The Week in Review, by T.D. Thornton

The GI Kentucky Derby has long been billed as the most exciting two minutes in sports. After a series of lawsuits involving America's signature horse race over the last six years, it might be more precise to start referring to it as the most litigated two minutes in sports. The week between the first two legs of this year's Triple Crown began with the connections of Derby winner **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) opting out of the GI Preakness Stakes based on the assessment by trainer Bill Mott and owner/breeder Godolphin that skipping Saturday's race in Baltimore would be in the colt's best interest. Rather than wheel back two weeks after the Derby, Sovereignty will now be pointed for the June 7 GI Belmont Stakes at Saratoga.

After several days of re-ignited public debate about whether the Triple Crown race spacing needs to be adjusted to meet the modern "less is more" template for training top-level Thoroughbreds, the week closed with the news that Sovereignty's jockey, Junior Alvarado, is facing a \$62,000 fine and two-day suspension for allegedly violating the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA) rule for using his whip two times above the six-strike limit when winning the Derby.

Delivered via late-day Friday news dump in the form of a ruling posted to the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation (KHRGC) website, chief state steward Barbara Borden, state steward Brooks "Butch" Becraft, and Churchill Downs steward Tyler Picklesimer signed off on the penalties. *Cont. p3*

JOURNALISM CONFIRMED FOR PREAKNESS

The rule infraction is HISA-based, but the local stewards are in charge of interpreting and reporting purported violations of it.

Because news had broken earlier in the week that Alvarado had been asked to appear at a Thursday stewards' hearing to discuss his Derby whip use, the ruling wasn't a complete shock.

But what was unexpected was the severity of the penalty. Because of a previous one-strike-over-the-limit whip infraction that Alvarado had incurred within the past 180 days (on Dec. 1, 2024, while, coincidentally, also winning a race for Mott at Churchill), HISA Rule 2283 (c)(1) mandated the doubling of what otherwise would have been a \$31,000 financial hit (10% of the winning purse) and a one-day suspension.

The super-sized fine is believed to be the second-largest monetary penalty ever imposed on a United States jockey.

Put another way, that's three strikes over the limit (within five months on two different mounts) and you're out \$62,000.

Alvarado is considering an appeal. "As everybody can see, it's unfair the penalties we're facing," he told *Daily Racing Form*'s Dave Grening Saturday.

So where exactly does Alvarado's \$62,000 fine stand compared to recent penalizations of jockeys?

The highest financial penalty handed down to an American jockey is believed to be the \$100,000 fine (and five-year suspension) imposed upon the late Roman Chapa by the Texas Racing Commission after a finish-line photograph showed him holding an illegal electrical horse shocking device while winning a stakes race at Sam Houston Race Park in 2015.


On the lower end of the scale--but for an act that most racetrackers would consider far more egregious than hitting a horse eight times in a race--contrast that penalty to the \$100 fine that the stewards at Mountaineer Park imposed upon jockey Jose A. Leon in 2023 after multiple licensees testified that Leon dismounted from an unruly horse and intentionally struck it across the face with his whip during morning training.

Alvarado further told Grening that--like most rational people who are averse to long, drawn-out processes involving lawyers, but also want to fight for what they believe in--"I would like to just get it over with and put it behind me. I don't want to carry this one extra day, but at the same time I don't want to give up that easily like they were right."

Past performances suggest that Alvarado's appeal process is likely to take quite a while to play out.

He can first contest his HISA charges before an internal adjudication panel. A secondary step would be to appeal to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC). A third option might be litigation in the court system.

Every year since 2019, there have been lawsuits in the pipeline related to several Kentucky Derby outcomes.



The connections of Maximum Security unsuccessfully tried to sue the Kentucky racing commission that year over an in-race foul disqualification in a case that lingered in the courts until 2020.

The 2021 Derby yielded the medication-related disqualification of Medina Spirit, and trainer Bob Baffert's subsequent banishment by Churchill Downs and his penalization by the Kentucky commission spawned a three-year series of largely fruitless legal actions that lasted until just before the 2024 Derby.

The prediction here is that Alvarado's case will at least make it to the FTC appeal level.

If it does, his odds of success will get a significant boost if the case gets assigned to chief administrative law judge D. Michael Chappell, who has already twice ruled in favor of a single jockey, the New Mexico-based jockey Oscar Ceballos, the only rider so far to have HISA penalties related to a more-than-six-strikes whipping violation wiped off his record.

Ceballos's two cases dating from 2022 and 2024 (11 total strikes in each instance) were different in that he argued (and the administrative law judge agreed) that the over-the-limit hits were used for safety or to control a dangerous situation.

Alvarado, by contrast, indicated in several published interviews last week that some of his striking motions with the whip never even made contact with Sovereignty, and that those actions were meant to encourage the colt without actually hitting him.

HISA's rules explicitly permit that type of action, stating, "A jockey may show or wave the crop to the Covered Horse without physically contacting the Covered Horse."


Although those circumstances are different from Ceballos's two overturned rulings, the administrative law judge did write in the 2024 reversal that, "The burden of proof is on the Authority to show, by a preponderance of the evidence, that the covered person has violated a rule issued by the Authority."

According to Alvarado's version of the May 8 hearing that was conducted via Zoom, the three Churchill stewards couldn't--or wouldn't--tell him exactly at which points in the race he hit Sovereignty with the allegedly over-the-limit strikes.

As Grening reported: "Alvarado said that during his meeting with the stewards, he tried to point out the two times where he swung but did not make contact with the horse, but got no response from the three stewards."

Alvarado told the *Form*, "They didn't argue that I did, they stayed silent. They made me count the times that I had contact with the horse. When I asked [them] if they could count where they think I had contact, they didn't."

The HISA whipping rule does give stewards flexibility to determine if "the merits of an individual case warrant consideration of an aggravating or mitigating factor."

None were listed on Alvarado's ruling, though.

For background, HISA's six-strike rule that went into effect in 2022 was partially modeled after similar regulations approved in Kentucky in 2021.

