5 1/2 furlongs on the Keeneland turf when taking the 2020 GII Shakertown Stakes. Lulu's Pom Pom was bred to Magic On Tap for this term.

Out of Date With Destiny, the only foal that the chronically subfertile George Washington sired, the Night Of Thunder colt was picked up by Farrell for 90,000gns at Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale.

Speaking of the monumental profit, he said, "It's the stuff of dreams. Will I ever sell a horse for that sort of money ever again? Probably not."

He added, "You just never know if it's all going to happen but it has and Anthony Stroud turned up on behalf of Godolphin, and Coolmore were very strong as underbidders, so a big thanks goes to the buyers. I can't believe it. It's just amazing stuff and I'd like to thank the whole team around me.

"He was just a very nice yearling. We never imagined that we'd be able to afford him to be honest. It's worked out. The stallion is exceptional--he couldn't be going any better. They all breeze very fast and obviously go on to be very good racehorses as well." Cont. p3

Only Willie Browne had a better day at the office than Farrell. The latter, who is based in Kildare, cleared a whopping $\[\in \]$ 2.8 million for six horses sold and enjoyed major profit with a Gun Runner colt that went the way of Justin Casse for $\[\in \]$ 450,000 and a Harry Angel filly that sold to Highclere for $\[\in \]$ 230,000. They were sourced for \$145,000 and 45,000gns respectively.

As for Stroud, who held off the persistent challenge of Coolmore to sign the winning docket on the top lot, he commented, "The really good horses like him, and others, that's what people are focusing on. The valuations at times can be difficult but, if you really like one, you've got to go for it."

The Night Of Thunder colt led home what was another record-breaking trade at a breeze-up sale. Turnover climbed 24% to \le 27,444,500 while the average was also on the rise by a massive 21% to \le 201,798 and the median by 20% to \le 120,000. The clearance rate also rested at an extremely healthy 87%.

Williamson Does It Again

It was very much a case of that man again early in the session after Norman Williamson, who sold recent 2,000 Guineas winner Ruling Court at this breeze-up sale 12 months ago, set the tempo when his Maxfield colt went the way of Godolphin for a cool €1 million.

It proved to be another shrewd piece of business for the man behind Oak Tree Farm given that he sourced the colt at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale for just \$70,000 last year. Anthony Stroud, who signed for lot 5 on behalf of Godolphin, confirmed that the colt would be trained by Charlie Appleby.

A delighted Williamson said, "I wasn't expecting a result like that but he is a beautiful horse. Everybody who saw him absolutely loved him and the sire has been selling so well in America."

Asked how he managed to buy the Maxfield colt for just \$70,000 at Keeneland, Williamson quipped, "That's our job, isn't it? I bought him with a view towards him being an early two-year-old because he was strong but he wasn't very big. Come Christmas, he just transformed. He grew and looked like a totally different horse. You need a bit of luck."

It proved to be another profitable trip to sunny Deauville for Williamson who cleared €1.84 million on four horses sold on the day. On the buying front, it was nothing short of a dominant performance from Stroud at the top end of the market. And was it any surprise? The leading bloodstock agent added a second Classic winner sourced from the breeze-ups to his CV when Ruling Court followed on from Native Trail and he summed up the past week as being "fantastic".

He commented, "It was great for Norman and great for the breeze-ups. It was also excellent for Coolmore with Ruling Court being by Justify. Very good for Godolphin, also."

Glending Rings the Million Bell

Roderic Kavanagh and Cormac O'Flynn have wasted no time in ensuring that the name of their Glending Stables has been in lights from the early days of their consigning business.

Vandeek--now a stallion at Cheveley Park Stud--was the first to advertise their pinhooking and pre-training talents when topping the Tattersalls Craven Sale two years ago before going on to win the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park Stakes. At Goffs UK recently they pulled off another triumph when selling a Too Darn Hot filly for £320,000 after giving 35,000gns for her as a yearling.

But that paled into insignificance alongside Saturday's sale of a Sioux Nation filly (lot 25) from the family of dual Listed winner Bahia Breeze for €1 million--a staggering mark-up from her yearling price at the V.2 sale at Arqana last autumn of €48,000.

