The GI Dunkin' Diana Stakes continues, as it has for nine of the last ten years, to run through the Chad Brown barn as Excellent Truth (Ire) (Cotai Glory {GB}) just edged out favorite She Feels Pretty (Karakontie {Jpn}) in a stretch duel to take the opening Grade I of the Saratoga summer meet.

While eyes and wagering dollars were on Cherie DeVaux's She Feels Pretty, Brown wielded a strong hand in stablemates Excellent Truth and Dynamic Pricing (Ire) (Night of Thunder {Ire}), the one-two finishers in the GI Just A Game Stakes over this course June 6. Heavy rain Saturday morning dampened the course down to yielding and expected pacesetter Be Your Best (Ire) (Muhaara {GB}) scratched for Saffie Joseph, Jr. leaving a five-horse field otherwise intact. Excellent Truth, notably second to her stablemate in the aforementioned Just A Game and also to Choisya (GB) (Night of Thunder {GB}) in the GI Jenny Wiley at Keeneland, stretched out to Saturday's 1 1/8-mile distance with aplomb in the silks of Resolute Racing.

Expertly guided in the hands of Flavien Prat, aboard for both of her starts since coming stateside for John Stewart, the 5-year-old broke inside of her stablemate and hustled up to form a three-wide charge for the lead outside of rail-drawn She Feels Pretty and Choisya who outsprinted them both. **Cont. SARATOGA NOTEBOOK, PRESENTED BY NYRA BETS: SOVEREIGNTY GETS WORK IN BEFORE ANOTHER STORM SLAMS SARATOGA

SARATOGA SPRINGS--Just before 8 Saturday morning, **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) beat the weather. But just barely.

The GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont Stakes champ got his work in before the heaviest of yet another strong Saratoga thunderstorm pelted Saratoga Race Course.

With rain beginning to fall, Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott was able to get Sovereignty out on the Oklahoma Training Track for a five-furlong work. Ridden by his assistant Neil Poznansky and working in company with stablemate Jefferson Street (Street Sense), Sovereignty covered the distance in 1:02.18 (5/12).

The leader in the 3-year-old division, Sovereignty is being pointed to the \$500,000 GII Jim Dandy Stakes at Saratoga on July 26.

"I think we are in good shape," Mott said outside his barn on the Oklahoma. **Cont. Pg. 5**

The favorite took back, opting to sit third as Choisya led along the hedge with Excellent Truth never far behind as the field cornered for the first time. In a single file line up the backstretch, the Jenny Wiley winner continued to lead through the opening half in :48.52 with little pressure from either two of her main rivals who were yet to move behind her. It was Excellent Truth who jumped first, drawing alongside midway around the far turn while She Feels Pretty was winding up three wide and the three of them came off the corner together. As the longshot pacesetter faded along the hedge, Excellent Truth was led to contend with the four-time Grade I winner to her inside and the pair threw down the length of the stretch with the Chad Brown runner just edging past the favorite in the final strides to win in a driving finish. It was the 10th overall Diana win for Brown while Flavien Prat picked up his third straight having claimed the last two editions aboard Whitebeam (GB) (Caravaggio).

"It means a lot," Brown said of his landmark win. "A lot of different horses have done it. Many of the same team members, though. I know I mention his name a lot--[Bobby] Frankel--but I think about him on days like this. This was a race that I can't believe he only won twice, he always pointed to it. It was right in his wheelhouse with a female turf horse--he taught me so much. A big part of it is him, his legacy lives on, because it is his system we are using."

Of Excellent Truth's win, he

said: "That reminded me a little bit of the 3-year-old race [2024 GII Lake Placid] when Grayosh, in another race versus She Feels Pretty, came back again on her. I'm really happy for this horse. She had her day today. She has had two tough trips. I think you could argue with a cleaner trip, she could be 3-for-3 in the country. She has always trained like a top horse all winter. I want to thank John Stewart [owner, Resolute Racing] and his team. He could've picked anyone to train her, I was so happy when she showed up in our barn at Payson this winter. She has never had a bad day. She deserved the win today."

"We felt in her last couple of races, she was probably a little further back [than optimal]," Brown continued. "As Flavien [Prat] and I got to know her, she didn't have that electric turn of foot that maybe we thought was under the hood when we really turned her loose in a race. She took a few strides to get going, a little bit more of a strong, steady run she has. So, he had been commenting to me, particularly after the last race, 'you know Chad, I probably should've been a little closer today, and I would've avoided that wide trip on the final turn. I'm going to try to get closer.' Then with the scratch of the six [No. 6, Be Your Best], it became, 'I may even be on the lead now. I don't want to be far away at all.' Luis Saez [aboard No. 2, Choisya] wanted to be on the lead, which I understand, so we got a good trip. Down the lane, there was no excuse for either horse, we ran right down the stretch together and she showed a lot of heart."

Winning owner John Stewart said of the result, "It's awesome. We won the New York last year with Didia [with trainer Ignacio

Correas, IV] and now we have this one here with Chad--and Chad is Saratoga racing. Excellent Truth had a couple of shots and got second in both of them. We knew she was this quality of horse. I think it's a testament to NYRA with the weather challenges and everything that came up to have the race run today and the competition we had in the race. It wasn't a big field, but it was really deep. This is what I got into racing for--to make sure we're competing at the highest

level with the best horses, and I think we all saw that today. Any one of those horses could have won that race and it was just phenomenal to get the win. Chad and Flavien [are] a dangerous combination and I'm really happy to have them train and ride for us."



"I am glad we got the horse breezed today," Mott continued. "It worked out well enough; it looked like he went good. He moved well, the time was good, the rider was happy."

The road outside of Mott's barn was flooded by 8:45 a.m. after a 45-minute rain pounded the area. It looked like a mini lake.

"We didn't expect this, can you believe it?" Mott said. "We got out in time, fortunately, because it looks like we've got some more rain coming (Sunday). I don't know. This track (Oklahoma) might not have a chance to dry out."

This was Sovereignty's third work since winning the Belmont Stakes, which was run at Saratoga, on June 7. He has won three of four starts this year. Besides the Derby and Belmont, he also won the GII Fountain of Youth at Gulfstream Park.

In his other start this year, he was second in the GI Florida Derby.

La Cara Up Next To Make Her Case For Casse

The race for best 3-year-old filly in the land will heat up next week when the \$500,000 GI Coaching Club American Oaks is run at Saratoga Race Course.

Hall of Fame trainer Mark Casse is hopeful that one of his distaff runners can strengthen her case in the 1 1/8-mile race. That is Tracy Farmer's **La Cara** (Street Sense), who already owns a pair of Grade I wins in the Ashland Stakes at Keeneland and the Acorn at Saratoga on June 6.

