Bill Mott feeds Sovereignty a carrot Sunday morning

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. - After a post-race visit for a beer and some hors d'oeuvres at the downtown Whitman Brewing Company, Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott was home, conked out on the recliner.

"I must have slept in the chair for an hour," Mott said. "I turned the TV on and, at the count of three, I was gone. I woke up at midnight and went to bed."

And that is how Mott spent his night after his talented 3-year-old colt **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) turned the 157th running of the GI Belmont Stakes into his personal playground. He stamped himself as the best of his division with an emphatic three-length win over **Journalism** (Curlin) in the finale of the 2025 Triple Crown.

Sovereignty, owned by Godolphin, also won the GI Kentucky Derby and has three wins in four starts this year.

"He is a top-notch horse," Mott said, standing outside Sovereignty's stall at the Oklahoma Training Track early Sunday morning. "I don't think there is any denying that now. I think we have seen enough. It didn't happen just one time. He has put in some good runs consistently."

DETERMINISTIC HOLDS ON FOR EMOTIONAL MANHATTAN VICTORY

In perhaps the most fitting end to a dramatic weekend of racing in upstate New York, **Deterministic** (Liam's Map) held on for a last-gasp victory in the GI Manhattan Stakes Sunday at Saratoga, giving Miguel Clement his first top-level victory just two weeks after taking over the stable following the passing of his father, longtime New York conditioner Christophe Clement.

"I'm very fortunate and very lucky we have a great team. Very much Dad's legacy," Clement said. "It is beyond emotional, the last two weeks, to be honest with you. Both professionally and personally. A massive emptiness to win this race without my Dad, but life goes on."

Deterministic, a \$625,000 Keeneland September graduate, had been purchased on behalf of St. Elias Stables by bloodstock agent Michael Wallace, who passed away Saturday. *Cont. p5*

Sovereignty to Target Travers (cont. from p1)

A steady stream of Sovereignty fans made their way to the grassy area in the barn area and snapped pictures of him.

The blanket of white carnations, which Sovereignty earned for the Belmont, were draped over a post in front of his stall.

The next major target for Sovereignty will be the GI Travers Stakes at Saratoga on Aug. 23. How he gets there is what Mott must figure out. He said he could either train him up to the race or, more likely, run him in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes at Saratoga on July 26.

"The immediate goal is to let the trainer rest a little bit," Mott said with a laugh "Walk the trainer for a few days and get him back in the feed tub, then we'll decide. Our goal will be to get [Sovereignty] to the Travers the best way we can."

Mott reiterated Sunday what he said at his Belmont press conference Saturday night: he was not going to play the "what if" game when it came to the GI Preakness Stakes.

After Sovereignty beat Journalism in the Kentucky Derby, Mott and Michael Banahan, Godolphin USA's Director of Bloodstock, wasted little time in adamantly announcing they would not run in the Preakness and have a go at the Triple Crown.

After winning the Belmont, he was not going to speculate that had Sovereignty run in Baltimore, he would now be celebrated as the sport's 14th Triple Crown winner. Journalism won the Preakness, overcoming a rugged trip with some bumping in the stretch.

"No, that would be totally ridiculous to even consider it as far as I'm concerned," he said. "We are pleased with the outcome. Who knows? What if we are at Pimlico and we got caught up in a logjam. You look back, you don't know. Where would we have been when all that happened? Hey, it turned out good for us, it turned out good for the horse, it turned out good for the connections. No regrets."


Journalism Will Head West, But Could Come Back East

Just before 7 a.m. Sunday morning, trainer Michael McCarthy examined his war horse **Journalism** (Curlin), the runner-up in Saturday's GI Belmont Stakes. The colt passed the test.

"He is very well," McCarthy said outside at the Oklahoma Training Track.

Journalism finished second to Sovereignty (Into Mischief) in the Belmont and the GI Kentucky Derby. In both races, Journalism was the favorite. He did win the GI Preakness, also as the favorite.

After being on the road for the last six weeks, Journalism will head back home to California and McCarthy's barn at Santa Anita on Tuesday. From there, McCarthy will figure out a plan for Journalism's next start.



The long-range goal for the year is the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Del Mar on Nov. 1.

McCarthy said Journalism could have two starts before that. The GI Haskell Stakes at Monmouth on July 19, the GII Jim

Dandy at Saratoga, the GI Travers Stakes, also at Saratoga, and the GI Pennsylvania Derby at Parx on Sept. 20 are options.

"Everything is on the table," McCarthy said. "I could see that scenario [three races] very easily. We will get him home, let him get his feet underneath him a little bit and have an easy week or 10 days and then get back in a rhythm with him."

Journalism, owned by Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, Bridlewood Farm, Don Alberto Stable, Robert LaPenta, Elayne

Stables Five, Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, has raced five times this year and has three wins and two seconds.

He was the only horse that ran in all three legs of the Triple

Crown.

Journalism has run at four different tracks--Santa Anita, Churchill Downs, Pimlico and Saratoga--in his last four starts. "It takes a special horse to be able to go from venue to venue,

racetrack to racetrack and not needing to take a particular kind of racetrack with him," McCarthy said. "Second in the Kentucky Derby with a little bit of a muddled trip early, an adventurous trip in the Preakness and getting the job done, and a third race in five weeks and showing up and bringing his 'A' game in the Belmont and nearly getting it done. There is a lot to like about that."

Journalism will head home with only one piece of the Triple

Crown and a pair of solid, but not special efforts.

