



NYQUIST 'RISING STAR' NYSOS TOPS

SOVEREIGNTY CONTINUES TO RULE IN THE JIM DANDY

Ninety-five years ago, a horse named Jim Dandy upset Triple Crown winner Gallant Fox at odds of 100-1 in the GI Travers Stakes at Saratoga. Saturday, with the traditional Travers prep race now named in honor of that monumental beating, the team behind GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont Stakes winner Sovereignty (Into Mischief) reminded everyone why their colt is the top of the class, avoiding any drama to take the GII Jim Dandy Stakes.

Not that there was ever any doubt. With GI Preakness Stakes winner Journalism (Curlin) 3,000 miles away in California, Sovereignty was left to deal with four rivals he'd already soundly beaten before. There was Baeza (McKinzie), who ran second to Journalism in the GI Santa Antia Derby before settling for third in both the Derby and the Belmont. Mark Casse runner Sandman (Tapit), who debuted with blinkers Saturday, could do no better than seventh in the Derby and third in the Preakness.

Baoma Corp's **'TDN Rising Star'** Nysos (Nyquist), who is a neck away from being undefeated in six career starts, made just his second trip around two turns Saturday, resulting in a victory in the 1 1/16-mile GII San Diego Handicap at Del Mar. His fellow Bob Baffert-trained stablemate Mirahmadi (Into Mischief), a \$1.05-million Keeneland buy who finished second in the GI Del Mar Futurity two years ago, set all the pace, holding off all but Nysos to complete the silver-haired trainer's exacta. MGSP Tarantino (Pioneerof the Nile) stalked throughout to finish third.

When the gates flew, MGSP Judge Miller (Curlin) lost his footing behind and nearly sat down, forcing a tardy exit from his outside post. The setback didn't impact anyone else, least of all Nysos, who broke from the inside. Mirahmadi showed the way through a :23.49 first quarter as Nysos got comfortable on the rail in a joint fourth alongside GSW and 'TDN Rising Star' Hall of Fame (Gun Runner). Mirahmadi continued to rev the motor up front, tripping the timer in :46.91 for the half, but when the tempo quickened, Nysos idled with no where to go. Trapped on the rail behind Mirahamdi, Nysos and Flavien Prat finally found room at the eighth pole. Nysos accelerated and Prat waved the stick at him twice as the pair inhaled the pacesetter to skip home much the best in a hand ride. The 2 3/4 lengths marked Nysos's smallest margin of victory to date, but visually it was as strong as ever and he won in hand with his ears pricked. "He was ready," said Baffert after the San Diego. "Prat just sat patiently behind there and he had enough horse to cut the corner." Cont. Pg. 5



And **'TDN Rising Star**' Hill Road (Quality Road), who won the traditional Belmont prep in the GIII Peter Pan Stakes, wound up fifth in the final leg of the Triple Crown. The only new shooter on

the scene was New York-bred Mo Plex (Complexity) who projected to be the speed of the race off a nice win in the GIII Ohio Derby at Thistledown last month.

Drawn widest of the quintet, the Godolphin homebred, guided by regular pilot Junior Alvarado, had more to say about the pace than perhaps was expected, breaking nicely to the front only to be outrun in the opening furlong by Mo Plex with Baeza taking up position along the rail. The field remained rather compact around the clubhouse turn with Sandman

also racing closer than usual and Hill Road, the longest shot on the board at 18-1, whipping-in the field through an opening quarter that went in a moderate :24.54. Jeremiah Englehart's Mo Plex continued to dictate terms up the backstretch with Baeza inching closer to grab second from Sovereignty who remained out widest of the bunch.

As the half went in :48.49, Hill Road made a short-lived move

up the inside along a rail which the pacesetter left vacant but quickly fell out contention as the real running started between the top three at the quarter pole. Despite being fanned out to nearly the center of the course, Sovereignty was left with just a gusty run from Baeza who was glued to his side at the quarter pole and while the two appeared briefly on even terms, the Derby champ, under mostly a vigorous hand ride from Alvarado, quickly pulled away to leave little doubt who the best 3-year-old in the country is. The well-related Baeza, whose

jockey Hector Berrios was making his Saratoga debut Saturday, scooped up another Grade I placing while Hill Road finished well but far back to round out the minor awards. **Cont.**



"I'd say it was good, it was a winning trip, a winning ride, a winning run," said winning conditioner Bill Mott. "We hope he comes back good and hopefully he trains as well for the Travers as he did for this. It is interesting [running closer to the pace]. Junior [Alvarado] said by the time he got to the first turn he was already starting to relax with him. I guess in some races it is good to be able to have a little early position, rather than come from as far back as he did in the Derby and some of his other races."

Of his star's next expected start, Mott said, "We are trying to get ready for the Travers and that is the main objective for everybody, I think. It is a race I've never won, and I'd really like to win it before I check out [laughs]. We'll give it our best go."

"I was 100 percent confident of what I had underneath of me," Alvarado added. "[Sovereignty] got to get out and I stayed with my horse and by a little bit before the three-eighths pole when I asked him, he started picking it up a little bit. He just jumped right away and went after them. Then I didn't want to kind of pass by those horses right away. I didn't want him to be on the lead too early turning for home so I kind of nursed him out a little bit with those horses. When I asked him, right after we turned for home, he took off and then after that once again just doing enough to keep him in the lead without really asking him for his best. I got to about 75 percent, 80 percent out of him. We thought this was a prep. We don't need to get everything out of him today. That was the idea and sometimes those are the races you have to run and I thought we were kind of taking it easy coming into the stretch and just hoping for his best and that's what he did. Now, for the next couple races coming up, we are going to do what we did in the Derby and the Belmont." Cont.





Pedigree Note:

Sovereignty is yet another Grade I-winning son of super-sire Into Mischief who also counts Derby winner Authentic to his credit. It's also a feather in the cap for leading broodmare sire Bernardini whose daughters have 118 stakes winners including champion 2-year-old filly Immersive (Nyquist). Godolphin made a splash into the family by picking up first dam Crowned for \$1,200,000 as a yearling at Keeneland September in 2014. Crowned, who passed in 2024, was a daughter of GI Juddmonte Spinster winner Mushka who sold for seven figures twice in her own career before lastly bringing \$650,000 at KEENOV 2016 for SF Bloodstock and Newgate Farm. While clearly the class of his siblings, Sovereignty has two full-sisters, one of whom was a winner. Crowned's last foal was a yet-unnamed Nyquist colt born last year.

