SOVEREIGNTY RULES AGAIN IN BELMONT STAKES

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY -- There's absolutely no doubt who the ruler of the 3-year-old division is now.

Just like he did in the GI Kentucky Derby, Godolphin homebred **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) collared **Journalism** (Curlin) in the stretch, and powered on by to capture the 157th running of the GI Belmont Stakes with authority.

It was the same first three finishers across the line on the first Saturday in May with the blue-blooded **Baeza** (McKinzie) up for third once again.

The Belmont Stakes Racing Festival was held at Saratoga Race Course for the second straight year while construction of the new Belmont Park continues downstate.


"It was pretty much like the Derby," winning rider Junior Alvarado said. "He was very exceptional today. I couldn't believe how much horse I had the whole way around today."

Off as the 5-2 second-choice after his much-discussed bypassing of the GI Preakness Stakes--won in dramatic fashion by Journalism--Sovereignty was away in good order from his inside draw and found himself sitting *much* closer to the front than usual, racing in a joint second as **'TDN Rising Star' Rodriguez** (Authentic) clicked off an opening quarter in :23.42.

Sovereignty cruised along beautifully in an inside fourth with Journalism, favored in all three legs of Triple Crown and off at 2-1 this time, racing to his outside as the half-mile went up in :47.60.

Journalism made the first move on the top two of Rodriguez and **Crudo** (Justify) and rolled up three deep beneath Umberto Rispoli approaching the quarter pole.

Rispoli tried to win the race right there and Journalism kicked for home as the one to catch.

Sovereignty was steered out by Alvarado, beginning to make a flashy move of his own at this point, and the rematch that everyone was waiting to see between the Kentucky Derby winner and Preakness winner--the roar of the 46,243 in attendance on a steamy day at the Spa said at all--was set.

The drama, however, was short lived.

Sovereignty lengthened that massive stride of his down the center of the course and was well on his way to another brilliant performance. The winning margin was three lengths, with another 3 1/2 lengths back to the aforementioned third-place finisher.

The final time over a track that began the day as a sea of slop following heavy morning and early afternoon rain, but ended up harrowed and good, was 2:00.69.

Due to the configuration of Saratoga's main track, the Belmont Stakes was once again contested at 1 1/4 miles rather than the traditional distance of 1 1/2 miles.

"This is home," winning Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott said. "It's the race we were pointing for after the Derby and fortunately it worked out very well. I'm sure we would have taken some criticism had he gotten beat today and he hadn't run in the Preakness, but it worked out." **Cont. p5**





"The horse was good. Junior rode him well. He had a lot of confidence in him and when he cut him loose the horse responded and got the job done."

Mott continued, "I feel we beat a good field of horses. Journalism is a really good horse. I've watched him here this last week and I've looked at him--he's in good form, he looks great, his hair is good and his weight is good. I think he was ready to run today and he ran a good race, you know. Sovereignty was good enough to run him down and get the job done."

The Belmont was Sovereignty's fourth race this season.

A jaw-dropping, last-to-first maiden winner in the GIII Street

Sense S. at third asking last fall, he was an impossible winner in his belated sophomore return (due to a fever) in the GII Coolmore Fountain of Youth S. Mar. 1 over a Gulfstream Park surface very well-known for not playing kindly to his come-from-behind running style.

Sovereignty lost little in defeat there four weeks later, completing the exacta in the GI Curlin Florida Derby prior to his heroics in Louisville.

His 2-year-old form also included a debut fourth in the always-loaded Travers day maiden at Saratoga, which was highlighted in these same pages in our 'Second Chances' series.

Pedigree Notes:

Have a day, Into Mischief and Spendthrift Farm. With three Grade I races contested at the Spa Saturday, Into Mischief sired the winners of two, while his son, Maximus Mischief, who stands alongside the six-time leading stallion, sired the winner of the other. Does it get better than that?

Into Mischief tallied his 25th career Grade I winner in Saratoga's GI Woody Stephens Stakes Saturday afternoon with 'TDN Rising Star' Patch Adams, then barely took a deep breath before adding his first Belmont winner with Sovereignty, who also gave him his third Kentucky Derby win in six years just five weeks ago. Into Mischief, who started the hard way and is now seeing his better books come to fruition, has 85 graded winners and 175 black-type winners.

The Spendthrift stalwart may be the undisputed king of sires these days, but it's also hard to beat the late Bernardini as a broodmare sire. Currently ranked third by earnings among U.S.based broodmare sires of 2025, Bernardini has 113 stakes winners out of his daughters, including last year's 2-year-old filly champion Immersive (Nyquist)--who, like Sovereignty, races as a Godolphin homebred--and three graded winners by Into Mischief. Bernardini, the champion 3-year-old colt of 2006 and winner of that year's GI Preakness Stakes, also was a homebred for the operation and stood his entire career at Darley.

John Ferguson purchased Crowned, the dam of Sovereignty, for \$1.2 million on behalf of Godolphin at the 2014 Keeneland September yearling sale. Unraced, the mare produced four foals with a year off between each: the winning mare Jane Grey (Into Mischief), who has 2024 and 2025 Medaglia d'Oro fillies; the placed 5-year-old mare Misintention (into Mischief); Sovereignty; and a yearling colt by Nyquist. Crowned passed away in 2024. -- Jill Williams

JOURNALISM'S CAMP NOT THROWING IN THE TOWEL By Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY -- The party was just getting started in the cramped winner's circle at Saratoga Race Course. It almost seemed like half of the 46,243 that came out to Saratoga to watch the GI Belmont Stakes were in there. Well, let's not get carried away.

But it was jammed, and everyone was singing the praises of **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief), the Most Valuable Player in the second annual Belmont Stakes Festival at Saratoga.

Even those who were vanquished by Sovereignty had to give a congratulatory nod to the Godolphin-owned, Bill Mott-trained and Junior Alvarado-ridden champions.

While Sovereignty was getting his flowers, connections of the second-place finisher, Journalism (Curlin), the 2-1 favorite, had to swallow another tough loss. The three-length defeat came on the heels of a $1\,1/2$ -length defeat in the GI Kentucky Derby.

"I think you can call it a rivalry," Aron Wellman, the President and Founder of Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, who head the ownership group of Journalism, said outside the winner's circle. "But the scoreboard reads, 2-0."

Michael McCarthy, Journalism's thoughtful trainer, paused after speaking to a handful of writers and listened to a throng of fans who were shouting mostly good things.

