



JOURNALISM A GO FOR BELMONT STAKES AFTER SARATOGA WORK

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – It didn't take long for trainer Michael McCarthy to make the decision. After watching his long-striding colt **Journalism** (Curlin) gobble up the ground at Saratoga Race Course Sunday morning, McCarthy gave the thumbs up sign.

Journalism is going to run in Saturday's 157th edition of the \$2-million GI Belmont Stakes.

"Based off what I saw here this morning, I would be hard-pressed to find a reason not to enter," McCarthy said after Journalism worked four furlongs in :47.54 on the main track with regular jockey Umberto Rispoli on board.

McCarthy said Journalism would be entered Sunday when entries were due. The draw will take place Monday at 5 p.m. at Universal Preservation Hall in downtown.

Journalism, who won the roughly run GI Preakness Stakes in his last start, was second in the GI Kentucky Derby. If he starts in the Belmont, he will be the only horse to run in all three legs of this year's Triple Crown.

"I want to do this because I felt like the horse was telling me he could handle running three times in five weeks," McCarthy said.

CLAIBORNE SECURES BREEDING RIGHTS TO MINDFRAME

Mindframe (Constitution--Walk of Stars, by Street Sense), most recently winner of the GI Churchill Downs Stakes, will take up stud duties at Claiborne Farm at the conclusion of his racing career, the farm announced Sunday evening.

Tabbed a **'TDN Rising Star'** following his 13 3/4-length debut victory at Gulfstream Park last March, the dark bay colt was second--beaten just a half-length by Dornoch (Good Magic)--in the GI Belmont Stakes in just his third trip to the post. He was second again after recovering from a stumbling start in the GI Haskell Stakes the following month.


Mindframe is unbeaten in two starts to date this year, winning the Mar. 1 GII Gulfstream Park Mile and the May 3 Churchill Downs Stakes.

Journalism a Go for Belmont Stakes (cont. from p1)

Journalism and Rispoli made the walk from the Oklahoma Training Track and stepped on the main track at 8:45 Sunday morning under cloudy skies and an unseasonable temperature in the low 50s.

Once the horse got back to his barn on the Oklahoma, it was evident that the Belmont would be the target. McCarthy was especially impressed with how strongly Journalism galloped out: five furlongs in 1:00.10 and six furlongs in 1:12.60.

The work was originally planned for Saturday, but those plans were scrapped after a steady rain late Friday night lasted most of Saturday. Over two and a half inches of rain fell, but Journalism saw a good-looking track on Sunday. And he relished it.

"He is a wonderful mover; he gets over the ground very well, has an incredible stride," said McCarthy, who arrived here from California Thursday night.

If you were looking at any other clues that would signal Journalism starting in the Belmont, consider this: Aron Wellman, president and founder of Eclipse Thoroughbreds, the colt's owner, was also in town from California. Rispoli, who regularly rides in California, said he was here with his family for the week.

"This is an American Classic," Wellman said. "You only get three shots at them. We have been fortunate to participate and compete in the first two. It would mean a lot. There is a lot of importance and prestige associated with this race. We feel like we have the goods."

The Belmont is expected to have a field of eight. The presence of Journalism means a rematch of the Kentucky Derby where he was defeated by **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) by a length and a half in the slop at Churchill Downs.



Both camps are looking forward to the rematch.

"I am sure there are people that will probably favor Journalism, and some will probably favor Sovereignty," said Bill Mott, Sovereignty's Hall of Fame trainer. "They are two very good horses."

"It will be really great for the sport," said Rispoli, who has ridden Journalism in six of his seven starts. "I always say the best horse is going to win. Hopefully, it will be our time this time. Both of us had good trips in the Derby; he beat me."



Journalism and Sovereignty are the Belmont headliners, but six others will attempt to crash the party. They include **Baeza** (McKinzie), who was a neck behind Journalism in Louisville, GII Wood Memorial winner **Rodriguez** (Authentic), GIII Peter Pan winner **Hill Road** (Quality Road), Preakness fifth-place finisher **Heart of Honor (GB)** (Honor A.P.), and a pair from Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher: **Crudo** (Justify), winner of the Sir Barton Stakes at Pimlico on the Preakness undercard and **Uncaged** (Curlin), the sixth-place finisher in the Peter Pan.

The Belmont will be run at Saratoga for the second consecutive year as Belmont Park continues its large-scale renovation. And, for the second straight year, it will be run at 1 1/4 miles, rather than the traditional 1 1/2 miles because of the main track configuration at Saratoga.