At the time of the passage of those state rules, Borden was not silent about a revised penalty structure that gave stewards leeway to employ common sense in meting out fines and suspensions.

"There are many times we struggle with the mandatory penalties that are scattered throughout our regulations and don't always give us discretion when we feel like we need it," Borden said at a meeting of the Kentucky commission's rules committee back on May 3, 2021.

Ironically, Borden expressed that sentiment about the need for discretion exactly four years prior to the date of Alvarado's winning ride on Sovereignty that netted him a mandatory \$62,000 HISA fine.

GOAL ORIENTED WORKS FOR PREAKNESS

Goal Oriented (Not This Time) tuned up for his expected stakes debut in the GI Preakness Stakes at Pimlico Race Course next Saturday with a four-furlong drill in :47.60 (4/35) at Churchill Downs Sunday. Churchill clockers caught the colt going the first quarter of a mile in :23 3/5 and galloping out five-eighths of a mile in 1:01 1/5 with exercise rider Eric Garcia in the saddle.

"He went a half really easily," said trainer Bob Baffert, who will be looking to extend his record of eight Preakness victories. "He did it on his own, just cruising around there. That's all he needed. He was nice and relaxed. Looks like the race didn't take too much out of him. I just wanted a little maintenance work. I just wanted to see how he handled it. He's only had two outs,

and you want to see how it affects them mentally. Some horses get a little bit uptight or tense and nervous. He handled it like a pro. He's got a great mind."

Tabbed a 'TDN Rising Star' following his six-furlong debut win Apr. 6 at Santa Anita, the \$425,000 Keeneland September purchase followed up with a 1 1/16-mile allowance win at Churchill on the Kentucky Derby undercard May 3.

Goal Oriented will be making just his third lifetime start and starting at his third different track in Saturday's Preakness.

"It's asking a lot," Baffert said. "But I've always been really high on this horse. He's a big, strong horse. He's handled everything thrown at him. He's shipped, he won. Justify won the GI Santa Anita Derby third out. I'm not comparing him to Justify, but he's a big, strong horse like Justify. I think he can handle it."

PETER PAN WINNER HILL ROAD EYES **BELMONT STAKES**

Amo Racing's Hill Road (Quality Road) may have earned himself a tilt at the June 7 GI Belmont Stakes with his win in the GIII Peter Pan Stakes at Aqueduct Saturday.

"He bounced out of the Peter Pan in good shape," trainer Chad Brown said Sunday. "Hopefully once we get him back under tack and he's healthy and good, we will go onto the Belmont."

A debut winner at Leopardstown last August, Hill Road was third behind champion Citizen Bull (Into Mischief) in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Del Mar last November for trainer Adrian Murray. Transferred to Brown, he opened 2025 with a third-place effort in the Mar. 8 GIII Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby and had been expected to start in the GII Wood Memorial Stakes before being sidelined by a fever.

Brown said he was expecting a big comeback effort in the Peter Pan.

"I was not surprised--it was a good spot for him," Brown said of the Peter Pan win. "After a little bit of a layoff, it was a reasonable spot for him to get going again. It wasn't too difficult of a race, it was at the right distance, at least off a layoff, and I think at a mile and a quarter, you'll see the best of him. That's what he's been looking for."

Brown sent out reigning 3-year-old champion **Sierra Leone** (**Gun Runner**) to work four furlongs in :50 flat (131/187) over the Belmont Park dirt training track Sunday. The colt, who was third in the GII New Orleans Classic in his 4-year-old debut Mar. 22, is expected to make his next start in the June 28 GI Stephen Foster Stakes at Churchill Downs.

"He is doing fine. He is idling for a little while and is probably not going to run until the Stephen Foster in late June," said Brown. "Today was a solo [breeze], just maintenance to stretch his legs. I might pick it up with him next week and do something a little more serious."

BURNHAM SQAURE POINTS TO MATT WINN

Whitham Thoroughbreds' **Burnham Square** (Liam's Map), coming off a troubled sixth-place effort in the GI Kentucky Derby, is now being aimed at the June 8 GIII Matt Winn Stakes at Churchill Downs, trainer Ian Wilkes confirmed.

Jockey Brian Hernandez, Jr. had to check repeatedly aboard Burnham Square in the Derby when when Admire Daytona (Jpn) (Drefong) slowed abruptly in front of him.

"In a 20-horse field, somebody is going to have trouble and I guess it was my turn," Wilkes said the morning after the race. "I thought he ran a terrific race. He got stopped at the half-mile pole when everybody else was making their move and then he got going again to get sixth. Without the trouble, I think he would have been in the top three."

Burnham Square opened his sophomore campaign with a win in the Feb. 1 GIII Holy Bull Stakes and, after finishing fourth in the GII Coolmore Fountain of Youth Stakes, he won the Apr. 8 GI Toyota Blue Grass Stakes.

GODOLPHIN FLYING START TRAINEES HOST LEADERSHIP LEXINGTON FOR 'THOROUGHBRED INDUSTRY DAY'

Though Lexington, Kentucky is commonly known as the 'Horse Capital of the World,' serving as a central hub for the Thoroughbred industry, there are many who live in the area that have no knowledge of how multi-faceted the world of horse racing truly is. In an effort to bridge that gap, first-year trainees on the Godolphin Flying Start (GFS) course--currently based in Lexington--coordinated with leaders across the greater equine industry to host a "Thoroughbred Industry Day" for the Leadership Lexington group on Thursday, May 8.

Spanning 11 months, Leadership Lexington is a leadership development program for professionals in the greater Lexington area that consists of 10 informative day-sessions that help broaden perspectives and provide an increased understanding of the community, signature industries, and public issues.

May's day-session was entirely focused on the Thoroughbred industry, one of Lexington's most prominent industries with a storied history in the city.