Kavanagh and O'Flynn, in the company of their partners Teresa Magalhaes and Serena O'Flynn, both of whom play key roles in the operation, stood transfixed ringside as the filly's price soared way beyond expectations. Anthony Stroud, acting on behalf of KHK Racing, had the final bid after a lengthy duel with an online bidder.

Stroud was not impressed by the tardy bidding process, with an online bidder pushing up the price in €10,000 increments. He said, "I don't know how long it went on for but bidding in

increments of €10,000 when the horse has gone beyond half a million slows the whole thing down. I think it probably needs to be reviewed. It's hard for the auctioneer but it's also very hard when you have somebody on the other end of the telephone and they don't really understand how it is going up in increments of €10,000. It slows the whole auction up, too. Who knows who you are bidding against when it is online but I happened to know who I was bidding against."

He added, "That is some sort of satisfaction. We bought Vandeek from this vendor. This filly did a very good time and looked very well."

After the hammer eventually fell, a stunned Kavanagh said, "The top of the market is so fruitful. They want a premium product and she is--hopefully she will go on to be one. It was amazing. You couldn't in your wildest dreams predict that."

O'Flynn added, "The ticker was going some. We may have looked cool on the outside but on the inside we were bubbling. Anthony Stroud has bought a good few from us in recent years and we can't thank him and his clients enough, not just for supporting us but for the whole industry. It keeps us all going for the rest of the year." Cont. p5

Blandford's Brown Comes Away With Nine Horses Despite 'Frustrating' Day

Richard Brown admitted to feeling the frustration about not being able to rival Anthony Stroud at the very top of the market despite the fact the Blandford Bloodstock agent left Arqana with nine juveniles sourced for various different clients.

But the one Brown was really waiting on was Tally-Ho Stud's Mitole half-sister to Royal Ascot hero Valiant Force (lot 185) on which the hammer fell at \le 800,000.

Brown said, "It has been a very frustrating day but this has made it. The market has been extremely strong. We have been on what we perceive to be the best horses here but it has been tough. It has been extraordinary trade but she was the one. She makes the difference. I just think she is a beautiful filly. An outstanding athlete.

"The vendor and I disagree on whether she is mature or needs time. She's a big filly and, the more I look at her the more I come around to his [Roger O'Callaghan's] way of thinking in that she is big and mature. We will get her back and she'll get some time off before we figure out if we shoot for Ascot or not. The nice

thing is, if we shoot for Ascot, she's a big filly. We won't put any pressure on her."

He added, "We have bought nine horses today. I shouldn't moan but it has been frustrating. I think there is more depth to the market than normal. I had a couple smaller orders at the Guineas Sale last week but I got blown out. I filled those orders earlier today instead. This is an elite, select sale but, like everything, I am sure there are guys who have had tough days and I feel for them. It's hard when you have had a tough day and all of this is going on around you. But you can't say anything other than it was a pretty extraordinary breeze-up season. The top has never been healthier."

Breeze-up King--or Pope--Bags Second Seven-Figure Sale of Season

Willie Browne is widely known as the breeze-up king but French bloodstock agent Laurent Benoit christened him the new Pope of the breeze-up game and, you know what, it might just stick. The legend behind Mocklershill sold his second seven-figure lot of the season when his Siyouni colt was knocked down to Coolmore's MV Magnier for €1 million.

Showering the colt with praise, Browne said, "I have consigned a lot of horses down through the years but I don't think I have consigned a better-looking horse. If you were any kind of a connoisseur of a horse, for me, he was nearly the perfect kind of horse. I was hoping that he'd gallop well and he did. I think he's worth it. I do. I loved the horse. When you get that kind of money you want them to be good and I'm assuming he'll go to Aidan [O'Brien]."

Browne also sold an Acclamation colt for 1.4 million gns at the Craven Breeze-Up Sale last month and, speaking on the market, he said, "Well it's very time-related. I haven't been watching it too closely today but they tell me there are still some soft patches. Luckily enough, I've sold every horse I brought here bar one. But as I said before, you need a fast horse."

Americans in Action

President Trump's announcement--and subsequent partial climbdown--on trade tariffs had cast some uncertainty over the participation of American buyers at the breeze-up sales but there was still some evidence of support from across the Atlantic at Argana.