"We will get him home," McCarthy he said to them, "feed him some carrots and maybe come back here in August (for the Grade I Travers)."

Journalism had earned favoritism after his heroic and brave win in the GI Preakness Stakes three weeks ago in Baltimore. While Journalism was playing pinball through the stretch at Pimlico and completing an improbable victory, Sovereignty was resting in Mott's barn at the Oklahoma Training Track.

Waiting for the Belmont, Waiting for Journalism.

The debate would start as soon as the Belmont was finished. Did Sovereignty have an advantage because he was fresher? Journalism was the only horse to compete in all three legs of this year's Triple Crown.

McCarthy and Wellman were not going to use that as an excuse.

"I am very pleased with my horse's effort," McCarthy said. "I could not be prouder of him. You would have to think that a horse of (Sovereignty's) caliber gets five weeks between races ... I just thought our horse ran very well."

It appeared as though Journalism might just even the score when he and jockey Umberto Rispoli disposed of leaders **Rodriguez** (Authentic) and **Crudo** (Justify) and roared into the lead heading into the stretch of the 1 1/4-mile race.

But Sovereignty was gaining momentum, and he was closing. Fast.

"It was reminiscent of the Kentucky Derby," McCarthy said.
"We opened up at the top of the lane and I saw those
(Godolphin) royal blue silks and I knew it would be the two of
them all over again."

Rispoli, back outside the jockey's room, shook his head when asked about the race. He was disappointed in the result, of course, but not in his horse.

Journalism, he said, gave him everything he had. He refused to say the colt was tired, the rigors of the three hard efforts in five Triple Crown races finally getting to him.

"I had the two targets," he said. "When there was a quarter of a mile to go, it was time to go. He responded. He fought. He just got beat. I never felt a lack of energy from him."

If there was any nit-picking to be had for the trip, maybe it was Journalism having a bit of a stumble coming out of the gate. No one was saying it cost him.

For the second time in five weeks, Journalism just got beat by the better--and fresher--horse.

McCarthy, Wellman and Rispoli hope there is another chapter in the rivalry and hope it comes sooner than later.

"We are probably going to face each other probably until the end of the season," Rispoli said. "It will be a good battle; it will be good for the sport."

"Listen," Wellman said, "This horse has danced every dance and has shown up every single time. Everyone hopes these two horses can face off again the second half of the season."

McCarthy, before disappearing into the crowd, talked of seeing Sovereignty again. Maybe in the Travers, hopefully at the end of the year in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic on his home court at Del Mar.

"Let's hope everybody stays happy and healthy and we will see him in November in our backyard," he said. "I can't say enough good things about that horse. I can't say enough good things about my horse."

ALL THE RAGE: RAGING TORRENT A FRONT-RUNNING, UPSET WINNER OF THE MET

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. -- Raging Torrent (Maximus Mischief) continued his ascent with a powerful, 2 1/2-length victory over heavily favored 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness (City of Light) in the 'Win and You're In' GI Hill 'n' Dale Metropolitan Handicap at Saratoga. Just a Touch (Justify) held third over second-choice White Abarrio (Race Day).

"(Winning the Met Mile) is something that I never dreamt of just because it seems so far-fetched, but a horse like Raging Torrent is kind of a once-in-a-lifetime kind of horse," winning trainer Doug O'Neill said. "He's got speed. He's got stamina. He's got class. He has no problem shipping and it's just a wonderful feeling."

Overlooked at odds of 8-1 following wins in the GI Malibu S. at Santa Anita Dec. 26 and the G2 Godolphin Mile at Meydan Apr. 5, the Yuesheng Zhang and Craig Dado colorbearer cleared the field of five from his outside draw beneath Frankie Dettori over the sloppy and sealed going.

He showed the way through fractions of :23.92 and :46.86 with 3-4 choice Fierceness, a last-out winner of the GII Alysheba S. in track-record time at Churchill Downs, in hot pursuit in second after brushing with White Abarrio at the start exiting from his rail draw.

Fierceness drew up alongside Raging Torrent approaching the quarter pole and it looked like a two-horse race from there with the former appearing to be going the better of the two.

Raging Torrent still had plenty left in the tank, however, and turned back Fierceness to win going away for his third straight victory.

Raging Torrent, a game winner of Del Mar's GII Pat O'Brien S. last summer, had a three-race winning streak snapped when seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint last fall.

"He's been in great form," O'Neill said. "We intentionally gave him that time off after the Malibu and were shooting for the Godolphin Mile after that. Usually when you make a plan, God laughs, especially in this business, but Raging Torrent is just one of those unique horses who you can make a plan (for) and he comes through and does it. Incredible."

O'Neill added, "If he comes out of it good, the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile will be a logical goal and maybe a race between now and then. The plan is to take him to California on Tuesday and play it by ear."

Fierceness, previously three-for-three at the Spa, led by a heart-stopping win in last summer's GI Travers S., will be pointed for the GI Whitney S. at Saratoga Aug. 2, per trainer Todd Pletcher.

"Actually, Johnny (Velazquez) said he broke so sharply he kind of hit the gate and came back with some blood on his mouth," Pletcher said. "Then the first sixteenth of a mile was pretty rough. They were bouncing around trying to get position. After that he got into the exact position that we wanted, he just couldn't get by the horse on the lead." **Cont. p9**

Pedigree Notes:

Raging Torrent is one of three graded winners and the lone top-level winner for Maximus Mischief, a Spendthrift-based son of Into Mischief. He is the only starter from his winning dam Violent Wave (Violence), who was claimed by Equinox, Inc. for just \$6,250 out of her career finale at Gulfstream Park in 2018.

Violent Wave, a \$150,000 KEESEP yearling and a half-sister to GSW The Nth Degree (Distorted Humor), was offered with Raging Torrent in utero at the 2021 Keeneland January Sale, but was led out unsold on a bid of \$27,000. Raging Torrent was himself bought back for the same price by breeders Rodney Winkler and Alfonso Mazzetti at Keeneland September in 2022, and it was Mark Davis's name (Steve Rothblum, agent) on the ticket when he fetched \$75,000 at the 2023 OBS April Sale (:10).

The first daughter of Violence to produce a Grade I winner, Violent Wave is also the dam of the unraced 3-year-old colt Contra Mundum (Honor A.P.), a \$55,000 RNA at KEESEP in 2023, and the 2-year-old filly Layan (Collected), a \$47,000 KEENOV weanling.