Following an outing spectating morning training at Keeneland, Leadership Lexington's group of 45 attendees sat in on a panel entitled 'Thoroughbred Industry Education, Workforce & Community Engagement.' The discussion was hosted by Greg Harbut, Ed Brown Society and Kentucky Horse Racing Commission; Kara Heissenbuttel, Keeneland; Laurie Mays, Kentucky Chamber of Commerce; Annise Montplaisir, Amplify Horse Racing; Frank Taylor, Stable Recovery; Clark Williams, Ed Brown Society; and moderated by Hallie Hardy of Horse Country.

After receiving an overview of the local Thoroughbred industry, the group ventured out to experience it firsthand as they traveled to Hagyard Equine Medical Institute, the Kentucky Horse Park and Secretariat Center, Spy Coast Farm, and Spendthrift Farm.

It was during these visits that they not only witnessed the intricacies of breeding, raising, racing and safely retiring a racehorse, but also gained perspective on how vital the equine industry is as a whole to the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

With a wealth of newfound knowledge under their belts, the Leadership Lexington group returned to Keeneland's sales pavilion where they participated in a hands-on Thoroughbred sale simulation.

"As a graduate of both the Godolphin Flying Start program and Leadership Lexington, it was exciting to host the Flying Start group here at Keeneland and have them help us show the community of Lexington just what happens at the sales pavilion and the impact it has, which is broad," said Dean Roethmeier, Keeneland's Director of Sales Operations.

"We're always excited to have people out to the races, but it's really fun to open the doors here at the sales and show everybody a peek behind the curtain at just how much goes into each of these moments in the sales ring."

Under the guidance of prominent industry members Liz Crow, Kenny McPeek, Danny Mulvihill, Gavin O'Connor, Tom Ryan, and Jonny Smyth, participants were given a brief overview of what it takes to not only host a live Thoroughbred auction, but work it through the perspective of a consignor, agent, and buyer.

"I think it's eye-opening to see all of the intricacies that go into the horse industry that you wouldn't normally see. I come to Keeneland once a season, but that's not all there is. There's so much more to it," said David Urekew, Plant Manager of Graham Packaging and a member of the 2024-25 Leadership Lexington class. As they made their way around the Keeneland sales pavilion, sale rings and surrounding barns, the participants learned about what it takes to get a horse ready for a sale, which included opportunities to pet and groom the horses while also hearing firsthand about the process behind evaluating a horse prior to bidding. Industry leaders, serving as mentors for the group, explained the basics in regards to conformation, pedigree, and reading through a pedigree page in a sale catalog.

From there, each group was given the opportunity to participate in a mock auction of six horses with the industry mentors guiding them through the fast-paced bidding process.

A group of six track ponies and retired racehorses served as stand-ins for prominent Thoroughbreds previously sold at Keeneland, though Brother in Arms (War Front)--originally sold for \$2.9 million at the 2019 Keeneland September Yearling Sale--represented himself. The third foal out of 2012 GI Kentucky Oaks winner Believe You Can (Proud Citizen) is now happily retired and enjoying life as a riding horse, owned by Mulvihill's daughter, Grace.

"The biggest takeaway from my experience was to see not only how invested Keeneland is in the Thoroughbred industry, but the actual surrounding community. It's amazing to know that this isn't just a racecourse generating revenue, it's all about the experience you get out of it," said Steven Pickarski, Financial Services Manager of Kentucky League of Cities and a member of the 2024-25 Leadership Lexington class.

Working alongside GFS graduates Conrad Bandoroff, Sam Bussanich, Hallie Hardy, Dean Roethemeier, and Caroline Wilson, the group of 12 GFS trainees spent four months planning and constructing an all-encompassing experience to allow the group of Leadership Lexington participants to fully immerse themselves in the Thoroughbred industry.

"Of the four teams, we had a multimedia team, that's our team, so we were in charge of the digital side of things such as filming on the day, preparing the presentation that was shown, and covering any media aspects. There was also a stage management team that kept us all on track, and a material team that produced our catalog, along with any other information that was distributed. The fourth team handled the industry members, meaning they were in charge of reaching out to people to invite to the event, which was really successful. We were really grateful for them to all turn up and give their time to us and to Leadership Lexington as well," explained GFS trainee Megan Bulbulia.

Though a laborious process, the event itself proved more than worthwhile as another example of industry members working together, in an effort spearheaded by GFS trainees and alumni, to bridge the gap between those within horse racing and those outside of it.

"I think it's really special. It's so nice to see a fresh perspective of the industry through other people's eyes and also to explain our experience, describing what the industry actually has to offer and how important it is to the local and global economy. Seeing how people resonate with that, especially from Lexington...it was nice to be a part of that," concluded Bulbulia.

MONMOUTH PARK SETS MOTHER'S DAY ATTENDANCE RECORD

Monmouth Park set a Mother's Day attendance record Sunday when a crowd of 14,687 turned out to support a 10-race card. The New Jersey track's previous Mother's Day record attendance of 14,121 was set in 2015. The total handle for the day was \$4,144,072.

"We appreciate the turnout by our fans to help make Mother's Day a special afternoon at Monmouth Park," said Bill Anderson, the track's president and chief operating officer. "It's always nice to see a big crowd and a festive atmosphere like we had today."

A year ago, Monmouth Park had the second largest Father's Day crowd in track history with 28,976 in attendance. The track's record Father's Day crowd of 29,262 was set in 2015.



Freedom's Not Free has found a home on the grass, and he made even-money look like a gift here as he stamped his name to the Cinema Stakes annuals with an authoritative win.

A winner last out Mar. 9 at this venue in the local Pasadena Stakes--where he produced a career-high Beyer figure of 84 in the process--and third two back Feb. 16 in the Baffle Stakes, he came into this contest with a string of works signaling his readiness. The betting public picked up on those waves, and crowned him the favorite in his question to pick up another stakes win.

Breaking in line with the rest, Freedom's Not Free was in no rush to see the front, and he tracked the tempo set by Incanto

(Ire) in second behind :23.10, :46.94, and 1:11.11 splits. She had just enough left. She's a really good filly. You can tell she is learning every race. I think he wants to run even more. I want to see where she takes me next."