McCarthy was proud of the efforts of his horse in the grueling series and expects he will be a tough foe for the rest of the division the second half of the year.

"He is a special horse that can take a heavy workload," he said. "You don't see many horses like him. So much is putting spacing into races and, I suppose, there is something to that. In this particular case, I thought he was a horse that could handle something like the Triple Crown, and I certainly think he did."

Shirreffs Puzzled With Baeza's Belmont Performance

John Shirreffs, the trainer of GI Belmont Stakes third-place finisher **Baeza** (McKinzie), was asked what he thought of his horse's race.

After a long pause, Shirreffs smiled and asked the lone writer this:

"Does that cover it all?" he said.

Baeza, the 7-2 third choice in the eight-horse Belmont, was never a factor as he finished 6 1/2 lengths behind the winner Sovereignty (Into Mischief) and three lengths away from Journalism (Curlin), who was second.

Shirreffs came in with high hopes as Baeza had exited a solid showing in the GI Kentucky Derby where he was third, just a neck behind Journalism, who was second to Sovereignty.

"When [jockey] Flavien [Prat] asked him to go, it took him a long time to really engage and get going," Shirreffs said outside Baeza's stall at the Oklahoma Training Track. "He did not have that big kick at the end like he did in the Derby. I don't know why. I am a little perplexed. Obviously, I thought he would run a lot better than he did."

Shirreffs said his first thought was that Baeza may not have liked the drying out Saratoga track. Steady rain early in the day had made the Spa oval sloppy, but it was listed as good by the time the Belmont was run.

Shirreffs could find nothing wrong with Baeza, owned by C R K Stable LLC and Grandview Equine, on Sunday morning. The horse is scheduled to ship back to California on Tuesday and Shirreffs said a plan will be made for the next race moving forward.

The Belmont was Baeza's sixth career start, and he only has a maiden win on his resume. After breaking his maiden in his third start, he was a solid second behind Journalism in the GI Santa Anita Derby and then had the impressive run in the Derby.

"I still think his future is bright," he said. "Yesterday was just not his day. He has to figure things out, without a doubt."

Deterministic Holds on For Emotional Manhattan Win (cont. from p1)

Sent off at 5-1, Deterministic broke sharply and was soon at the head of affairs. He was nudged along by **Tucson** (Constitution) through an opening quarter in :23.69 with his stablemate **Far Bridge** (English Channel) a close-up third. Deterministic had gained some separation through a half in :48.47 and he scampered further clear as the three-quarters went up in 1:12.99. Far Bridge rolled up to challenge his stablemate at the top of the lane and it looked to be a one-two finish for the Clement stable, but **Integration** (Quality Road) unleashed a furious late rally to just miss catching the pacesetter on the line. The time for the Manhattan, shortened from 1 3/16 miles to nine furlongs when it was moved to the inner turf course, was 1:48.93.

"Once I turned on the backside, I was in cruise control," said winning rider Kendrick Carmouche, who was capturing his first Grade I at Saratoga. "He was relaxed and into his stride like I had him at Aqueduct. Just an amazing horse. Whenever I got to the top of the lane, I asked him to quicken, and he quickened right away. He heard those horses coming, but he was just floating along. He was just running, man." *Cont. p6*

"I am just very happy for Miguel and the Clement family," Carmouche continued. "They've been through a lot in the last couple weeks and last six months--whatever you want to call it-we've all been through that and it's a hard thing to go through. But the good thing is, his daddy left him a legacy and he's going to make sure he stays strong with it and keeps pushing hard. I'm just glad that I'm part of the team."

The consistent--and versatile--Deterministic has now hit the board in 10 of 12 lifetime starts. He captured last year's GIII Gotham Stakes over a sloppy Aqueduct main track in just his second start.

Transferred to the turf after off-the-board efforts in the GII Wood Memorial and GIII Peter Pan Stakes, the dark bay colt was second in the GIII Manila Stakes and third in the GI Saratoga Derby Invitational before winning the GIII Virginia Derby. Second in the GIII Jockey Club Derby Invitational in October, he ended 2024 with a win in the GIII Hill Prince Stakes Nov. 9.

Deterministic was coming off a front-running, course-record setting, victory in the nine-furlong GII Fort Marcy Stakes in May.

Of the decision to move Deterministic to the turf, Clement said, "To be honest, when he ran poorly in the Wood Memorial, we were all devastated. Even before that, I had a small inclination because I took him on the infield and he moved like a dream, but there was no chance after winning the Gotham that we could tell someone, 'hey, he actually moved remarkably well on the grass.' Dad was already stereotyped and labeled as a turf trainer, so if I did that after the Gotham, before running in the Kentucky Derby potentially, it would have been the end of us, so I kept my mouth shut."

Clement continued, "I thought his [Determinstic's] last work on the turf course was remarkable on the Oklahoma. He has handled all different surfaces, ground, distances--today was a very good race. Kendrick seems to be getting along with him. He has tactical speed, and speed is always dangerous on the turf."

Pedigree Notes:

One of 13 graded winners for Liam's Map, Deterministic is the stallion's sixth winner at the top level. He is the ninth Grade I winner for his broodmare sire, Speightstown.

Deterministic is the only stakes winner out of Giulio's Jewel, who died in 2022. The mare was a half-sister to graded-placed Duff One (Harlan's Holiday).

Under the winner's third dam, Amelia, are graded winners Assateague and Rainha Da Bateria, as well as Grade I-placed He's Had Enough (Tapit).



