



SATURDAY SIRES: CONSTITUTION



Constitution at WinStar Farm | Sarah Andrew

He has a name as American as apple pie. How fitting then that Constitution has had a big week (and month) leading up to the Independence Day holiday. The WinStar Farm stallion's 'TDN Rising Star' Mindframe won his second Grade I of the year--one of just five horses to do so--in Saturday's GI Stephen Foster Stakes at Churchill Downs over a star-studded field while notching a 105 Beyer Speed Figure. Less than 24 hours later, Constitution's Pin Up Betty added the Anchorage Overnight Stakes in Louisville after also winning the GIII Old Forester Mint Julep Stakes earlier in the month, with her two June wins bookending additional stakes victories by Constitution's 'TDN Rising Star' Parchment Party in the GIII Belmont Gold Cup Stakes and the promising 'TDN Rising Star' Admiral Dennis in the Delaware Derby.

Constitution currently appears among the country's top five 2025 leading sires by earnings, or top four if the earnings are amended to include solely North American performances.

"I think he's very, very consistent and gets a high percentage of solid horses," said David Hanley, WinStar's senior vice president of bloodstock services, "and now he's risen to the top of the league this year on the general sires list for runners in North America. He's only behind Into Mischief, Curlin, and Gun Runner.

Q&A WITH LUCINDA FINLEY: "HISA ON VERY SOLID CONSTITUTIONAL FOOTING"

The United States Supreme Court punted on Monday the constitutionality of the Horseracing and Safety Integrity Act (HISA) back down the legal ladder, requiring three different federal appeals courts to reconsider their earlier decisions on the matter in light of a fresh ruling by the highest court in the land. The Supreme Court's Friday decision in Federal Communications Commission (FCC) vs. Consumers' Research saw a 6-3 majority of justices essentially dismiss an argument that the agency delegated too much authority to a private company to administer the program. With this decision in mind, the Supreme Court issued near identical "summary dispositions" for all three of the active petitions before the court focused on HISA-stemming from the 5th, 6th and 8th Circuits of the U.S. Court of Appeals-requiring them to reconsider how they had ruled in their prior decision on HISA's constitutionality.



"When you look at their top progeny this year--Sovereignty for Into Mischief, Journalism for Curlin, and Locked for Gun Runner--Constitution is right there with Mindframe. He stacks up with all of those horses. Now with Mindframe having beaten the Breeders' Cup Classic winner Sierra Leone and last year's Kentucky Derby winner Mystik Dan [in the Stephen Foster], I think that puts him right at the elite status."

Bred by Grapestock LLC and Fox Hill Farms in Kentucky, Constitution was the first of three graded winners for his dam, the Distorted Humor mare Baffled, who sold for \$3.5 million at Fasig-Tipton while carrying a full-sister to him the same year he covered his first book. Such is the Constitution effect that a half-sister sold for \$2 million at that same sale that year.

For his part, Constitution brought \$400,000 as a Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling. Twin Creeks Racing signed the ticket, but he raced in partnership for Twin Creeks and WinStar.

"He was a very talented racehorse," said Hanley.


Named a **'TDN Rising Star'** on debut, **Constitution** won his first three starts, including the GI Florida Derby. After missing the Classics with a hairline fracture in a cannon bone, he returned to add a GI Donn Handicap win at four. Even before the Donn, WinStar CEO and president Elliott Walden called him, 'the most exciting stallion prospect of his generation."

Despite not necessarily expected to get early 2-year-olds, Constitution led the first-crop sire list in 2019 by both graded stakes winners (4) and winners (30) and finished second by earnings. It was a quick rise to the top levels, a spot he's showing no signs of abandoning. Constitution has eight U.S. stakes winners this year, with current international performers including Chilean Group 1 winner Spazzatura (Chi) and Chilean MGSW Medjool (Chi).

Among his first-crop runners was Tiz the Law, who won the GI Champagne Stakes at two before adding the GI Belmont Stakes, GI Travers Stakes, and GI Florida Derby at three. Now an Ashford sire and Constitution's first significant son at stud, Tiz the Law finished third in a close 2024 freshman sire race. With a joint-leading five black-type winners and two graded winners in 2024, Tiz the Law has added five graded performers in 2025 thus far.

"Constitution has so many things going on for him, including Tiz the Law, who is making a bit of an impression as a stallion as his first son to go to stud," said Hanley. "Stallion sons Americanrevolution [first weanlings this year] and Independence Hall [first 2-year-olds] are also in the pipeline and they are both getting nice horses. Independence Hall has a lot of 2-year-olds on the watch list, with a couple out of the 2-year-old sales that were very impressive. A colt sold for \$1 million at OBS March.

"Everything kind of builds to Constitution's continued success, but also his continued popularity." Cont.

Although expectations were high for Constitution as a stallion from the start, Hanley said it has been gratifying for the WinStar team to see him not only fulfill, but exceed, expectations and to be appreciated as one of the nation's leading stallions.

"For us, he's more popular this year than last year. He bred 186 mares and he's had good yearling sales. And now with a horse like Mindframe, who not only won the Stephen Foster, but also won a Grade I going seven furlongs, it shows Constitution is an elite horse."

In his six crops ages three and up, Constitution has 39 graded winners and 77 black-type winners, including four champions in Chile from three years early in his stallion career when he shuttled. With a dozen 'TDN Rising Stars' and three seven-figure yearlings at Keeneland last September, the son of Tapit continues to make noise. Although he's had seven-figure yearlings the last three consecutive years, his yearling average and median have both consistently been on the rise with a career-high \$329,708 average in 2024, as well as a career-high median of \$300,000.

"I think with the mares that he has in the pipeline over the last few years, you'd expect him to get stronger, continue to get good mares, and hopefully continue to sire more Grade I winners," said Hanley. "He's knocking out a lot of quality runners and now for him to have an elite horse like Mindframe has really put him up there with the very best stallions in America right now."

Constitution kicked off his stallion career at \$25,000 in 2016 and took the customary drop in his fourth year, going down to \$15,000. That turned out to be a short-lived bargain, as his fee has steadily climbed since.

The last three years, he's stood for \$110,000, one of an elite group of just a dozen horses in North America currently at six figures. His own sire, Tapit, is among those six-figure stallions, as is another son of Tapit, Flightline.

A striking bay with distinctive facial markings, Constitution doesn't seem to be limited in what he throws. Like the best stallions, his runners have performed on turf and dirt, short and long, and they've been both fillies and colts.

"They tend to mature more as 3-year-olds and he gets highclass turf horses and top-class dirt horses," said Hanley. "He's just a very good stallion all around.