An impressive winner first out going seven furlongs at her homebase of Parx last July, Takethemoneyhoney came home a two-length winner next time going six panels against restricted company at Laurel Feb. 22. Nosed out for the win by Catherine Wheel going a mile at the Big A Mar. 15, she rebounded to score by 5 1/4 lengths over that same trip in a Laurel optional claimer Apr. 13.

Trainer Michael Moore added, "The [\$500,000, Grade III] Molly Pitcher (on July 19) has to be a possibility now. Graded stakes is the next step you would think. We always thought this filly could run. When she won her first race by 13 1/2 lengths I remember thinking 'I didn't know she could run like that.' Some

horses have the ability but not the gameness. She has it all." Goodonehoney produced a filly by Wicked Strong last season and was bred back to Cloud Computing.





HENRI MATISSE POUNCES LATE FOR POULAINS GLORY, BREAKS TRACK RECORD

Representatives of Wootton Bassett's first Coolmore crop continued their plunder of elite-level contests with last term's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf hero **Henri Matisse** doubling his tally at the top table and registering a narrow victory, in track-record time, from Juddmonte's **TDN Rising Star Jonquil** (Lope De Vega) in Sunday's G1 Emirates Poule d'Essai des Poulains at ParisLongchamp.

The 12-5 favourite was positioned many lengths off the tempo as a group of five stole a march on the remainder of the field through halfway. Bustled along to improve upon turning for home, the eventual winner thundered forward to launch his challenge entering the final furlong and was driven out to best the rallying Jonquil by a head. The runner-up's fellow Rising Star and winner's stablemate **Camille Pissarro** (Wootton Bassett) flashed home late to finish a length adrift in third. The win provided trainer Aidan O'Brien with a sixth renewal of the mile Classic, five shy of Robert Denman's century-old record of 11.

"He's a horse that doesn't like to be in front too long and it was a nice, even pace," the winning trainer commented. "We were hoping it was going to be like that, because he was going to be ridden back, and we're delighted with the outcome."

PARIS, France — "Where's Charlie?" The reaction of Francis Graffard, looking for Charlie Fellowes to commiserate before celebrating his own good fortune in being awarded the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, spoke volumes. Not only for the decency of the winning trainer but for the extreme awkwardness surrounding the prolonged stewards' enquiry and ultimate outcome. One man's gain, another's pain.

In the case of the demoted Shes Perfect it was not, however, just one man's pain. Almost 60 syndicate owners had joined manager Basher Watts on the pilgrimage to Longchamp in pursuit of Classic glory. On seeing their free-running filly battle back when seemingly beaten, plunging her nose down on the line to be first past the post by the merest of margins, they filled the winner's enclosure with whoops and hollers, hugs and tears.



He added, "When the pace is strong and even, usually if you have the best horse you have a chance. There was going to be no traffic for everybody, but when you're riding back you're

never sure you're going to get there. I'm never confident, I'm always hopeful, but Ryan [Moore] gave him a brilliant ride. I think he could be a miler and we think that he's probably going to be a [G1] St James's Palace horse, but obviously the lads will decide that."

Ryan Moore, who added to his lone prior victory aboard The Gurkha (Galileo) in 2016, added, "They went a good gallop and it sorted the race out. He travelled very well, very comfortable, he picked up well and I always felt like he was going to win. He's a

horse with an awful lot of ability, he was good in America last year and he was good on his comeback. I think he's getting better and there's a chance he'll get further, but he's pacey and he's got a lot of gears."

Reflecting on the performance of third home Camille Pissarro, O'Brien said, "Christophe [Soumillon] thought his horse could be a French Derby horse, so the lads will probably split them up and we'll see what happens."

Pedigree Notes

Henri Matisse, one of his sire's 14 winners at the highest level, is the sixth of seven foals throne by Immortal Verse ((Pivotal), whose career highlights include victories in the G1 Coronation Stakes and G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois. Immortal Verse topped the sheets at Tattersalls' 2013 December Mares sale when knocked down for 4,700,000gns. She is the leading performer out of stakes-winning G3 Prix Fille de l'Air runner-up Side Of Paradise

(Sadler's Wells), whose descendants include stakes-winning G1 Queen Elizabeth II Stakes runner-up Roseman (Kingman).

ZARIGANA AWARDED POULICHES; SHES PERFECT DEMOTED by Tom Frary

At the end of a week to forget for Kieran Shoemark, the rider who had suffered agony at

Newmarket eight days earlier had to endure a second bout as the ParisLongchamp stewards stripped his mount Shes Perfect of G1 Emirates Poule d'Essai des Pouliches glory on Sunday. Connections of the Charlie Fellowes-trained daughter of Sioux Nation were ebullient for a precious few minutes after the photo showed her a nose ahead of the 4-5 favourite Zarigana, but an objection from Mickael Barzalona soon raised the alarm.

After deliberation, the officials judged the 18-1 winner to have

caused interference to the eventual fourth Exactly as she drifted left in the closing stages, who in turn took Zarigana off a true line. With such a minimal margin separating the duo who had

finished the other way around in the course-and-distance G3 Prix de la Grotte, the decision came down in favour of the Aga Khan Studs' daughter of Siyouni.

"Obviously, it was a tough few minutes and we don't like to

win like this," trainer Francis-Henri Graffard said of the promoted winner, who for a brief period looked to have suffered a second heart-breaking defeat here, having also lost out by a nose in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac on Arc day. "We feel sorry for the connections of Shes Perfect, but this is racing and it has happened to me in the past. To be fair to my filly, when she came, she got really unbalanced at the wrong time and at the

end it was only a nose." "I am very happy for this filly, there was a lot of expectation and she deserved a win like that and it would have been very frustrating to be second, beaten a nose," he added. Cont. p6

"It's so important for the team, it's huge. It's quite hard to really enjoy it, it's more like a relief than proper joy. I think she can be ridden closer to the pace, but I think it's important to

give her cover. Mikael gave her a good ride and I think she deserved to win, but again I'm very sorry for the connections of Shes Perfect."