Violent Wave was bought back for \$575,000 in foal to Up to the Mark at the 2024 KEENOV sale.

'RISING STAR' PATCH ADAMS SCOOTS CLEAR IN WOODY STEPHENS by Alan Carasso

'TDN Rising Star' Patch Adams (Into Mischief) took his record at one-turn trips to three wins from four tries with a clear-cut victory in Saturday's GI Woody Stephens Stakes at a drying-out and freshly harrowed Saratoga Race Course.

Hard-ridden from gate four by Luis Saez, the bay colt took up a prominent early spot as GII Pat Day Mile upsetter **Macho Music** (Maclean's Music) cut out the fractions in advance of **Madaket Road** (Quality Road) down the backstretch. Under constant urging as longshot **T Kraft** (Connect) went through underneath him in third, Patch Adams was off the bridle to pick up as Macho Music and Madaket Road continued to lock horns on the pointy end.

Back into the bit passing the quarter pole, Patch Adams loomed up three off the inside under a full head of steam in upper stretch, took command with about a furlong to travel and came away late to take it by 2 1/4 convincing lengths as the lukewarm 17-5 favorite. Fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Big Truzz (Justify), in a bit of traffic at the half-mile marker, came on late to take third ahead of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and Eclipse Award winner Citizen Bull (Into Mischief).

A debut third as odds-on at Keeneland last October, Patch Adams was accorded 'Rising Star' honors when decimating a field of Churchill maidens by better than 10 lengths, earning a 98 Beyer that was 10 points higher than that achieved by First Resort (Uncle Mo) in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes later in the program, albeit over a sprint trip. That effort suggested that the sky was the limit, but after fourth-place efforts as the favorite in the GIII Southwest Stakes and GIII Tampa Bay Derby going long, he was cut back to a 6 1/2-furlong allowance on the Derby undercard May 3 and he responded with a handy 2 1/4-length defeat of Big Truzz.

"We tried to mess it up by trying to run him long a couple of times, but you always try for that and you have to realize where your success lays," said WinStar President, CEO and Racing Manager Elliott Walden. "He showed that he's a seven-furlong horse the day he broke his maiden and has been telling us what he wants to do."

While trainer Brad Cox was less willing to commit, Walden indicated a return to Saratoga for the GI H. Allen Jerkens Stakes in August was probable for Patch Adams.

Pedigree Notes:

Patch Adams is the 25th top-level winner for his sire and his fifth out of a mare by WinStar's legendary and much-missed Distorted Humor, including 'Rising Star' and current WinStar stallion Life Is Good, Jerkens-winning sire Practical Joke, the aforementioned Citizen Bull and this year's GI Curlin Florida Derby hero Tappan Street. Goldencents is out of a mare by Banker's Gold, like Distorted Humor a son of Forty Niner. Into Mischief is now the sire of 175 black-type winners, 85 at the graded/group level worldwide.

WinStar purchased Patch Adams's stakes-winning third dam for \$150,000 in foal to Awesome Again at Keeneland November in 2001 and bred eight winners from her, including G1 Dubai World Cup hero Well Armed (Tiznow); Grade III winner Witty (Distorted Humor)--the dam of GSW Bombard (War Front)--and the dam of GI La Troienne Stakes heroine Played Hard (Into Mischief).

Well Armed's full-sister Life Well Lived was represented as recently as Friday by GIII Belmont Gold Cup winner and 'TDN Rising Star' Parchment Party (Constitution), and she is also the dam of GISW and Japanese-based sire American Patriot (War Front) and MGSP Muqtaser, a full-brother to Well Humored. Once sold to Bobby Flay for \$1.25 million at Keeneland November in 2017, Life Well Lived was purchased by Machmer Hall for \$360,000 the same day Parchment Party was named a 'Rising Star' at KEENOV in 2023 and delivered a full-brother to that Pin Oak-owned runner last season.

The last listed produce from Well Humored is Patch Adams's 2-year-old full-brother Wall Street, who breezed a half-mile at Churchill Downs in :50 flat on June 6.

BOOK'EM DANNO BACK TO WINNING WAYS IN THE TRUE NORTH by Alan Carasso

Winner of last year's GI Woody Stephens Stakes on this program and very game third in the GI H. Allen Jerkens Stakes, **Book'em Danno** (Bucchero) made the most of his third trip to Saratoga with a stalk and grind-it-out defeat of fellow elite-level winner **Mullikin** (Violence) in a high-class renewal of the GIII True North Stakes Saturday afternoon.

The 23-10 second choice--about \$5,000 behind favored **Nakatomi** (Firing Line), Book'em Danno left gate five without incident and was content to lay third through the opening exchanges, as **Concrete Glory** (Bodemeister) set a good pace in advance of Mullikin. The latter made his move early beneath Flavien Prat to claw his way to the front at about the midway point of the turn, but Paco Lopez had the move covered atop the New Jersey-bred Book'em Danno, and the two began to put a gap on their rivals nearing the stretch.

Despite the demanding pace--the half was a taxing :44.72 over the rain-affected going--Mullikin had a kick and remained in front, albeit narrowly, with a furlong to race. But Book'em Danno, who typically saves his best for a finish, wore his rival down late to take it by 1 1/4 lengths. Nakatomi, last year's GI A. G. Vanderbilt Handicap winner and a near-miss runner-up in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen when last seen Apr. 5, bombed the start and rushed up beneath Irad Ortiz, Jr., but never factored thereafter, finishing fifth.

"He's had some bad luck in his races where he got beat a head and a neck, but I really wasn't afraid of anybody today," said winning trainer Derek Ryan. "The six [furlongs] is a little short for him; six and a half, seven is his trip. [Jockey] Paco [Lopez] gave him a great ride. He loves to be on the outside. I've been preaching that for the last year, and I finally got someone who will do it for me. So, I was very happy. I said, 'Sit third, but make sure you're on the outside."

"He'll run on anything. Good horses, they said they'll run on a tin roof. He's just a good horse," Ryan added.