Once he got that little seam, I knew it was over. I'm glad to win the San Diego. I haven't had the best of luck in this race. I've had some great horses get beat here."

Baffert previously won the San Diego with Maximum Security in 2020 and Fed Biz in 2014. Nysos's win represented his 179th stakes win at Del Mar, the most of any trainer. It was also the 100th stakes win at Del Mar for Prat.

"[Nysos] broke well and he was comfortable down inside, so I stayed there," said Prat. "He was comfortable all the way around. I didn't have any special instructions with him; just ride."

Nysos may not have a lot of races on his CV, but he brings his 'A' game every single time. After breaking his maiden on debut at Santa Anita in the fall of his juvenile season--a runaway 10 1/2-length score good for 'Rising Star' honors and a 96 Beyer Speed Figure--he captured the GIII Bob Hope Stakes in a similar performance. Brought back early in his 3-year-old year for another daylight score in the one-mile GIII Robert B. Lewis Stakes--his only previous try around two turns--he was sent to the sidelines for 15 months before returning in Louisville on Derby Day this year to face a deep field in the GI Churchill Downs Stakes. Nysos suffered his only career loss that day, falling short by just a neck to 'TDN Rising Star' and MGISW Mindframe (Constitution) while deadheating for second. He hasn't lost since, capturing the GIII Triple Bend Stakes May 31 at Santa Anita by 5 1/2 lengths with a career-high 108 Beyer in his lead up to Saturday's stretch out in the San Diego. Baffert said after the San Diego Nysos would be aimed at the \$1-million GI Pacific Classic, Del Mar's signature 1 1/4-mile test for older horses Aug. 30. Cont.

Pedigree Notes:

Darley's Nyquist, firmly entrenched among the top 10 leading sires of 2025 with his sixth crop of 2-year-olds racing this year, is the sire of Nysos and 17 other graded winners. His 30 black-type winners include two Eclipse champions, one Sovereign Award winner, and eight Grade I winners. Nysos, like four other Nyquist graded winners (including two of his three champions), is out of a Bernardini mare. The late Bernardini, who stood alongside Nyquist at Darley, has 118 stakes winners out of his daughters including Saturday's GII Jim Dandy Stakes winner Sovereignty (Into Mischief). As a Godolphin homebred, that dual Classic winner will eventually join Nyquist in the Darley stud barn.

Nysos is out of the unraced Zetta Z, who sold at the 2021 Keeneland November sale for \$35,000 to Three Times A Charm. It was the same sale where Nysos first sold; Cypress Creek paid \$130,000 for him as a weanling. Nysos would sell twice more: asa \$150,000 Fasig-Tipton October yearling to Best A Luck Farm and finally as a \$550,000 2-year-old at OBS to Baoma. His dam would also go through the ring again. On the heels of Nysos's early performance, Zetta Z would sell at the 2024 Fasig-Tipton Winter Mixed Sale for \$2 million to Coolmore Stud. The foal she was carrying, a filly a Cyberknife, is now a yearling. The mare also has a 2-year-old colt named Warnock (Yaupon), who sold as a weanling at Keeneland in 2023 to AAA Thoroughbreds for \$450,000. Zetta Z is a granddaughter of Unbridled Elaine (Unbridled's Song), winner of the 2001 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and a half-sister to 1997 GI Ashland Stakes winner and Grade I producer Glitter Woman (Glitterman).

LOVESICK BLUES SPRINGS THE 18-1 UPSET IN 'WAYI' BING CROSBY

It was bomb's away Saturday at Del Mar as Lovesick Blues (Grazen) surged past pacesetter Hejazi (Bernardini) in the final sixteenth to spring the upset in the GI Bing Crosby Stakes and secure himself a spot in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint in November.

The true war horse of the field (his 40 starts are more than several other runners combined), the 7-year-old gelding began his career all the way back in 2020, earning wins at nearly every California track and banking over \$500,000. And while his career began at the lowest maiden claiming levels running for tags of \$12,500 and \$14,000, Lovesick Blues has seen an uptick in form over the last two years. His first stakes start was a third, beaten just a neck, in the 2023 edition of the GIII Daytona Stakes at Santa Anita and he's been knocking on the door ever since. Purchased privately from breeder Nick Alexander to kick 2025, Lovesick Blues left Steven Miyadi's barn to join Librado Barocio this year and has contested exclusively stakes company in four starts as a 7-year-old including a win in the six-furlong Siren Lure Stakes two back at Santa Anita May 10. Fourth most recently in the same GIII Daytona Stakes he placed in two years ago, the son of Grazen was stepping into immensely deep waters Saturday to tackle his first Grade I.

Drawn widest of the nine-horse field, the 18-1 shot broke with the frontrunners along the inside but quickly took back and allowed a four-wide calvary charge to go on with the tempo up the rail. Falling back nearly to the rear of the first flight, he stayed wide and in the clear as Hejazi got the best of the frontrunners and broke away with Roll On Big Joe (Prospective) right on his flank. 2-1 favorite 'TDN Rising Star' World Record (Gun Runner) sat fifth just outside of the well-regarded

Dr. Venkman (Ghostzapper) and it was several lengths back to Lovesick Blues and fellow longshot Smooth Cruisein (Girvin). GII Carter Stakes winner Crazy Mason failed to really accelerate from the gate and was a long ways back with the entire field to pass. Around the far turn, Hejazi was still the one to catch through the half-mile in :44.48 and it looked for a moment at the top of the lane as if the \$3.5m EASMAY topper might finally grab that elusive stakes win for Zedan Racing and Bob Baffert. But fanning out six paths across the track, Lovesick Blues was just getting going alongside a host of pursuers looking to run down the pacesetter. Everyone seemed to be running out of time but it was the son of Grazen who broke away from the challengers and kept rolling home, nailing Hejazi in the final strides to win going away in emphatic fashion. World Record finished up best of the pack to grab third for Rodolphe Brisset. In addition to earning a Breeders' Cup slot, Lovesick Blues also awarded trainer Librado Barocio, who also heads Mia Familia Racing Stable, his first Grade I win.