The leader of the division is the Brad Cox-trained Good Cheer (Medaglia d'Oro), who won her first three starts this year-including the GI Kentucky Oaks--before finishing fifth in the Acorn. Good Cheer is not targeting the CCA Oaks, although could be seen in the \$600,000 GI Alabama at Saratoga on Aug. 16.

Immersive (Nyquist), last year's Juvenile Filly champion, also trained by Cox, could also be in the starting gate in the CCA Oaks.

"Right now, we are ahead (of Good Cheer) in Grade I's," Casse said outside his barn on the Saratoga backstretch. "She won a stake in New Orleans (GII Fair Grounds Oaks) and I don't know if that ranks as high as the Ashland. It's pretty close. Obviously, the (Kentucky) Oaks carries a big punch. I would say when Saratoga ends, there will be a clear-cut leader. I just hope it's us."

La Cara had her final work for the CCA Oaks on Friday, going four furlongs on the main track in :49 (28/92).

"She went perfect," Casse said. "We were going for an easy work."

Casse also has another solid contender in the division in Nitrogen (Medaglia d'Oro), owned by D J Stables LLC. She won her first five starts of the year and has positioned herself as the top 3-year-old grass filly in the land. She ran valiantly in the GI Belmont Oaks Invitational at Saratoga on July 5 but lost by a nose to another Cox filly, Fionn (Twirling Candy).

In her prior start, Nitrogen showed her affinity for the dirt when she won the GIII Wonder Again, by 17 lengths, which was originally scheduled for the grass. Granted she only beat two others, but she showed enough to give Casse the confidence to say her next start will be in the Alabama.

"I am proud of our team," he said. "We have two fillies that are two of the best 3-year-old fillies in North America. This is going to be an interesting meet."

Prat Had To Make A Tough Decision

No one can be in two places at once.

As much as jockey Flavien Prat would like to, he can't be at Saratoga Race Course on July 26 and also at Santa Anita Race Track on the same day.

So, he had to pick. And he'll head to California.

Prat will ride the well regarded **Nysos** (Bernardini) in the GII, \$300,000 San Diego Stakes at Del Mar; his other option was to be on Baeza (McKinzie) in the GII, \$500,000 Jim Dandy at Saratoga.

"It's never an easy decision," Prat said outside the jockey's room at Saratoga.

Prat rode Nysos, trained by Hall of Famer Bob Baffert, in the GII Churchill Downs in May and finished third in a three-horse photo finish. The winner of the race was Mindframe (Constitution), who is considered the leader of the older horse division.

Inglis DIGITAL USA It was Nysos' first start since February of 2024. He won his first three starts by a combined 26 3/4 lengths and Prat was aboard for two of them, the GIII Robert B. Lewis and the GIII Bob Hope Stakes.

Nysos was then sidelined by injury before re-emerging. After the Churchill Downs, he won the GIII Triple Bend Stakes at Santa Anita under jockey Juan Hernandez on May 31 (Prat was riding in Kentucky that day).

"I am kind of committed to Nysos," Prat said. "I always felt like he could be anything."

When Baeza runs in the Jim Dandy for trainer John Shirreffs, he will be ridden by Hector Barrios, who rode him in three of his first four starts, including a second-place finish in the GI Santa Anita Derby.

FAR BRIDGE TOYS WITH SHORT FIELD IN BOWLING GREEN

'TDN Rising Star' Far Bridge (English Channel) toyed with three rivals Saturday and made easy work over a course labeled as yielding in the GII Bowling Green Stakes at Saratoga.

One of the last runners saddled by the late Christophe Clement, the LSU Stables-owned 5-year-old, now in the more-than-capable hands of son Miguel, won his first two starts to kick off 2025 going 1 1/2 miles in the GIII Pan American at Gulfstream before shipping north to take the 1 3/8-mile GII Man O' War Stakes May 10 at Aqueduct. In his first start for the younger Clement, Far Bridge cut back to the 1 1/8-mile GI Manhattan Stakes and just missed a neck behind fellow 'Rising Star' Deterministic (Liam's Map) and Integration (Quality Road) in a distance perhaps slightly shorter than his preferred.

Stretched back out to the 1 3/8-mile distance Saturday facing a field decimated scratches due to morning rain, Far Bridge broke widest of the quartet and was happy to settle second as the

group worked themselves into a single file line into the first of three turns. As expected, one of two Todd Pletcher runners Tucson (Constitution) hustled to the front under Luis Saez while El Rezeen (English Channel) and Saffie Joseph, Jr. runner Harrow (Lea) were comfortable doing their running late. Saez hit the gas on Tucson, opening up a several length advantage past the wire for the first time while Far Bridge never looked in trouble with regular pilot Joel Rosario aboard. The field stayed single file along the rail around the clubhouse turn and into the backstretch through six furlongs in 1:14.83 before Far Bridge could wait no more and began reeling Tucson back in, closing the margin in the length of a few strides before drawing alongside at the midway point up the backstretch. As the pacesetter threw in the towel, the 1-2 favorite assumed command and had a clear lead as the closers swarmed in on a fading Tucson. El Rezeen made a gallant late run but was never a danger to the winner as Far Bridge cruised home well in hand to win while Harrow beat out Tucson for the show spot.

"Strategy went out the window [after all the scratches]," Clement admitted. "Joel [Rosario] knows the horse very well. He's won five of his last seven starts - just keep it simple. I told him, 'you know him inside out. You're the best, Joel; he's the best. You two will figure it out.' I walked it [the turf] this morning around 11:30 and I thought it was actually good to be honest with you. I thought the turf course was in very good condition - very even, very safe. I had zero reservations about the going."

Clement added that Far Bridge would likely be set to defend his title in the GI Resorts World Casino Sword Dancer Stakes Aug. 9, saying, "100 percent. We will be there."

Randy Sarf of LSU Stables added: "He ran like he's been training, he ran like who he is. He's a beautiful horse, and he fights. He tries every day. He gallops, he jogs and he breezes [like] just a really good horse. I'm blessed to have a horse like that and to be part of this game and have something like this. The Clement family is a big part of Far Bridge--my parents, my kids, and everything. This was nice. It's nice to win in Saratoga and [we're] looking forward to the Sword Dancer."