The unlucky runner-up in the GIII Perryville Stakes at Keeneland last October, Book'em Danno was arguably over the top when a slightly hampered fifth in the GII Cigar Mile Handicap Dec. 7 and connections called time on a season during which he bankrolled better than \$800,000. After being ruled out of trips to Saudi Arabia and Dubai in February and March, Book'em Danno resumed in a \$150,000 overnight handicap on Virginia Derby weekend, but when just two horses took him on, it meant that he had to be ridden atypically on top of the speed, and he left there knowing he'd had a race, covering the seven furlongs in 1:20.03. Part of that incredibly deep field for the GI Churchill Downs Stakes May 3, Book'em Danno was awkward for a stride or two in upper stretch, led between calls in deep stretch and settled for fourth, beaten a neck for all of it behind 'TDN Rising Star' Mindframe (Constitution). Pedigree Notes:

Book'em Danno is thus far the most decorated performer for his sire, who covered his first book of mares in New York in 2024 and now anchors the fledgling stallion operation at Ironhorse Stallions in Stillwater, about 20 miles south and east of Saratoga. Bucchero covered in excess of 185 mares this season.

Breeder Greg Kilka purchased the unraced Adorabella for \$14,000 in foal to Fast Anna at the 2020 Keeneland January Sale, and that foal, Girl Trouble, did her part in improving the page with a pair of juvenile stakes scores in 2022. When factoring in Book'em Danno's emergence in late 2023, the family became even more valuable, as the mare's then-yearling colt by Classic Empire topped the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic October sale on LC Racing's bid of \$135,000. That same operation added Adorabella to the fold when paying \$550,000 for the mare in foal to Medaglia d'Oro after she was supplemented to the Fasig-Tipton November Sale. Adorabella subsequently aborted that foal. Adorabella returned to the Darley superstar and produced a colt this past Apr. 1.

The stakes-placed second dam produced snythetic stakes winner Alydiva (Quality Road) and she is a daughter of Esprit d'Escalier, the dam of GSW & MGISP Gastronomical (Sunshine Forever). Alydorable was purchased by Thomas & Mitchell Bloodstock for \$5,000 at the 2023 Keeneland November Sale and foaled a filly by Sir Winston last May before being covered by Bucchero.

Nitrogen has shown a keen affinity for the turf, but apparently the homebred does not mind a bit the slop either. When the GII Wonder Again Stakes was taken off the grass before midday and downgraded to a Grade III, trainer Mark Casse considered an exit stage left, but instead the Hall of Famer chose to run his stable star despite the conditions. It all worked out.

Always entered on the grass, Nitrogen ran third in the GI Natalma Stakes at Woodbine last fall and was third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Del Mar. Turning the page, the newly-minted 3-year-old proceeded to rattle off four stakes wins in a row--Ginger Brew, GIII Florida Oaks, GII Appalachian and GII Edgewood.

Slammed at the windows to the tune of 40 cents on the dollar, the heavy favorite only had two other entries to contend after the scratches were reported. At the bell, Nitrogen tracked lightly-raced Bessie Abott up the backstretch, but around the far turn the talented filly started to make her move to the outside and from then on the race was essentially over as she cantered down the lane like it was a walk in the park.

"I have been on the phone over 50 times and about 25 were for [Nitrogen]." said trainer Mark Casse. "We were discussing should we scratch, what would we do, how would it set up? We finally said, well, we're just going to have to [do it]. So let's give it a try, let's find out now, so we did it and it worked out. One of the decisions made was we want her in this pattern, and I talk about it all the time. I've got her in a pattern and I didn't want to lose that.

"The crazy thing is, I told Jon Green this morning [that] she is better today than I've ever seen her in her life," he said. "That was another thing that made them say, 'Let's run.'"

Pedigree Notes:

Highly-decorated Darley stallion Medaglia d'Oro (by El Prado {Ire}) of course claims his share of celebrated female dirt runners from Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra to dual champion Songbird.

Tiffany Case was a \$320,000 purchase by D. J. Stable at the 2019 Keeneland November Sale while carrying her first foal—a filly named Love to Shop (Violence). That offspring became a stakes winner and multiple graded-placed campaigner for Repole Stable and St. Elias, who bought her for \$200,000 as a Keeneland yearling.

Nitrogen is Tiffany Case's second foal, while her third is a yearling filly by Gun Runner. A half-sister to GSW & GISP Talk Veuve to Me (Violence), Tiffany Case was not reported as bred for this past season. Delving into the Wonder Again winner's extended female family, Nitrogen's second dam is a full-sister to SW Winning Point. @campbellparlay

After two eye-catching wins to kick off her sophomore season, CSLR Racing Partners LLC's Cash Call went to the post the favorite in Saturday's GIII Summertime Oaks at Santa Anita, despite never previously tasting stakes company nor running further than six furlongs. She passed each test with ease, digging in to slip by her stablemate, GIII Santa Ysabel Stakes third Howin, in the stretch while never letting 'TDN Rising Star' Our Moonlight close.

On the board in two sprints at two, Cash Call took six months to reset before reappearing in April at Santa Anita. Getting Lasix for the first time, she impressed with a length win in the six-panel contest and a 92 Beyer Speed Figure. Back May 18 over the same track and trip, Cash Call repeated the visit to the winner's circle, securing an 89 Beyer and a five-length victory. She's worked well since, including a bullet :58 3/5 (1/49) over five furlongs June 1.

The \$600,000 OBS April graduate broke smoothly Saturday but--after setting the pace in her last win--found herself three wide tracking in third going into the first turn as Howin set the :23.50 first quarter. As 22-1 Sea Runner (Gun Runner), who was stakes placed last year, positioned herself stoutly between the two Bob Baffert-trained fillies, Cash Call held her spot as rider Juan Hernandez implored her to remain patient. He let the bay go on the turn and the response was instant as she swept past Sea Runner to challenge Howin. With the battle joined two furlongs from home, Cash Call dug in with her ears pinned, inching past Howin in the stretch to prevail by three-quarters of a length.

"At the barn they've always liked this filly," said Hernandez, who has been aboard in all five of her starts. "I think she just wasn't ready in her first couple of races. But now that's she a little older, she's getting better. I felt underneath me in her last couple races that she wanted to go long.

"She broke sharp. I was in a good spot. She was happy on the outside. She relaxed beautifully and was traveling so well. She was in a good rhythm just waiting for me to shake the reins and when I did, she picked it up and hit the wire first."

Pedigree Notes:

It took a few months, but Gainesway sire McKinzie finally got a win in a graded race that wasn't a Grade I. He kicked off his freshman year last year with dual GISW and 'TDN Rising Star' Chancer McPatrick, as well as with GISW Scottish Lassie. He's even had a slew of GI placings as a sire, including with Baeza in the Kentucky Derby and Saturday's Belmont, Quickkick in the Breeders' Cup, and a number of others, but it was Cash Call who got his first 'regular' graded win. Overall, the son of Street Sense, who was a MGISW and a 'Rising Star' during his own career, has four black-type winners to go along with his three graded winners and additional nine stakes-placed performers.