"When he broke I said 'great' and we taught him how to close, so when Giovanni (Franco) was turning for home and circling them, I knew he was running," said Barocio. "I picked up my wife, I was going crazy. Man, what a miracle happened. My first Grade I."

Winning rider Giovanni Franco added, "You know what, I always have complete confidence in this horse. Turning from home he was doing it just like a morning workout; I was just waiting for the time to go. By the time he hit the stretch, he was all out. I have only been able to ride him in the grass races. And he excels well on the grass, but as far as working him on the main track he is always dragging me out there. I told Librado (Barocio) you know, why not take a chance. As soon as I got back to work on horses in December, this was one of my first workers that I got on. He got me my first stakes win back. Now he got me a Grade I win, and I'm just thankful." **Cont.**

Pedigree Note:

The fifth graded stakes winner for leading California sire Grazen, Lovesick Blues is also his sire's first Grade I winner though he has been represented by previous Grade I placings from Lieutenant Dan and Enola Gray. Queenofhercastle, a winner herself, has produced three winners from as many to race including this runner's half-brother, Golden State Juvenile Stakes winner Speedy Wilson (Tough Sunday). The dam herself is a half to MGSW Queen Bee To You (Old Topper), already responsible for GSP Princess Madison (Speightstown). SARATOGA NOTEBOOK, PRESENTED BY NYRA BETS: FIERCENESS THE ONE FOR PLETCHER IN WHITNEY by Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.-'TDN Rising Stars' Fierceness (City of Light) or Mindframe (Constitution) in the GI \$1 million Whitney Stakes?

Will one of them be running or will it be both?

Those questions got definitive answers Saturday morning outside Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher's barn on the Oklahoma Training Track.

When entries are taken for the meet's marquee race for older horses on Sunday, both horses names will be front and center, but it will be Fierceness who carries the flag for Pletcher and the ownership group of Mike Repole's Repole Stables, Derrick Smith, Michael B. Tabor and Mrs. John Magnier.

"We plan to enter both," Pletcher said. "We want to make sure we have a good week and if everything goes smoothly, the plan is to run Fierceness," Pletcher said. "We are fortunate to have two horses that are multiple Grade I winners that are capable of running in these kinds of races."

Mindframe, who has won all three of his starts this year--all at different distances--will be pointed to the \$1 million GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at the end of the meet, Aug. 31. But he will be entered in the Whitney as a safeguard in case Fierceness ends up not running.

The two 4-year-olds both worked on the main track at Saratoga Saturday morning. Fierceness and exercise rider Danny Wright appeared at 7 a.m. and went in company with stablemate Dreamlike (Gun Runner), going four furlongs in :49.40 (104/167).

"All of his works have been excellent," Pletcher said. "We tried to do a little less with him today than he did last week when he had such a big work (five furlongs in 1:01.70) and such a strong gallop out. This was more of a maintenance work."

Mindframe, owned by Repole and Vinnie and Teresa Viola's St. Elias Stable, and exercise rider Carlos Quevedo appeared later at 8:45 a.m. and also went four furlongs in :49.22 (87/167) while working in company with stablemate Classicist (Curlin).

For now, Pletcher will be fine keeping his two stable stars away from each other. Fierceness has won six of 11 career starts and is coming off a second-place finish in the GI Met Mile at Saratoga June 7.

"I think, for a race like the (GI) Breeders' Cup Classic, I would look forward to having both of them in there and taking their best shot at it," Pletcher said. "There is a good chance we'll keep them separated until that day."

Joseph Mulling What to do With Skippy

Trainer Saffie Joseph Jr. knows that he will be running **White Abarrio** (Race Day) in next Saturday's Whitney. He's not sure what he is going to do with his stablemate **Skippylongstocking** (Exaggerator).

The 6-year-old horse, who seems to get better as he gets older, worked four furlongs in :49.22 (87/167) on the Saratoga main track in company with stablemate Wally World (More Than Ready) at 8:45 Saturday morning.

Joseph said he will decide on Sunday whether he will put Skippy's name in the entry box.

"We won't decide until we have to," Joseph said outside his barn on the Saratoga backstretch Saturday morning.

The main goal for Skippy this summer, Joseph said, is the GII Charles Town Classic in West Virginia on Aug. 22. It's a race that Skippy, owned by Daniel Alonso, has won the last two years. Joseph would love a three-peat.

Skippylongstocking was entered to run in the GI Stephen Foster at Churchill Downs on June 28, but Joseph scratched. He hasn't run since May 26 when he won the GII Hollywood Gold Cup Stakes at Santa Anita.

Joseph would like to get a race into Skippy before the trip to Charles Town, but the Whitney is a tough spot, he knows that.

"The cons are the competition," he said with a laugh. "The pros are if we were to win it. We want to run in the Whitney. We did it last year (finishing fifth). If he runs in the Whitney and has a hard race and you mess up the Charles Town Classic ... that is the drawback."

Skippylongstocking has started 32 times and has 11 wins, three seconds and seven third place finishes. This year, he has two wins and two thirds in four starts.

"He is consistent," Joseph said. Cont.

"He has gotten better as he has gotten older. From his 4-year-old year on, he has been really, really good. Every track he goes to, he runs. Thankfully, he has been able to stay around and he has been a joy to have."

DAISY FLYER COMES FLYING LATE WITH NAIL-BITING RALLY IN LAKE GEORGE

It was overcast and foggy, but weather was not going to stop her as Daisy Flyer (Mshawish) flew home in the final yards to take the GIII Lake George Stakes at Saratoga.

Sent to George 'Rusty' Arnold as a juvenile, she ran a flat eighth last summer on unveiling July 21 at Ellis Park, but produced her first inkling of the dramatic final kick in her Sept. 5 graduation at Kentucky Downs when she won the photo by a head. When her connections stepped her up into the GII Miss Grillo Stakes at the Belmont Big A meeting that October, she never left the back half of the field, finishing ninth. Allowed some time away after that effort, she returned Mar. 1 at

Gulfstream Park in the GIII Herecomesthebride Stakes, and roared home in the lane to run third in a blanket finish, beaten less than a long neck for it all as an 87-1 long shot.