Key to the outcome here was the errant passage of Shes Perfect inside the final two furlongs, but the real story of the race was the remarkable final three-furlong split of Zarigana as she stormed home in a rapid :32.50 despite receiving a bump. Once she was clear of Exactly, her surge to the line in :11.31 demonstrated how much running she had left in the tank

and there is no decisive call on the judgement of the inquiry.

Charlie Fellowes was taken aback by the outcome, with an appeal being considered. "I thought the contact was minimal

and it was a long way out, so I was very surprised," he explained. "In England, it would not have been overturned--we would have kept it. I need to speak to some people and get some advice on the situation--whether it's worth appealing, I've no idea really."

"My filly is so tough, I was worried about the ground before the race and that it was plenty quick enough for her, but she's obviously more versatile than I realised," he added. "I think she'll stay 10, but she just needs to relax a bit better. She's just nearly won a Classic over a mile, so there's no desperate need to step her up yet. We'll maybe look at that later in the year."

TDN Rising Star Zarigana may not be asked to emulate the Classic double achieved by her second dam Zarkava, with the

G1 Prix de Diane appearing less likely than the G1 Coronation Stakes where she can renew rivalry with the demoted winner.

"I'm not sure she needs to step up in trip," Graffard added. "If we decide to stick to a mile, then we will go to Royal Ascot and the Coronation with her. Mandanaba should step up in trip and head to the Prix de Diane."

Pedigree Notes

Frankel's Zarkamiya, who proved a genuine 12-furlong performer when winning the Listed Prix Thiberville and finishing third in the G1 Prix Vermeille, is one of two notables produced by the luminary Zarkava who holds a special place in the operation's annuls. Her Dubawi-sired G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud-winning son Zarak is now emerging as a force in his second career, while Zarkava's G3 Prix Minerve-winning half-sister Zarshana by Sea The Stars is responsible for Frankel's G1 Prix Ganay runner-up Zarir. The third foal out of Zarkamiya is a filly named Zarouma by Zarak's sire Dubawi.

Their cries of 'Shooey' added yet more poignancy to what looked to be the ultimate tale of sporting redemption: Classic glory for Kieran Shoemark after a torrid week of being pushed down the pecking order of jockeys at Clarehaven.

Whatever one's view of the outcome of the previous weekend's 2,000 Guineas, there can be no denying that Shoemark has been riding at the top of his game this season. An owner or trainer looking for the 'best available' could well have had their heads turned by his performances in each of the Longchamp Classics. From a desperate draw, Luther outran his odds to take fourth for Fellowes in the Poule d'Essai des Poulains, while Shes Perfect was beaten only by her own slight waywardness in the straight. And it was slight. The rules, often more harshly applied in France than in other jurisdictions, have to be adhered to, no matter how aggrieved those closest to the action may justifiably feel.

As Zarigana was announced as the winner there was booing in some quarters around the parade ring. The tears of stunned joy shed by Fellowes as he attempted to take in the extraordinary performance of his filly to deliver what had appeared to be his first Classic winner will have tasted bitter on his cheeks only moments later. Watts magnanimously led his followers in a round of applause for the team from the Aga Khan Studs as they departed the hallowed arena, crestfallen.

"That's horseracing," said the admirably equable Shoemark, showered and changed and on his way out of the weighing-room after calling a polite "Merci" to the officials within. He could have walked on by and refused to speak at this gloomiest of hours but instead the politeness continued.

"I'm gutted for the connections but we've got a wonderful filly who has put up another mighty performance. I am sorry for the connections that it didn't happen today. Unfortunately I think that was part of my 'it comes in threes' and we'll get over today and I am sure we'll see her at Ascot." Cont. p8

He added of his week in an unwelcome spotlight, "I've had an incredible amount of support throughout the last five, six days – even just walking back in off the filly then, and my phone's been red hot. It's just another rollercoaster of emotions.

"I'm a big boy, I've got big shoulders, and we'll move on."

Emotion enveloped both sides of this equation. Those involved with Zarigana clearly took no pleasure in throwing shade on the visitors' brief moment in the sun.

"Nobody wants to win a race like this," said Graffard, who is currently dominating the French scene with a 30 per cent strike rate, so many of those winners coming in the green and red livery of the Aga Khan Studs.

This should have been a delightful result for Princess Zahra Aga Khan and her loyal team – one that reflected not only the immense contribution of her recently deceased father to racing and breeding but also that of her great grandfather.

Zarigana's coronation echoes down through a century and more, way beyond her famed and beloved granddam Zarkava, whose first Classic triumph she emulated here. This was a victory eleven generations in the making, right the way through from the second handful of yearling purchases by HH Aga Khan III in 1922, which included the supremely influential Mumtaz Mahal.

For that extraordinary devotion to the development of thoroughbred families alone, nobody could deny the Aga Khan Studs another major success here – a seventh in the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches since 1984. It is to their credit that Graffard, Princess Zahra and her family made no show of celebration as they were handed their trophies.

At the other end of the broad spectrum of racehorse ownership came the many involved with Shes Perfect. They have a terrific filly, no doubt, and it can only be hoped that the collective dismay they must have felt on leaving Longchamp can soon be focused on what may lie ahead.

Shoemark, too, must find his strength in adversity. He looks to be well on his way.

LIKE MOTHER LIKE DAUGHTER AS GEZORA WINS THE SAINT ALARY by Tom Frary

Bringing yet more success to the Francis-Henri Graffard stable in 2025, White Birch Farm's **Gezora** emulated the 2006 Prix Saint-Alary success of her dam Germance at ParisLongchamp on Sunday. Sent off at 6-1 for the former Group 1 contest, now a level below carrying the sponsors' "Auguste Rodin Coolmore" title, last year's G3 Prix des Reservoirs winner was anchored behind the leading pair early by Mickael Barzalona.

Showing the sharpest acceleration of the quartet in the straight, the daughter of Almanzor who had been third behind

Mandanaba and **Flaming Stone** in the course-and-distance G3 Prix Vanteaux last month took over from the latter 300 metres from the finish before seeing off her stablemate, Dubawi's 1-2 favourite **Audubon Park**, by 1 1/4 lengths.