Brent and Beth Harris bred Cash Call in Kentucky from the D'wildcat mare D"fashion, who also produced Strategic Dreams (Archarcharch), a MSW who finished third in the 2018 GIII Soaring Softly Stakes at Belmont. In the name of their Westwind Farm, best known recently for producing champion Epicenter (Not This Time) and MGISW Sweet Reason (Street Sense), the Harris family bought D'fashion for \$150,000 at the 2018 Keeneland November sale. They resold her at the same sale in 2022 for \$75,000 to Waldorf Farm. The mare, who has produced two of the eight stakes winners for D'wildcat as a broodmare sire, has a 2-year-old colt named Fortius (Game Winner) and a yearling filly by Cyberknife. Both sold in 2024, with the nowjuvenile bringing \$450,000 at Keeneland September when selling to Belladonna Racing and the now-yearling going to Diamond I for \$230,000 at the Fasig-Tipton November sale. D'fashion is a half-sister to G3 UAE Derby winner Express Tour (Tour d'Or).

The entire complexion of the Pennine Ridge Stakes changed Saturday. Not only did the race come off the turf and have its distance reduced from 1 1/16 miles to eight furlongs, as well as

get hit with an automatic downgrade from Grade III due to the surface switch, but it also saw the scratch of morning-line favorite Zulu Kingdom (Ire) (Ten Sovereigns {Ire}), second-choice Flying Mohawk (Karakontie {Jpn}), and two others. A. P. Kid, who has been working extremely sharply on the dirt, didn't mind and took advantage to secure his first big win after a debut sixth on dirt at Gulfstream in February behind eventual GIII Lexington Stakes winner and GI Preakness runner-up Gosger (Nyquist). He broke his own maiden at second asking when moved to the turf, again at Gulfstream, then waited until Saturday to make a reappearance.

A \$275,000 purchase by Donegal Racing, who also won Thursday's GIII Poker Stakes at Saratoga with Donegal Momentum (Uncle Mo), A. P. Kid chased 6-5 choice Mi Bago from the outset. With the latter intent on the lead, opening up by as many as three lengths while uncontested through :23.64 and :46.92 fractions, A. P. Kid bided his time patiently in second. When rider John Velazquez asked on the turn, A. P. Kid responded beautifully and went right on by Mi Bago--a MSW who was last seen a close fourth in the GI American Turf Stakes at Churchill Downs--in the stretch while several paths wide, kicking clear with aplomb to prove much the best. He crossed the line 6 1/4 lengths in front of the pacesetter, who had another 3 1/2 lengths on maiden winner Golden Channel.

"He had been on the turf once and he had been on the dirt once," said Donegal's Jerry Crawford. "His dirt race was abysmal and his turf race was elegant, so naturally we wanted to bring him back on the turf. Watching him today, how do you say what he is other than pretty damn good." **Cont. p16**

Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher agreed: "He's a colt we've always thought a lot of. He just recently disappointed us in his debut, so we switched to the grass and it worked out, but he had been training so well on the dirt that we decided to give him another try. We were a little unsure of the sloppy conditions, but we certainly felt like we needed to take a chance. I'm not sure where to [go] after this. We'll see how he comes out of it and come up with a game plan."

Pedigree Notes:

Lane's End stallion Honor A. P. has had an excellent spring, getting his first graded winner, Margie's Intention, in the GII George E. Mitchell Black-Eyed Susan Stakes on Preakness Day and following up with a new black-type winner in A. P. Kid on Belmont Day. The GI Santa Anita Derby winner and grandson of Lane's End stalwart A.P. Indy has four stakes winners in his first crop of sophomores, as well as Belmont entrant Heart of Honor (GB), who had three black-type runner-up finishes in Dubai this spring. Honor A. P.'s second-crop 2-year-olds feature the winning Romeo, placed third Thursday in the Tremont Stakes.

Parks Investment Group LLC bred A. P. Kid in Kentucky out of Lady Mamba, a \$1-million purchase at the 2015 Keeneland September sale by Mayberry Farm. A stutter-step career led to her sole win at age five after some close finishes and A. P. Kid is one of two foals she's produced to date. Her own dam, the placed Siren Serenade, was a \$1.025-million purchase by Don Alberto Corp. at Keeneland January at age 11 and was a daughter of four-time GISW Versailles Treaty, making her a half to GISW George Vancouver (Henrythenavigator) and GSW/GISP Saarland (Unbridled).

Lady Mamba, who has now produced one of the 48 stakes winners out of daughters of War Front, was last covered by Cody's Wish for 2025.

BELMONT STAKES DAY AT SARATOGA CROSSES \$100 MILLION IN HANDLE

The 12-race Belmont Stakes Day card, highlighted by Sovereignty's (Into Mischief) victory in the GI Belmont Stakes, generated all-sources handle of \$101,861,883 with a paid attendance of 46,243, NYRA announced in a press release Saturday evening.

Originally a 14-race card, heavy rain in the Saratoga Springs region Friday and Saturday forced all races off the turf and canceled both the GI Jaipur [Race 9], a "Win and You're In" for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint; and the GI Resorts World Casino Manhattan [Race 12].

That pair of Grade I's will instead be run Sunday, June 8 to close out the 2025 Belmont Stakes Racing Festival.

On-track handle for the Belmont Stakes Day card was \$10,440,740 while all-sources handle for the Belmont Stakes alone was \$55,456,793.

The Belmont Stakes Racing Festival concludes Sunday with a 13-race card beginning at 12:10 p.m. headlined by the Manhattan and Jaipur.

FINAL GAMBIT IN A STARRING ROLE IN **MATT WINN**

One of the pieces to the handicapping puzzle that was this year's GI Kentucky Derby was just how Juddmonte Farm's Final Gambit (Not This Time) would handle a conventional dirt surface, having raced only on turf and synthetic tracks in his four starts prior to that.

The homebred had punched his ticket to the Run for the Roses when exploding through the lane to dominate the GIII Jeff Ruby Steaks Mar. 22, and he answered the surface question when making up a stack of ground--albeit behind a strong tempo--to round out the superfecta while finishing just over four lengths behind Sovereignty (Into Mischief). A 17-1 chance five weeks and a day ago, Final Gambit will be a fraction of that price against a maximum of six rivals in Sunday's GIII Matt Winn Stakes at Churchill Downs. The rail-drawn Gaming (Game Winner) will scratch in favor of Sunday's Affirmed Stakes at Santa Anita, trainer Bob Baffert told the TDN's Sue Finley on Saturday.