Pedigree Note:

One of 74 stakes winners for the late, great English Channel, Far Bridge is the third and final foal out of the Kitten's Joy mare Fitpitcher who also sadly passed in 2021. As an earner of over \$2.3m in his career, he is far and away the most accomplished of his siblings though his 6-year-old half-sister Bali Belle (Bal a Bali {Brz}) did manage three wins and six-figure earnings herself. Third dam Pleasant Temper, a multiple graded stakes-winning daughter of Storm Cat, also produced the dam of GII Rebel Stakes winner Long Range Toddy (Take Charge Indy).



Lambert has had the rejection and a little bit of ridicule, he said. "Some people have thrown rocks at me," he added, one recent afternoon via Zoom in a brightly lit corner of his Kentucky home, a small bronze horse as his virtual companion. "But it's getting around to universal acceptance now."

If the bronze had been of the flesh-and-bone kind and trained in Kentucky these past couple of years, chances are it would have worn Lambert's StrideSAFE wearable sensor, used on every horse in every race in the state since May of 2023.

Thanks in huge part to this blanket program in Kentucky, StrideSAFE has now been used on over 55,000 individual starts, providing a rich trove of data to understand just how best to use this system to identify the Holy Grail of racing welfare--those horses that exhibit no visible lameness but harbor a brewing problem that could turn catastrophic without intervention.

The equation is simple: "screen, scan, save." Use a wearable sensor like StrideSAFE to screen for early potential injuries. Scan the horse for problems. Then if something shows up, give the horse the necessary time off.

It has reached the point where StrideSAFE is now able to identify in which leg the brewing problem is located, and even the type of pathology, the sesamoids versus the condyles (the end of the cannon bone making up part of the fetlock), said Lambert. Brewing injuries in the fetlock are notoriously hard to diagnose.

In a recent *TDN* letter to the editor, trainer Dale Romans shared his story of a stakes-level trainee that StrideSAFE had flagged for being at increased risk of injury in its right-front sesamoid in its last race, as well as a flag in the start prior.

The horse was visibly sound, but given the StrideSAFE readings, Romans sent it for a precautionary PET scan, which indeed detected worrying bone remodeling in the right-front sesamoid bone.

"This horse is now resting for 90 days and is expected to make a full return to training pending a clean recheck. Without StrideSAFE, we wouldn't have caught it," Romans wrote.

Nevertheless, the racing community at large is still proving reluctant to more broadly adopt these wearable technologies, said Churchill Downs' equine medical director, Dr. Will Farmer.

"We've come a long way. We've learned a lot. I know StrideSAFE has learned a lot," said Farmer. "My biggest push with this is that I really would like our horsemen to engage with it."

What would help, said Lambert, would be to start viewing the sensor as a veterinary tool rather than simply a training aid. As Lambert describes it, "this is about developing a new level of finesse in veterinary medicine."

The Evolution of StrideSAFE

StrideSAFE is a wireless iPhone shaped bio-metric sensor that fits into the saddle cloth. It captures a variety of measurements while a horse is breezing or racing, like its acceleration and deceleration, its up and down concussive movement, and its medial-lateral motion (movement side to side).

As Lambert and his team's understanding of what StrideSAFE can do has evolved, so has the way they relay its information.

In earlier iterations, it worked on a traffic light system, with a green for all-clear, a yellow for caution, and a red for possible danger.

Since then, Lambert and his team have refined the system to use a risk factor calculation from one to five, with five the category in which a horse is most at risk of a fatal or career ending injury--nearly 300 times more likely than horses that fall within risk category one.


StrideSAFE has now been used on some 55,000 individual starts at 13 racetracks around the country. Of the 55,000 individual starts--many of them in Kentucky--about 65% of the horses have been given a rating of one, about 25% were classified two, and the remaining 10% fell in the three, four and five range.

Furthermore, during that time, 152 horses suffered catastrophic injuries. "We have [StrideSAFE data for] nearly 400 career races from those 152 horses," said Lambert. "So, we have longitudinal records on those horses, which is a massive data set."

Using Artificial Intelligence (AI) to run the profiles of the horses in this database, Lambert and his team have been able to more thoroughly and quickly refine their machine to better understand which horses are at heightened risk of injury and why. **Cont.**

The most telling rendering of StrideSAFE's efficacy perhaps best lies in individual cases. Lambert is preparing about eight or nine of them for a paper in a peer-reviewed journal.

Lambert tells the story of a one-time Derby prospect, who even as early as May of his two-year-old year was flagged by StrideSAFE during his breezes. The horse then won two of his races in the fall of that year, but in doing so, StrideSAFE showed that something again was amiss, despite being visibly sound.



"This StrideSAFE readout of the one-time Derby hope is from January of his 3-year-old year. Here, he's flagged as a number 5 risk."


By the time January rolled around, the connections decided to scan the horse, the findings of which indicated he would need 60 days off. But before returning to work, subsequent PET scans and X-rays showed a major problem in the left-front condyle, along with bone remodeling in the other three fetlocks for which time-off was also recommended.

"He was sound to the eye throughout all of that," said Lambert. "But they operated on it and screwed it [the left front]. He's come back to the races and run three times, had a green flag each of the three times since."

With all this data under his belt, Lambert has a growing belief that potential problems can be picked up as far back as a year prior to any serious injury occurring.

As Lambert tells it, something occurs that causes the horse serious enough initial pain to show up on StrideSAFE, but which is still not visible to the human eye.

"The horse learns to live with it. The problem will heal a little bit. That's when some bone remodeling goes on. It'll get more stable, doesn't hurt so much. It doesn't show you a strong red anymore. It shows a category two or three instead of a category four or five," said Lambert, stressing how this isn't a set in stone timeline of pathology.

"But as you get closer and closer to the fatal race, the pain can actually be diminishing because the condition is healing to some extent and stabilizing. But it's still there," said Lambert. "That's a new way of thinking about these things."

Kentucky Program

Such chronology in the pathology of an injury wouldn't surprise Farmer, he said. "Looking at the necropsy program, we know that these are repetitive use injuries. These aren't singular events. And that fits that idea. It's logical," he said.

"They're either going to adapt to the issue, or they're going to adjust their strides and we can pick that up with the sensor, but we may not be able to pick it up at the jog," said Farmer.

This tallies with one of Farmer's main takeaways from the two years that StrideSAFE has been deployed in Kentucky--a program paid for by the tracks. According to Farmer, Churchill Downs has invested nearly \$1 million in piloting the technology at its Kentucky tracks.

StrideSAFE's findings, Farmer said, support the overwhelming wealth of evidence that catastrophic injuries aren't caused by a bad step but rather are the accumulative wear and tear over repetitive races and workouts.