Agent Kerri Radcliffe has long had strong links with American buyers and she signed for lot 118, a colt by Justify, at €725,000 on behalf of an Memo Racing, a new hedge fund-backed partnership. He will be returning to his place of birth, where the half-brother to three black-type runners had originally been bought at Keeneland by Eddie O'Leary and Mags O'Toole for \$150,000.

"He's by Justify, so it doesn't get much better, and he'll go to America, Radcliffe said. "I don't know who's going to train him yet but we'll figure that one out as we go along. He's got a great pedigree and is a gorgeous horse, and we all know what happened with a Justify from this sale last weekend."

On a memorable day for Cormac Farrell, his CF Bloodstock draft sold a Gun Runner half-brother to two Grade III winners, including the Tampa Bay Derby runner-up Sole Volante, to Justin Casse for €450,000. With yet more equine arimiles being clocked up, he too will be returning to America.

Major owner-breeder Mike Repole, one of the stars of Netflix's Race for the Crown, is another regular American buyer at Arqana, and he was back on the scoresheet on Saturday as the purchaser of lot 105. Sherborne Lodge's filly by Sioux Nation, from the further family of Lady Carla, was knocked down at €145,000, having been a 24,000gns Tattersalls Somerville yearling.

Repole later picked up lot 135, a Siyouni filly out of a half-sister to Group 1 winner Feed The Flame, for €200,000 through Alex Solis and Jason Litt.

Ramiro Restrepo's Marquee Bloodstock was also active and bought the Wootton Bassett (GB) half-sister to Group 2 winners Royal Dornoch and Hawksmoor for €280,000. The filly, however, represented the stark contrast of returns in the breeze-up sector as she had been signed for last August by trainer Satoshi Kobayashi for €360,000.

'Doing Right by the Horse' Leaves O'Callaghans In Clover

The sale of Yeomanstown Stud's Blue Point colt to Anthony Stroud on behalf of KHK Racing for €900,000 proved a timely reminder of all the hoops these horses must jump through. Initially bought as a foal for 170,000gns to pinhook as a yearling, the Blue Point colt missed his engagement at Book 1 of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale for whatever reason.

The O'Callaghan family at Yeomanstown Stud have a thriving stud business, are masters of the pinhooking craft, breeze horses and even have some in training. In short, they turn their hand to everything. And in this instance, being able to stand back and do right by the colt paid off in the long run.

David O'Callaghan said, "He is a great horse by a top stallion and he breezed very well. He was very well-liked by everyone on the sales ground and had a lot of admirers. I am glad that Anthony Stroud bought him and he is going to Roger Varian who will do a very good job with him. We bought him as a foal from Michael Gaffney and brought him back to Book 1 but had to withdraw him there. We decided that we'd bring him back here and he has been very straightforward ever since."

He added, "We're in the horse business. We're horse traders and do whatever we have to do in order to do right by the horses. We are fortunate to be able to do several different pieces. He actually made what I thought he would make and I even felt he had a chance of breaking the million-euro mark, which you don't say too often. All the right people were lining up and, even if the top three buyers didn't turn up, there were plenty of others just below that."

Talking Points

■ Bloodstock agent Alessandro Marconi, who sourced Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Metropolitan as a yearling, has been an increasingly active figure at the breeze-up sales in Europe this season and struck for the Brown Island Stables-consigned New Bay filly for €450,000. The New Bay filly put in one of the most impressive breezes and hails from the family of Classic winner Ervedya.

- Brighton & Hove Albion footballer Georginio Rutter continues to be a regular face at bloodstock sales across Europe. Having been spotted at Goffs UK last year, he was at Arqana on Saturday alongside Xavier Blanchet. The French native has the four-time winner Quasar in training with Blanchet and is also a partner in Nuit De Gala, a winner from the first crop of Without Parole who is in training with Jean-Claude Rouget.
- Proof that two Eds are better than one came in the sale late in the day of lot 193 for €820,000. Ed Sackville conducted the bidding on behalf of an existing client of Ed Walker, and the huddle of people let out a collective whoop when the hammer fell in their favour. Sold by Roger Marley's Church Farm Stables, the daughter of Wootton Bassett is out of the Australian Group 3 winner Zargos (Shamardal). She had been bought for €125,000 in the same ring last August by Grove Stud.
- A total of 13 horses sold for €500,000 or more compared to six last year. Meanwhile, the four seven-figure lots that sold on Saturday brings the total number of millionaires this breeze-up season to seven.