"He came out of the Derby in really good shape and we were proud of his effort that day," trainer Brad Cox told the Churchill Downs media office. "We targeted this race to give him another opportunity on dirt without shipping somewhere. He worked three times since the Derby and I thought each one was solid leading into this race." Cont. p17

Cox said Saturday that Flavien Prat is scheduled to retain the mount despite being named on horses in the postponed GI Manhattan Stakes and GI Jaipur Stakes.

Final Gambit is joined in the field by four other Derby alumnus, including 'TDN Rising Star' East Avenue (Medaglia d'Oro). Eighth after failing to find the front on Derby Day, the Godolphin homebred figures to have an easier time getting to the lead from the outside gate on Sunday in a field void of early speed.

Burnham Square (Liam's Map) was up on the wire to defeat East Avenue in the GI Toyota Blue Grass Stakes on Apr. 8 and turned in a mostly even effort in the Derby, enduring a bit of bumper cars a half-mile from home before passing tiring rivals into sixth.

Coal Battle (Coal Front), upset winner of the GII Rebel Stakes, was a mid-pack 11th in the Derby, while Chunk of Gold (Preservationist), a longshot second in the GII Risen Star Stakes and GII Louisiana Derby, exits a ninth.

The Matt Winn sextet is completed by Just a Fair Shake (Laoban), the distant runner-up to Belmont Stakes participant Crudo (Justify) in the May 17 Sir Barton Stakes at Pimlico.



Having enjoyed a fruitful 2024 campaign, Joe Shiesty kicked off his 2025 season with a trip to the winner's circle after a gate to wire victory in the Mighty Beau Stakes on a rainy day at Churchill Downs.

His last three races were some of the best in his career, as his victory over allowance company at Keeneland Oct. 6 produced a 94 Beyer, and his runner-up effort to MSW & GSP Valentine Candy (Justify) sprinting on this main track Nov. 3 produced his third Beyer in the 90 range and his highest on the surface. He was run down late Nov. 24 when he returned to this turf course last out against allowance rivals, and failed to hold off the returning Run Carson by 1 1/4 lengths.

Off here at 3-1 on an overcast racing day in Kentucky, Joe Shiesty was not the fastest off the blocks but soon rocketed into the lead to show the way through an opening quarter in :21.56. Ears pricked as he rolled through a half-mile in :43.98 and building up a three-length advantage into the homestretch, it was now a task of 'catch me if you can'. Arrest Me Red tried valiantly to close the gap but came a neck short on the wire. Run Carson won the photo for third.

"We just wanted to do whatever was right for Joe Shiesty," said trainer Eric Foster. "We took our time after he had surgery at the end of the Fall Meet here at Churchill."

"When he breaks well, he's going to make it hard on everyone else. It's a joy to have some good horses to go along in your barn. It's nice to have some horses you can count on like Joe Shiesty," Foster said. "I knew if he broke good today he was going to be extremely tough. The five-eighths distance fit him perfectly coming off a break. Regardless of how far they were going, he was going to break well and go hard out front. I think he was just getting a little tired at the end and we'll look for him to be even stronger next time."

Jockey Luan Machado was also impressed with the effort, saying "I remember the first time I rode him [trainer] Eric [Foster] told me he's the 'fastest horse in North America.' He was right. We went 20 seconds for a quarter-mile at Keeneland. He showed that speed today early without me even asking him. He's a very talented horse and can run well on any surface."

Joe Shiesty is the second horse for his dam to claim black-type behind his elder half-brother GSP Johnny Unleashed (Colonel John). He has an unraced 3-year-old half-brother named Unleashing (Klimt) as well as a yearling half-sister by Yaupon. Ready to Unleash had visited Jackie's Warrior for 2025. Winterberry became a stakes winner as a juvenile, taking the Glorious Song Stakes at Woodbine after a failed attempt on the grass when sixth in the GI Summer Stakes. Off the board twice as the favorite both times since that last win but going back up to her winning distance of seven furlongs, the 2-1 second choice was intent on the lead and opened up a one-length advantage over Nata Trouble as 2-5 race favorite and stablemate Shifty settled third. Having things largely her own up front, Winterberry cruised through fractions of :23.52 and :46.38 and came off the turn with more than enough to turn Nata Trouble back and roll home in front-running fashion. Shifty failed to produce a rally and could do no better than third.

"She's 80 percent better than last year," said winning rider Patrick Husbands of his filly's maturity level. "Last year, she started showing you not to get in her way--just go with the flow. She has come a long, long way."

One of 34 stakes winner for Frosted, Winterberry is out of a half-sister to GISP Off Topic (Street Sense). Her 2-year-old half-sister by Collected sold to D.J. Stable, Winterberry's owner, for \$110,000 at KEESEP while Dreams Are Free last reported a yearling Street Sense colt after having lost her 2025 Essential Quality foal. 

In case you didn't get it before this week, the message is clear. Relatively exuberant here, he was always responsive and after freewheeling downhill to Tattenham Corner with plenty left in the tank straightened up and stayed on powerfully to finish the job.



Lazy Griff, at an inflated and disrespectful 50-1 given his record, was 3 3/4 lengths behind to provide the Middleham Park

syndicate and Charlie Johnston with a red-letter day in his own right, while Tennessee Stud ground out third. A further length behind, the Joseph O'Brientrained G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner was making it a second place-getter for Wootton Bassett in the Epsom Classics over the two days. This was truly one for the strong stayers, which will ease the minds of connections of the withdrawn Ruling Court. One who never factored was Ryan Moore's pick **Delacroix**, who carried the mantle of favourite

looking to give Dubawi his first Derby and ultimately trailed in ninth.

This represented the first time that Aidan O'Brien has won the race with a colt by a son of Galileo, who kicked it all off for him

On the same day at the end of August that Field Of Gold was capturing one of the day's feature events in the G3 Solario Stakes, Lambourn was on his way to the French provincial track of Craon for the Listed Criterium de l'Ouest with the yard looking to spread its enviable array of class juveniles even further than before.

What should have been a straightforward task turned into near-calamity, with Christophe Soumillon having to graft to get Lambourn past the post first in front of a small crowd who can probably scarcely believe that they witnessed a future Derby winner that afternoon. Blinkers were on for The Curragh's G2 Beresford Stakes, but Lambourn was most definitely off that day and he went into winter quarters having been last of five in his first major examination.