'HE LOOKED SMOOTH': SOVEREIGNTY TUNES UP FOR BELMONT

GI Kentucky Derby winner Sovereignty (Into Mischief) tuned up for his rematch with Derby runner-up and GI Preakness Stakes winner Journalism (Curlin) in Saturday's GI Belmont Stakes with a four-furlong work in :48.84 (3/17) over the Oklahoma training track in Saratoga Sunday.

The Godolphin homebred, working solo under exercise rider Neil Poznansky, was caught by NYRA clockers through splits of :12 3/5, :24 2/5 and out in 1:02 flat and 1:16 3/5.

"He went well," trainer Bill Mott said of the work. "We just wanted a nice breeze, in :48, :49, which is what we got. He galloped out good. He looked smooth. He came back good. It was a maintenance-type breeze, and that is what we got."

Sovereignty made his racetrack debut at Saratoga last summer, finishing fourth Aug. 24. Sunday's work was the colt's third straight breeze at the upstate New York venue since winning the May 3 Derby. He worked four furlongs in :49.76 (13/32) May 17 and five furlongs in 1:02.54 (4/5) May 24.



CRUDO CONFIRMS BELMONT STATUS

Bobby Flay and James Ventura's **Crudo** (Justify) confirmed his readiness for Saturday's GI Belmont Stakes with a four-furlong work in :48.86 (4/17) over the Oklahoma training track Sunday in Saratoga. Last-out winner of the Sir Barton Stakes, the colt worked in company with GI Woody Stephens Stakes contender **Gate to Wire** (Munnings).

Crudo broke off about one length back and traveled to the outside of Gate to Wire as NYRA clockers timed him through splits of :12 4/5, :24 4/5, and out in 1:01 3/5 and 1:14 3/5.

"I thought it was an excellent move," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "He worked really well, galloped out nicely. I was very pleased with him. He's had a good couple weeks since he ran."

Crudo, a front-running 7 1/4-length maiden winner going seven furlongs at Keeneland Apr. 19, romped home by 7 1/2 lengths in the 1 1/16-mile Sir Barton at Pimilco May 17. He will be making his fourth lifetime start in the Belmont.

"It's undoubtedly a pretty strong field," Pletcher said. "The top three from the Derby look to be really good colts. We've always been really high on the way the horse trained. His last two races have been very good."

Pletcher will also saddle WinStar Farm and Repole Stable's **Uncaged** (Curlin) in the Belmont.

A \$600,000 purchase at the 2022 Keeneland September sale, Mindframe races for Mike Repole's Repole Stable and Vinnie Viola's St Elias Stables and is trained by Todd Pletcher.

"He's such a versatile horse," Pletcher said of the 4-year-old. "From just missing last year in the Belmont and now winning a Grade I going seven-eighths. It just shows how special of a horse he is."

Claiborne president Walker Hancock added, "Mindframe is the kind of rare talent that has the ability to be a breed-

shaping stallion. He has been brilliant in every start, he is versatile from seven to 10 furlongs, and is battle tested against the very best of his class. His pedigree, physical presence, and proven ability at the highest level make him an exceptional

addition to our stallion roster. We are thrilled to welcome him to Claiborne."

On the board in all six lifetime starts to date, Mindframe has

won four times and earned \$1,292,160.

BRIAN KNIPPENBERG NEVER GAVE UP ON MERCANTE AND NOW HE'S BEING

REWARDED The Week in Review, by Bill Finley

Trainer Brian Knippenberg knew there was something wrong with Mercante (Gun Runner), but didn't know what it was. He also knew that the horse had a ton of talent and maybe he could patch him up and he'd be a useful horse. Not many would have done so. It would have been easy to give up on a horse that was sidelined for 15 months after he finished third in a July 22, 2023 allowance race at Saratoga for trainer Bill Mott.

Fast forward to the present and Mercante looks like one of the best turf horse in training. His latest win came in the GIII Arlington S. on Saturday at Churchill Downs.

It was after that July 2023 race that Mott sent the horse back to Hermitage Farm, owned by Carl Pollard. Knippenberg is his farm manager and trains a few horses for him on the side, mainly the ones that aren't good enough to make it at the bigger circuits. Knippenberg wasn't given any instructions

or given a time frame. Rather, Pollard wanted him to look under the hood and try to figure out what was wrong with Mercante.

Mercante had a tendon problem, but it was an unusual one. There was swelling in the afflicted area, but otherwise Mercante appeared to be perfectly sound.