While she wasn't the favorite here, the betting public definitely took notice of her after those efforts, and sent Daisy Flyer off carrying 7-1 odds for this breakthrough attempt. Near the back in fifth but closer than in her previous starts, she saved all the ground going into the backstretch and was asked to close the distance as they swung through the far turn after six furlongs in 1:10.02. Rallying relentlessly from the outside as 7-5 favorite Classic Q (Classic Empire) tried to hold them off, Daisy Flyer made good on her name to overhaul that longtime leader in the final strides, winning by a neck. The betting choice hung on for second by a nose over Reining Flowers (Midnight Storm).

"I was trying to get her up to be second and all at once she made that little late spurt, and it all worked out," said Arnold. "She's a filly we obviously liked to bring her back from Mar. 1 to now and run in a graded stake, but she had trained the right way and backed it up."

When asked about a next start, the conditioner said, "She'll be going farther. Her next start is in the Dueling Grounds Oaks [Sept. 10] at Kentucky Downs going a mile and five-sixteenths. We had to get her eligible for it--it's an invitational and I don't think she'd quite done enough and now she has."

Pedigree Note

Hailing from a salty European female family, Daisy Flyer was bred top to bottom for grass racing and claims a fleet of successful relatives. Three of her elder half-siblings earned Listed and/or Graded black-type, and the sisters in that trio have gone on to broodmare careers, namely Turf War (War Front)--a winner producer in Japan--and Scarabea (American Pharoah), whose most recent is a 2025 filly by Authentic. The lone brother in that bunch is 11-time winner, GIII Essex Handicap-third Time for Trouble (English Channel). Dam Starstruck now boasts six winners from six to the races, and her latest of racing age is a juvenile colt named Turf Star (Caravaggio). She has a 2025 filly by Channel Cat to her tally.

Starstruck is a daughter of multiple highweight mare Agnetha (Ger) (Big Shuffle), an English Group winner and placed in the G1 Phoenix Stakes. The second dam was herself a full-sister to MGSW-Ger Areion, who went on to become a six-time leading sire in Belgium and Germany as well as being crowned a leading broodmare sire in Slovakia.

Stud TNT homebred Running Away (Gun Runner), already a two-time stakes winner, added her first graded stakes win Saturday in the GIII Monmouth Oaks for trainer Wesley Ward. A filly who was three-for-three in races where she got the lead, the 9-2 shot wired the field this season in both the Busanda

Stakes at Aqueduct and, most recently, the Horseshoe Indianapolis Handicap over a sloppy track May 14. Sandwiched between those starts was an off-the-board effort at this same 1 1/16-mile distance at Keeneland in the GI Ashland Stakes in April.

Facing a plethora of fast fillies Saturday, Running Away broke in front with Paris Lily (City of Light) just a touch faster to her inside. Those two handled the speed up front, posting an opening quarter in :23.36 as longshot Naked Eye (Vekmoa) sat third along the rail in a field that settled out largely single file. GII Black-Eyed Susan runner up Paris Lily went along under moderate pressure, leading Running Away only narrowly into the far turn as the pace slowed past the half-mile pole in :47.18. Pink Ruby (Connect) looked to make a three-wide bid outside of the leaders off the far turn but Running Away was getting away and hit the final sixteenth alone. A late challenge from race favorite Fondly (Upstart) came up short as Running Away picked up the win. The victory also marked jockey Victor Espinoza's first at Monmouth Park since he captured the GI Haskell Stakes aboard Triple Crown winner American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) in 2015.

"I thought it was exciting, and I was looking forward to it because of her style," Espinoza said. "I feel like I pretty much want to let her stretch her legs and perform her best. As far as all of the speed on paper, that's always a concern. Before the race there's always a concern with that. I figured if I was going to go I might have to try something crazy. I was able to ease her back a little bit; not too much, just a little bit, and I was hoping to stick there and just clear on the first turn. If I was clear on the first turn on the outside, then I think I was okay. It really helped me to be able to drive her the way I wanted to. It makes my job much easier."

Ward added, "Sometimes, I know this from my jockey days, it looks like you've got a lot of speed in a race and then it plays in the riders' minds. I think it played in Victor Espinoza's mind a little since he didn't just go right to the front. I really don't give these type of riders instructions. I'll tell them about the horse but not about how the race might play out because they get things in their minds and I'd rather they just do what they feel is necessary. Watching the race, as I jockey I might have ridden it differently and I might not have had the same outcome because I'd have probably just went. The first few jumps out of the gate she kind of stumbled but she picked herself up right away and got right into it. We had Kentucky Oaks aspirations for her but it didn't materialize when we gave her a little time and ran her in the Ashland Stakes. With a little bit of a troubled trip and start she faltered on us in that race. We gave her time again and she won and now she has won again today. She's turning into a high-quality filly."

Pedigree Note:

One of 42 stakes winners for Three Chimneys sensation Gun Runner, Running Away is out of the WinStar-bred mare Allez Marie who was group-placed in Brazil before selling to Three Chimneys for \$750,000 through the Fasig-Tipton Digital platform in December 2024. In addition to Saturday's winner, she's also produced Cicada Stakes winner Workaholic (Sky Mesa), Sugar Bowl Stakes winner Legalize (Constitution), MSP Fouette (Nyquist) and GSP Tomato Bill (More Than Ready). Allez Marie is herself a daughter of GI Kentucky Oaks winner Summerly. Running Away's yearling half-brother by Munnings also sold to Three Chimneys through the same sale for \$320,000 as a weanling while Allez Marie produced a colt by Elite Power this year and returned to Gun Runner for 2026.

Beaten in both her last outs by the undefeated Laurelin (Ire) (Zarak {Fr}) while faced with yielding and good ground, Glassman Racing's Candy Quest shipped north to Woodbine, where she found firm turf, a return to Lasix after three tries without it, and her first black-type win in the GIII Ontario Colleen Stakes Saturday.

Despite 8-5 Boca Queen (Ire) (Kingman {GB}) completely missing the break a few spots to her inside, Candy Quest was unbothered and settled nicely in the clear while second from last. It Ain't Two (GB) slugged it out up front--first with Lupa (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) and then with SP Hidden Quarry (Preservationist)--through :23.39 and :46.62 fractions while Candy Quest bided her time until the turn. She cut the corner, tipped out into the lane, and ran down It Ain't Two, who was stubbornly stuck on her wrong lead, late. Candy Quest crossed the line 1 3/4 lengths the best as Somethinabouther nosed out a game It Ain't Two for second.