"He's a beautiful horse. Physically, he's a very correct horse. A medium-sized quality mare suits him very well and he obviously gets a broad spectrum of mares seeing as he's a very well-made horse himself. While he fits a lot of mares, I think the most suitable mare for him is a medium-sized quality mare with muscle tone and plenty of quality."

Hanley gave a nod to Constitution's damsire, WinStar's Distorted Humor, who has emerged as one of the top broodmare sires of this generation.

"Constitution is a good mix of Tapit and Distorted Humor. I think he's got a lot of Distorted Humor in him and I think a lot of that comes through in his progeny, that will to try hard, to show speed, to have some precocity.

"Temperament-wise, Constitution is not aggressive, but he's an active, high-energy horse and I think a lot of that comes from his Distorted Humor genes on the bottom. I think he has a lot of that in his progeny."

At 32, Distorted Humor is pensioned but remains at WinStar's stallion complex. Hanley said he is doted on at the farm, where first-crop yearling stallion Life Is Good is also out of one of his daughters. *Cont.*

While it would be folly to expect any young stallion to match the career accomplishments and long-term influence of Distorted Humor, Constitution is just 14 with his best-bred crops yet to reach racing age. With his books continuing to improve, there's a good chance he'll continue to trend upward. Hanley said he's on the right path.

"He's right up there with the top stallions we've had. Obviously Distorted Humor has been a champion sire several times and he would have been the best," said Hanley. "Speightstown and Tiznow were just amazing stallions, with More Than Ready being another one. Constitution is getting to their level. I think he's on an upward trajectory and hopefully he can go on and be on par with those stallions."

In those decisions, the 6th and 8th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals upheld HISA's constitutionality. The 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, however, struck down HISA's enforcement mechanism as unconstitutional.

To discuss the possible implications from the Supreme Court's actions for HISA, the *TDN* spoke Thursday with constitutional law expert Lucinda Finley.

Finley is the Frank Raichle Professor of Trial and Appellate Advocacy, and director of Appellate Advocacy at the University of Buffalo Law School. The following has been heavily edited for brevity.

TDN: Why does the FCC vs. Consumers' Research case that the Supreme Court ruled on last week hold such import over the various HISA cases?



LF: Essentially, the cases involve the same constitutional issue, namely whether congress delegated too much authority either to the [Federal Trade Commission] FTC in the HISA cases, or the FCC in the consumers' research case.

And second, did the agency delegate too much authority to a private entity, namely HISA [Authority], in the horse racing cases and a communications entity in the FCC case?

They involve the same basic constitutional issues of what is known as the nondelegation and the private nondelegation doctrines-the concern about the scope of congress' authority to grant discretion to agencies, and an agency's authority to grant discretion to develop rules to private entities.

TDN: Can you summarize the decision in the FCC vs. Consumers' Research case, and how it's applicable to HISA?

LF: What the decision to me is saying is that a majority of the Supreme Court have zero interest in reconsidering their longstanding precedence about the non-delegation and private nondelegation doctrines.

A six judge majority of the current Supreme Court has basically reiterated and upheld the precedence that the 6th, 8th and partially the 5th Circuit in the HISA cases have relied on to find most of HISA constitutional. *Cont.*

The majority of the Supreme Court in the FCC vs. Consumers' Research case said congress can give broad authority to determine rules to an agency, as long as they have some general intelligible ascertainable principal to guide what the agency does.

The HISA statute clearly has that. All the rules that are developed have to be based on the welfare and the safety of horses and riders and the integrity of the sport.

That is actually more intelligible guidance than the principle in the FCC case, where the statute said that the private entity just had to determine a fee-that telecommunication carriers had to contribute to a fund as whatever amount was sufficient to enable the extension of telecommunication services to poor communities.

The second principle from the FCC case concerns the private nondelegation doctrine.

The petitioners in that case were challenging how, in order to provide broadband and other telecommunication services to poor or rural areas that the private marketplace might not want to serve on its own because they wouldn't make enough profit, the agency set up a fund requiring fees to be paid in.

The agency in that case, the FCC, had given the authority to a private party to look at how much things were costing, what it would cost to extend services, and based on that, to determine the fee that the service providers had to contribute to the fund.


The petitioners said that delegation by the federal agency to a private body violated the private nondelegation doctrine. The Supreme Court said, 'no it doesn't. It's fine.'

They noted that all the private body was doing was essentially making recommendations that the federal agency had to review and had the approval power over.

I think this new Supreme Court decision makes that argument a slam dunk for the constitutionality of the structure of the HISA Act, [for] it gives the [HISA] Authority the ability to recommend the rules in the first place and then send them up to the FTC for approval.

TDN: The Supreme Court has vacated each lower court's decision (in the 5th, 6th, and 8th Circuit Court cases), sending each one back to its originating federal appeals court. Can you walk us through what this will mean procedurally?

LF: We call it G.V.R. Grant the petition for certiorari. Vacate the lower courts. And remand for reconsideration. The Supreme Court is saying, 'We're going to show respect to the lower courts who have looked at the particulars of the HISA structure, and let them be the ones to reflect on our new decision and write their own opinions explaining how our new decision applies to the HISA cases.'



By vacating the lower court decisions, basically what that means is there is no binding ruling for or against the constitutionality of HISA right now.

The lower courts will now probably ask the parties to submit briefs with their respective arguments as to how this new FCC vs. Consumers' Research case bears on the constitutional questions in the HISA cases, and then the lower courts will get to write their own opinions saying how they think this new decision applies to HISA.

TDN: How long will that take?

LF: That's a question of how quickly the lower courts decide to set a briefing schedule and whether they want oral arguments or just want to do it based on a briefing schedule.

I would hope that the lower courts will want to move this forward rather quickly because these cases were up at the Supreme Court for quite a long time. I think everyone understands it would be best to have a definitive resolution to the HISA

Lucinda Finley | *University of Buffalo* issues sooner rather than later.

TDN: The 6th and 8th Circuits agreed that HISA's rulemaking structure is constitutional. The 5th Circuit disagreed by opining that HISA's enforcement provisions are unconstitutional because it incorrectly delegates governmental enforcement powers to a private corporation.

How do you expect each of the appeals courts to act as they reconsider their original rulings in light of the FCC v. Consumers' Research decision?

LF: First let me say, the cases would go back to the same panel of three judges in the lower courts that heard the case initially, who already found the basic structure and rule-making authority in the HISA statute to be constitution.

I also think it is highly likely that the lower courts will once again, now bolstered by this new Supreme Court decision, say that the basic structure of the HISA statute that recognizes the private HISA Authority and gives it the ability to recommend rules to the FTC-and the FTC then gets to approve them, reject them, suggest modifications-that fundamental structure of the statute is constitutional.