More recently, he worked as an independent bloodstock agent with Vinnie and Teresa Viola's St. Elias Stable in the United States, as well as with Kuldeep Singh Rajput's Gandharvi Racing Stables.

Wallace is survived by his wife, Kristi, and five children.

Ag Bullet stamped her ticket to the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint with a powerful victory over the boys in the GI Jaipur Stakes at Saratoga Sunday. The race had originally been scheduled for the loaded GI Belmont Stakes card, but was moved to Sunday after heavy rains hit the upstate track Saturday. The transfer allowed jockey John Velazquez to pick up the mount from Flavien Prat, who was in Kentucky to ride Final Gambit in the GIII Matt Winn Stakes Sunday.

Sent off at 5-2, Ag Bullet broke in tandem with Coppola (Into Mischief) just to her outside and she settled just off that foe through an opening quarter in :22.52. The gray mare rolled up to engage the longshot pacesetter entering the straight, surged to the lead with a furlong to run and sailed clear to the wire.

"Man, it was easy," Velazquez said. "She behaved so well in the gate. They told me she was a little bit nervous and bad at the gate. But man, she was so good, did everything perfect. Broke well, like we were expecting to break. One speed goes and I sat right off of them or third. She allowed me to sit right off of them and when I asked her to go, she was there for me. It was pretty easy."

Of the result, winning trainer Richard Baltas said, "Over the moon. It's been an up and down thing with this filly. She was overachieving last year. We tried to get the Grade I and were second, third and third, and now she's got a Grade I win and she's a very valuable filly."

Ag Bullet, winner of the GIII Monrovia Stakes down the hill at Santa Anita last April and the GII Kentucky Downs Ladies Turf Sprint in August, was a narrowly beaten third in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint before stretching out to a mile to finish third after setting the pace in the Dec. 1 GI Matriarch Stakes--both over the Del Mar course which will host the Breeders' Cup in November.

Ag Bullet was a troubled seventh in her lone previous 2025 outing in the May 2 GIII Unbridled Sidney Stakes.

"I'm going to run her in Kentucky Downs in the race she won last year," Baltas said of a return to the GII Ladies Turf Sprint. "Maybe she is a five-and-a-half [furlong] horse. I always wanted to stretch her out to six and a half [or] a mile, but she might be better sprinting. We could run her one more time [other than Kentucky Downs before the Breeders' Cup], but I'm not in any rush."

Godolphin homebred East Avenue got back to winning ways with a gutsy wire-to-wire victory in the GIII Matt Winn Stakes Sunday at Churchill Downs. Facing just three rivals, the 7-5 favorite stepped right out to the early lead and was tracked by Coal Battle and Burnham Square through an opening quarter in :24.41 and a half in :47.66. Burnham Square, Coal Battle and second choice Final Gambit (Not This Time) lined up across the track behind him as East Avenue turned for home a length in front. Final Gambit's rally never materialized, leaving Coal Battle to box on to the pacesetter's outside as Burnham Square attempted to rally to his inside, but East Avenue refused to let either rival by, maintaining a half-length advantage to the wire.

"Our plan was to go to the lead," said winning rider Luis Saez.

"He broke well and got in a good rhythm down the backside.

Turning for home, he had to fight back against [Burnham Square and Coal Battle]. I was impressed how he held them off."

Winning trainer Brendan Walsh added, "I think the distance today was right in his wheelhouse. He's a gutsy horse when he makes the lead like he did today. I was very impressed how he battled back against Burnham Square, who came up to his inside, and Coal Battle on his outside."

Tabbed a 'TDN Rising Star' following his eight-length debut victory at Ellis Park last August, East Avenue was all-but awarded a championship after his dominating victory in the Oct. 5 Gl Claiborne Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland. But he was 13 1/4 lengths adrift of Citizen Bull (Into Mischief) after a stumble at the start of the Gl Breeders' Cup Juvenile and was soundly beaten while making his sophomore debut in the Feb. 15 Gll Risen Star Stakes. He worked his way back into Kentucky Derby consideration when second, a nose short of Burnham Square, in

the Apr. 8 GI Toyota Blue Grass Stakes. He was eighth behind Sovereignty in the May 3 Derby last time out.

Pedigree Notes:

The unraced Dance Music, out of Grade I winner Dance Card (Tapit) and a half-sister to Horse of the Year Cody's Wish (Curlin) and to multiple graded winner Endorsed (Medaglia d'Oro), has a 2-year-old colt by Hard Spun and a yearling filly by Authentic. She was bred back to Not This Time last spring.

Saturday Flirt, making her dirt debut, strode home a powerful winner of the off-turf and downgraded Soaring Softly Stakes at Saratoga Sunday. The 4-1 shot settled off the pace as favored Cloe pressed Yougottahavehope (Twirling Candy) through an opening quarter :22.36. Cloe took over at the top of the lane, but Saturday Flirt was finding her best stride down the center of the track with a furlong to run and inhaled the favorite under a hand ride before sailing clear to an effortless-looking victory.

"I had a beautiful trip," said winning rider Junior Alvarado. "She broke good, sat off the pace a little bit. They were dueling on the lead a little bit. I was sitting in a perfect spot in there. When I starting picking it up, she was moving forward really nicely. I put her in the clear and she took off for home and did it very nicely.

Of the surface change, winning trainer and breeder Wesley Ward said, "There's always a worry. You never know until you do it. I decided she breezed so well at Keeneland on the dirt, that being her home track, a lot of my turf horses breeze good on the dirt. So, this was a little bit of an unknown, but I think the track's got some moisture in it and that's the reason why she got over it so well."