"There are horses that we see, they start off as 'ones,' then they go 'twos,' then 'threes,' then 'fours.' And then they ultimately have some diagnostics done, or they end up with a fracture," said Farmer. **Cont.**

As such, StrideSAFE offers "a very unique opportunity" to find the "needle in the haystack," said Farmer, giving trainers "insight into what's coming down the pipeline before the horse fractures," or worse, suffers a catastrophic injury.

"Rather than it being a fracture, they can get ahead of it, change training patterns for a period of time," said Farmer. "The goal is to keep horses safer, healthier and in the racing population longer."

Despite the promise, acceptance among the racing community is still limited. "The truth is that unfortunately, we don't have many trainers engaging with it," said Farmer. "For this to really take that next step, we need that trainer engagement."

Part of the problem is that the information collected by StrideSAFE isn't currently processed and sent back to the trainers in an easily accessible form, said Farmer.

"They need to make it as easy to have access to, whether that's a push--like a text push--with a report, or a reminder. That's something StrideSAFE needs to work out, how the information is relayed," said Farmer.

For StrideSAFE's part, they're working on a new password protected interactive website for trainers to access, with data on the welfare of the horse, as well as its performance. "In particular, the way in which they fatigue in a race," Lambert said.

But Lambert is beginning to see the communication issue from a slightly different angle--that the diagnostic component to the utility and effectiveness of StrideSAFE makes it a veterinary tool primarily.

"We're getting very sophisticated information about musculoskeletal health, and it's the vets that need to be the ones that manage that and learn about it," said Lambert.

AAEP Study

StrideSAFE is one of six wearable sensors currently being used in an ongoing study out of the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP). The others are Alogo, Arioneo, Equibase/Stable Analytics, Equimetrics and Garmin.

The goal, said Langsam, is to see which of these technologies can most accurately detect the sort of hard-to-detect emerging injury that requires intervention, said Dr. Sara Langsam, AAEP racing committee chair. Beyond the sesamoids and condyles, think buck-shins and small chips in the joint.

"At the end of the study, we would pass forward this information to HISA [the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act Authority], and they would potentially roll out some sort of integration into the entire industry," said Langsam.

Each of the sensors are being used on at least 100 two-year-olds throughout this year during high-speed workouts. Over 700 individual horses are enrolled.

Each horse that breezes is issued a green, yellow or red rating, with a 48-hour window for the study participants to receive the results. As on ongoing study, there are no concrete findings right now, said Langsam. **Cont.**



The study focused on 2-year-olds for several reasons. One was to minimize the variables in the study by using a cohort of horses that haven't already accumulated a lot of pre-existing wear and tear. Another is that two-year-olds offer the best opportunity to intervene as injury progresses.

"We know that about 40 percent of the 2-year-olds are going to get an issue. They like to get mild injuries that may take them out of training, but [which are] less catastrophic in general," said Langsam.

They're hoping to have some kind of conclusion ready for a public airing by the first or second quarter of 2026, said Langsam.

"A lot of low hanging fruit has already been conquered. Technology is going to be the next step to help us get even lower [fatalities]. And while zero is ever achievable or not, that is always the goal," Langsam said. "And this is just one part of the technological sphere that's going to help us move forward. It's exciting."

CURTAIN CALL GETS JUST THAT AFTER BREAKING MAIDEN BY 8 1/2 LENGTHS

SARATOGA SPRINGS - Sometimes, you just know.

When Hall of Fame trainer Mark Casse breezed 2-year-old **Curtain Call** (Tiz the Law) at his training center in Ocala, Fla., he shipped owner Terry Finley a simple, yet powerful text message. It was a photo of a Porsche.

Fast car.

Translation, in case you needed it: Curtain Call, Casse believed, was going to be a swift one.

His confidence was rewarded in Saturday's first race at Saratoga when Curtain Call dominated a six-furlong \$100,000 maiden special weight and earned a 'TDN Rising Star' rosette.

Curtain Call, ridden by Jose Ortiz, romped to an 8 1/2-length win, giving Casse his first baby victory of the season. Last season, he enjoyed much success in maiden special weight events with purses of \$100,000 with no restrictions, winning five times.

A couple of those winners you'll recognize. Sandman (Tapit), who went on to win this year's GI Arkansas Derby and finish seventh in the GI Kentucky Derby and third in the GI Preakness was one of them. So was La Cara (Street Sense), who was victorious in the GI Central Bank Ashland Stakes and GI DK Acorn this year.

Curtain Call won after finishing second in his first start, a 5 1/2 maiden special weight at Churchill Downs June 2. He was a distant second, 7 1/2 lengths behind 'TDN Rising Star' Obliteration (Violence), who went on to win the GIII Sanford Stakes at Saratoga July 5.

"Definitely," Casse said when asked if that first start helped Curtain Call, "I have said a million times that I like getting races into them. I think they learn a lot. I learned a lot today."

Finley, the founder, president and CEO of West Point Thoroughbreds, bought Curtain Call from SGV Thoroughbreds at this year's OBS March Sale of 2-year-olds in training for \$325,000.

"Steve Venosa [of SGV] is a very good friend of mine and he and I have done business for almost 30 years," Finley said. "He told me [Curtain Call] was very nice and he thought he had some upside. When you get that kind of input from someone you trust, it's a good thing."

Finley said Curtain Call is one of three Tiz the Law babies his group has purchased.

"And we paid good money for every one of them," he said.
"Quite frankly, I was not convinced about him until the
2-year-old sales. This year, they really showed themselves very well and we'll keep buying them."

Curtain Call went off as the 2-1 second choice behind even-money favorite **Tagermeen** (Into Mischief), who was debuting for Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen. He went for \$1.4 million in the April OBS Spring Sale of 2-year-olds in training.

After stumbling at the start, Curtain Call recovered, and Ortiz kept him just off the pace until taking over in upper stretch and proving much the best. Tagermeen chased him home and finished second for Ricardo Santana Jr. *Cont.*

They were 1 3/4 lengths in front of pacesetter **Throckmorton** (Caracaro), who settled for third in the five-horse field.

Throckmorton is trained by Jose D'Angelo and was ridden by Luis Saez.

For West Point, it kept a Saratoga streak going. Finley said his group has now won a race at Saratoga 22 straight years.

Curtain Call looks to have a future, something Casse predicted from the start. His next target could be the GI Hopeful at the end of the meet.

"He is going to get better and better with more ground," Casse said. "I'll keep my fingers crossed because I think he is a Breeders' Cup horse. We just have to figure a way to get there." Curtain Call ran the six furlongs in 1:10.31 and returned \$6.10, \$2.70 and \$2.10 on a track labeled as "sloppy."

"We were hoping it was drying out," Finley said. "You can make excuses all day long, but they all have to run over the same thing. I don't want to get a trainer ticked off at me, but that is a trainer excuse, not an owner excuse."