Now, the 5th Circuit found that the enforcement provisions of HISA were unconstitutional-that they gave too much enforcement authority to the private entity, because they gave it investigatory authority, subpoena authority, initial determination of violations.

There was no enforcement issue in the recent FCC Supreme Court case. There's nothing in that case that directly bears on the enforcement power given to the private entity. So, it is possible the same three judges of the 5th Circuit that already

> found the enforcement power part of the HISA statute unconstitutional will say, 'we stick with our view. Nothing the FCC case changes that.'

I suspect that HISA and the FTC will then be arguing, 'Oh, no, no. The new recent Supreme Court decision does change that.'

As I said, going back to that larger policy implication, by a strong six-to-three majority, the current Supreme Court has basically said, 'We are not interested in revisiting our almost hundred-year-old precedence on private

nondelegation. As long as the federal agency has the ultimate authority, it's constitutional.'

Based on that, I would expect HISA and the FTC to argue that even under the enforcement provisions, the FTC and administrative judges and ultimately the federal courts have the final decision on whether anyone has violated the statute, and if so, what the proper penalty should be.

We'll see whether the 5th Circuit is receptive to those arguments.

It's important to emphasize the Supreme Court overruled the 5th Circuit in their FCC vs. Consumers' Research decision.

It's generally been the U.S. appeals court for the 5th Circuit in a variety of cases that has been trying to resuscitate challenges to the longstanding precedent of the nondelegation and private nondelegation doctrines. I think the recent FCC case shows that there are only three Supreme Court justices wanting to go that way.

At some point, the 5th Circuit may realize, how many times do you need to get slapped down by the Supreme Court before you say, 'Okay, we get it. We're not going out and around to make new law on the nondelegation doctrine.'

TDN: But if the 5th Circuit rules in a way that would send the case back to the Supreme Court, what will happen then?

LF: If the 5th Circuit issues an opinion basically that HISA's rule making authority is constitutional but the enforcement authority is not, you will still have a conflict with the decisions of the 6th and 8th Circuits.

I would then expect that the FTC and the HISA Authority would once again petition the U.S. Supreme Court. And I think it would be very likely that the Supreme Court would have to take that case, because you would still have a conflict between the lower circuit courts on the constitutionality of a significant part of the HISA statue.

So yes, in another year or two, we could be right back at this same situation.

TDN: In this reconsideration process we're in right now, can the litigants apply other angles to their arguments, where they believe HISA is unconstitutional beyond the enforcement provisions?

LF: In their initial complaints filed in the district courts, they raised some additional issues such as the appointment authority [otherwise known as an appointments clause challenge]-whether the members of the HISA Authority need to be co-principal officers of the United States, given their rulemaking recommendation ability. And thus, need to be appointed by the president and confirmed by the Senate.

That's an issue that the lower courts didn't really resolve and was not an issue in the Supreme Court petitions that just got sent back for reconsideration.

Another issue they raised in their complaints initially in the district courts was what they call the anti-commandeering argument. They argue that the fee structure in the HISA statute puts too much pressure on state racing commissions to be the ones to collect the fees and send them to HISA. But the lower courts have rejected that argument.

So, [the litigants] could now try to focus on their appointments

clause challenges. But there was another Supreme Court case last week that I think resolves the appointments clause question as well [in Kennedy vs. Braidwood Management].

I read both of those Supreme Court decisions of last week as pretty much settling the questions of the constitutionality of HISA, even on the enforcement issue.

Under the enforcement scheme, it's very clear that HISA's enforcement rulings are the beginning of the process, they're not the final say. They [defendants] can go to an administrative law judge, and then ultimately to a federal court.

[Furthermore], the lived experience under HISA, we are seeing administrative law judges more and more actively reviewing HISA decisions, and often disagreeing with them or making substantial changes, modifying and reducing penalties.

TDN: Unsurprisingly, various sides in the separate HISA cases have all claimed the Supreme Court's Monday action as a win. Do HISA's opponents have any reason to feel emboldened by Monday's decision?

For example, the national HBPA described the Supreme Court's decision to remand as a "renewed opportunity for the Fifth Circuit to address the fundamental constitutional issues raised by horsemen nationwide-and do so in a manner consistent with the highest Court's recent guidance and precedent."

LF: I think the [broader NHPBA] statement signals that they're going to press their enforcement claims and their appointments clause claims in the lower courts.

As I already said, the FCC case decision does not directly consider enforcement powers. But to the extent the enforcement powers arguments against HISA are essentially private nondelegation doctrine arguments, it's still the same underlying constitution issue.

The way the Supreme Court has analyzed the question of private nondelegation is to look at whether the federal agency ultimately has the right to review and reject the actions of the private authority. And the Supreme Court said in the FCC vs. Consumers' Research case that if the federal agency has the power to review and accept or reject the actions of the private body, then it does not violate the private nondelegation doctrine.

That general principle should apply whether its enforcement recommendations of the private body or rule making recommendations of the private body.

As I said, I think the ultimate issue is, do they [the HISA Authority] have the powers of principal officers of the United States or not. That issue is why I think the case last week [Kennedy vs. Braidwood Management] about the panels that make recommendations about preventive health services to the secretary of HHS is so relevant.

The court said no, they don't exercise the powers of principal officers to the United States because ultimately what they're doing is making recommendations to the agency and the agency gets to decide whether to accept or reject their recommendations.

TDN: In light of all that has happened legally since HISA was enacted, how do you see its legal footing? Stronger than ever? Still a little shaky?

LF: I think the tenor of my remarks throughout our conversation has been that I think the Supreme Court decisions of last week put HISA on very solid constitutional footing.

I guess the big question going forward is going to be, how many other states are going to go the route of Texas and say, 'you know, we are so intent on doing it our own way that we are willing to give up millions of dollars in interstate wagering revenue that are a life blood of horse racing.'

SARATOGA NOTEBOOK: MCPEEK NEVER LOST FAITH IN THORPEDO ANNA

SARATOGA SPRINGS - Next Wednesday, 2024 Horse of the Year & 'TDN Rising Star' Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna) is expected to be in Saratoga. Trainer Kenny McPeek said she will ship to the Spa from Kentucky along with Mystik Dan (Goldencents), last year's GI Kentucky Derby winner.

Thorpedo Anna is coming off a three-length win in the GII, \$500,000 Fleur de Lis Stakes at Churchill Downs last Saturday.

"She is fine, she is like a rocket ship," McPeek said by phone from Kentucky Thursday. "She loves her work; she loves what she does."