Thought for the Day

Anthony Stroud was rightly peeved after signing for the $\[\in \]$ 1 million Sioux Nation filly after the underbidder, who was playing online, was able to place bids in increments of $\[\in \]$ 10,000 despite the fact the filly was rocking and rolling at six figures. Lest we forget that the same thing happened when Yulong bought Place Du Carrousel at the December Mares Sale here in 2023 for the unusual sum of $\[\in \]$ 4,025,000 after the filly had been in the ring for a yawning amount of time. It's a glitch in the system that needs to be changed. There's no way an online bidder should be allowed to go up in tens of thousands when a horse is making a certain figure in the ring when that same privilege is not afforded to bidders in the ring.

Astounding and last year's juvenile Group 1 winners Camille Pissarro and Twain. "He was never away and that's the first time he's come off the bridle," said Aidan O'Brien. "You can see his size and power and we're delighted with him. He learned a bit today, Ger Lyons's horse [Evening Blues] had a very good run the first day, and we'll see where he fits in. We always thought he was a [G2] Coventry horse and you'd like to get another run into him before [Royal] Ascot."

Albert Einstein, whose yearling full-brother died last year, is the first foal produced by G2 Airlie Stud Stakes runner-up Yet (War Front), herself a half-sister to G3 Ballylinch Stud 2000 Guineas Trial third Carracci (Quality Road) out of the dual Group 3-placed Butterflies (Galileo). Butterflies is one of eight black-type performers thrown by dual Grade II and multiple Grade III-winning matriarch Mariah's Storm (Rahy) headed by multiple Group 1-winning sire Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat). Mariah's Storm is also the ancestress of elite-level winners Gleneagles (Galileo), Happily (Galileo), Marvellous (Galileo), Joan Of Arc (Galileo), Decorated Knight (Galileo) and Above The Curve (American Pharoah). Yet was bred to Justify last year.

GREAT GENERATION DOUBLES UP IN THE CHARTWELL By Tom Frary

Twelve months on from her breakthrough moment in Lingfield's G3 Chartwell Fillies' Stakes, Holy Roman Emperor's **Great Generation** returned to the scene to record back-to-back successes under a three-pound penalty. Acquired by Cayton Park Stud following her win in Doncaster's G3 Sceptre Fillies' Stakes in September, the Marco Botti-trained 11-2 shot was reserved in rear early by Marco Ghiani and delivered with perfect timing to overhaul Jabaara in the final yards for a neck verdict.

"This is the ground she wants--the plan was to take our time, as she really has that final burst and final turn of foot," Botti said. "She tries very hard, but she will come on for this race hopefully. It could be a possibility to drop her back to six furlongs, but let's see how she comes out of it and then regroup. With fillies from three to four, you like to see them strengthen up and she has definitely got stronger."

"I keep saying one race that would suit her is the July Cup, as the stiff finish at the July Course will suit her down to the ground," he added.

"I would love to run her there, but there is Ascot as well. There are a few options over seven furlongs for her in August at York and there is also the Hungerford Stakes."

Ballydoyle's form in the Classic trials maintained its formidable momentum on Saturday with a one-two in the Listed Lingfield Derby Trial. At the line, the 4-5 favourite and Ryan Moore's pick Puppet Master had a short head to spare over Stay True in the extended 11-furlong contest, with neither stablemate giving an inch.

Camelot's Puppet Master, who had been fourth in the G2 Royal Lodge Stakes and in the G3 Ballysax Stakes on his return, had been forced to battle his way past Stay True, one of the last crop of Galileo, inside the last two furlongs as they pulled 3 1/2 lengths clear of Ghaiyyath's **Nightime Dancer**.

Paul Smith was on hand to give the lowdown. "They are two lovely horses that hit the line hard, so they get the trip well," he said. "Puppet Master relaxed well. He is quite an uncomplicated horse and Ryan was very happy with him.