Beaten 2 1/4 lengths by Delacroix in Leopardstown's G3
Ballysax Stakes in March, Lambourn showed enough zip to
suggest he had turned a corner over the break and confirmed
that impression at Chester's May Festival which was unwittingly
playing host to Epsom's new hero and heroine last month.
Unsurprisingly, the St Leger was touted for the winner
afterwards. "I'd say he's probably an Irish Derby horse, but he
will get further as well, he's very uncomplicated," O'Brien

added. "He will stay very well and has loads of class, so I would imagine he is very possible to go to the Leger if the lads decide that."

Interestingly, Lordan got to the four-furlong pole in 110.71 seconds, having taken his Oaks ride Whirl to the exact same point 24 hours earlier in 110.73. That is a serious piece of pace riding from a master of the clock whose experience of Epsom is limited relative to most of the riders in this renewal. Lambourn closed out the last half a mile in 48.61, half a second slower than Minnie Hauk in the Oaks and overall he was slightly slower than his stablemate, but there is a feeling that the ground had eased a touch from Friday to Saturday and so allowances for that have to be made. The Oaks and Derby winners are probably more or less on par at this stage, with Whirl probably third best of the colts and fillies over the two Classics.

Wayne Lordan said of his biggest day, "I didn't think it was going to be as easy as it was, but I was happy to take it. His ears were pricked and he was enjoying it out there. If you'd seen him in his other races, three out you're off the bridle on him as he saves plenty so I was happy to go forward good and early. He got the line really well and he's a horse who is going to stay further as well, so that option is there. The Derby is always the one growing up and when you win it, it's special."

Charlie Johnston said of the runner-up, "We told as many people as would listen we couldn't understand why he was such a huge price. It's safe to say the Chester form held up well. I'm surprised how well he handled the track, because that was always my biggest concern. He's quite a heavy-topped horse, so if the ground wasn't as soft as it was he wouldn't be here. I would say it will be the Irish Derby or the Grand Prix de Paris

next. The Irish Derby would mean going into the lion's den I suppose, but it will be one or the other I would say."

Joseph O'Brien, who rode Australia to glory here, said of Tennessee Stud, "I'm very proud of him, it was a serious run and he came home strongly. I'm so pleased for the owners, it's very good to be placed in the Derby and he's an unexposed type from whom there should be plenty more to come."

Pedigree Notes

Remarkably given his style of racing and need for at least this mile and a half, Lambourn is out of the Scat Daddy mare Gossamer Wings who was highly effective over five furlongs as she proved when placed in the G2 Queen Mary Stakes and G2 Flying Childers Stakes. She is a full-sister to the Stakes scorer Lavender Chrissie and a half to the GIII Victory Ride Stakes winner Baby J by J Be K, as well as Bernstein's stakes winner and GI Secretariat Stakes-placed Laureate Conductor.

The third dam Mighty Milk is kin to the GIII John B. Campbell Handicap scorer Hot Brush and the Summer Stakes winner Blazing Hot, in turn the second dam of the GII Super Derby hero Going Ballistic. Gossamer Wings's 2-year-old colt by Frankel is named Action, while her 2024 colt by that sire unfortunately died.

Aidan O'Brien will get up tomorrow morning as the trainer of 11 Derby winners with 47 British Classics to his name after another rip-roaring weekend at Epsom. It is a record that is somehow unimaginable and, yet, annually expected to be extended, and extended.

This latest colt to pass that celebrated piece of wood with his nose very firmly in front is a Coolmore homebred, and his rider very much one of the family at Ballydoyle, having joined the team there some eight years ago. Lordan has won a Breeders' Cup, an Irish 1,000 Guineas, and a 1,000 Guineas among a whole bunch of Group 1 victories. Now, at the age of 43, comes the biggest win of his career, a little over a year after he returned from serious injuries which saw him sidelined for eight months.

"Wayne Lordan works so hard and he deserves this for all the time and effort he puts into everything. To win the Derby, it's magical," said Magnier. "Wayne is one of the best riders in the world: his time and effort, his professionalism, is extraordinary."

He continued, "Aidan fancied all three horses, through obviously Delacroix was number one. But this horse is very genuine and just kept going. He's a Derby winner, by a Derby winner, by a Derby winner. That's pretty extraordinary. And that's how you win the Derby: breeding precocious horses that are quick enough to do it.

"He was going to be pretty hard to run down going around Tattenham Corner. I watched [the replay of] Slip Anchor this morning and for a moment I was thinking, 'Oh my God, Steve Cauthen's riding him'."

Cauthen rebooted, also known as the self-effacing Lordan, was brought into the media centre to face the questioning scrum, taking over in the spotlight from Ryan Moore who finished fully 16 lengths behind him on the favourite Delacroix.

"I do feel this horse was a bit overlooked because he's not a flashy horse, he goes along behind the bridle, he just does his own thing. I knew anything that got past me was going to have to stay really well and I knew my horse was genuine and tries hard," he said.

He could almost have been describing himself.

They say there are no prizes for finishing second, but there is no small amount of pride. In the case of Lazy Griff, son of a Melbourne Cup winner, beloved of his 30 syndicate members and many more of the Middleham Park Racing owners present on the day, finishing runner-up to a Coolmore horse in the Derby was the result of a lifetime.

"This is crazy stuff," said Middleham Park's Mike Prince as he watched their hero return to the second-place post with Christophe Soumillon. "But to be fair it was all there on page seven of the Bugle. His form in the [Prix de] Conde had worked out well with the horse who finished behind him winning the

Prix Saint Alary, and we knew he'd stay. Christophe is no fool. He's not come over here for nothing."

The Irish Derby, German Derby and Grand Prix de Paris are all now races to ponder in the colt's near future for trainer Charlie Johnston, who did however describe a potential rematch with Lambourn at the Curragh as akin to "going into the lion's den". There is of course always the final British Classic of the season at Doncaster for a Yorkshire-trained horse who certainly should get the extra distance of the St Leger.

In the meantime, however, another Derby meeting is in the books. We are nearing the end of days when we will see a Group 1 winner by Galileo, but Jan Brueghel added another to his tally in the Coronation Cup while Galileo's sons Australia and Frankel provided the winners of the Derby and the Oaks. Scat Daddy, grandsire last year of City Of Troy through his Triple Crown-winning son Justify, this year featured as broodmare sire of Lambourn.