Fans of the popular 4-year-old filly may have breathed a collective sigh of relief after the Fleur de Lis. That's because in her previous start, Churchill's GI La Troienne Stakes, Thorpedo Anna finished seventh--and last.

It was the first time in her 14-race career that Thorpedo Anna did not finish first (11 wins) or second. McPeek wasn't disappointed in the La Troienne result; he was enraged.

Thorpedo Anna was bumped hard, squeezed and bounced around like a ping pong ball while between horses going into the first turn and was basically eliminated.

"If you are a basketball fan, that was a flagrant 2 [foul]," McPeek said. "They mugged her. The notion that (Thorpedo Anna) wasn't right or ready is ridiculous. That was the only way they were going to beat her. I am actually still mad about it. She was locked and loaded and ready to win. I don't know if those tactics were accidental or intentional, but she should not have a mark on her race record because of that. It is what it is."

After the La Troienne, there were whispers that Thorpedo Anna had regressed, that she wasn't the same horse as last year. McPeek didn't buy it. *Cont.*

"She is ready to go, same as last year," he said. "Nothing has changed. She is a consummate professional. She does everything you ask her to do every day. She loves to work, she loves to eat, she loves to run. She wants to be the first one on the track every morning and is still the sweetest, kindest horse to be around."

McPeek said Thorpedo Anna, owned by Brookdale Racing Ic., Mark Edwards, breeder Judy Hicks and Magdalena Racing (Sherri McPeek) will target the \$500,000 GI Personal Ensign at Saratoga Aug. 23 and the \$650,000 GI Juddmonte Spinster Stakes at Keeneland Oct. 5.

If all goes well in those two races, things could get interesting. "Let's just say if she romps home in those two, you can make a case to entertain the [GI Breeders' Cup] Classic," McPeek said. "She steps up to her competition. Anyone who says she doesn't fit ... she has beaten **Sierra Leone** (Gun Runner) and she gave **Fierceness** (City of Light) all he could handle. I don't have to make any of those decisions for a very long time."

Thorpedo Anna was second in last year's GI DK Travers Stakes, beaten a head by 'TDN Rising Star' Fierceness. Sierra Leone, also a 'Rising Star' who would go on to win the 2024 Classic, was third in the Midsummer Derby.

McPeek also said he is not ruling out running Thorpedo Anna next season. While Thorpedo Anna is being pointed to a

Saratoga race, Mystik Dan's name will likely not be seen in the entry box. He is coming off a fourth-place finish in the GI Stephen Foster Stakes last Saturday after winning the GIII Blame Stakes at Churchill May 31.

"I'm not planning on running him again until September," McPeek said. "I don't see him running at Saratoga at this point. His presence will be felt up there training."

3-Year-Old Filly Championship On Casse's Radar For Nitrogen

The overwhelming favorite for Saturday's \$500,000 GI Belmont Oaks Invitational is **Nitrogen** (Medaglia d'Oro), who is 4-5 on the morning line.

The 3-year-old filly will be chasing her sixth win in as many starts this season for Hall of Fame trainer Mark Casse and owner D.J. Stable LLC. The classy grass runner is 3-for-3 on the lawn this year and Casse has a lofty goal for Nitrogen.

Providing everything goes well in the 1 1/8-mile Belmont Oaks on the Mellon Turf course, the next stop for Nitrogen would be the prestigious \$600,000 GI Alabama Stakes on the dirt at Saratoga Aug. 16.

"We still have our eyes set on being champion 3-year-old filly," Casse said outside his barn on the Oklahoma Training Track.

Nitrogen nets a sloppy Wonder Again | Sarah Andrew

"As long as she runs respectable [in the Belmont Oaks] and comes out in good order, I think we will try the Alabama," he said.

Nitrogen was last seen burying two others in the GIII Wonder Again Stakes, which was taken off the grass on Belmont Stakes Day at Saratoga last month. Nitrogen and jockey Jose Ortiz romped to a 17-length win.

"I realize she beat two other fillies that had no dirt form." Casse said. "But it was so how fast she ran and with the ease she ran and Josse said she just skipped over the dirt."

In her other four wins this year, Nitrogen won the GII Edgewood Stakes at Churchill Downs, the GII Appalachian Stakes at Keeneland, the GIII Florida Oaks at Tampa Bay and the listed Ginger Brew Stakes at Gulfstream Park. All of those were on the grass and were by a combined 6 3/4 lengths.

If Nitrogen does make it to the Alabama, she could be facing stablemate La Cara (Street Sense), who upset previously unbeaten **Good Cheer** (Medaglia d'Oro) on a sloppy (sealed) track in the GI DK Horse Acorn Stakes at Saratoga June 6.

Casse is targeting La Cara to the \$500,000 GI Coaching Club American Oaks at Saratoga July 19.

"La Cara still has a shot to be champion 3-year-old filly," Casse said. "If she runs well in the Oaks, she'll probably end up in the Alabama as well."

Running two top fillies against each other won't cause any worry for Casse.

"I never worry about that," Casse said. "Two different owners, two different running styles. I never, ever let that be a factor."

McCarthy In No Hurry To Decide Where Journalism Will **Run Next**

After a hearty spring campaign that saw him as the only horse to run in all three Triple Crown races, Journalism (Curlin) got

back to work on Sunday with his first work since the GI Belmont Stakes. That being said, trainer Michael McCarthy is in no hurry to figure out where or when Journalism will run next.

"I'm not even sure when he is going to work back," McCarthy said by phone from California. "He might work this weekend; we might wait a few days. He had three hard races in five weeks."

Journalism, owned by Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, Bridlewood Farm, Don Alberto Stable, Robert LaPenta, Elayne Stables Five, Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, went off as the favorite in all three Triple Crown races.

He finished second in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont Stakes behind Sovereignty (Into Mischief) and won the GI Preakness Stakes.

Journalism worked four furlongs in 47.80 (19/109) at Santa Anita on Sunday.

"Went very well," McCarthy said. Pleased with what I saw. I just wanted him to stretch his legs. I am going to kind of play it by ear."

McCarthy would not commit to having Journalism return in the \$500,000 GII Jim Dandy at Saratoga July 26 of the \$1 million GI Haskell Stakes at Monmouth July 19.

"I am going to let the horse tell me when he's ready," McCarthy said. "We have nothing on the table at this time. We are going to keep all our options open."

BELMONT DERBY/OAKS HEAD HOLIDAY WEEKEND AT THE SPA, TDN RISING STAR LOCKED RETURNS IN SUBURBAN

Saratoga's opening weekend kicks off with a trio of graded stakes Friday--the GI Belmont Derby, GII Suburban Stakes and GIII Manila Stakes. Saturday's card features three additional graded tests, including the GI Belmont Oaks. The day's undercard is highlighted by the GIII Sandford and GIII Kelso.