"There was no structural damage and he wasn't unsound," Knippenberg said. "It was just an unsightly swelling. Nobody could figure out what was happening."

So, with the blessing of his veterinarian, Knippenberg decided to put Mercante back into serious training. He also asked Pollard if he could train the horse.

"I told Mr. Pollard that I appreciated every horse he's ever sent me," the trainer said. "I've loved winning races for him. How about giving me a chance with a potentially big time horse like Mercante? He waited about 30 days and then he said go for it. That's how the whole thing got set in motion."

The swelling remained an issue, but Mercante was otherwise training well and Knippenberg thought he was ready for a race.

"We had him entered at Churchill and two days before the race, the leg just blew up. It was really bad. We sent him straight to the clinic. As is the case so often in life, the swelling was a


blessing in disguise."

This time someone figured out what was going on.

"They did an ultrasound on him and they found this tiny tear in what is called the manica," Knippenberg said.

According to the website vet-anatomy, the manica flexoria are bands of tissue proximal and distal to the fetlock, made of lateral and medial margins of the superficial digital flexor tendon.

If they could repair this problem, there would be no reason why Mercante couldn't come back and, perhaps, develop into a stakes horse. But would it be worth the cost, the time and the effort? All he had done for Mott was break his maiden in six starts.

Thank goodness he did because the horse has backed him up."

The Arlington was his seventh race since the long layoff and he's won four of them and was second in the GI Old Forester BourbonTurf Classic at Churchill.

"I'm proud of Brian because he fooled with him and fooled with him," Pollard said. "Bill Mott did a great job with him, but there was always something wrong. I was ready to give up on

Knippenberg said most owners probably would have given up on Mercante.

"Mr. Pollard is the greatest owner in the world," Knippenberg said. "He always defaults to his trainers and his farm managers." He will have an opinion, but he will trust the experts. He wasn't pushing to retire him. I presented him with the possible options. We could retire him and give him away as a riding horse or we could do this surgery The success rate on that surgery is about 70-30, which is not really great odds for something that is pretty expensive. But he went for it. He's game and he loves racing. As far as caring for horses, even the ones that can't race, I've never seen anyone like him. It's never a money issue with him. He always does what's right by the race horse."

For Knippenberg, Mercante has been a once-in-a-lifetime horse. He's been training since 2003 and has won 53 races. But many of the horses that came his way were Hermitage horses that didn't look like they had much of a future.

"I'm not looking to train a string of horses," Knippenberg said. "It was kind of a side thing I do with horses that have a little bit of a rap sheet. That's why this is such a cool story that a horse like Mercante would come in to the barn. We're not going to the sales and buying \$500,000 horses to try to win big races. It just one that passed through our hands and turned out to be this kind of a horse."

Knippenberg has one other horse in training. The other is the claimer Sassy and Bold (Daddy Long Legs). Like Mercante, she has won three races so far this year. Knippenberg is 6-for-10 on the year.

"The most special part is that Mr. Pollard has supported me by naming me his farm manager and sending me horses to train," Knippenberg said. "It was really special to win this race for him. It is gratifying because you always wonder why am I racing on the small circuits? Is it because I don't know what I'm doing? So it is nice to have a horse with this ability and he runs to his abilities. It's been really fun."

Knippenberg wasn't sure what would be next for Mercante, but he said he will look at all the top grass stakes.

"We used to be a Cinderella story," the trainer said. "Not anymore. With the way he's been running, there are very high expectations every time he starts."

Patching Up "Patches"

Reigning Canadian Horse of the Year Patches O'Houlihan (Reload) was scratched from Saturday's GIII Jacques Cartier S. at Woodbine, but trainer Bob Tiller is optimistic that the 5-year-old won't be sidelined for long.

"We came in early [Saturday] morning and the first thing we looked at him and as soon we saw him, we knew that something wasn't right," Tiller said. "He looked dull to me and we looked in the corner and he had left a lot of food. He wasn't feeling right. We couldn't run him. I would never run a horse in a situation like that where you might get a poor performance and make him even sicker. We love him to death. We adore him. We had to do the right thing and scratch him. He's much better today. It's just the second day, but we are optimistic. We'll do a lot of tests on him. I'm very confident he'll snap out of this."



Pin Up Betty captured her second graded stakes win under the Twin Spires with a late-running victory in the GIII Old Forester Mint Julep Stakes Sunday. The 5-1 shot was unhurried from the start and settled slightly off mid-pack while racing three wide on the first turn. Charlene's Dream was unchallenged on the front end, taking the field through fractions of :23.75, :47.45 and 1:11.35 and turned for home two lengths in front, but Pin Up Betty made rapid progress on the bend and closed powerfully down the center of the course. She overtook the pacesetter inside the final furlong and strode home in stakes record time of 1:40.55, eclipsing the mark of 1:40.70 set by Quite a Bride in 2007.