A debut winner in Ward's colors at Keeneland last April, Saturday Flirt was 10th in the G2 Norfolk Stakes at the Royal Ascot meeting in June. She returned from 10 months on the sidelines to just get up for the win in a 5 1/2-furlong allowance over the Keeneland turf Apr. 16.

"We bought her last year before Royal Ascot and she just didn't fire that day in what was a good race and it took her almost a year to get her back," said Alex Cole, racing manager to owner Fitriani Hay. "Wesley begged me this year not to bring her to Royal Ascot so he could run in this race, which now qualifies her for the 3-year-old turf sprints at Kentucky Downs."

Ward added, "We're kind of looking at Kentucky Downs [G2 Music City], and looking at the conditions we needed some money. We needed a stakes win. There's a 6 1/2 [furlong] race for 3-year-old fillies down there. She was meant to go to [Royal] Ascot to run in a listed race because the owner [Jim Hay], who I had on the phone, he's in bed right now in England and he watched it from bed. [The owner] being from England, [Saturday Flirt] was meant to go there and after looking at the conditions of the race, we opted to stay here, which worked out for us. It doesn't always, but it did today."

Pedigree Notes:

Dragic, who is a half-sister to champion Echo Zulu (Gun Runner) and to Grade I winner Echo Town (Speightstown), produced a colt by Gun Runner in 2024 and a filly by that sire this year.

The mare was purchased by Wesley Ward for \$100,000 at the 2017 Keeneland September sale and was trained by Ward to third-place finishes in the 2018 Belmont Futurity and Kentucky Downs Juvenile Stakes for owner Steven Bell.

"I still have the dam," Ward said. "I partnered with Goncalo Torrealba of Three Chimneys on a couple of Gun Runners, so that's going to make him happy."

Saturday Flirt is the 35th stakes winner for her sire Mendelssohn and the 55th stakes winner for her broodmare sire Broken Vow. Also by Mendelssohn out of a Broken Vow mare is this year's Eclipse Overnight Stakes winner Wendelssohn.

The Week in Review, by T.D. Thornton

The 2025 Triple Crown season delivered something even more elusive than a sweep of the series by a single horse--a legitimately intriguing rivalry between two talented colts that could end up on par with the likes of Affirmed vs. Alydar or Sunday Silence vs. Easy Goer. The afterglow of the GI Belmont Stakes at Saratoga includes plenty of anticipation and speculation about when one-two finishers **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) and **Journalism** (Curlin) might meet again.

In the meantime, here are seven takeaways from Saturday's card at the Spa.

1) The Preakness Predicament: Journalism had plenty of backers rooting for him from the "throwback" perspective of wanting to see a top-level horse rewarded for running in all three legs of the Triple Crown. If he had managed to beat Sovereignty in the Belmont Stakes, the win might have resonated as a theoretical victory for the idea that contenders who run in the GI Kentucky Derby don't necessarily need to sit out the GI Preakness Stakes.

Instead, the opposite happened: Sovereignty's connections opted out of the Preakness based on their belief that running back in two weeks would likely be too demanding. That decision ended up looking like precisely the right move when Sovereignty uncorked a no-doubt effort that clearly established him as the sophomore kingpin.

Journalism's connections bucked the current "less is more" training convention by racing him in all three Classics within five weeks. He went off favored in each of the Triple Crown races, finishing second in the Derby behind Sovereignty, winning the Preakness despite a troubled trip, and again running second-best behind Sovereignty in the Belmont Stakes.

The mindset of skipping the Preakness wasn't going to change the industry overnight if Journalism had bested Sovereignty in their return engagement. But it might have tilted that line of thinking in a slightly different direction.

Sovereignty's winning

2) Derby Deja Vu: How often would you have guessed that in the roughly century and a half history of the Triple Crown races, the Belmont Stakes yielded the same 1-2-3 finishers as the Kentucky Derby?

It's actually happened only once before, in 1977.

Triple Crown champ Seattle Slew beat Run Dusty Run and Sanhedrin in the Derby 48 years ago, then polished them off again in that order of finish in the Belmont Stakes.

Not only was Saturday's trifecta of Sovereignty, Journalism and **Baeza** (McKinzie) a repeat of this year's Derby result, but it was remarkable how closely the tactics of the late stages of the race matched the performance five weeks ago when circumstances were very different in a 19-horse field at Churchill Downs.

In the Derby, the early speed unfolded more or less as it projected to, and Journalism was on the move from midpack while outside entering the far turn with Sovereignty shadowing him after being farther back. They turned for home as the obvious horses to beat, five wide and seven wide, respectively.

The frontrunners in the Belmont also came out of the gate true to form, but this time, in a smaller field, Sovereignty (from post two) and Journalism (after an inconsequential stumble at

the start) were parked closer to the pace, with Journalism outside and Sovereignty nearer to the fence, alternating heads third and fourth down the backside.

Journalism was the first to make his run at the leaders, sizing them up before pouncing nearing the quarter pole. Sovereignty got repositioned outside and never let Journalism out of striking range, building serious far-turn torque. They again turned for home together tipped toward the outside, clearly with more momentum than anyone in their wake. This time they were in paths four and five, with Journalism again inside and just in front of Sovereignty.

In the Derby, Sovereignty took over a furlong and a half from the wire, and he was emboldened when Journalism dug back in and fought him hard for another sixteenth before Sovereignty opened up in the run to the wire, winning by $1 \frac{1}{2}$ lengths.