The Belmont Derby offers a salty assembly of turf horses, including European invader **Luther (GB)** (Frankel {GB}), who is trained by Charlie Fellowes.

In three starts this term, Luther was runner-up on the synthetic at Chelmsford in April before finishing fourth behind winner Henri Matisse--beaten only 1 1/4 lengths--in the French 2,000 Guineas, the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulins, at Longchamp in May. The sophomore looks to get back on track following a 15th in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly June 1.

Final Gambit (Not This Time) was third on the sod at Churchill Downs last November before finishing a close-up second going a mile over Turfway's synthetic Jan. 4. Winning his next two over that track, including the nine-furlong GIII Jeff Ruby Steaks in March, the grey came home a bang-up fourth behind Sovereignty (Into Mischief) and subsequent Preakness hero Journalism (Curlin) in a wet renewal of the GI Kentucky Derby. The Juddmonte homebred finished in that same spot June 8 in the 8 1/2-furlong GIII Matt Winn Stakes and gets another try on the grass here.

GIII Transylvania scorer **Test Score** (Lookin At Lucky), runnerup in the GI American Turf last time out, makes his first start back since as does GISW **New Century (GB)** (Kameko), who was third in the American Turf.

Cutting back from his last out victory in the American Turf,

Zulu Kingdom (Ire) (Ten Sovereigns {Ire}) appears hard to beat in the one-mile Manila. A winner in his sole start in France for Andre Fabre last term, the Irish-bred is four for five since joining Chad Brown stateside. Winner of the GII Pilgrim and GIII With Anticipation over this surface at two, the bay took the one-mile Columbia Stakes at Tampa earlier in March.

Locked Looks for Redemption in Suburban

'TDN Rising Star' Locked (Gun Runner) took plenty of money in his latest start in the GIII Alysheba at Churchill Downs on May 2 when finishing a fair bit behind his winning stablemate Fierceness (City of Light). Despite that tough beat that day, the lightly-raced chestnut has shown he is more than up to the task despite the recent defeat.

Victorious in the GI Breeders' Futurity at two, the colt also finished third in that season's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Winning both starts at three, including the GII Cigar Mile at the Big A in December, he closed well to be runner-up behind White Abarrio (Race Day) in the GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational at Gulfstream in January before galloping home an 8 1/2-length winner in the 10-furlong GI Santa Anita Handicap. Jose Ortiz gets the return call here.

Saturday's Graded Action Led by Belmont Oaks

While there certainly are some nice fillies ready to lineup in Saturday's featured Oaks, **Nitrogen** (Medaglia d'Oro) seems to breath different air than her rivals in Saturday's GI Belmont Oaks.

Trained by Mark Casse, the D J Stable homebred has proven unbeatable so far this season, winning all five starts, including a quartet of graded stakes. Grade I placed in a pair of starts at two, Nitrogen won this season's Ginger Brew Stakes, GIII Florida Oaks and GII Appalachian before cruising home a confident winner of Churchill's GII Edgewood Stakes May 2. *Cont.*

With only two others daring to face her in the rained-off GIII Wonder Again Stakes at this venue on June 7, she was all alone at the wire, winning by double digits. Regular rider Jose Ortiz gets back on board here.

Looking to stand in the way of the morning line favorite is **Fionn** (Twirling Candy), who herself has shown consistency, winning four of her last five starts, including the nine-furlong GIII Regret Stakes at Churchill on May 31. Trained by Brad Cox, the dark bay gets the services of Flavien Prat for the first time. The jockey-trainer combo are pure fire, having connected at almost a 50% strike rate at the Spa so far this year.

The juvenile division also gets some play Saturday with six entered for the six-furlong Sanford.

'TDN Rising Star' Obliteration (Violence) ran off to an embarrassingly easy victory in his Churchill debut going 5 1/2 furlong June 12 and gets jumped into graded company for his follow-up swing.

Mark Casse offers up two viable options, however, with runaway debut winner **Strategic Risk** (Noble Bird) and morning line favorite **Blinging It Back** (Volatile), who finished third in the Tremont Stakes at the Spa June 5. A homebred for John Oxley, Strategic Risk faces opening company here after his debut win over fellow Florida-breds June 7. His stablemate, who is still a maiden, was third in his career bow in Louisville May 1. Irad Ortiz Jr. rides the former while his brother, Jose, is named on the latter.

The GIII Kelso has attracted eight, including a handful marked for main-track-only. Among the main contenders, **Donegal Momentum** (Uncle Mo) comes into this off a 1 3/4-length score in the June 5 GIII Poker Stakes over this course. He faces Poker third-place finisher **Intellect (Fr)** (Intello {Ger}), in addition to dual graded stakes winner **Think Big** (Twirling Candy).

Graded Action From Coast to Coast

Horseshoe Indianapolis has its day with a pair of sophomore tests--the GIII Indiana Derby and GIII Indiana Oaks. Though still a maiden, **Publisher** (American Pharoah) has spent much of the season knocking heads with the current Triple Crown class. Promoted to sixth via DQ in the GIII Southwest in January, he ran fourth in the GII Rebel Stakes before finishing second to Sandman (Tapit) in the GI Arkansas Derby. He hasn't seen racing action since finishing 14th in the Kentucky Derby.

Victorious in the aforementioned Rebel, **Coal Battle** (Coal Front) was third in the Arkansas Derby before coming home 11th in the Derby. he most recently finished third in the GIII Matt Winn.

Likely favorite in the card's filly counterpart, **Clicquot** (Quality Road) tries to collect her first taste of black-type following a pair of Kentucky wins. Trained by Brendan Walsh, the grey was a six-length winner going seven panels at Keeneland in April before taking her two-turn bow at Churchill May 31.

Also featured Saturday, Woodbine offers the GIII Hendrie Stakes, while Los Alamitos presents the GII Great Lady M Stakes, which features the returning Grade I winners **Sweet Azteca** (Sharp Azteca) and **Kopion** (Omaha Beach), winner of her three latest starts including the GI Derby City Distaff in May.

Delaware's Saturday card is highlighted by the 11-furlong GIII Robert G. Dick Memorial while Prairie Meadows showcases the GIII Cornhusker Handicap.

Harris was also a nationally recognized figure in Thoroughbred racing, known for breeding and racing many distinguished champions. His deep love for horses and the sport was matched by his leadership and advocacy within the industry, where he served as a mentor and ambassador for generations.

Holding positions with California Thoroughbred Breeders Association, the California Horse Racing Board, and the Thoroughbred Owners of California, Harris was a member of The Jockey Club of America since 1988.