"I got on the horse in the morning," said rider Sahin Civaci, who not only won the GIII Trillium Stakes earlier on the card, but also scored his 700th lifetime win Saturday. "I liked her, and we had an easy, comfortable trip, and then everything opened up and she kicked on. She was in full run, so I didn't have to encourage her more. She was doing it herself."

A \$225,000 buy by Glassman at the 2023 Keeneland September sale, Candy Quest broke her maiden on debut in her only race at two, then added an optional allowance win at Gulfstream in March, as well as placings in both the Sanibel Island Stakes and the Penn Oaks prior to her win in the Ontario Colleen.

Pedigree Notes:

With Candy Quest's win Saturday, Connect got his second winner on the day's Woodbine card, following debuting 2-year-old Sweet Fusion. The son of Curlin, who has five crops of racing

age, now has 15 black-type winners and seven graded winners. Winner of the GI Cigar Mile in 2016, the Lane's End stallion counts 2023 Canadian champion Witwatersrand and 2021 GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity winner Rattle N Roll among his top runners to date.

Candy Quest is also the second graded winner for her dam, the winning Candy Crush, who is by another Lane's End stallion in Candy Ride (Arg). Candy Crush produced MGSW and 2021 Sovereign Award winner Frosted Over (Frosted), as well as GSP Take a Stand (Will Take Charge). The mare has a yearling filly by Flightline, a Mar. 25-foaled filly by Authentic, and was bred to Not This Time for next term. Candy Crush hails from the same extended family as Hall of Famer Easy Goer and his champion dam, Relaxing.

Literate, a \$50,000 claim by C2 Racing Stable as a maiden at Gulfstream in February 2023, produced a career high to upset last year's King's Plate winner in Saturday's GIII Trillium S. at Woodbine.

Literate trailed the field of six through fractions of :24.10 and :47.51 and began to advance with a rail run on the far turn. She was shifted out in the stretch and came charging to reel in the heavily favored Caitlinhergrtness.

Literate, a three-time winner over this course last season, made four previous starts this term, led by an optional claiming win over champion Just F Y I (Justify) on the Gulfstream dirt Mar. 13. She entered following a sixth-place finish in the GI Fasig-Tipton La Troienne Stakes May 2 at Churchill Downs and a fourth behind Caitlinhergrtness in the GIII Belle Mahone S. Woodbine May 31.

"I figured that she's going to come running," winning trainer Martin Drexler said. "As it turned out, we saved ground all the way around there, so it actually was a great trip."

He continued, "I just thought that we had a little bit of a wide trip last time. She's coming to this race training even better than she did the last time. Not to take away from Kevin (Attard)'s horse (Caitlinhergrtness), she's a great filly, but I really do think this is a good horse."

CONTENDERS GET FINAL WORKS IN BEFORE **NEXT WEEKEND'S WHITNEY**

Reigning champion 3-year-old colt and 'TDN Rising Star' Sierra **Leone** (Gun Runner), second last out in the GI Stephen Foster on June 28 at Churchill Downs, worked a half-mile in :48.80 (52/167) Saturday to the inside of Secured Lender over the Spa main track. The Chad Brown runner is expected to start in next Saturday's GI Whitney Stakes, a 'Win and You're In' race for the GI Breeders' Classic in November at Del Mar.

"He worked super. It was just maintenance," Brown said. "He's bounced out of the Stephen Foster race in good order, and he was moving great through the lane."

The \$2.3 million Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearling Sale purchase will face a Whitney field expected to include some of the top older horses in the country with fellow 'Rising Stars' Fierceness (City of Light), Mindframe (Constitution) along with White Abarrio (Race Day), Skippylongstocking (Exaggerator), Post Time (Frosted), Highland Falls (Curlin), Gould's Gold (Goldencents) and Mama's Gold (Bolt d'Oro) all possible.

Brown said he is not too concerned just yet about where his horse ranks in terms of year-end honors, but feels Sierra Leone is in good order as he looks for his first win at the Spa.

"It's early in the season still and a lot of racing to go," Brown said. "The horse is the reigning 3-year-old champion and he's coming off a very nice race. I'm happy with how he's training and that's all that really matters to me at the moment."

Godolphin's homebred Highland Falls also turned in his final work for the Whitney when covering five furlongs in 1:01.55 (3/13) solo over the Saratoga Race Course main track on Saturday.

Trained by dual Eclipse Award-winner Brad Cox, the 5-year-old worked in his usual blinkers with Luis Saez up.

The work was supervised by Blake Cox, the son of and assistant to Brad who said the team was pleased with what they saw from Highland Falls.

"He was good. He went five-eighths from the half and went nice and smooth, letting him quicken down the lane," Cox said. "He looked very happy and it was a good work. He's a good enough work horse on his own, so we just figured we'd go solo this week."

Highland Falls returns to the scene of his best performance to date, a four-length romp in last year's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup that equaled a career-best 104 Beyer Speed Figure.

"He's doing great and obviously, he had a good year here last year, so I think he likes this place," Cox said. "I think he's very similar to last year – we liked him a lot going into the Jockey Club and he's a more seasoned horse now. There's some very good horses in there, but hopefully he can get a piece of it."



OBS RECORD-SETTING BRANT AS ADVERTISED, DELIVERS 'RISING STAR' PERFORMANCE ON DEBUT AT DEL MAR

Brant (c, 2, Gun Runner--Tynan, by Liam's Map), the record-setting \$3-million OBS March breezer, lived up to the hype for Hall of Famer Bob Baffert with a spectacular 'TDN Rising Star' performance on debut at Del Mar Saturday.

The 4-5 choice sat the trip in third through an opening quarter in :21.56, revved up three deep at the top of the stretch and leveled off with powerful strides to win going away by 5 1/4 lengths. Civil Liberty (Independence Hall) was second. The final time for 5 1/2 furlongs was a sharp 1:02.63.