Graffard, who was later to go through the gamut of emotions after the Pouliches, is thinking of the G1 Prix de Diane for the first two. "Gezora is a nice filly, very straightforward, she had a very good first run in the Vanteaux here and she came on a lot for the race," he said. "She blossomed physically and mentally she was so happy and well in herself that I said to the owner we should give it a go today, we had nothing to lose and she lengthened really nicely in the straight."

"Audubon Park is a big, scopey filly and I didn't want to run her four times before the Prix de Diane, so I gave her a long break and physically I think she needed it today," he added. "She was a little bit in season also--when I put the saddle on her she was showing bad signs to me. She needed the run, she asked for a big blow at the wrong moment in the straight and she will come on a lot for that. She's a lovely filly. Gezora will definitely go to the Prix de Diane after that and regarding Audubon Park, let's see how she comes out and I will speak to the owner, but this is a trial and she will probably line up too."

Pedigree Notes

Gezora is the last foal out of Germance, who also captured the G3 Prix de la Nonette and G3 Prix Penelope and was second in her Diane. Responsible for only one black-type performer so far in Teofilo's triple listed-placed Garance, she is a half to the dual listed scorer Gaily Game by Montjeu related to Sea The Stars's G1 Prix d'Ispahan-winning sire Mekhtaal and Le Havre's G1 Criterium International runner-up Normandy Bridge. This is also the family of the G1 Derby Italiano hero and Arc runner-up White Muzzle and the G1 Dubai World Cup hero Almutawakel.

ZARAK'S FLATTEN THE CURVE EDGES OLEANDER-RENNEN THRILLER, NEW YORK AN OPTION by Sean Cronin

Eckhard Sauren's former handicap stalwart **Flatten The Curve** (Zarak) registered a third success for conditioner Henk Grewe on Hoppegarten's Sunday card by defeating Irish raider **Enfranchise** (Invincible Spirit) in an enthralling finish to the Berlin track's two-mile G2 Comer Group International 54th Oleander-Rennen.

The resurgent six-year-old closed last term with a career high in Cologne's G3 Silbernes Pferd and opened this campaign with a three-length tally in this venue's Listed Altano-Rennen last time.

Patiently ridden off the tempo in seventh until urged forward once into the home straight, the 2-1 second favourite weaved a passage to the far side hedge for his challenge entering the final furlong and had enough reserves under a late drive to outpoint Enfranchise by a head in a thrilling bobber. Last year's runner-up **Waldadler** (Adlerflug) fared best of the remainder and finished 1 3/4 lengths adrift in third.

Flatten The Curve's victory qualifies for an automatic place in New York's GII Belmont Gold Cup. "That race is the plan and the [G1] Irish St Leger is also an option," Grewe told *GaloppOnline*.

Winning rider Thore Hammer-Hansen added, "This is a very special victory for me. The horse has improved tremendously

from start to start and fought like a true champion today. It was a bit tight at times, but he pulled through and, in the end, he won with his heart."

DUBAWI'S TDN RISING STAR DELACROIX ANNEXES LEOPARDSTOWN FEATURE

Just minutes after stablemate Henri Matisse (Wootton Bassett) secured G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains glory in France, Aidan O'Brien nominee and **TDN Rising Star Delacroix** (Dubawi) laid his Classic credentials on the line in Leopardstown's G3 Cashel Palace Hotel Derby Trial Stakes and passed with flying colours, registering a 2 3/4-length triumph in the 10-furlong test.

Last seen annexing March's G3 Ballysax Stakes over the Foxrock venue's same mile-and-a-quarter strip, the 1-3 favourite accepted a tow from stablemate Rock Of Cashel (Wootton Bassett) and raced second after breaking on the lead. Easing to the fore off the home turn, he was beyond recall after quickening clear approaching the furlong pole and hit the line with a comfortable buffer. Juddmonte's Dermot Weld trainee Purview (Kingman) finished second, four lengths ahead of Joseph O'Brien contender Tennessee Stud (Wootton Bassett) in third. First or second in all seven starts, Delacroix also annexed last term's G3 Autumn Stakes at Newmarket and ran second in both G2 Golden Fleece Stakes and G1 Futurity Trophy.

"Gavin [Ryan] went along at an even tempo [aboard Rock Of Cashel] and Wayne [Lordan] got a lovely lead into it," reflected Ballydoyle's Chris Armstrong. "When he got after him, a furlong-and-a-half out, the most impressive part was he really lengthened and quickened to the line. Wayne said going to the line he was having a good look, which is a good sign there is plenty left in there. His homework has been very good since here the last day, he's come forward lovely and all being well he'll come forward again. It's on to Epsom now."

Pedigree Notes

Delacroix, one of his sires 192 pattern-race winners, is the latest of four foals and one of two scorers from as many runners out of multiple Grade I-winning dual US champion Tepin

(Bernstein), who also bagged Royal Ascot's G1 Queen Anne Stakes. Tepin, whose other winner is last term's G1 Prix de Royallieu heroine Grateful (Galileo), is a full-sister to GII Peter Pan Stakes and GIII Coolmore Lexington Stakes placegetter Prime Cut. She is also kin to three-time Grade II winner Vyjack (Into Mischief). Delacroix's stakes-placed third dam Round It Off (Apalachee), who produced dual Grade III-winning sire Disco Rico (Citidancer), is a half-sister to GII Ladies Handicap and dual GIII Carousel Stakes victrix Miss Slewpy (Slewpy).

"She's been showing up really well at home and I know her pretty well from seeing her race against Makarova last year," Walker said of the 5-1 winner. "Whether or not we think about the [G2] Temple Stakes at Haydock or a Group 2 back in France on our way to Ascot, or we go straight to Ascot I don't know, we'll see how she is, but the focus will be the [G1] King Charles III."