"I really enjoy riding this filly--she's just a fun horse to ride," said winning jockey Luis Saez. "She tries hard every time. I think she liked the firm ground here today and seems like she really enjoys this turf course."

Pin Up Betty won back-to-back nine-furlong races over the Churchill lawn last spring, breaking her maiden after a string of four runner-up efforts May 9 before winning the June 1

GIII Regret Stakes. She was winless in six starts since, but was beaten just a neck when second last time out in the May 3 GII Churchill Distaff Turf Mile.

"She likes to be on the outside of horses, so even though we lost a little position early, it probably worked out for the best," said winning trainer Mike Maker. "We didn't get the best of the photo last time but thankfully we did today."

Kirk Wycoff's Three Diamonds Farm purchased I'm Betty G for \$150,000 at the 2016 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May Sale of 2-Year-Olds in Training. She won three stakes races and was three times graded-placed in the farm's colors. Also the dam of stakes winner and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint runner-up Governor Sam (Improbable), the 11-year-old mare has a 2-year-old filly by City of Light who sold for \$500,000 at this year's OBS Spring sale. Her 2024 foal by Jackie's Warrior died and she was barren when bred back to Constitution last year. While carrying Governor Sam, she sold for \$275,000 to Stoneriggs Farm at the 2021 Keeneland November sale.





MOORE CHARMED BY WOOTTON BASSETT'S PRIX DU JOCKEY CLUB HERO CAMILLE PISSARRO



Camille Pissarro | Scoop Dyga

A seemingly wide-open renewal of Chantilly's G1 Qatar Prix du Jockey Club ultimately produced the most straightforward outcome as Ballydoyle's **Camille Pissarro** prevailed as the 12-5 favourite. Drawn against the rail, one of the stable's abundance of Wootton Bassett colts only had to follow the pace aided by the yard's **Trinity College** taking the shortest route.

Ryan Moore's only complication came in the closing stages as he needed to thread the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner through a gap no more than a horse's width but he had all the momentum with his mount having saved so much energy throughout. At the line, the sire's second Classic winner of 2025 had half a length to spare over Godolphin's **Cualificar**, Lope De Vega's G3 Prix la Force and G3 Prix de Guiche-winning son of the Oaks heroine Qualify who covered himself in glory from stall 12.

Juddmonte's **Detain** was a neck away in third, making it a onethree for Wootton Bassett as it had been in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains when Camille Pissarro had been two places behind stablemate Henri Matisse. **Cont. p3**

UNBEATEN MIDAK TO BE SUPPLEMENTED FOR BETFRED DERBY

"He did everything right today and Aidan had him in a beautiful frame of mind," Moore said after steering his second

Prix du Jockey Club winner and first for Ballydoyle. "Fair play to Christophe [Soumillon], he said he'd have no problem with the trip and he showed nice acceleration there. He put them away."

Only the elite Prix du Jockey Club winners are able to make a successful winning debut over six furlongs in April of their juvenile season and that is what Camille Pissarro did in the Naas maiden now synonymous with the stable. Like the subsequent Group winners River Tiber and Aesop's Fables before him and

All of those outings were at or around six furlongs, which if on pedigree seemed his bag in reality was too sharp for this burgeoning mile-to-a-mile-and-a-quarter prospect. Trying his

best to deal with the heat of the precocity tests of the Coventry, Gimcrack and Anglesey, he was finally able to express himself on the Arc card where he outstayed Rashabar, Field Of Gold and Henri Matisse. Like Giant's Causeway all those years ago, he was asked to race against his elders in The Curragh's Listed Gladness Stakes first time up this season and moved forward from that comeback to fill the frame and the eye with his staying effort in the Poulains.

As the overhead showed, the start could not have worked out any better for Ballydoyle with

Trinity College allowed to forge a lead and the favourite untroubled as he worked into his slipstream. **Cont. p4**

> had a lot of belief in this horse-we thought he'd win the Coventry last year so to get him to win a Jockey Club is a tremendous effort by all the team. He's a beautiful-looking horse who's always shown plenty and will improve and get better."