In the Belmont, Sovereignty didn't take over until just outside

the eighth pole. And while Journalism once again responded to the challenge, this time his counter-kick was only for about three strides. The difference this time was that Sovereignty's move was more overpowering, doubling the margin of victory to three lengths.

The Beyer Speed Figures in the Derby for Sovereignty, Journalism and Baeza were 104, 102 and another 102.

In the Belmont, they were 109, 105 and 100.

In between, Journalism won the Preakness with a 98 Beyer.

3) Did Rispoli Move Too Soon? This question will be ripe for debate in the coming months as the sophomore season unfolds and the Journalism-Sovereignty rematch looms.

My opinion is no, he didn't--not in light of the circumstances of the Preakness.

You can even wind the discussion back further to Journalism's win in the GI Santa Anita Derby for deeper context. In that race, Umberto Rispoli absorbed some criticism for getting Journalism stuck on the rail three furlongs out in a five-horse field. The colt had to shoulder aside a rival to fight free, and he endured a more arduous trip than he should have in his final prep before the Kentucky Derby.

In Louisville, Rispoli seemed intent not to get trapped inside again, so he gave up a fair amount of ground on the turn before fully unwinding when he thought he could wait no longer. In that instance, Journalism got collared by a better colt who had executed a better-timed move.

Even though the post-Preakness focus centered on Journalism overcoming a rowdy stretch run to snatch victory from the jaws of defeat in a visually arresting effort, Rispoli admitted post-win that he had a difficult time getting his colt interested down the backstretch and around the far turn, and that he "just didn't have the horse" at the quarter pole.

So it only made sense in the Belmont Stakes that Rispoli launched Journalism into full flight when he did. Even though he again got overtaken by a superior rival after reeling in his pacemaking targets, waiting any longer was not going to change the end result.

4) California Is Dead--Long Live California! For a circuit that has constantly been in the news as a racing region that is supposedly sliding off the grid, Southern California-based horses capped a productive Triple Crown season with a big day at the Spa on Saturday.

Horses from Santa Anita ran 2-3 in the Kentucky Derby, won the Preakness, and finished 2-3-4 in the Belmont Stakes.

In addition, the last two winners of the GI Metropolitan Handicap, the nation's most prestigious one-mile dirt stakes that is now slotted on the Belmont Stakes undercard, have both been SoCal-based. National Treasure captured the 2024 edition, while Raging Torrent (Maximus Mischief) wired the Met Mile on Saturday.

5) Juvy Champs Take It on the Chin: Here's another historical oddity--the two most recent champion 2-year-old colts (and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winners) both lost separate races within two hours of each other on the same Saturday card at Saratoga.

'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness (City of Light), the 2023 juvenile male Eclipse Award champ, ran second as the 3-4 favorite behind Raging Torrent in the Met Mile.

Citizen Bull (Into Mischief), the 2024 juvenile champ, was fourth at 9-2 odds in the GI Woody Stephens Stakes.

Has this ever happened on the same card? *TDN* would welcome input from someone with access to a more robust database (or a better memory) than me.

6) Big Day Overload: It doesn't matter how much gravitas a Triple Crown race day carries, or how special Saratoga is. A marathon Saturday card that with a first race that goes off at 10:47 a.m. and ends with a final post time of 8:05 p.m. is simply too much.

We're talking nearly 9 1/2 hours here, a time frame that got stretched even more thinly when wet weather necessitated the cancellation of two grass stakes that got rescheduled for Sunday's card.

Running 12 races in a span allotted for 14 (with the feature race immovable because of national TV broadcast constraints) meant over an hour's wait between races at one point, with other gaps exceeding 50 minutes throughout the day.

7) Looking Ahead: Although the possibility exists that the under-construction Belmont Park could host a festival-style Belmont Stakes meet in 2026 before the revitalized track's planned grand opening in September of next year, the most likely Triple Crown scenario for '26 will see the Derby in its usual first-Saturday-in-May spot, followed by the Preakness at Laurel Park (while Pimlico also gets rebuilt), and the Belmont Stakes again at Saratoga while shortened to 10 furlongs instead of the traditional 12.

Think about this: By the time the Belmont Stakes reverts to its namesake track and historic distance in 2027, the third jewel of the Triple Crown will have been contested at the truncated distance of 1 1/4 miles four times within seven years.

One of those shortened Belmont Stakes was the 1 1/8-miles version in 2020 because of the pandemic. The 2024-26 editions at Saratoga got sliced to 10 furlongs because the New York Racing Association didn't want to start the race on the far turn over the Spa's nine-furlong main track configuration.

It will be interesting to see if the recent seasons of getting away from 12 furlongs for the final leg of the Triple Crown will be a catalyst for arguments in favor of permanently keeping the Belmont Stakes at 10 furlongs.

IF SOVEREIGNTY IS THIS GOOD, WHAT DOES THAT SAY ABOUT TAPPAN STREET?

Sovereignty (Into Mischief) is on top. He got there by winning two of the most important races on the calendar for 3-year-olds. With his wins in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont Stakes, he leads the way because this is a sport where they're always asking, "What have you done for me lately?"

But that doesn't necessarily mean that he's the best 3-year-old to have run this year.

The last time Sovereignty lost was in the Mar. 29 GI Curlin Florida Derby. He didn't have any excuses. He just wasn't as good as the winner, **Tappan Street** (Into Mischief). Prepping for the Kentucky Derby, Tappan Street suffered a condylar fracture to his right front leg in an Apr. 26 workout. His Triple Crown dream ended that day.