ARC RACES INITIATIVE LAUNCHED BY FRANCE GALOP

Arc Races, a new eight-race initiative that will grant each winner a spot in the €5-million G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in the autumn, was launched by France Galop on Sunday. Highlighting some of the best of French racing, the aim of the series is to raise the profile of the Arc, which takes place at ParisLongchamp on October 5 this year.

Spread across the calendar, the Arc Races include the

following contests: the G1 Qatar Prix du Jockey Club on June 1 and the G1 Prix de Diane Longines on June 15 both at Chantilly; Saint-Cloud's G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud on June 29, the G1 Grand Prix de Paris back at ParisLongchamp on July 13, and the G1 Sumbe Prix Jean Romanet at Deauville on August 24. In addition, ParisLongchamp will host the Qatar Arc Trials on September 7 which encompass the G1 Qatar Prix Vermeille, the G2 Qatar Prix Niel and the G2 Qatar Prix Foy.

Winners of the Arc Races will be granted a wildcard to run in the Arc, provided they meet the race conditions. If there are too many starters (race limit is 24), Arc Races winners will be given priority and will not be included in the elimination procedure.

France Galop will also refund their entry fees (€8,300), while horses that have not been entered will be given the opportunity of an entry window 15 days after the official closing date. Winners of the Arc trial races will have their entry fees refunded. More importantly, if they don't have an entry in the Arc, they will receive a free supplementary entry worth €120,000.

SOHO SQUARE (GB) (f, 3, Showcasing {GB}--Cuban Treasure {GB}, by Havana Gold {Ire}), well beaten on her sole start over six furlongs at Yarmouth in September, tracked the early leaders and looked to have too much to do inside the last two furlongs. Benefitting from a pace collapse, the 8-1 shot was in front 100 yards from the line and asserted to score by a neck from Ten Sovereigns's Hello Goodbye. The winner is the first foal out of the unraced dam, whose three listed-placed half-siblings include Montjeu's Lingfield Oaks Trial runner-up Bellajeu. The second dam is the Listed Pinnacle Stakes winner and G3 Ormonde Stakes-placed Arbella, while the family also features the G1

Middle Park Stakes-winning sire Primo Valentino. Cuban Treasure's 2-year-old filly by Magna Grecia is named Tutts Clump, while she also has a yearling filly by Ardad. ROOSEVELT (GB) (c, 3, Frankel {GB}--Materialistic {GB} **(SP-Eng)**, by Oasis Dream **(GB)**), a G1 Irish Derby entry who trailed all nine rivals home in his Apr. 9 debut going 10 furlongs at this venue in his only prior start, broke sharply and set the tone from flagfall. Untroubled on the front end for the most part, the 7-1 chance came under pressure when threatened at the top of the straight and was driven out inside the final furlong to hold the late bid of Delta (Kitten's Joy) by a head. "Wayne [Lordan] gave him a lovely ride," said Ballydoyle's Chris Armstrong. "He steadied it up, he got the fractions spot on and stretched on at the line. In fairness, he ran here the last day and Declan [McDonogh] spoke highly of him. He's a big, burly colt and he's still carrying plenty of condition, even today. He's stepped forward from the last day and will step forward again. Wayne said he had two good blows before the line. He's a horse that stays well and has all the right entries. He could come back here for something like the [Listed] Nijinsky and could end up an Irish Derby type or the [G2] Queen's Vase for [Royal] Ascot. He'll strip fitter again so there is more to come from him." Roosevelt is the fourth of six foals and third scorer from as many runners produced by Listed Snowdrop Stakes runner-up Materialistic (Oasis Dream), herself one of four black-type performers out of G2 Lancashire Oaks victrix and G1 Yorkshire Oaks second Pongee (Barathea). They include the multiple Group-placed stakes-winning duo Drill (Dansili) and Pinzolo (Monsun). Pongee is also the second dam of stakes-winning G2 Prix de la Nonette and G3 Prix de Guiche third Alkandora (Nathaniel). Roosevelt's third dam is the stakes-winning matriarch Puce (Darshaan), whose descendants include G1 MacKinnon Stakes victrix Magic Wand (Galileo) and G1 Irish Oaks heroine Chicquita (Montjeu), the latter being the dam of G2 Curragh Cup winner Emily Dickinson (Dubawi). The 950,000gns Tattersalls October Book 1 graduate is a full-brother to a yearling colt and half to a 2-year-old colt by Wootton Bassett. Sales history: 950,000gns Ylg '23 TATOCT. BUTTERFLY WINGS (f, 3, Justify--Butterflies {Ire} {MGSP-Ire}, by **Galileo (Ire))**, collected minor prizes in all three prior starts and went postward for this returning off a fourth behind the TDN Rising Star performance of Catalina Delcarpio (Lope De Vega) over this course and distance on sophomore return last month. Trapped three-wide in a prominent third through halfway, the 2-1 second choice was rousted along to inch ahead with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining and drew clear in the latter stages to defeat Diamond Exchange (Wootton Bassett) by four lengths. "She had run in a couple of very good maidens and we thought she might have won by now," admitted Chris Armstrong. "Hopefully that win will give her the confidence to send her to the next level. Wayne [Lordan] felt she was grand at that trip, but the best would probably be when she goes up to a mile-and-a-half and that gives plenty of options. It's great to get the maiden win and we'll see where she fits in with the other fillies and try to get some black type." Butterfly Wings is the fourth of five registered foals and third scorer produced by G3 Munster Oaks and G3 Flame Of Tara Stakes placegetter Butterflies (Galileo). The Aprilfoaled bay is a half-sister to G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial third Carracci (Quality Road) and G2 Balanchine Stakes runner-up Yet (War Front). The latter, in turn, is the dam of Saturday's **TDN Rising Star** Albert Einstein (Wootton Bassett). Butterflies is one of eight black-type performers thrown by dual Grade II and multiple Grade III-winning matriarch Mariah's Storm (Rahy) headed by multiple Group 1-winning sire Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat). Mariah's Storm is also the ancestress of elite-level winners Gleneagles (Galileo), Happily (Galileo), Marvellous (Galileo), Joan Of Arc (Galileo), Decorated Knight (Galileo) and Above The Curve (American Pharoah). Butterflies has a yearling colt by Gun Runner to come and she was bred back to Gun Runner last year. Lifetime Record: 4-1-0-1, \$17,919. INNORA (GER) (f, 3, Lord Of England (Ger)--I Think So (Ger), by So You Think {NZ}), fifth on her sole juvenile start in Baden-Baden's hotly-contested Winterkonigin Trial conditions event in August, was in front of the main pack early behind the tearaway leader. Left in front passing the three-furlong pole, the 9-2 shot opened up to register an impressive 13-length success from Nurania, the Camelot filly who had been second on debut to Fantastic Moon's half-sister Fire and Ice. Jockey Thore Hammer-Hansen said, "I was quite surprised by how far I was in front, I had only concentrated on finding a good rhythm and she was so effortless." The unraced dam, a half-sister to three blacktype performers headed by Lord Of England's G1 Deutsches Derby hero Isfahan, descends from the champion Indica who trounced the colts in the G1 Aral-Pokal. Her 2-year-old filly Impressive Lady is by Waldpfad, while she also has a yearling colt by Neatico and a filly foal by Torquator Tasso. Sales history: €30,000 Ylg '23 BBASEP. In command throughout, the 1-2 lock was nudged along in early straight and ridden clear inside the final quarter-mile to easily outclass Some Rules Apply (Equiano) by an impressive 4 1/2 lengths. Ascot Royal is the latest of 11 reported foals and seventh scorer produced by a winning daughter of the multiple Graded-placed Listed River Downs Breeders' Cup Handicap victrix Ashford Castle (Bates Motel), herself a half-sister to GI Spinaway and GI Matron Stakes heroine Strategic Maneuver (Cryptoclearance). The April-foaled bay is a half-brother to G3 Chipchase Stakes victor Above The Rest (Excellent Art). Sales history: €30,000 RNA Ylg '23 GOFORB; €11,000 2yo '24 BBAGM; 16,000gns RNA 2yo '24 TATGNS. PASAND (FR) (c, 3, Persian King {Ire}--Princess Sofia {UAE}, by **Pennekamp)**, an Apr. 26 debut fourth going seven furlongs at Dusseldorf in his only prior start, broke from the outside stall in fourth and went forward to claim the rail and the lead after the initial exchanges of this one. Comfortably clear straightening for home, the 9-10 pick was shaken up passing the quarter-mile marker and stayed on well under continued urging to hold the late surge of Mabel (Lord Of England) by 1 1/4 lengths. Pasand, full to the unraced 2-year-old filly Sofia's Spring, is the eighth of nine live foals and eighth scorer produced by a multiple-winning daughter of the G3 Fred Darling Stakes, G3 Jersey Stakes and G3 Beeswing Stakes placegetter Russian Royal (Nureyev). He is also kin to G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud and G1 Grosser Preis von Baden-winning sire Prince Gibraltar (Rock Of Gibraltar), the stakes-winning Princess Gibraltar (Rock Of Gibraltar) and G3 Bahrain Trophy third Sofia's Rock (Rock Of Gibraltar). Descendants of Russian Royal also include dual Group-winning G1 Cheveley Park Stakes second Illuminate (Zoffany) and G3 Premio Dormello-winning G2 Oaks d'Italia runner-up Lady Catherine (Bering). SHOCK IN THE NHK MILE CUP, AS PANJA TOWER PREVAILS by Heather Anderson