Carrying his signature white and green checked colors was MGSW Closing Remarks (Vronsky).

'The Great Race Place' said in a press release on Thursday abouth Harris's passing, "Santa Anita Park joins the racing community in mourning the loss of California owner and breeder John Harris. His contributions to the Thoroughbred industry in our state cannot be overstated and his support was unwavering. The green and white Harris Farms silks were omnipresent in Santa Anita's winner's circle and the legacy of the man they represent will be everlasting. Our thoughts are with his family, friends and fellow horsemen and women. May his memory be a blessing."

Beyond his professional achievements, Harris had an unwavering passion for helping people and supporting his local community. Whether through philanthropy, mentorship, or

quiet acts of kindness, he consistently uplifted others and believed in giving back to the region and industry that shaped him. His humility, generosity, and integrity were hallmarks of his life.

Harris was recently married in June to his beloved wife, Cookie Harris, with whom he shared deep joy, admiration and companionship. He is survived by Cookie, extended family, and countless friends and colleagues whose lives were enriched by his strength of character and enduring compassion.

A private burial ceremony will be held, while a public celebration of life is being scheduled and will be announced

"BIG BEAUTIFUL BILL ACT" PASSES WITH **POSITIVE & NEGATIVE IMPLICATIONS FOR RACING**

The One Big Beautiful Act (OBBBA), passed by Congress and expected to be signed into law by President Trump, makes permanent 100% bonus depreciation, an important incentive for Thoroughbred breeders and owners, but also has negative implications for gamblers that are concerning to the industry.

The Republican-controlled House of Representatives passed the bill on Thursday, and now the bill heads to President Trump's desk to be signed, which is expected to happen on Friday, July 4. The bill extends Trump's 2017 tax cuts, approves hundreds of billions of dollars on the military and the funding of deportations, and instills steep cuts on Medicaid, food aid, and renewable energy funding.

On the positive side for racing, the one-hundred percent bonus depreciation was part of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, signed into law during the first Trump administration.

Originally, this provision included a phase-out schedule that made bonus depreciation 40% this year, 20% in 2026, and completely phased out by 2027. Now, it will stay at 100%, retroactive to Jan. 20, 2025.

In a press release Friday, the National Thoroughbred Racing Association thanked Representative Andy Barr (R-KY), who was instrumental in leading the charge to cut problematic language changing the nature of the excess business loss carryover, which was removed in the final version of the bill. In addition to Barr, NTRA President and CEO Tom Rooney credited Senate Majority Leader John Thune (R-SD) and former Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-KY).

But, as outlined by the TDN's Dan Ross in the July 3 edition, the version of the bill passed contains a tax provision that could prove prohibitive to gamblers, with ramifications for horse racing's bottom line.

Deductions for gambling winnings will be limited to 90% of annual losses. Currently, gamblers can deduct 100% of wagering losses (below a net profit) for any given year.

The NTRA went on to say that while there are many victories for the horse racing industry in the OBBBA, there is still work to be done to offset some losses by horseplayers in their ability to deduct tax losses. The organization said they were committed to working on that fix moving forward.

When asked what possible fixes could be implemented to reverse the impacts from the new gambling tax, Rooney said it would most likely have to come with next year's budget. "We will figure that out," he added.

PTHA REACHES SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT ON INTERNAL LITIGATION

In a joint statement from President Bob Hutt and Executive Director Jeff Matty of the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (PTHA), the Bucks County litigation filed last fall by members of the board of directors was settled on terms that all parties believe to be in the best interest of the PTHA and its 2,500-plus membership, the organization said via a press release on Thursday.

On Oct. 22 of last year, TDN's T.D. Thornton reported that seven of the 11 directors of the PTHA had filed a legal response that denied sweeping allegations of corruption and cronyism that were made the prior month by Hutt and another board member. The directors specified for removal by Hutt included Matty, who was also under contract to work as the PTHA's executive director.

In the settlement agreement, the parties recognize that all directors have acted in good faith and in the best interest of the PTHA at all times and that no party should be removed based on the conduct raised in the litigation.

As a result of the settlement terms, the board will seek to implement a plan of action within the next 60 days by amending the bylaws. Changes will include mandatory board training at the beginning of each term, along with a more robust conflict of interest and mandatory disclosure policy. The release goes on to state that neither the parties nor their counsel shall have any other comment about the litigation or the settlement.

REPORT: DRUG COMPOUNDING EXEC FOUND GUILTY IN MISBRANDING **CONSPIRACY CASE**

Sam Glover, the vice president of sales for the Arkansas-based company U.S. Compounding, faces up to five years in prison at sentencing after being found guilty of one felony count of drug adulteration and misbranding conspiracy at a federal jury trial that concluded in New York last week.

Ray Paulick of the *Paulick Report* was first to break the news of the verdict.

According to the Paulick Report, "Prosecutors alleged that Glover was part of a conspiracy from 2015-2021 to sell the compounded medication omeprazole/fenbendazole paste, which treats both equine ulcers and intestinal worms, without obtaining prescriptions from a veterinarian who had established a valid client-patient relationship with each horse."

The Paulick Report story stated, "Glover conspired with Kentucky veterinarian Dr. William A. 'Bill' Baker and Kyle Zorn, then the company's east coast sales manager, to use Baker's name on prescription forms in exchange for what they allege were monetary kickbacks to Baker. The prescriptions were written, prosecutors said, even though Baker had not seen or treated the horse."

The Paulick Report stated that Zorn and Baker were identified as "co-conspirators" in court documents. Neither was indicted.

Echo Sound need one ping--and one ping only--to know when it was time to zero in on her target, and the result was run silent, run deep in the GIII Victory Ride Stakes at Saratoga on what was a Thursday opening day.

Near perfect across a five-race career, Echo Sound debuted a winner last summer at Ellis Park and then cleared an optional claimer at Churchill Downs in early September. The bay won the Myrtlewood Stakes at Keeneland in late October before she was beaten by 2 1/2 lengths in the Fern Creek Stakes in Louisville Nov. 30. Taking a break, her 3-year-old campaign was marked by getting her picture taken in the GIII Ms. Preakness Stakes at Pimlico May 16.

Bet down to 3-2 here, the chalk did not go all ahead full at the break as longshot Hollygrove (Complexity) took control up the backstretch. Ready to engage the pacesetter around the far

turn, Echo Sound turned up the pressure and at the top of the lane the filly was ready to see the race out. Inside the eighth pole the 3-year-old cleared as the wire beckoned.