But what if?

If Sovereignty could win two legs of the Triple Crown but could not beat Tappan Street in the Florida Derby, does that not mean Tappan Street is the better horse? Things are never quite that simple in racing and it could be that Sovereignty matured and improved following the Florida Derby defeat? But it is a legitimate question.

Trainer Brad Cox has every right to complain about his bad luck, but that's not him.

He's got too much else to worry about and understands there's nothing to be gained by looking back.

"I think that Tappan Street is a very good horse and he showed he can compete at the Grade I level," said Cox, who trains Tappan Street for the partnership of WinStar Farm, CHC, Inc., and Cold Press Racing. "He obviously beat a very good horse in the Florida Derby in Sovereignty. It's different for me because I'm part of the Godolphin [the owners of Sovereignty] team, so I am happy for those guys. And Bill Mott is a class act. I don't really think about it. I'm trying to move forward with it. Hopefully, we can get our horse back at some point and maybe we could have a rematch with him. We obviously would have to be able to come back and show the good form where it makes sense to face him again."

Cox wasn't the least bit surprised that the top two performers in the Triple Crown series, Sovereignty and GI Preakness and GI Santa Anita Derby winner Journalism (Curlin), came out of

the Florida Derby and the Santa Anita Derby.

"We were zeroed in on the Triple Crown preps with several horses and I really felt like the Florida Derby and the Santa Anita Derby were by far the best two preps," he said. "Some speed figures didn't make the Florida Derby quite as fast as they did with some other races. I thought the top two horses in the Florida Derby were serious and obviously top two horses in the Santa Anita Derby were serious. It's kind of showing up now a couple months removed."

Cox said that Tappan Street's surgery went well and he looks forward to having him back on track at some point, maybe even later this year. He is currently rehabbing at WinStar Farm.

"I think his recovery will be typical of what you see with these kinds of injuries," Cox said. "Sixty days off and then probably some light exercise. The surgery went very, very well and we've had several horses in the past who have had surgery like this

> that came back to compete at a higher level than before they were hurt. I'm pretty optimistic about him being able to come back and be a bigger, stronger horse."

> Cox envisions a scenario where Tappan Street runs before the end of the year, but he won't be pushing him and will look to find a fairly easy spot for him to make his return.

"I wouldn't rule it out," Cox said don't think we could get enough

when asked if Tappan Street will run again this year. "To say there's a Grade I this year that would make sense, I'd say probably not. I

foundation underneath him to be ready for something like that. We will just have to see."

Sovereignty is the leading candidate for the 3-year-old champion and by the time voters cast their ballots, the Florida Derby will be a distant memory. There are no such awards for the horse that beat the horse that beats everyone else.

No Excuses for Good Cheer

Perhaps the biggest surprise of the Belmont-at-Saratoga meet was that **Good Cheer** (Medaglia d'Oro) finished up the track in the GI Acorn S. It was her first loss after winning her first seven starts. She was fifth.

"She came out of the race fine," Cox said. "I can't use the racetrack as a big excuse when she had performed well on a wet track before. You could tell at the half-mile pole that something wasn't right. Luis [Saez] started really pushing her along and she wasn't responding. She didn't quit, but she didn't pick off horses like she normally does when she is asked to. We'll keep her here in Saratoga for the near future. I'm not sure where she will land. We'll look around for spots and see what makes the most sense."

IMMERSIVE READIES FOR 2025 DEBUT

Godolphin's undefeated champion 2-year-old filly **Immersive** (Nyquist), off since winning last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, tuned up for her seasonal debut in next Saturday's Monomoy Girl Overnight Stakes with a four-furlong work in :49.20 (23/53) at Churchill Downs Sunday. The filly returned to the work tab at Churchill Downs in early May after being sidelined with bone bruising. Leading into the Monomoy Girl, she has posted six published workouts, including her latest move Sunday morning.

"We're looking forward to getting her started again," trainer Brad Cox said. "She's doing well since coming back to the string at Churchill and looks just as good as she did as a 2-year-old." Under Cox's exercise rider Joel Osorio, Immersive began her Sunday move with an opening quarter-mile in :25.40 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:01.80.

In addition to her Breeders' Cup win, Immersive won last year's GI Spinaway Stakes and GI Darley Alcibiades Stakes.

A regular entry on the turf, Kilwin proved her versatility over the dirt when she captured the Leslie's Lady Overnight Stakes at Churchill Downs on Sunday.

Unveiled as a winner at Ellis Park last July, the filly netted the Untapable Stakes at Kentucky Downs before finishing a respectable fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Del Mar Nov. 1. Taking a break over the winter, Kilwin finished sixth in the Limestone Stakes at Keeneland Apr. 11 and was last seen as the runner-up in the GIII Mamzelle Stakes under the Twin Spires May 10.

The bay tracked just to the outside of Eclatant (Into Mischief) in the second flight as favorite Vodka With a Twist made the pace up the backstretch. With the leader cruising along into the far turn, Kilwin made a bold three-wide move and confronted the chalk as the pair entered the lane. The 3-year-old went right by her target past the sixteenth pole and got her picture taken.

A half-sister to GI Belmont Stakes champ Sir Winston (Awesome Again), the winner's unraced dam is responsible for 2-year-old colt Mojacar (Essential Quality) and a yearling filly by Flightline. Spanish Star was bred to Cody's Wish for this past spring.