> Aidan O'Brien had been swayed to make the step up in trip by Christophe Soumillon, who had ridden the winner in the Lagardere and the Poulains, and was quick to pay tribute to the jockey who was on Detain this time. "Christophe was delighted with him last time and

"This is a very important race and he's now a very important horse," he added. "He's a perfect, big, powerful, black horse by Wootton Bassett and over time, he has toughened up. What a ride Ryan gave him--he had a lovely draw and even though he had that and has that class, I don't think Ryan could have waited any longer. He was prepared to wait and ride him to get the distance, as we weren't sure beforehand. All races are open to him, as a mile is no problem and there is the Eclipse."

William Buick said of the runner-up, "I ended up in a nice position and he did everything I asked of him really. The winner's a good horse, as we all know, and Cualificar will possibly get a little bit further. He'll possibly get an Arc prep now and he does have the quality."

Godolphin's representative Louise Benard echoed those sentiments. "It's very promising going forward.

He's entered in the [July 13 G1] Grand Prix de Paris, but we'll have to see how he comes out of this race and the decision lies with André Fabre," she said. "William said the horse had a great temperament and was really straightforward during the race, so it's a very nice second place behind a very good colt."

Juddmonte's Barry Mahon said of Detain, "It was a very good performance and we're really happy. Christophe [Soumillon] told us he believed in his chances for a few strides, so we have a lot to look forward to this season. The 2,000-metre trip suits him

perfectly and we could even consider 2,400 metres. He'll have a short break, as he's had a busy start to the season."

The Aga Khan Studs racing manager Nemone Routh was delighted with the efforts of the fifth and sixth Azimpour and Ridari. "We're very happy with Azimpour. His draw didn't help, but he produced a very good final straight," she said. "He came home strongly, but probably just a bit too late. I think he was the best finisher from the outside in the whole race. Looking ahead, I think he'll be better on softer ground, so he'll probably be more effective later in the year. He's entered in the Grand Prix de Paris, but we'll have to reassess, because the track is often a bit too firm for him at that time of year."

"As for Ridari, he doesn't really have any excuses. We're wondering if he truly stays the 2,100 metres," she said. "Based on the Poule d'Essai form, he should have been just behind the first few but today, he didn't have the speed to finish off. He lacked something at the end. Maybe the distance is simply too long for him."

Pedigree Notes

Camille Pissarro, who becomes Wootton Bassett's second Jockey Club winner after Almanzor in 2016, was in no way guaranteed to stay this far on immediate pedigree given the record of his half-siblings. Cont. p6

The family includes another Coronation Cup heroine in Rizeena by Wootton Bassett's sire Iffraaj) and Kingman's G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas-winning sensation Field Of Gold. Entreat's 2-year-old filly by Dark Angel topped the Tattersalls December Yearling Sale when selling for 900,000gns to Henry Lascelles.

GODSPEED TOO STRONG IN THE SANDRINGHAM by Tom Frary



Godspeed's finishing sectionals in the G3 Prix de la Grotte showed us that she was a class act and Peter Bradley's colour-bearer confirmed that in Sunday's G2 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly. This was effectively won at the break, with Christophe Soumillon instantly getting a length on the inexperienced favourite **Vadinska** and able to sit in mid-division while that peer was anchored out the back.

Slipping by the leader **Eponine** with ease passing two out, the Carlos and Yann Lerner-trained 7-2 second favourite was in cruise control from there en route to a length verdict over that daughter of Tamayuz. Time Test's **Betty Clover** was a length further away in third, with the 9-10 market-leader Vadinska ending up fifth in a race that proved a write-off in all areas bar the educational.

Third in the Grotte, having finished faster than the winner Zarigana with a :33.09 final three-furlong sectional, Godspeed had to endure a horror draw in 13 back at ParisLongchamp for the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches. In the event, she was a respectable eighth beaten just over four lengths having yet again demonstrated her lethal finishing kick with only Zarigana faster from three out.

Connections are pondering a tilt at the G1 Prix de Diane now. "We had plenty of confidence, as we know she has a lot of talent," Yann Lerner said of the winner, who was sent off the 7-2 second favourite. "The Diane is an option, but first I need to talk with all the partners. She is a very easy filly and it's a question of whether she can use that turn of foot over 2,100." Cont. p7

Pedigree Notes

Whether Godspeed, who is the third Group winner for her second-crop sire, will stay the 10 1/2-furlong trip of the Diane is an unknown with her dam Mary's Precedent at her best over a mile when winning the Listed Prix de Bagatelle here. Her other black-type daughter, the Listed-placed Mary's France, found that trip her maximum but was by the faster sire Acclamation.