"As for the other one, he is in the mix for the big races going forward. We will see what happens in Ireland on Sunday and with The Lion In Winter at York. There are other possibilities like the Irish Derby and races at Royal Ascot, so we can spread them around."

"Richard [Kingscote] was very happy with Stay True," he added. "He is still a big baby and that was only his second run so he will come on a lot for it. He hit the line very well and he will get a trip nicely so all routes point for a Derby for him as well."

Puppet Master's dam is Dark Angel's triple Group 3 winner Realtra, whose half-sister Starlite Sienna was responsible for El Kabeir's G1 Fillies' Mile third Bright Diamond and the stable's promising juvenile Neolithic by Sioux Nation. From the family of the G1 Racing Post Trophy hero Seattle Rhyme, her 2-year-old full-sister to the winner is named Emmeleia while she also has a yearling colt by Baaeed who was a 270,000gns purchase by Yeomanstown Stud at the Tattersalls December Foal Sale.

With just two overmatched rivals in opposition, Aidan O'Brien trainee Giselle's superior form and class told as the daughter of Frankel overcame Lingfield's Epsom-style intricacies, delivering a facile nine-length success in the track's William Hill-sponsored Listed Oaks Trial on Saturday.

Last term's G3 Staffordstown Stud Stakes third and 3-10 pick was a shade keen racing third in a first-time hood through the initial stages of this seasonal debut. Negotiating the downhill section and taking closer order in the home straight, she seized control approaching the quarter-mile marker and bounded clear thereafter to easily outclass Harpsichord (Ribchester) by daylight for a career high. O'Brien's two previous winners of the contest include subsequent G1 Irish Oaks and G1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine Seventh Heaven (Galileo).

"I was afraid she'd be too keen, because she had been keen, and it was a good experience for her," said O'Brien. "I don't know what was in her head this year when she started back, she was just very on the bridle and, hopefully, that will settle her."

Coolmore's Kevin Buckley added, "Ryan [Moore] said she was a little unsettled for a time and was keen enough, but she got the job done nicely. We put the hood on her for the first time, which was okay considering they went steady. She has a fantastic pedigree and we have a lot to look forward to."

Giselle, who becomes the 155th stakes winner for her sire, is the first foal out of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf and GI Just A Game Stakes heroine Newspaperoftherecord (Lope De Vega), whose Group 3-winning dam Sunday Times (Holy Roman Emperor) ran second in the G1 Cheveley Park Stakes. Sunday Times, who is also the dam of Listed Cecil Frail Stakes winner Classical Times (Lawman (Fr)), is kin to Listed Bosra Sham Fillies' Stakes runner-up Question Times (Shamardal), herself the dam of three black-type winners headed by Camelot's G1 Irish Derby hero Latrobe and multiple Group 1-placed Listed Salsabil Stakes victrix Pink Dogwood. The April-foaled bay's third dam Forever Times (So Factual) is a half-sister to multiple Group-winning dual G1 Prix de la Foret runner-up Welsh Emperor (Emperor Jones), the stakes-winning Majestic Times (Bluebird) and the Group 3placed Brave Prospector (Oasis Dream). Newspaperoftherecord, who was bred to Justify last year, has the winner's 2-year-old full-brother Benvenuto Cellini and a yearling full-sister to come.

Successful in Newmarket's G3 Tattersalls Stakes and runner-up in the G1 Dewhurst Stakes at two, Alyanaabi may have been under-performing a touch in his four starts last term despite finishing fifth in the G1 2,000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace Stakes. RESERVE BANK STEPS UP TO PLATE IN THE GOODWOOD By Kit Gow/TTR AusNZ

Reserve Bank (Capitalist) may have been the baby of the field, but there is no doubting his ability now as the three-year-old colt made it three stakes wins in a row on Saturday when causing an upset in the G1 The Goodwood. Winning the Listed Redelva Stakes, followed by the G3 Tobin Stakes a fortnight ago, the Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr-trained colt was only at start number nine when lining up at Morphettville.