"Mark [Cornett] has a knack for finding these kinds of horses," said trainer Saffie Joseph. "She's exceeded our expectations. She won at Gulfstream, beat a good field. The number came back slow but the form was very good from that race. Then she went to Oaklawn and today she gutted it out again.

"After the Oaklawn race we felt very good, figure-wise," he said. "At the top of the stretch I didn't feel very good. I thought she was going backwards for a minute. At the wire I felt a lot better. She trained well and she just continues to improve. She's a gutsy filly and you can probably see her being in the Test. Her granddam is Harmony Lodge, who was a pretty good horse."

Gaming tallied his first stakes victory here since taking home the hardware in the GI Del Mar Futurity as a juvenile, securing the Listed Affirmed Stakes Sunday afternoon at Santa Anita.

Starting his season in the GIII Southwest Stakes Jan. 25, he rebounded from that eighth-place effort to run second Mar. 30 in Oaklawn's Hot Springs Stakes to Clever Again (American Pharoah). I didn't know if he would or if Nevada [Beach] would run on by him in the end. He wasn't able to today. The rail might've been a little bit of a factor but they both ran good and we are happy."

Watson continued, "I don't know what it would be like not to have horses with [Bob Baffert]. I have never been with anybody else, but he is great--he makes it fun. I've been with Paul and Mike for 20 years, I don't know how long exactly, and we have always been with Bob. Bob takes care of us and every now and then we get lucky."

Gaming is the most accomplished runner for his dam, whose offspring can be traced to several countries, but he is her first to garner any black-type. The most recent of racing age is a juvenile full-brother to the victor, but So Stylish has also produced a yearling colt by Union Rags and another full-brother to Gaming this year. Their dam is herself a half-sister to European champion juvenile colt, multiple Group 1 winner One Cool Cat (Storm Cat) as well as to the mare responsible for the branch which yielded MGSW Free Rose (Munnings). Returning to domestic duty after his Far Eastern ventures, last year's King George hero **Goliath** (Adlerflug) cruised to a welcome facile win in Sunday's G3 La Coupe at ParisLongchamp. Sauntering to the front from the outset under Christophe Soumillon, the 9-10 favourite only had to stretch inside the last two furlongs to dispatch the filly Grand Stars (Sea The Stars) by 1 3/4 lengths.

"We decided not to fight with him and let him be comfortable and when he's like that he's very good," trainer Francis-Henri Graffard said of Resolute Bloodstock and Philip Baron Von Ullmann's flagbearer, who had run a rare tame race in the G1 QEII Cup in April.

"He can quicken off any pace, he just needs to be relaxed as he is a horse that can be very tense. That's why he ran so poorly at Sha Tin, so I'm very happy and we can re-start with him. This race will do him good and I have to discuss with the entourage, but we will target the big races again."

MARANOA CHARLIE BACK TO HIS DOMINANT BEST IN THE MOUSSAC

Fast but not quite fast enough for six furlongs, Maranoa Charlie (Wootton Bassett) was back in his comfort zone on Sunday and back in the winner's enclosure at the end of ParisLongchamp's G3 Prix Paul de Moussac. Let loose from the outset of the seven-furlong G1 Prix Jean Prat prep by Aurelien Lemaitre, the 19-10 favourite who was fourth in Chantilly's G3 Prix Texanita speed test last month relished the opportunity to dominate from an early point.

Chased to the line by the Wertheimers' Silius (Dubawi) as he had been when staging a successful comeback in the G3 Prix Djebel in April, Peter Maher's colour-bearer kept rolling for a two-length verdict, with another Wertheimer homebred 2 1/2 lengths away in third in the filly **Polyvega** (Lope De Vega).

GOLDEN HORN'S LADY CHARLOTTE REMAINS UNBEATEN AFTER SNAGGING HOPPEGARTEN FEATURE By Sean Cronin

The hitherto unbeaten Andreas Wohler trainee **Lady Charlotte** (Golden Horn) leapt to head of the ante-post betting market for August's G1 Preis der Diana (German Oaks) after producing a determined effort to prevail in Sunday's G3 Diana-Trial over 10 furlongs at Hoppegarten.

She had previously registered two wins in Poland for former trainer Maciej Janikowski last term and annexed Hannover's Listed Preis der Neuen Bult in her German debut last month.

The 11-5 second favourite settled off the pace with one behind in sixth after a slick getaway and eased into fifth after a half-mile had elapsed. Bustled along to reduce arrears at the top of the home straight, she went second entering the final furlong and quickened smartly under a late drive to deny last month's G2 Karin Baronin von Ullmann Schwarzgold-Rennen victrix **Nicoreni** (Brametot) by a neck in the dying strides. Fantastic Moon's half-sister **Fire And Ice** (Masar) fared best of the remainder and finished two lengths adrift in third.

"She most definitely relished the [soft] going and the step up in trip," said winning jockey Adrie de Vries. "On good going it might have been more difficult for us, but she really is a great filly and 2000 metres is the minimum trip for her. She only ever does as much as necessary and, as long as she keeps doing that, we can keep dreaming."