Brant becomes the 20th 'Rising Star' for leading young stallion Gun Runner. Brant's two-time winning dam Tynan, a half-sister to GSW and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up Pappacap (Gun Runner), had a filly by Candy Ride (Arg) in 2024 and a colt by Bolt d'Oro this year. Tynan was a \$225,000 KEESEP yearling purchase by Brant's breeder PTK.

A \$200,000 KEESEP yearling purchase by St. Clair Stables, Brant brought a record-setting \$3 million from Amr Zedan after powering through a :9 3/5 breeze from the Eddie Woods consignment at OBS March. The previous record for a horse sold at OBS was the \$2.45 million paid by agent John Moynihan on behalf of Coolmore for a Tiznow colt at the April sale in 2017.

Zedan and Baffert also campaigned Gun Runner's three-time GISW and 'Rising Star' Taiba.

TOMMY JO A NEW 'RISING STAR' FOR INTO MISCHIEF AT SARATOGA

Tommy Jo (f, 2, Into Mischief--Mother Mother, by Pioneerof the Nile) became the 53rd 'TDN Rising Star' for her out-of-this-world stallion Into Mischief with a powerful performance on debut at Saratoga Saturday.

Off as the 2-1 second choice, the Spendthrift Farm homebred was ridden along in fifth, hit the gas with a flashy, sweeping move on the far turn, opened daylight in the stretch and was hand ridden by John Velazquez to a facile 3 3/4-length victory over Tennesse Belle (Yaupon).

Tommy Jo's final time of 1:11.24 for six furlongs was faster than the 2-year-old male equivalent earlier on the program, won by \$950,000 OBS March graduate Soldier N Diplomat (Army Mule), who stopped the timer for the same distance in 1:11.87.

Tommy Jo's dam Mother Mother, a fellow 'Rising Star' after a runaway debut win for Bob Baffert at Del Mar in the summer of 2018, was a two-time stakes winner and also hit the board in a trio of Grade I events. She brought \$1.8 million from Spendthrift Farm at the 2020 FTKNOV sale. She was bred to Vekoma for 2026. Mother Mother is a half-sister to longshot GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Commanding Curve (Master Command).

Tommy Jo is bred on the same Into Mischief x Empire Maker cross as GI Kentucky Derby winner Mandaloun, G1 Dubai World Cup winner Laurel River and the ill-fated, three-for-three multiple stakes winner Taraz. Both Mandaloun and Taraz were tabbed as 'TDN Rising Stars.'

Spendthrift Homebred Romps In Saratoga Maiden *by Bill Finley*

Ned Toffey, the general manager of Spendthrift Farm, was confident going into Saturday's seventh race at Saratoga. The Spendthrift homebred **Tommy Jo** (Into Mischief) had been training lights out for Todd Pletcher and the entire team was expecting a big effort. They got something more.

"Some of us were discussing what we saw in her back in Ocala when she was being broken and her early breezes there," Toffey said. "She was one that gave some sore backs to the exercise riders down there. She's been really forward and always wanting to do more right from the very beginning. They don't all telegraph it that way but she certainly tipped her hand from an early stage. You just never know because there are so many factors. They have to deal with the crowd, deal with the gate with a bunch of other horses in there. You never know they're going to handle things on race day. And it's Saratoga. Everybody has a horse they are excited about. We certainly have felt like she is a very, very nice filly. We were cautiously optimistic that she would run well. I would say she exceeded expectations."

Ridden by John Velazquez and the second choice in the wagering at 2-1, Tommy Jo stalked the early pace set by race favorite **Vajra** (Vekoma). Vajra, who stumbled at the start, was done in mid-stretch while Tommy Jo coasted right on by for a 3 3/4-length win. The running time was 1:11.24. Five races earlier, a maiden for two-year-old colts was won in 1:11.87.

Pletcher said afterward that he would likely point Tommy Jo to the GI Spinaway S. on August 30.

Toffey said the filly was named for the granddaughter of Spendthrift owners Eric and Tammy Gustavson. The two-legged Tommy Jo has yet to celebrate her first birthday.

The four-legged Tommy Jo is a Spendthrift product through and through. She is by the farm's star stallion Into Mischief (Harland's Holiday) out of a Spendthrift-owned mare Mother Mother (Pioneerof the Nile). Mother Mother was purchased by Spendthrift at the 2020 Fasig-Tipton November sale for \$1.8 million. Tommy Jo is her second foal to make it to the races and her first winner.

"For me, that's makes it way more rewarding," Toffey said.
"Obviously we want to win more than a maiden but when you do well with a homebred that's the most special part of all of this. We try very hard to raise a good horse and put a lot into it. As we all know, it's not an easy game, start to finish. When you get one who really has talent it's very gratifying."

Om N Joy, one of the more whimsically named horses in training, required eight starts to break her maiden, but it's been nothing but blue skies since as she recorded her third consecutive black-type victory in Friday's Fleet Treat Stakes at Del Mar.

The second betting choice while looking to add this to the 6 1/2-furlong Evening Jewel Stakes Apr. 5 and the May 24 Melair Stakes going two turns, Om N Joy was beaten for speed and settled in mid-division before pinching ground at the fence into the final three furlongs. Pulled off the fence by Kent Desormeaux approaching the stretch, she easily claimed longshot leader Hurricane Layla (I'll Have Another) and was ridden out to score as 'mounds' the best.

Om N Joy is the lone stakes winner for her sire (by Munnings), a two-time graded winner going long on the grass, but whose maiden victory sprinting over the Del Mar synthetic in the summer of 2014 came at the expense of future Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, fifth as the 7-5 chalk on his racecourse debut. Sent along by Mychel Sanchez, the odds-on favorite argued the pace outside of Celtic Contender through an opening quarter in :22.67 and was sent to the front fully three furlongs from home. Firmly in front at the top of the lane, he never felt the sting of the crop in the late stages to win as much the best.

Winning Always a Thrill, Be It the Stanley Cup Or a Race at Saratoga By Tim Wilkin

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. – As the 2-year-old colt **Soldier N Diplomat** (Army Mule) was charging down the stretch at
Saratoga Race Course Saturday afternoon, his owner, Vinnie
Viola, up in his clubhouse box, was eyeballing him and the finish
line at the same time.