CALL FOR AN ENCORE! CURTAIN CALL GIVES THE SARATOGA CROWD A 'RISING STAR'

Rain or shine, the show must go on, and **Curtain Call** (Tiz the Law) gave the people what they came to see at Saratoga, kicking home powerfully at second asking to claim '**TDN Rising Star**' honors.

The son of Tiz the Law was unveiled June 12 at Churchill Downs to run a well-beaten second behind fellow 'Rising Star' Obliteration (Violence). That runner returned to action July 5 at this venue to put on a Tour de Force in the GIII Sanford Stakes,

winning by 10 1/2 lengths and earning a 91 Beyer after covering the six panel distance on a fast track in 1:10.65.

Well-supported by the betting public here at 2-1 odds, he gave them a moment to sweat when he stumbled coming out of the gate, but recovered well to track **Throckmorton** (Caracaro), who was determined to control the tempo. Content to follow that one as the frontrunner rolled through an opening quarter in :22.17, the field swung through the bend behind a half in :45.15, and the running was on as they entered the homestretch.

Called on for his best as even-money favorite **Tagermeen** (Into Mischief) loomed on his outside and Throckmorton refused to throw in the white flag from the rail, Curtain Call found a brisk second wind to kick home by a widening margin in a final time of 1:10.31. The public choice came second while the long-time leader ran third.

Curtain Call is the most recent to get his picture taken for Deep Trouble, who now claims four winning offspring from as many to the races. She has a yearling full-brother to the 'Rising Star' and had been bred to Verifying for 2025. Deep Trouble hails from the immediate female family of MGISW Artemis Agrotera (Roman Ruler), whose half-sister is the second dam, SP Submerge (Fusaichi Pegasus). This is also the family of GISW Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy).

EXPERIENCE MATTERS AS AMOSS FILLY WIRES FIELD IN SARATOGA MAIDEN

Spa Prospector (Authentic) didn't fare well in her first career start. She was seventh, beaten nine lengths in a race at Churchill.

Saturday's second race at Saratoga didn't figure to be any easier as it was filled with a collection of well-bred first-time-starters from some of the game's top stables. But trainer Tom Amoss went into the race with a lot of confidence in his filly.

He was proven right and she skipped over the Saratoga slop to win the six-furlong race by 3 1/2 lengths under Jose Ortiz.

"Why did she run so much better? It's simple. it was all about her having experience," Amoss said. "I really liked her the first time she ran at Churchill but she was just was very, very green and all over the racetrack.

"She wanted to get away from the other horses so she started lugging out a little bit," he said. "She made things hard on her rider, Brian Hernandez Jr."

"That's the great thing about having a race under your belt as opposed to debuting," he said. "You can see all the mistakes in their first start and work on them, and we worked on those mistakes and she really ran well today."

Spa Prospector, a \$450,000 Keeneland September purchase, showed no speed in her debut, but she rocketed out of the gate Saturday and could not be caught.

"Having the one-hole today, she broke clean, so I just let her go to the lead," said Jose Ortiz, who swept the early double.

The only horse who came close to Spa Prospector was **Jetty's Home** (Enticed), who moved into second on the turn. Sent off at 20-1, Jetty's Home was the other horse in race who had started before.

The final time on the sloppy surface was 1:10.94 and the winner paid \$13.40.

Ginger Ale (Into Mischief), a half-sister to Grade I winner Search Results (Flatter), was bet down to 6-5, but didn't show much before checking in fourth.

It was a good start to the day to anyone playing the "experience" angle. **Curtain Call** (Tiz the Law) won the first race in what was his second lifetime start.

KANTHAROS FILLY JUST HOLDS ON TO WIN OFF-THE-TURF MAIDEN AT SARATOGA

Wesley Ward knew his filly **Pulstar** (Kantharos) was fast but did she have the stamina to win Saturday's sixth at Saratoga, a maiden race that came off the turf and was run at 5 1/2 furlongs on the dirt? The answer is yes, but just barely.

Like so many Ward-trained 2-year-olds, Pulstar shot out of the gate and grabbed a two-length lead down the backstretch. In mid-stretch she was still two in front, but the Mark

Casse-trained **Delightful Darling** (Flameaway) was bearing down on her. The pair were basically on even terms at the wire, but the bob of the head went Pulstar's way.

"I'm glad this race wasn't run at 5 1/2 furlongs plus a jump. If so, I'm not sure she would have won," Ward said.

Ward, who excels with sprinters on both surfaces, had no problem with the race coming off the grass.

"I was happy that it came off the turf," he said. "I was worried that it was going to dry out and be just like a regular track. She's got some distance issues.

"She's a real small filly and that is the reason I tried her on the grass the first time," he said. "Sometimes, horses like her will go a little bit longer on the grass."

Ward believes she improved from her first race, a second-place finish in a Churchill maiden.

"She got a lot out of that last race where she was beaten a

head," he said. "It moved her forward fitness-wise and experience-wise" he said. "All those factors came together today."

Pulsar is owned by and was bred by Roy and Gretchen Jackson of Lael Stable.

The plan going forward, Ward said, was to try to find turf races at five furlongs.

"I told Doug Cauthen, who is the stable manager for the Jacksons, that I think she's really better at 5 than 5 1/2 on the grass. We'll get a work or two into her on grass and hopefully we can find some spots on the turf for her."

Joel Rosario rode the winner, who paid \$6.40. The running time was 1:05.26.

SPECTACULAR IS THE WORD: SPECTACULAR GREY SAILS HOME TO 'RISING STAR' HONORS AT MONMOUTH PARK

An eye-catching debut is often a signal of big things to come. **Spectacular Grey** (Not This Time) gave her connections a lot to dream about at Monmouth Park Saturday when she earned 'TDN Rising Star' honors via a sensational unveiling.

Coming into the race for trainer Alexis Delgado, who only had one other starter recorded for 2025 and no winners, the grey's July 4 four-panel move from the gate in :47.60 (2/24) showed the betting public enough to award her 5-1 odds against a salty field.

Off a bit slow but initially content to track from midpack behind an opening quarter in :22.25, Spectacular Grey changed her mind passing the quarter pole and made a rush to the front that even caught the announcer's attention.

The victress is the first winner to the races for her dam Rose Grey, who has since produced a yearling filly by Charlatan and a 2025 colt by Life Is Good. Said dam is herself a daughter of SP Smitten (Tapit), making her a half-sister to GISP Commandperformance (Union Rags). This is the female line of GSW Snit (Fit to Fight), whose daughters GSW Blind Date (Not For Love) and MSW Sales Tax (High Yield) also going on to produced black-type runners.