Stamina clues come in the form of the G3 Prix Cleopatre winner and G1 Prix Saint-Alary runner-up Crown Princesse by Zarak and in the third dam Allwaki's GI Del Mar Oaks-placed daughter Premiere Creation. This is the family of the Arc and Prix du Jockey Club hero Sottsass and the multiple Grade I winner Sistercharlie who were both by sires who plied their trade over sprint trips. Knowing what they had in Godspeed, Mary's Precedent's 2-year-old filly by Iffraaj was also snapped up by the Lerners for €105,000 at Arqana Deauville August.

ADLERFLUG'S LORDANO PREVAILS IN BADEN-BADEN THRILLER

Last term's G2 Grosser Hansa-Preis hero **Lordano** (Adlerflug) had been strategically calibrated by two prior starts this term and added to his burgeoning palmares with a narrow victory in Sunday's G2 Grosser Preis von Tattersalls, formerly known as the Grosser Preis der Badischen Wirtschaft, at Baden-Baden.

Lordano, never out of the first four in 15 prior stars, also ran third in 2024's G1 Preis von Europa and went past the judge in fourth first time, but was shuffled back to sixth--several lengths adrift of the clear leader **Mansour** (Tai Chi)--turning onto the back straight. Scrubbed along to close rounding the home turn, the 7-2 third choice weaved a charmed passage between rivals to make his challenge approaching the final furlong and stayed on in resolute fashion to deny **Wilko** (Mastercraftsman) and **Queimados** (**Sea** The Stars) by a head and a half-length after a thrilling three-way drive.

"The race didn't quite go according to how we'd planned, but that was absolutely awesome," beamed winning rider Leon Wolff. "He is such a genuine and game horse, he gave 120 per cent in the closing stages and coming through to win the race in the way that he did was like flying and a rollercoaster ride all in one."

Trainer Marcel Weiss added, "I was also keeping one eye on [stablemate] Narrativo, who was unlucky turning into the home straight and lost his stride trying to keep pace with Lordano. Lordano has never disappointed us and I was quite hopeful after his run at Hoppegarten [in last month's G2 Oleander-Rennen], which did him the world of good. He's a great horse, just like his sire, and he is a great horse to have in the stable."

She didn't get to the racetrack, but he said she would be a good filly. I asked Christophe about going further and he said a mile and a half is good, that she relaxes well and accelerates well and not to change things at the minute."

"She has options and if she came out of it well she could go for the [G2] Ribblesdale and if she needed a bit more time she could go for the [G1] Irish Oaks," he added. "There's also a race in France a bit later on so she has plenty of options and let's see how she comes out of it, but she looks to have a big future."

MONTEILLE CAUSES UPSET IN THE GROS-

CHENE by Tom Frary

One of the least likely in the line-up for Sunday's G3 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly, Gerard Augustin-Normand's **Monteille** belied expectations and defied the odds to win with authority. Starting at 29-1 with only bits of form to commend her, the homebred, who had joined Mario Baratti from Pascal Bary in the winter, had two cards up her sleeve. They were her liking for this track at which she had captured the G3 Prix Texanita last term at a similarly large tote return and the fact that this was only her second attempt at five furlongs, with the first a respectable one when beaten just over a length in ParisLongchamp's G3 Prix du Petit Couvert in September.

Helped by the stalls antics and resulting significant ground giveaway by the 1-2 favourite **Kind Of Blue**, as well as the suicidal pace set by **Ponntos**, she was able to grind away towards the rail and once in front under Cristian Demuro a furlong from home was always going to be too strong. At the line, there was a 1 3/4-length margin to the even-bigger outsider **Lesslepasser** as the main fancies felt the heat.

"She was very unlucky in the Petit Couvert, where she never saw daylight and would have been in the first three and might have won," Augustin-Normand's racing manager John Hammond explained. "She was over the top last autumn and needed her first run back. She looks like a filly that is coming to herself and has a good shape about her. She is in the [G1] King Charles III at Ascot and it is now a possibility, let's see."

Connections of Kind Of Blue were happy to draw a line under this non-event and trainer James Fanshawe said of the G1 British Champions Sprint winner, "Looking at it from a positive angle, he's been out, had a run and blown the cobwebs away. All being well, we'll go to Ascot. It wasn't ideal, but at least he's

got a run under his belt. We'll make sure it doesn't happen again."

Said Princess Zahra, "When Midak won his last race, I asked Francis [-Henri Graffard] 'this is a Jockey Club horse isn't it' and he said 'we can't as you have another runner for that race and there is also another horse in our stable'.