"I was holding my breath the whole way down," Viola said. Soldier N Diplomat had to hold off a late charge by **Accost** (MacLean's Music) to win the second race, a \$100,000 maiden special event weight for 2-year-olds. At the end of the six furlongs, Soldier N Diplomat, trained by Hall of Famer Steve Asmussen, had won the race by a neck.

Viola owns St. Elias Stable with his wife Teresa. He is no stranger to success in sports. Last month, the Florida Panthers, owned by Viola, won their second straight Stanley Cup, beating the Edmonton Oilers in six games.

If Soldier N Diplomat's rousing victory in his first start reminded Viola of Panthers star Sam Bennett scoring a breakaway goal, he wasn't saying. But the rush of victory at the Spa in front of a packed house was just as sweet to Viola as a Panther victory at a sold-out Amerant Bank Arena in Sunrise, FL.

"The physical sensation is a little different," Viola said in the winner's circle. "When you win a horse race, you kind of get to exhale. When the hockey game is over, you inhale."

Ridden by Jose Ortiz, Soldier N Diplomat began separating himself in deep stretch and Viola began feeling good. Then, Accost and jockey Manny Franco began to rally for trainer Chad Brown and the result was certainly in doubt.

"When he took the lead around the sixteenth pole, I started to lean in, thinking he was going to widen," Viola said. "When I saw the other horse coming, I started to lean back ..."

No worries, Ortiz had it the whole way.

Viola paid \$950,000 for the colt and a major reason he did it was on the advice of ace bloodstock agent Steve Young. Army Mule, who Viola also campaigned, carries a soft spot in the owner's heart. He ranks him at the top of the list of horses he has owned even though he only raced three times.

He won them all by a combined margin of 22 1/4 lengths, the last being a 61/4-length win in the GI Carter Handicap in April of 2018. He was retired late that year because of a knee injury, one that cost him most of his 2-year-old season.

Young found Soldier N Diplomat at this year's OBS March Sale. "Steve called me and said, 'Vin, this is a stamp of Army Mule," Viola said. "We looked at him and thought he looked just like his dad." Cont. p8

All eight of the runners in the race were making their career debuts.

Soldier N Diplomat had showed promise in the mornings and Ortiz had worked him. Mornings and afternoons are two different things.

"He relaxed well, which helped us a lot and he punched home nicely," Ortiz said. "They are babies, you never know. Sometimes, they work good in the morning, but you never know until you get out here."

Soldier N Diplomat ran the six furlongs in 1:11.87 and paid \$3.90, \$2.80 and \$2.10.

"He has trained terrific," Young said. "He is one those horses that trains with such action and mechanics that shows he has got more in the tank."

Viola wasn't sure what is next for his budding star, but the GI Hopeful Stakes at the end of the Saratoga meet was heard in the winner's circle.

Viola said he has a "few more" Army Mules in his possession, but Soldier N Diplomat is his best.

"This is just a real blessing," Viola, who probably said the same thing at the end of the NHL playoffs, said as the Saratoga winner's circle emptied out.





CALANDAGAN OUTGUNS KALPANA IN KING GEORGE THRILLER

ASCOT, UK -- Two years, two geldings, two King Georges. Francis Graffard has carried all before him in his native France this season and he returned triumphant to Ascot on Saturday with Calandagan his willing accomplice to repeat the success last year of stable-mate Goliath.

"I'd prefer to have a very good gelding than a bad colt," the trainer quipped in response to a query as to the missing anatomy of the son of Gleneagles. It is hard to argue with that assertion when scrutinising Calandagan's increasingly impressive race record, which now includes back-to-back Group 1 wins at Saint-Cloud and Ascot and another four runner-up finishes at the top level, including behind City Of Troy in the top-rated race in the world last year, the G1 Juddmonte International.

The Aga Khan Studs' homebred was narrowly favoured over Jan Brueghel to continue his run of success at the Berkshire track, where he first properly burst onto the scene last year with his six-length romp in the King Edward VII Stakes. Onlookers were expecting a battle royal between that pair, who had been first and second when last they met in the Coronation Cup at Epsom.


"He's cantered round and they all seemed to be coming off the bridle while he was still travelling well and Cliff [Lee] said that's the best he's ever picked up and quickened," said Burke. "He was working nicely, but he always works nicely, and I thought that was a massive step up on what he's done. But if there is anything to be learned from the 75th running of the King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes, it is never to second-guess the race tactics of the Ballydoyle runners.

The St Leger-winning duo of Jan Brueghel and Continuous took up the running from the outset but instead of going on as might have been expected, Continuous was under an apparent tight hold from Wayne Lordan to sit at the girth of Jan Brueghel and Ryan Moore as they hugged the rail up front, with Rebel's Romance tucked in behind the Aidan O'Brien pair.

Having settled nicely behind the leading trio, Juddmonte's homebred Kalpana was let loose by Oisin Murphy as they rounded the home turn, quickly sliding round the outside to take up the running herself in a manner that meant business. For Calandagan and Mickael Barzalona, who had been last throughout the early stages but followed through in her slipstream, it took nearly the full length of the Ascot straight to thwart the determined Kalpana and steal a length victory, ensuring the King George trophy would leave for France for the second year running.

"The tactics during the race were not what I was expecting, when I saw Continuous going very steadily it was all different," said Graffard. "When the filly kicked on for home my horse was still travelling well and I was hoping he was going to catch her at

the end. He lengthened so strongly, he's a very good horse."

HH Aga Khan III won just the second running of the King George back in 1952 with his Derby, Eclipse and St Leger winner of the same year, Tulyar. His grandson, HH Aga Khan IV, struck next with the brilliant Shergar in 1981 and that success was followed by victories for Alamshar and Azamour in 2003 and 2005. Twenty years on and that great owner-breeder is no longer with us but his legacy will live on well beyond his sad passing back in February, as this season's results have already exemplified.

With his gelded status, Calandagan is something of an outlier in the racing operation of the Aga Khan Studs but he is not alone. Vazirabad carried the green-and-red silks with notable success through 13 group victories in France and Dubai, and Calandagan is another step up still from that great stayer.

"As a two-year-old he was very difficult in the morning and first time out at Deauville he didn't want to load," said Graffard as he explained what would certainly have been a reluctant decision to geld Calandagan. "Second start he dropped the jockey on the way to the stalls. I taught him to load with the starters at Deauville for four days but we struggled to load him and he showed a lot of character during the race and he was third. I had no choice really."