He swiftly justified his place in an elite field when rocketing home under Jamie Melham from the back to score by a length and three-quarters from local galloper **Sir Sway** (Sir Prancealot), with ante-post favourite **Giga Kick** (Scissor Kick) a whisker away in third. Melham was claiming back-to-back Goodwoods, having guided Benedetta (Hellbent) to Group 1 glory in her home state last year.

"Nothing went to plan," she said. "He reared out the gates, missed the start, but I just got a dream run. Giga Kick was on our outside, and I thought if I drag back now and get on his backside, he's going to be too sharp, so we just rode for luck.

"The gaps came and I was just a passenger. Mick's [Price] got this horse absolutely flying. That was a very impressive win."

"I was a bit concerned in the run, where he was," said Price. "I did say to her [Melham], 'He's a nice flow-along sort of horse, he doesn't like the mixed messages and don't drag him back'. But thankfully they ran along and he was allowed to use his big stride late and he took off." Cont. p16

"He just needs a bit of room," Price added. "As the race worked out, you know, it was probably a good spot for him to be. There was a bit of argy-bargy going on up in front, wasn't there? He's a lovely colt and he's won a Group 1. Fantastic."

Pedigree Notes

A \$410,000 Inglis Melbourne Premier Sale purchase for his trainers, Reserve Bank is the second Group 1 winner for his Newgate Farm-based sire Capitalist, who will stand for A\$44,000 (inc GST) this season. He is also the first three-year-old colt this season to capture a Group 1 in open company. He is the first stakes winner from Our Songbird (Fastnet Rock), who visited Capitalist again in the spring. She is a half-sister to the Listed winners Corsaire (Anabaa) and Debonairly (Snitzel).

Yulong Investments share in the ownership of Reserve Bank. Possibly, in the future, he could be one to carry on the sire line of Written Tycoon, being a grandson of Yulong Stud's outstanding sire.

Ballydoyle look to get off the mark in the 2025 Classics and will be buoyed by the news on Friday that Henri Matisse has received a highly favourable draw in six for this turning test. Kept back for this following his success in the G3 Ballylinch Stud Red Rocks Stakes in March, the experienced son of Immortal Verse has all boxes ticked with Ryan Moore on board despite the presence of last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner Camille Pissarro. Drawn in 15, that stablemate will have to navigate the crowd to overcome a terrible post position, but at least he is a hold-up merchant and Christophe Soumillon clicked on him here on Arc day. Another Irish challenger to do well in the draw is the G1 Futurity Trophy and G2 Beresford Stakes winner Hotazhell, but he has a length to find on Henri Matisse on their G2 Futurity Stakes meeting last summer and will need to be sharp to win this on his seasonal bow. First and second in the course-and-distance G3 Prix de Fontainebleau, Ridari and Sahlan have fared contrastingly with the draw and that has probably killed the chance of the latter, while Juddmonte's G3 Greenham Stakes winner Jonquil has a tricky stall in 12 so Oisin Murphy will be in full analysis mode in the lead-up. Francis-Henri Graffard has the draw gods to thank for the mercy shown to his star duo Zarigana and Mandanaba and their showdown greatly enhances this renewal. Preference is for the former, who bids to erase the memory of her painful course-and-distance defeat in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac on Arc day with her stablemate perhaps more one for the Diane next month. Better Together represents the G3 Prix Imprudence form and she will love this mile, while the main Ballydoyle hopes Exactly and Bedtime Story are fascinating contenders. Exactly was bang there with Zarigana at the end of the Marcel Boussac and could just have improved more, while the latter was only fifth there as she staged a meek retreat into the shadows having looked champion material earlier in the season. Few will ever forget her sensational Royal Ascot display last June, when the thought of Ryan Moore not even choosing her for a Pouliches would have been unimaginable and from stall nine she will be hunted around by Colin Keane in what could be the start of a process of re-education. Outside Godspeed is not out of things, having impressed with her effort behind Zarigana in the G3 Prix de la Grotte, while Ollie Sangster looks to get heavily involved in a second fillies' Classic in the space of eight days with the classy Celestial Orbit. Closely matched with the favourite on last year's formlines, the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner is joined by fellow Westerberg colour-bearer **Acapulco Bay**, an intriguing back-up for Ballydoyle who we haven't seen anywhere near the best of yet.