"I then asked 'what are you thinking of doing' and he just looked at me and replied, 'Epsom'. We all thought it would be lovely to have a runner in the race and he has ticked all the boxes and there is no reason not to run him."

The late Aga Khan won his first Derby with Shergar in 1981, with Shahrastani following in 1986 and Kahyasi in 1988. Midak's broodmare sire Sinndar stamped his name on the Blue Riband in 2000, with Harzand bolting up under Pat Smullen in 2016.

Said Graffard, who will run Calandagan (Gleneagles) in the G1 Coronation Cup the day prior, "The Derby at Epsom is a dream race for me, I have walked the course and my grandfather would always talk to me about the Epsom Derby.

"We have this horse Midak who needed supplementing for either the Prix du Jockey Club or Derby, so I said to Princess Zahra 'you already have two runners in the Jockey Club, so why not give it a go in the Derby'.

"British racing has very kindly named the Derby in honour of His Highness the Aga Khan this year, so we will take our chance."

Runner-up to Kimi Rey over this course and distance last month before finishing third behind the Wertheimers' No Tune over six back here in mid-May, Graft lived up to his title to break his maiden in this unexpected black-type breakthrough. Henry's son was very courageous and the horse has done the job for him--this is a great reward."

The winner's dam Preobrajenska is a half to Oasis Dream's G1 Prix Morny heroine and G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas runner-up Pretty Pollyanna, with this being the Gredley family of the Oaks and Irish Oaks heroine User Friendly. Her yearling colt is by Naval Crown.

Earning **TDN Rising Star** status with an emphatic win over this course and distance in September, Rayevka was sent to the G1 Cheveley Park Stakes 12 days later and unsurprisingly found the experience too much at that stage. Fourth on her return in the G3 Prix Sigy back over this track and trip in April, the homebred dazzled this time in a deep race for its kind. **Cont. p13**

Restrained early towards rear, she tanked her way into contention approaching the final furlong and let fly from there for an impressive success.

This performance was made all the more special by the clock readings, with four consecutive sub-11-second splits including a brilliant penultimate one of :10.72 when all her rivals were flagging. The operation's racing manager Nemone Routh was not holding back. "She's really good," she ssaid. "She pulled too hard on her comeback and so we really wanted her to let go of the bit today, as she's a sprinter who has that final burst of speed."

"We are happy to see her show what she can do," she added. "We'll stay between 1,000 and 1,200 metres. Mickael [Barzalona] says she can go to the front, that she has the speed to do it, but we wanted her to be able to learn today. She isn't entered in the Commonwealth Cup, so we will have to see whether we supplement or not. Francis-Henri has always held her in high esteem, which is why she raced in the Cheveley Park Stakes last year."

Rayevka's dam is Holy Roman Emperor's dual Listed-placed Rayisa, a half to Dark Angel's G3 Athasi Stakes winner Rehana from the family of Indian Ridge's G3 Killavullan Stakes winner and G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas runner-up Rayeni and last year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine Rouhiya by Lope De Vega. Her 2-year-old colt is by Sea The Moon.

The February-foaled homebred bay, whose second dam is G3 Meld Stakes third Bea Remembered (Doyen), is half to a yearling colt by Thunder Moon and hails from the family of Group 2-winning G1 Deutsches Derby runner-up Taishan (Armistice Day). "He is a very nice two-yearold, we've always liked him and we fancied him to run a big race on debut at the Curragh, where he ran well," said trainer David Marnane. "That race has worked out well and he has improved. He is quite lazy, so I'd say there is plenty of improvement left in him. He has the size to be a three-year-old and he isn't a horse to be getting lofty about yet, so we'll pick our spot with him. He should improve a lot though, and I think he will end up being a very good horse. When he works at home, he works real well and is the perfect model." Gavoo is the latest of two foals and lone scorer out of a half-sister to the stakes-placed Laurel Canyon (Nyquist). Descendants of the April-foaled bay's second dam, dual stakes-winning GI Las Virgenes runner-up and GI Hollywood Starlet third High Heeled Hope (Salt Lake), include Grade III-winning GI Test Stakes runner-up Sweet Hope (Lemon Drop Kid) and the dual Grade III-placed stakes winner Zanotti (Gio Ponti). "Conor Quirke and his wife Kathryn, from Fermoy, own her and have been very good to me," McLoughlin said. "They got in touch last year and sent me two 2-year-olds this year, so I couldn't thank them enough. Kathryn has a big love for horses and when this filly wasn't making her €30,000 reserve last September, she dug her heels in to keep her, and how right she was. We thought a lot of her and we've always liked her, but I thought inexperience might get the better of her. Ben [Coen] said when he put his stick down, she put her head down and dug in. She will strengthen up and would be suited to six furlongs on a straight track, or maybe seven with a bend. We had the G2 Airlie Stud Stakes in mind for her in July so that could be looked at now, to hopefully get black type." Magny Cours is the 10th of 11 foals and sixth scorer produced by Listed Prix de la Vallee d'Auge third Ares Choix (Choisir), herself a half-sister to G3 Chartwell Fillies' Stakes winner Emerald Star (Mount Nelson) out of stakes-winning G3 Prix de Psyche third Ares Vallis (Caerleon). The February-foaled bay, a half-sister to recent G3 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas) victrix Beenham (Havana Grey) and a yearling filly by King Of Change, hails from the family of G1 Prix Ganay heroine Trillion (Hail To Reason) and G1 Australian Derby hero Angel Of Truth (Animal Kingdom). CROIX DU NORD BOUNCES BACK IN TOKYO