"Each one of them [her races] has been a step this year," said Rusty Arnold, who also trained the race's namesake Victory Ride (Seeking the Gold). "The race was tougher I think today and she took a step forward--so, very, very happy.

"She was a pretty good 2-year-old," he said. "She got beat once and the reason she got beat [was] she had a little issue. We turned her out, gave her the winter off, and I think she has taken a couple steps forward. We're going to need one more step forward for the next one."

"We bred her," said Gabriel Duignan, winning owner and co-breeder of Echo Sound. "We bred her with the Pieratts. This was her [Eagle Sound's] last foal, unfortunately her mother died a few hours after having her, she hemorrhaged. This is her first filly, so we said we are keeping her. That makes this extra special."

Pedigree Notes:

Echo Sound remains the lone graded winner for his second-crop sire (by Speightstown). Eagle Sound has produced 11 foals, all of whom have raced and she claims nine winners out of the bunch with the Victory Ride champ being her last registered foal of record. Digging into Echo Sound's extended female family, we find GII Blue Grass Stakes hero Wild Syn (Wild Again), MSP Magdalena's Chase (Cape Town) and MSW Island Escape (Petionville). @campbellparlay

OWNERVIEW WEBINAR COVERS THE DEVELOPMENT OF YOUNG HORSES

The fifth installment of the 2025 OwnerView webinar series took place on July 1 focusing on the development of young horses with panelists Niall Brennan (Niall Brennan Stables), David O'Farrell (Ocala Stud), trainer Lindsay Schultz and retired pinhooker Eddie Woods. Gary Falter, the project manager for OwnerView, moderated a panel discussion.

The conference is hosted by The Jockey Club and the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and presented by Bessemer Trust, Keeneland, and Stoll Keenon Ogden. The panel was sponsored by OCD Pellets.

According to O'Farrell, it's important to start working with foals as soon as possible if they are nursing and healthy.

"You know they would follow their mother if you let them and they'd lead right into the stall," he said. "But it's hugely important that you go ahead and put the mini halter, the figure eight halter, on and coax them down the shed row and teach them to lead right off the bat."

The panelists agreed that starting horses should be done slowly and quietly.

"The slower you go, the better it is. If you get into a rush, it ends up a mess," Woods said.

Brennan concurred. "If you go a little too quickly with it and frighten them, then that's a different story," he said. "We just take our time, and similar to Eddie, we spend about a week in the stall with the riders just playing with them, putting the tack on them, turning them around, and just judging them individually."

Another theme was starting and working horses together.

"We send them out in groups, especially for the first while that they're at the track," said Schultz. "And if we don't have a group then you might send them out with a pony. The first part of the process, they always go in company."

The next session entitled 'Buying at the Sales and Digital Sales' will be held Aug. 12 at 2 p.m. ET. The full schedule may be viewed here. There is no fee to register for the series, but

registration is required.



Rebellious Type sells at Saratoga | Fasig-Tipton

The pricier half of a coupled entry, **REBELLIOUS TYPE** (Into Mischief) makes his belated debut for the partnership of Spendthrift Farm LLC, Cypress Creek Equine and St. Elias Stable. The 4-year-old son of MGSW Teresa Z brought an even \$1,000,000 as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale in 2022 and comes in on a steady work tab for trainer Amelia Green. This is the family of champion 2-year-old filly Storm Flag Flying (Storm Cat) via third dam, MGISW My Flag (Easy Goer).

Opposing Rebellious Type is a trio of 3-year-olds led by **Apalta** (Authentic), a \$525,000 grad also from the Saratoga Sale in 2023. First dam Southern Ring, who did her racing in Canada to the tune of a pair of graded stakes wins, sold for \$875,000 in foal to Into Mischief at KEEJAN in 2021 to Determined Stud who bred Apalta. She has already produced GSP Ladywearsthering (Uncle MO0 and SP Adora (Into Mischief). There's plenty of Canadian back class in the pedigree with \$1.1m KEENOV broodmare Radiant Ring as her third dam, making this the family of Canadian champion 3-year-old filly Catch the Ring (Seeking the Gold) and her daughter, another Canadian champion 2-year-old filly in Catch the Thrill (A.P. Indy).

First-time starter **Subito** (Speightstown), a Juddmonte homebred, is a half-brother to GISW Obligatory (Curlin) and to GSP Treble Clef (Arrogate) while another half-sister, Napier (Midnight Lute), is responsible for \$1.3m OBS March 2-year-old and MGISP Ferocious (Flatter). First dam Uno Duo, a stakes winner herself, is a half to French G1SW Etoile Montante (Miswaki). Juddmonte bought into the family via third dam Nijinsky Star for \$700,000 back at KEENOV in 1987 and was well-rewarded for it with plenty of Grade I class found under her page.

One of just a few runners with any experience in the field, Godolphin homebred **Fort Nelson** (Bernardini) made one start in October of last year when fourth at Aqueduct going seven furlongs. The colt is out of MGISW Seventh Street (a \$1,000,000 purchase for Godolphin as a 2-year-old in 2007), making him a half to GSW/GISP Lake Avenue (Tapit) and a full-brother to GI Malibu Stakes runner up Marking. **TJCIS PPS**

Having beat older horses in an allowance at Churchill downs in course record time Apr. 30, Classic Q stepped up to contest the 1 1/8-mile GIII Regret Stakes but faded from the lead as the favorite when last seen May 31. Dropped back to the flat mile Thursday, the 8-5 favorite put in a stellar effort to earn her first black type win in the Wild Applause on the opening day of the July 4th Racing Festival at Saratoga. Sent to the lead just as she was in the Regret under Jose Ortiz, Classic Q gunned it from the outside in a duel with Lavender Disaster into the first turn. The pair opened up several lengths back to the rest of the field before Lavender Disaster backed up, letting Classic Q go solo up front through fractions of :23.34 and :46.46. Still needing to be caught at the quarter pole, the leader had a host of challengers making bids led by Play With Fire who was set down inside the final furlong. But Classic Q had something left and was able to keep her rival from getting by to earn the win.



OISIN MURPHY PLEADS GUILTY TO DRINK DRIVING OFFENCE

Multiple champion jockey Oisin Murphy has been fined £70,000 and banned from driving for 20 months after he appeared at Reading Magistrates' Court on Thursday afternoon where he admitted to driving over the limit for alcohol.

The 29-year-old pleaded guilty to one count of driving a motor vehicle while over the prescribed limit of alcohol. He was not asked to plead on another count of failing to cooperate with a preliminary test at the roadside.

A four-time champion jockey, Murphy was charged by postal requisition on June 19 after he drove his grey Mercedes A Class off the road and into a tree in Hermitage, Berkshire in the early hours of April 27. He rode a double at Windsor the following day when employed by trainers Richard Hughes and John and Thady Gosden.