Deep Creek's **Panja Tower** (Tower Of London) upset the G1 NHK Mile Cup at Tokyo on Sunday, producing a strong stretch run to sweep the spoils. The Shinsuke Hashiguchi-trained colt was winning his first Group 1 race.

Rated in midfield through the early going, the 25-1 shot stayed out of trouble on the backstretch. Spun widest of all off the turn, he set sail for the pacesetter, **Voulezvous** (Satono Crown), just before the 400-metre mark. Several rivals had a similar idea, and the field was soon strung across the course with at least six horses in with a chance by midstraight. Panja Tower kept grinding, eventually outfooting all of his foes to win by a head over the rallying **Magic Sands** (Kizuna), himself a nose in front of the filly **Cerbiatto** (Lord Kanaloa) in third.

"We were able to sit in a good position but the rhythm was more of an important factor and I'm happy he ran steadily in good rhythm today," said jockey Kohei Matsuyama. "As you know, he's shown his strength since his debut and has a graded win in Tokyo, and the way he stretched incredibly today proves he has a bright future ahead of him,"

A winner of his first two starts at two, including the G2 Keio Hai Nisai Stakes, Panja Tower was a well-beaten 12th in the G1 Asahi Hai Futurity to **Admire Zoom** (Maurice), favoured on Sunday and the eventual 14th-place finisher of the NHK Mile Cup. The Tower Of London colt improved to fourth in the G3 Falcon Stakes over 1400 metres behind **Yankee Barows** (Epiphaneia)--ninth today--in March when making his 3-year-old bow. Admire Zoom was found to have lost a shoe during the running.

Pedigree Notes

The first stakes winner of any sort for his sire, whose eldest foals are now 3-year-olds, Panja Tower is a paternal half-brother to G3 Kokura Nisai Stakes third Arlington Row. Tower Of London won the G1 Sprinters Stakes and stands for ¥2 million at Darley's Japanese satellite.

The second foal, runner and winner for his unraced dam Clarksdale (Victoire Pisa), Panja Tower is followed by a 2-year-old filly by Declaration Of War, a yearling colt by Pyro and a colt foal of this year by Admire Mars. Granddam Acoustics (Cape Cross) foaled the Japanese Derby hero and sire Logi Universe, and Acoustics herself is a half-sister to three stakes winners anchored by group winners Renforcer (Symboli Kris S) and Northern River (Agnes Tachyon). This is also the family of Japanese champion Songline (Kizuna) and G1 Shuka Sho/G1 Nassau Stakes heroine Deirdre (Harbinger).