Lady Charlotte, who becomes the 11th pattern-race winner for her sire, is the third of five foals and one of two scorers out of a half-sister to G2 Blandford Stud Stakes victrix Monturani (Indian Ridge), dual stakes-winning G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise runner-up Monnavanna (Machiavellian) and Listed Noel Murless Stakes victrix Mill Springs (Shirocco). Monturani is the second dam of dual Group 2-winning G3 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas)

Making the most of a break in the weather to get his favoured easy ground, Hamish made it 10 black-type wins as he made a successful seasonal debut for the fourth consecutive time. Just over a year after he had pushed Luxembourg close in Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup, the beloved stalwart of Somerville Lodge had to work hard to see off two relative minnows from Clarehaven but ultimately produced the goods.

"We introduced a pony after he ran at Goodwood two years ago and he's been pretty good everywhere until today, where he was absolutely appalling again!" Maureen Haggas explained. "The tack fell off about four times, eventually we managed to get it on and keep it on and once he was moving he was fine. He was pretty naughty at the start, but he has been crying out for a race for a long time and he needs soft ground. He's been ready to go since the John Porter which was the middle of April, so he's just pretty bored now and needed a day out."

"He likes routine, but he has got a little bit bored and he's not the sort you can take for a day out either as that blows his brains," she added. "I ride him every day and he doesn't feel like a nine-year-old, just the last two weeks you can see him looking at me saying 'what on earth are we doing this for?'. It's good he's had a day out to remind him what it's all about."

Hamish's dam Tweed, a full-sister to the Listed Lingfield Oaks Trial winner Vow and half to the G1 Doomben Cup hero Beaten Up and the G3 John Porter Stakes scorer Harris Tweed, also has a 2-year-old filly by Ulysses named Katell Golett, a yearling filly by Cracksman and a colt foal by Nathaniel.

"He has never stopped improving and I thing there's more improvement to come. I shall speak with the entourage, but I think the plan is to take him to the Grand Prix de Paris."

Daryz, who becomes the 138th stakes winner for his sire, is the 10th of 11 foals and one of six scorers out of G1 Hong Kong Vase victrix and G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud third Daryakana (Selkirk). The May-foaled homebred bay, whose dam is out of G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix Vermeille heroine Daryaba (Night Shift), is a half-brother to five stakes winners including G1 Prix Ganay-winning sire Dariyan (Shamardal), GII Knickerbocker Stakes and GIII Monmouth Stakes winner Devamani (Dubawi) and G2 T von Zastrow Stutenpreis victrix Darkaniya (Frankel). We skipped the [G1 Poule d'Essai des] Pouliches because going one mile on fast ground against the best fillies would have been tough. She could now go for the [G3] Prix de Psyche at Deauville."

Safia is the first of two foals and lone scorer out of an unraced half-sister to G3 Prix Chloe victrix Suphala (Frankel) and the stakes-winning G3 Prix du Calvados third Sivoliere (Sea The Stars). The latter produced the dual stakes-placed Doctor Carl (Fastnet Rock). JANTAR MANTAR RETURNS IN STYLE WITH YASUDA KINEN STRIKE

Jantar Mantar kicked off his four-year-old campaign in the best possible fashion when running out a comfortable winner of Sunday's G1 Yasuda Kinen at Tokyo, a 'Win and You're In' for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile.

Sidelined since a down-the-field finish in December's G1 Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin, the son of Palace Malice showed no signs of rustiness on his belated return with a sharp exit from the stalls in the hands of Yuga Kawada. Never far away from the pace set by **Mad Cool** (Dark Angel), the smooth-travelling Jantar Mantar moved up to challenge the long-time leader entering the final furlong and from there he quickly skipped clear to win by a length and a half from longshot **Gaia Force** (Kitasan Black). Race favourite **Soul Rush** (Rulership), reappearing after his G1 Dubai Turf defeat of Romantic Warrior back in March, was a neck further back as he finished third for the second consecutive year, with the same distance back to **Brede Weg** (Lord Kanaloa) in fourth.

"The colt broke well and was in a good position in third to start, but then he got a little overexcited as horses came from behind so I got a little worried," Kawada said of his fourth Yasuda Kinen winner. "I was still in doubt as to how he would respond at the stretch, but considering the circumstances, he really put in a good performance in the end and really exceeded my expectations as to how strong he is. He was unable to race to his standard at all last time, but I'm glad that he was able to show his true form today.


"I knew he would become a potential miler when he won the Asahi Hai as a two-year-old and was certain he was the best miler in Japan when taking the NHK Mile Cup title."

Trained by Tomokazu Takano, Jantar Mantar was named Japan's champion two-year-old colt of 2023 after winning each of his three starts, culminating with his maiden top-level victory in the Asahi Hai Futurity Stakes. Having kicked off his three-year-old season with back-to-back defeats, including a third-place finish in the G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2,000 Guineas), he then doubled his Group 1 tally with a commanding performance in the NHK Mile Cup.

On Sunday, the Shadai homebred became the first NHK Mile Cup winner to also land the Yasuda Kinen, further enhancing an excellent record which has seen him miss the frame just once in eight starts, having clearly not been himself when well beaten at Sha Tin.

Pedigree Notes

India Mantuana, the dam of Jantar Mantar, produced the best effort of her career when winning the GIII Red Carpet Handicap at Del Mar in 2018. She was led out unsold on a bid of \$145,000 at the 2019 Fasig-Tipton November Sale, before being purchased by Shadai for \$100,000, pregnant to Accelerate, at Keeneland January in 2020. Cont. p12

She unfortunately aborted that foal and was bred to Palace Malice prior to her export to Japan, where she slipped her Kizuna foal in 2022. She was bred to Palace Malice again in 2024, with a two-year-old filly by Pyro and a yearling filly by Isla Bonita already on the ground.