Trainer Mark Casse sent three undefeated juveniles into the Victoria Stakes at Woodbine, and Casson (Caravaggio) emerged as the last man standing of that group to keep his perfect record intact by a clear margin.

A four-length winner on unveiling May 11 against local maidens, the gray was a 7-2 chance against his stablemates Jupiter (Upstart) and the flashy Rude Procedure (Authentic). The former went off as the 6-5 favorite and the latter was 2-1.

In no rush initially, Casson had a head on Valley of Kings (Classic Empire) while rating four wide at the :22.79 first quarter, then asserted sole command entering the bend as Rude Procedure tried to match strides. In full flight for the wire by the time they reached the top of the stretch, the victor sailed home by 2 1/2 lengths as Jupiter overtook Rude Procedure in the late yards to nab second, giving Casse the trifecta in the race.

"He broke a little slow," said winning rider Rafael Hernandez. "He was outside, so he broke a little bit out, and when I tapped him in the shoulder, he started picking up. So, I let him cruise.

"My horse was just kind of waiting for me to start moving there to give me a second gear. I had total confidence."

Winfinity earned black-type for the first time in the Miss Disco Stakes Saturday at Colonial Downs.

"She ran well her first start at Tampa and then we went to Keeneland and after the race [jockey] Irad Ortiz said `you've got to get this filly on the grass,' which made sense with Karakontie. He's such an underrated stallion. What surprised me is how quick she is."

"When she won for me at Laurel [on her turf debut], after she was stuck behind horses and took off and won the way she did, I knew she was going to be a nice filly," said winning rider Jaime Rodriguez. "I wasn't able to ride her in her last start [the Stormy Blues Stakes] but I told my agent 'I don't care what I have at Delaware Park today, I am riding this horse in the stakes race at Monmouth Park'."

The victress hails from a busy family as her half-sister Pappascat (Scat Daddy) is responsible for GSW & MGISP Pappacap (Gun Runner) as well as GSW Boppy O (Bolt d'Oro). That mare has a 2025 Candy Ride (Arg) filly to her credit this year. Another half-sister named Fate Factor (The Factor) was multiple stakes-placed in her racing career and produced a 2025 Constitution colt recently. Roja is the most recent to the races for Redmeansgo, who does have a juvenile filly named South Philly Slide (Vekoma) and a 2025 filly by Cyberknife on the records. 



That 85-40 favourite looked to be going best inside the last two furlongs, but as his run flattened out No Half Measures emerged to power past the 12-1 shot Big Mojo and prevail by a neck, with the 40-1 shot Run To Freedom (Muhaarar) completing the shock tricast 1 3/4 lengths away.

"Richard told me she's very genuine and better with a bit of dig in the ground, but that it was an open race and they had to have a go," commented the winner's journeyed jockey, who had

ridden successfully in Hong Kong and had recently been served with a ban by the BHA for social media comments. "I left her alone for as long as possible and when I gave her a flick she accelerated. I'm getting into the twilight of my career, but the one thing I have is a lot of self-belief and every dog has his day."

With nine of her 13 starts prior to this over five, No Half Measures was actually threefrom-four at this trip with her

only try since last April resulting in a win in Deauville's Listed Prix Moonlight Cloud in August. Looking exposed on form figures entering this feature, with her two races this term resulting in a ninth in the Rowley Mile's G3 Palace House Stakes and a second in the Listed Achilles Stakes, she did nevertheless retain that potential over the extra distance.

While Spy Chief did too much in front, the winner and Run To Freedom were the ones racing away from the main group which proved vital as their riders played the clock to perfection. Notable Speech travelled along with the true sprinters as if he truly belonged, but when the exhausting final climb came into view he had already given everything.

Owner Paul Teasdale said of Big Mojo, "I'm absolutely delighted with him. We've tried him over six this year, we've been brave. Today was always going to be a tough ask, but he did fantastically well. I'm really proud of him, I thought he'd just about got it but not quite, I'm still delighted. The King George, the Nunthorpe, the Flying Five--we're in all of them, so we've got some options. He travels so well, he can withstand the pace and he's got a great finish in him. He's really maturing into a top-class horse."

Charlie Appleby is going back up to seven furlongs with Notable Speech, with the G1 City of York Stakes on his agenda. "Will genuinely sounded disappointed, he said he'd thought he'd done everything right and then at the business end he just didn't finish," he said. "We've been seeing the same thing at a mile, so maybe we've got a look a bit harder at him, I don't know. It was always going to be hard to jump to make an assessment after his first time sprinting at this level. I see no reason not to meet halfway at seven and go to York, which was always our plan."

Fascinator has the unraced three-year-old filly Gypsophila (Expert Eye), the £130,000 Goffs UK Premier two-year-old filly Mystic Veil (Showcasing) and a yearling colt by Territories.

FOURTH SUPERLATIVE FOR DUBAWI, SIXTH FOR APPLEBY AS SABA DESERT STRIKES

Picked by William Buick from the two Godolphin hopes for Saturday's G2 Superlative Stakes, **Saba Desert** (Dubawi) justified that call to continue connections' run of success at Newmarket's July Festival. Swooping late to deny the 4-6 favourite **Italy** (Wootton Bassett), the grandson of the Irish 1,000 Guineas heroine Gossamer defied a market drift to 6-1 to prevail by 1 1/4 lengths and deliver a fourth renewal to his sire who won this himself in 2004.

"We went to Sandown with a lot of confidence and William said he had felt like sitting there and winning on the bridle that day which is rare for him," Charlie Appleby said after greeting his sixth winner of this staging post. "He's a horse we've held in high regard for a while and is the typical stamp of a Dubawi--deepgirthed and short-backed--and as it's a road we often take he could go to The Curragh for the National and then on to the Dewhurst. He's more of a Guineas type than a Derby horse for next year."

Opening his account at Sandown in the maiden won by the stable's Native Trail in 2021, the chestnut leapt in the air at the break and missed the kick which served as a blessing as the filly **Venetian Lace** (Masar) streaked up the stand's rail. Italy, who had been too free throughout the early stages, and the winner's stablemate **Wild Desert** (Too Darn Hot) were compromised as she drifted left running downhill and the way was clear for Saba Desert to overhaul them all in the closing stages.

Appleby was keen to upgrade the effort of Wild Desert. "I'm delighted with him, as he was the one that probably got the most interrupted run and he might go to Goodwood for the Vintage. He's a hard horse to gauge, as he's not a work horse at home, whereas the winner is push button--if you want to win a gallop by 10 lengths, he will."