In a feat that should be remarkable but is now almost business as usual, the trophies for all three of those Group 1 races are now in transit to a select corner of Tipperary.

Urged to try to put into words the magnitude of his eleventh Derby victory, O'Brien spoke of the focus placed on the race in the regime of his horses: "Everything in Ballydoyle is about Epsom." Enough said.

INVINCIBLE SPIRIT'S SPIRITUAL MAKES ALL FOR PRINCESS ELIZABETH TRIUMPH

George Strawbridge's **Spiritual** (Invincible Spirit), a €280,000 Argana August acquisition, won one of eight prior black-type starts and outwitted 10 opponents under Rab Havlin by making all for a career high in Saturday's Oddschecker-sponsored G3 Princess Elizabeth Stakes at Epsom.

The 9-1 chance, last seen hitting the board in Lingfield's G3 Chartwell Fillies' Stakes, broke swiftly from an outer stall and seized an immediate lead here. Untroubled on the front end throughout, she was shaken up to go clear of toiling rivals approaching the final furlong and kept on powerfully in the closing stages to easily account for Bright Thunder (Night Of Thunder) by 4 3/4 lengths.

"She loved it in front, she relaxed and got a bit of space around her, which gave her plenty of confidence," said John Gosden. "A mile is her trip and that was an easy mile. She ran well in the seven-furlong race at Lingfield and it was lovely to win a Group 3 like that in good style. They gave it to her easy up front and she's a good filly, but she sometimes worries about the others. She's got a Group 3 now, so we'll go and look at a Group 2 somewhere and if she doesn't win she might be placed. There's one in France we've our eye on."

Pedigree Notes

Spiritual, who becomes the 77th pattern-race winner for her sire, is the latest of three foals and one of two scorers produced by Listed Stanerra Stakes winner and G3 Give Thanks Stakes and G3 Loughbrown Stakes third Wild Irish Rose (Galileo), herself a half-sister to GIII Hotham Stakes victor Ruscello (Cape Cross).

The March-foaled bay's second dam Sea Picture (Royal Academy) is a half-sister to G1 Yorkshire Oaks-winning matriarch Hellenic (Darshaan). Hellenic produced multiple Group 1-winning US champion Islington (Sadler's Wells), G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis hero Greek Dance (Sadler's Wells) and G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud victor Mountain High (Danehill). Her descendants also include G1 Melbourne Cup hero Fiorente (Monsun).

MAISON LOUIS'S DERBY IS A SUPER FOURTH GROUP 1 WIN FOR SUPER SETH

Super Seth's super season continued on Saturday at Eagle Farm, where first-crop son **Maison Louis** led home a quinella for John O'Shea and Tom Charlton in the G1 Queensland Derby. The gelding found himself trapped into the centre of the pack as they straightened, but jockey Ryan Maloney was able to weave him into the clear and send him forward in the last furlong for victory over stablemate **King Of Thunder** (Tivaci) by a length.

"I'm a proud Queenslander, so it's a big thrill today," O'Shea said. "He's just a tough, resilient little horse and he's come from obscurity to win a Queensland Derby so we're very excited.

"He's just been a progressive horse by a top young stallion in Super Seth. I think the key was that he was able to cope with the workload."

After the Derby was pushed back one week due to the rain, Maloney serendipitously filled in for original jockey Ben Melham, and was pleased with the result.

"It was a very dawdling run Derby, and when J-Mac made his move at the half-mile, he increased the tempo, but not by a hell of a lot," he said. "When he (Maison Louis) got the gap, he pinned his ears back and was just tough as nails."

YOU WAHNG ANSWERS THE CALL IN CLOSE QUEENSLAND OAKS FINISH

She may have not won a stakes race before, but **You Wahng** (So You Think) has been lurking in the background of the 3-year-old fillies' races all autumn, waiting for the right time to pounce. Saturday's delayed G1 Queensland Oaks provided the right stage for the Kris Lees-trained filly, who had notched up third placings in the G3 Adrian Knox Stakes and G1 Australian Oaks earlier in the year.

The filly strode forward upon straightening, with **Pinito** (Trapeze Artist) as her biggest threat as they headed home. You Wahng found her every stride matched to the line, but she got her head in front to snatch victory for Lees and Tommy Berry, with **Benagil** (Manhattan Rain) in third.

Lees shared that it took a marathon 16 hours, split into two eight-hour trips, to get the filly to Queensland due to heavy flooding through north east New South Wales, but it was more than worth it to secure an Oaks.

"It was a lovely ride from Tommy," Lees praised. "He was able to get us straight across from the gate and got into a lovely position in running.

"He had a lot of horse coming to the corner, but I was always just a little guarded that last furlong when she presented, but she was able to find under pressure.

"She looked the winner a long way from home. She was on her last legs late, but she found something extra under pressure so that was very pleasing." Cont. p16

Remarkably, it was the filly's first metropolitan win. Lees indicated that the paddock called for her now.

"She'll have a well-deserved rest because she's had a good prep. She's been up all throughout and we thought, after the Oaks in Sydney, we were a chance and she's delivered."

JOLIESTAR PLANNING EVEREST CLIMB AFTER KINGSFORD-SMITH VICTORY

Joliestar (Zoustar) justified her favouritism for the delayed G1 Kingsford-Smith Cup with a dashing victory by a head over Zarastro (I Am Invincible) in the 1200-metre contest at Eagle Farm on Saturday. The 4-year-old mare was last out running second in the G1 All Aged Stakes, beaten half a length, but she turned the tables on Saturday to notch a third career Group 1 victory.

Sent wide and back on the home turn, Joliestar had an extraordinary amount of ground to make up on the leaders, Zarastro and eventually third placegetter **Golden Mile** (Astern), but, under James McDonald's calm steerage, she devoured the ground upon straightening to swoop in at the last moment. It went to a photo finish, but she managed to nab the win within the shadows of the post.

The victory propelled Waller to an unprecedented height, setting a new record for Group 1s captured in one season with win number 19.

"It's been hard to run the leaders down today, but we discussed things pre-race and we couldn't change our racing pattern," Waller said. "James went straight across from the barriers and got in front of Giga Kick and one or two others, and that was what probably won him the race.

"Joliestar was off the bridle at the 500 (metres), but her class got her home. We missed out on (winning) The Everest last year, so we would like to have another crack this year." Cont. p17

"She wasn't entitled to win, but that's how good she is," McDonald said. "I was lucky I was on a proper horse, even though she didn't like the ground at Eagle Farm today."