YUSHUN by Heather Anderson

After losing his unbeaten record when second in April's G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas), **Croix Du Nord** was on something of a recovery mission, and he delivered when it counted, running out a three-quarter length winner of the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) on Sunday. **Masquerade Ball** (Duramente), third in the Satsuki Sho, charged home second, 1 1/2 lengths to the good of **Shohei** (Saturnalia). **Cont. p16**

G1 Tokyo Yushun Cont.

The betting public felt the 2400 metres of the G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) was well within the son of Kitasan Black's scope, and they duly made him the 11-10 favourite. On a quest to be the fifth Derby winner for Sunday Racing, the eventual winner raced in a stalking fourth behind the dueling leaders **Satono Shining** (Kizuna) and **Ho O Atman** (Duramente) with Sho Hei in third.

Ho O Atman took the lead outright once the field had entered the backstretch, and Yuichi Kitamura remained patient aboard Croix Du North. Trying to steal a march on his rivals, Ho O Atman opened up a double-digit margin at one point and still had a huge gap back to Satono Shining on the far turn. That lead shrank rapidly once the pacesetter reached the 500-metre mark and a cluster of horses appeared poised with their challenges. Churning away 100 metres later, Croix Du Nord found the front 1 1/2 furlongs from home and he held firm as the rallying Masquerade Ball came flying for second and a game Shohei ran third. Satono Shining held on four fourth, a neck back of the third-place finisher.

"I felt it was my responsibility to make Croix du Nord a Derby winner ever since the colt won the Hopeful Stakes, so my feeling now is that I am relieved to have accomplished by mission," said jockey Yuichi Kitamura. "The whole process since the win last year, including our runner-up effort in the Satsuki Sho, was a meaningful and precious learning experience for me. The colt felt great today and I was able to come into the race with every confidence so victory itself came as no surprise to me."


A winner of his first three starts at two including the G2 Hai Nisai Stakes and G1 Hopeful Stakes, Croix Du Nord was second in the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) to **Museum Mile** (Leontes) in April. That rival finished sixth on Sunday.

Pedigree Notes

Kitasan Black is best known as the sire of globetrotting wunderkind Equinox, but Croix Du Nord paved new ground on Sunday with his victory. Equinox was second in the 2022 Japanese Derby, the same position as the son of Black Tide's other Group 1 winner Sol Oriens, who placed in the race in 2023. Overall, the Shadai Stallion Station resident has sired 13 stakes winners with 10 of them at the group/graded level.

Rising Cross (Cape Cross) last graced the sales ring when she was a 73,333gns buy-back when offered by John Best Racing Stables during the Tattersalls Autumn HIT Sale of 2005. A winner of the G3 Prestige Stakes at two, the dark bay won the G2 Park Hill Stakes at three, and was also second in the G1 Oaks and third in the G1 Irish Oaks. Kept in training at five, she was third in the GIII Bewitch Stakes in the U.S. and retired with earnings of over \$500,000.

Croix Du Nord is one of 13 foals out of Rising Cross, 10 of which have run with seven winners among them. Besides the Japanese Derby hero, her best is the Manhattan Café filly Earthrise, who was placed thrice at Group 3 level in Japan. Rising Cross's latest offspring is a juvenile full-brother to the winner named Charing Cross, and a yearling filly by Satono Diamond. This is the extended family of G1 Derby winners Morston and Blakeney.