Aidan O'Brien said of Italy, "We're very happy, he was a bit

babyish and a bit green, as we thought he might be. He'll go back to the Futurity Stakes probably now. If he'd won today he'd have had to go into a Group 1 next, so in a way it's better. He came for experience and he hasn't been woke up at all really. We're very happy and we'll look forward to him the next time."

Saba Desert is the third foal out of the modest middle-distance handicapper Finespun (Sea The Stars), a daughter of the aforementioned Gossamer (Sadler's Wells) who also captured the G1 Fillies' Mile at two and produced the G1 Racing Post Trophy winner Ibn Khaldun (Dubai Destination). Her unraced daughter Veil of Silence (Elusive Quality) was responsible for Exceed And Excel's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint hero Mischief Magic (Exceed And Excel) and G3 Prix Eclipse and Listed Windsor Castle Stakes winner Sound And Silence.

NEVER SO BRAVE MAKES STAKES BREAKTHROUGH AT ASCOT


Saeed Suhail's **Never So Brave** (No Nay Never), fresh off a win in Royal Ascot's Buckingham Palace Handicap, claimed a first black-type success when pouncing late in Saturday's G2 Cornish Orchards Summer Mile Stakes back at the Berkshire venue.

"I was confident coming into it that, if he relaxed, he was good enough to be winning today," admitted Andrew Balding. "He relaxed beautifully, but we had to make our move a bit sooner than we thought we would because Jamie [Spencer] was getting loose on the lead. It was a bit nervy to be honest, but we're thrilled with his progression."

The 11-8 second choice was settled behind the clear leader in fifth until well beyond halfway. Still in second gear when easing into third passing the quarter-mile pole, he came under pressure to join the enterprisingly ridden **Point Lynas** (Iffraaj) with 100 yards remaining and edged ahead from there to defeat that rival by 3/4-of-a-length for a career high. **Cont. p8**

Wathnan Racing's 11-10 favourite **Haatem** (Phoenix Of Spain) held every chance inside the final quarter-mile and was the same margin adrift in third.

Looking down the pipe, the trainer added, "We've put him in the [G2] Lennox [at Goodwood], but we were keen to try the mile. He's a very versatile horse and I think he could be effective at six furlongs and up to a mile. He's just a very good horse. I'll have to discuss it with the owner because this has opened up a few more options, knowing that he does stay a mile, so we will see."

His stakes-winning second dam Just Ice (Polar Falcon) is a half-sister to five black-type performers headed by Listed Pretty Polly-winning G2 Lowther Stakes and G3 May Hill Stakes third Always On A Sunday (Star Appeal) and stakes-winning G3 Oleander-Rennen runner-up Palmetto Express (Glint Of Gold).

So reliable and consistent, **Al Qareem** (Awtaad) produced the goods once more at York on Saturday to collect an eighth black-type success in the G3 Silver Cup. A dual winner of Ascot's G3 Cumberland Lodge Stakes having captured the G2 Prix Chaudenay three years ago, Nick Bradley Racing's evergreen stayer was back over the same course-and-distance of his latest romp in the Listed Grand Cup last month.

Sent straight to the front by Clifford Lee, the 4-7 favourite eked out a 2 1/2-length winning margin from **Samui** (Siyouni).

"He just grinds it out, he's so honest and a superstar of a horse to train," trainer Karl Burke said. "I'd say the weight will rule him out of the Ebor, presumably he'd get a penalty as well. The Irish St Leger has always been the target, I think it'd be a nice race for him to roll the dice in." Cont. p9

REMEMBERING CAPTAIN FRED BARKER: A LIFE WELL LIVED

Captain Fred Barker, owner of the picturesque King Edward's Place Stud on the edge of the Downs near the Ridgeway, died recently at the age of 88.

Born into a world where hunting, racing and breeding were a way of life, horses were always at the core of Fred's being. He did just enough to survive his five years at Harrow and then spent several very happy years in the 11th Hussars, before taking over the running of King Edward's Place, which was once a discreet country retreat of Edward VII, as the name suggests, from his parents, 'Gar' and Nancy Barker in 1962, while in his mid 20s.

Ever the perfectionist, Fred worked hard to maintain the stud and with the help of his fellow former 11th Hussar, great friend and bloodstock agent, Johnnie Lewis, he spent a considerable amount of money on stallions, which he hoped would reinvigorate the stud and bring it the recognition it deserved.

Stallions like Klairon, Soleil, Manacle, Calpurnius, Prince De Gaulles, Quiet Fling and latterly Anfield, passed through the stallion yard at King Edward's Place. Manacle was the stud's most successful stallion. He sired Moorestyle - British Horse of the Year, European Horse of the Year and champion sprinter in 1980 - and was later sold to Australia.

Nick Angus Smith, a manager at King Edward's Place "a very long time ago", remembers that Calpurnius was a particularly dangerous horse and tried to savage his lad many times. Johnnie Lewis swiftly had him sold to the West Indies, where he went on to be champion sire.

Quiet Fling sired Old Country, winner of six races, including the G1 Derby Italiano, G1 Premio Roma and G1 Prix Royal-Oak. He was out of a daughter of Klairon.

The last stallion to stand at the stud was Anfield, a three-time Group 3 winner in Ireland by Be My Guest and a half-brother to Group 1 winner North Stoke. His best horse was the very good German colt, Turfkonig, who won the G1 Grosser Mercedes-Benz Preis.

Sadly however, none of the stallions Fred stood at King Edward's Place proved a huge success, or provided the necessary financial return. By the late 1980s, disillusioned with the racing industry and facing increasing head winds, as bloodstock became more expensive and it became ever harder to acquire commercial stallion prospects, Fred made the difficult decision to sell King Edward's Place. Sold to Allied Dunbar, it sadly disappeared off the map as a stud farm.

"I was born in the house, so it was a very difficult decision to sell," he said at the time.

It would be fair to say that to the wider equine community, Fred Barker was probably more renowned for his mastership of the Quorn and VWH hunts. His two stints as senior master of the Quorn were one of the longest in the hunt's history since the war. Cont. p10

Always beautifully mounted and impeccably turned out, Fred was meticulous in planning his days, enjoyed excellent relations with his farmers and even had the respect of the anti-hunting brigade.

Fred and his second wife Penny subsequently went on to become successful masters of the VWH hunt, before in recent years switching their interest to three-day eventing. After initially having horses with Australian rider Paul Tapner, they more recently kept them with Tom McEwan, which notably resulted in team gold and individual silver at the 2021 Tokyo Olympics with their horse Toledo de Kerser.