Murphy was officially charged on the Thursday of Royal Ascot week, when he rode another double, this time courtesy of Arabian Story and Never So Brave--trained by Saeed bin Suroor and Andrew Balding respectively. He ended the showpiece meeting with five winners in total.

Murphy spoke only to confirm his name, date of birth and address, but apologised via his barrister Alex Di Francesco KC before the verdict was delivered.

SIX DECLARED FOR SATURDAY'S ECLIPSE: **OMBUDSMAN TO UNDERGO SOSIE TEST**

Godolphin's G1 Prince Of Wales's Stakes hero Ombudsman (Night Of Thunder) will face five opponents after a select halfdozen were declared for Saturday's £1-million G1 Coral-Eclipse at Sandown.

The John and Thady Gosden trainee, who has drawn stall five, encounters fellow four-year-old Sosie (Sea The Stars), who will bid for a fourth success at the highest level from the neighbouring stall four.

The Classic generation, afforded a 10-pound concession from the elders, enjoys strong representation and features G1 2,000 Guineas hero Ruling Court (Justify) and G1 Prix du Jockey Club victor Camille Pissarro (Wootton Bassett). The TDN Rising Stars have been allocated stalls one and two, respectively. The field is completed by last term's G1 Futurity Trophy first and second Hotazhell (Too Darn Hot) and Delacroix (Dubawi), who renew rivalry from stalls six and three. Ryan Moore is sticking with last month's beaten Derby favourite Delacroix, while Christophe Soumillon reunites with Camille Pissarro.

LACK OF ENTRIES FORCES CANCELLATION OF **DUNDALK BARRIER TRIALS** By Brian Sheerin

A shortfall of 20 horses has forced Irish Thoroughbred Marketing (ITM) to abandon plans for the intended barrier trial fixture at Dundalk on Monday, July 7.

ITM's international representative Jeremy Greene, who has been the driving force behind the concept, revealed that it would not be financially viable to stage the card if a minimum of 70 entries were not received. Only 50 horses had been entered for next Monday's fixture and leading trainers Jack Davison and Gavin Cromwell, both of whom have been big backers of the initiative since its inception in 2020, admitted to being disappointed by the late cancellation.

"I certainly would be a big supporter of the barrier trials and had a few horses for Monday," said Cromwell, who readied Brownstown in a Naas barrier trial less than a month before that filly landed a Leopardstown maiden on debut.

He added, "The barrier trials have been a big addition to us and we've managed to get a couple sold off it as well so we're definitely big supporters of them. I don't know what the reason behind them not filling is as they are a good initiative."

It has been rumoured that some trainers were reluctant to educate their horses in a race scenario on the polytrack at Dundalk, but Davison said he wasn't buying such an explanation as an excuse and said the lack of support for the barrier trials on the whole is something that surprises him.

"It is disappointing," Davison said. "I planned on trialing five horses and was in favour of trialling at Dundalk. It's a very consistent surface so I can't see the track itself being an excuse for the races not filling.

"I am surprised that the barrier trials are not proving more popular. From a trainer's point of view, you can't beat a mock race to tell you where you are at. With my trainer's cap on, it's nice to be able to bring your horse away and work them within a bunch of horses in a non-racing environment. It's a big advantage, especially for trainers like myself who are operating with smaller strings."

Ahead of the opening barrier trial of the year at Naas, Greene told TDN Europe about the financial constraints involved in running the fixtures, and stated that entry fees generated a huge amount of the income required to cover costs.

Confirming the cancellation of Monday's meeting, he simply said, "We needed 70 entries to run but we only got 50. We're way short. We've publicised them on the Ras website and made it very clear about the conditions that need to be met. We have to put the fields together today so we're not going to make it. It's just one of those things."

SISTER TO KOPEK DES BORDES BRINGS **CURTAIN DOWN ON SUMMER SALE**

The curtain came down on the Argana Summer Sale on Thursday where Victoire Des Borde (Antarctique), a half-sister to Supreme Novices' Hurdle hero Kopek Des Bordes (No Risk At All), led the concluding session when selling to Guy Petit for €85,000.

All told, the aggregate for the Summer Sale was up a massive 24% to €13,311,200, while the average was up by 9% to €36,074. The clearance rate was a healthy 80% [up 14% on last year], while the median was up by €4,000 to €20,000.

A press release, issued by Argana after the sale, attributing quotes to president Olivier Delloye and CEO Freddy Powell, read, "If we retrace the sale chronologically, we can highlight the dynamism of the last breeze-up of the season, with a remarkable percentage of horses sold of over 96%. The stores then sparked some great bidding battles, with nine lots making or exceeding €100,000, testifying to the attractiveness of French maternal families." Cont. p4

Francis Graffard is considering the G1 Juddmonte International Stakes as an option for Daryz (Sea The Stars), who retained his unbeaten record when winning Sunday's G2 Prix Eugene Adam.

Nemone Routh, racing manager for Daryz's owner-breeder The Aga Khan Studs, said, "We're slightly scratching our heads with Daryz and we would need to sit down with Princess Zahra as well as there are several options we can take with the horse.

"I know Francis is quite interested in the idea of bringing him to the Juddmonte International and he's obviously done very well over that trip and we've only ever run him over a mile and a quarter. It would be a big ask as Sunday was only his fourth start, but he's an improving horse and we're really excited by him--he's bred in the purple and a proper horse."

Daryz's stablemate and fellow Aga Khan-bred Calandagan (Gleaneagles), who holds an entry for the G1 King George VI And Queen Elizabeth Stakes, was second to City Of Troy in last year's Juddmonte International, and claimed his first Group 1 victory on a good day for his connections in Sunday's Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. As a gelding, Calandagan was prevented from running in last year's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe but that would not be an issue for Daryz, who is a half-brother to the late G1 Prix Ganay winner Dariyan (Shamardal).

Routh continued, "We have an eye on the Arc at the end of the year, but [Daryz] needs to run before that and there are several different races he could run in. He could have a traditional prep for the Arc in the Prix Niel or he could take in something like York.

"We'll have to weigh everything up with him as he is still a little immature, but he's improved with every race and York is definitely an option. We will just have to see what is the right option as we haven't quite figured that out."



While he was impressive in the Prince of Wales's last month, Ombudsman faces a second quick race on fast ground in a short space of time for one who was so nurtured last term and any temporary regression will see him vulnerable, while the pace scenario is sure to be very different here with no obvious front-runner. Sosie looks like a fast mile-and-a-half horse and may lack the zip of the Classic-winning 3-year-olds. [Tom Frary].