Away from horses, Fred owned and operated the BEAS Helicopters company through the 1970s and loved his farming estate at Lushill, near Hannington, Wiltshire. Always one for an adventure, Fred memorably teamed up with Johnnie Lewis and another great friend and fellow 11th Hussar, David Dollar, to compete in the 1968 London to Sydney car rally, where despite not processing one iota of rally driving experience between them, they managed to win the amateur class and finish 18th of the 100 entries overall.

His eldest son Grant succinctly summed up his father at his recent funeral. He said, "Fred was prompt, precise and passionate. He also loved polo, power boats and parties, but most of all he loved beautiful things...and married two of them."

Fred Barker died peacefully at his home near Minchinhampton, Gloucestershire, surrounded by his wife Penny, children and his dog, Charlie.

His was the epitome of a life well lived.

JRHA Prepares For Equinox In High Summer Cont. from p1

This prompts a carnival of sorts on Tuesday morning, when the youngsters are brought with their dams to the shade of the woods alongside the sales arena to stand patiently while final inspections are made in the hours before the day's trade begins. But as much as this is about assessing the foals, where else would one have the chance to see such a stellar line-up of broodmares all in one place? Grade I winner follows Group 1 winner follows Grade I winner - a reminder of the Japanese breeders' exhaustive hunt for top-class bloodstock from all corners of the world. It is a spectacle like no other, but then, this is a sale like no other.

Over the last decade, the growth in turnover has more than doubled, with the combined aggregate of 2015 of ¥13.1bn (€76.4m) increasing year on year to the 2024 record of ¥28.9bn (€167.8m). The difference in the number sold in those two years? Only two: 470 in 2015 and 472 last year.

Demand for high-end bloodstock is not of course exclusive to Japan - corresponding elite sales in Europe and America have seen similar growth, often masking concerns lower down the order - but one key difference here is that neither the size of the foal crop nor the crowds at the races are diminishing in the way they are in most other parts of the world.

On Saturday morning, Teruya Yoshida welcomed a group of visitors to his Shadai Farm and sounded a brief note of caution regarding the wider economic picture on the back of trade tariffs imposed on Japan. Cont. p16

"I can't say there is a lot of confidence [in the market] because of President Trump," he said. "We export a lot of automobiles to America and that trade has been damaged.

"But we have many people here for the sale - there are more lookers than last year - so I think we will be okay."

Yoshida continued, "But in Japan Racing Association the betting has grown five per cent on last year, and in NAR [the National Association of Racing circuit, mainly on the dirt] it is up 10 per cent. Racing is so popular here. That means more people may come into ownership - the racing clubs [syndicates] are almost sold out."

The racing clubs in Japan offer not just a way into ownership but also a chance to be at the heart of the action with some top-class runners. In recent years such names as Almond Eye, Gentildonna, Lys Gracieux, Daring Tact, Loves Only You, Epiphaneia, Efforia, Buena Vista, and of course Equinox, have been owned by clubs.

Despite the unpredictability of the goings-on in the White House, it is fair to say that expectations are high in Hokkaido. For a start, it never hurts to have a world champion to showcase. In 2023, Auguste Rodin, from the small final crop of Deep Impact, gave a global reminder of the talents of the former Japanese champion sire with his victories in the Derby, Irish Derby, Irish Champion Stakes and Breeders' Cup Turf. But these exploits were not enough to match the superiority of Equinox, who strolled through the Dubai Sheema Classic, bloodlessly dispatching such classy challengers as Westover, Mostahdaf and Rebel's Romance, before returning to his home nation to win the Takarazuka Kinen and Tenno Sho en route to a hero's farewell in the Japan Cup. The latter was named the Longines World's Best Horse Race of that year, just as its winner towered

over all Thoroughbreds on rankings.

Equinox, a grandson of Deep Impact's full-brother Black Tide, was himself a member of the first crop of Kitasan Black. He now stands alongside his father at Shadai Stallion Station, the pair commanding equal fees of ¥20m (€116,000) in 2024 and 2025 - the highest of any stallion in Japan. The 'Book Full' sign was hung outside Equinox's stable just as soon as that record fee for a freshman had been announced, and he ended up covering 203 mares in his first year.

A number of those heading to Tuesday's sale were available for viewing on Saturday at Shadai, Northern and Oiwake Farms - the studs respectively owned by the Yoshida brothers Teruya, Katsumi and Haruya.

Teruya Yoshida has been in the game for too long to get carried away at this early stage by thoughts of what Equinox may or may not achieve in his secondary career. Wisely, he focuses instead of the achievements of his sire, whose fee has quadrupled since he first took up residence at the Shadai Stallion Station.

"Of course Equinox is remarkable but the father of Equinox, Kitasan Black, also produced this year's Derby winner [Croix Du Nord], so I have more confidence in him. [Equinox] is just a beginner as a stallion," he said. "The standard of Japanese horses is now very high so we will be very proud to present all these horses at the sale."

That the Japanese breeders are reaping rewards on the track and at the sales is as a result of concerted investment in the best race mares and stallion prospects available - from North and South America and across Europe and Australia. Yoshida's latest in-training purchase was Klaynn (Make Believe), just five days before she won the G2 Oaks d'Italia by seven lengths. Cont. p17

The owner may have been associated with reams of good horses over the decades but such was his desire that the Endo Botti-trained filly wear his silks in the Italian Classic that he had jockey Cristian Demuro take a set with him from France to Milan.

"For 20 years we have been buying many good mares from all over the world and that is now returning to the quality of the horses here," Yoshida said. "We've invested in quite expensive mares and that has seen some changes. But from my experience, good horses can also come from so-so mares, not always the expensive mares."

Yoshida is in good heart this Saturday morning as the bloodstock world prepares to turn its attention to the sale he runs with his brother Katsumi. Together, their Shadai and Northern Farm operations account for around 1,600 broodmares - almost double the amount of active mares across all of Germany.

He reminisces about the purchase of Northern Taste, some 50 years ago, in the early days of the Shadai Corporation.

"Before I bought Northern Taste, Lyphard was sold and he was a small horse but he became such a good stallion. Because I saw Lyphard the year before I had good confidence to buy Northern Taste," said Yoshida.

"When I went to America I expected the American horses to be big. Northern Dancer [sire of Lyphard and Northern Taste] was not big but he had a strong temper. I tried to have a photo taken with him at Maryland but he bit me, so I can't forget him. My father always liked to go to see good horses anywhere in the world. Now we have many foreign visitors here, so I am happy."

Those foreign visitors are undoubtedly happy to be here. In years gone by, the Yoshida clan set about learning all they could from some of the more established Thoroughbred breeding nations. Now, they are the ones teaching the lesson.