So, on the one hand, no stallion career beckons, but that can have its upside too. Calandagan has already taken his connections from France to England and Dubai. Greater globetrotting will surely ensue, and all the while he is only enhancing the record of his family members within the breeding operation. Behind him follows a winning three-year-old half-sister Calamandra (New Bay) and an as-yet unraced two-year-old filly named Calasita (Zarak).

Whatever they end up doing, it never hurts to have a big brother as cool as Calandagan.

Pat Downes and Nemone Routh of the Aga Khan Studs team had been the first in the pre-parade ring as they awaited the appearance of Calandagan from the racecourse stables, and Downes said in the joyful melée following his triumph, "If we hadn't gelded him, maybe we wouldn't be standing here today. We just don't know. But he's so consistent. He's a very, very talented horse."

He added, "I must say, when they are geldings there is less pressure, and you can really have a fun horse, and that's what he is, albeit at a very high level."

There is no such thing as a bad King George but it takes more than one high-level performer to make it an enthralling contest, and that is exactly what Kalpana brought to the party. Blooming with dapples as she walked the pre-parade ring, this beautiful daughter of Study Of Man was admittedly relegated to the runner-up spot today but it is easy to believe that more Group 1 glory will come her way - and we can all recall the subsequent success of last year's runner-up, Bluestocking.

Kalpana's trainer Andrew Balding said, "We're thrilled with her. She has run magnificently and has been beaten by a very good horse but she has lost little in defeat."

For Godolphin's Rebel's Romance, trapped behind Jan Brueghel as Kalpana made her run, it was ultimately another third-place finish in this race, just ahead of Jan Brueghel, who returned to the fourth-place spot in the paddock without his saddle and jockey.

The winner cannot of course be aimed at the Arc but he could be seen back on English shores as soon as August 20 for a repeat crack at the Juddmonte International. The small matter of a \$3 million bonus is on offer should Calandagan go on to win the Japan Cup after winning the King George, with the latter also having 'Win-and-You're-In' status for the Breeders' Cup.

"I would have no problem bringing him back to 10 furlongs, but I will discuss it with the owner," Graffard said. "A mile and a half is also the perfect distance for him, but he ran really strongly in the race at York last year and if he comes back really well, why avoid the race?

"We could maybe go for the Japan Cup at the end of the season. He will have a big target somewhere."

Palmer In Clover With Group Double On her third appearance at Ascot, Fitzella (Too Darn Hot) set a

fierce gallop from the gates and was never headed when winning the G3 Sodexho Princess Margaret Stakes by a length from Staya (Havana Grey).

Bred by Bob and Pauline Scott at Parks Farm Stud, the winner had been beaten only a neck on her debut at the track in May before posting a convincing win at Haydock and then running fourth in the G3 Albany Stakes at the royal meeting.

Fitzella is trained by Hugo Palmer, who outlined his intention to aim her towards the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' Turf at the end of the season.

"She has shown great gate speed today."

"The first weekend of November is a long way from now so she will definitely run again, and possibly twice, but I wouldn't think more than that. This is her fourth start of the year so I wouldn't want her to have much more than five or six," said the trainer.

Reflecting on the Albany Stakes, he continued, "Oisin [Murphy] was upset when he came in after the Albany as he felt that he had sat too close to a very strong pace and he did realise and took back, but the damage was done by then. We felt on reflection that it was probably her class that allowed her to finish fourth.

"Today the plan was to hold her up and to race more patiently and to use her finish, but she absolutely pinged the lids so Oisin went straight to Plan B. But it has worked very nicely, he didn't go hard, and it's very exciting."

A daughter of the Exceed And Excel mare Shamandar, Fitzella is a half-sister to the Listed-placed Admiral Nelson (Kingman) and was bought as a yearling from the Goffs UK Premier Sale for £170,000 by SackvilleDonald and Manor House Stables, where Palmer trains.

Palmer added, "I'm delighted for [her owners] Derek Passant and for Hefin [Williams], who are big supporters or ours and of others - they are big supporters of the game and this is the first group horse they've had. She was an expensive yearling but she was beautiful, and she still is."

Palmer secured a quick-fire Group 3 double when Cheshire Dancer got the nod in a scintillating four-way finish for the Longines Valiant Stakes.

Billy Loughnane was aboard the four-year-old daughter of Phoenix Of Spain, who came with a late run down the outside to deny the Ed Walker-trained American Gal (Kameko), with Chantilly Lace (Lope De Vega) and Irish raider Jancis (Tamayuz) completing the first four home. Cont.

"I was slightly nervous during the race, it wasn't the plan to sit last but they went an even enough gallop and she was really tough," said Palmer.

"Phoenix Of Spain is a very good young stallion, he notably has Haatem but others as well. I think this is the mare's fifth stakes winner, I think the others were all in Italy, so she is well bred."

The mare in question is the five-furlong winner Kristal Xenia (Xaar), whose four other black-type performers include Italian Listed winner Cherie Good (Big Bad Bob). Cheshire Dancer was bred by Ciara Eglington, and was another SackvilleDonald purchase, this time at the Tattersalls Ireland September Yearling Sale, where she was bought for €36,000.

"This looked a nice race and I was hoping the ground would be a bit quicker, but he's handled it. We've not had a lot of luck for Sheikh Obaid lately, so it's nice to get a Group 2 for him. I'll have to talk to the owner and see if he wants to supplement him for the [G1] Juddmonte International after that performance. He was second [in the GI Canadian International] at Woodbine for Roger Varian and that could be a nice Grade I to go for. He's a horse we can campaign around the world and why not go to the [G1] Irish Champion Stakes?"

The 8-1 chance, who annexed Southwell's G3 Winter Derby in February, settled into a smooth rhythm racing fourth behind the leaders until turning for home. Looming large on the bridle passing the quarter-mile marker, he was shaken up to seize control entering the final furlong and kept on strongly to defeat Almaqam by a decisive 2 3/4 lengths.

That roll call includes such great names as Ribot, Nijinsky, Brigadier Gerard, Grundy, Shergar, Dancing Brave, Nashwan, Galileo and Enable.

She continued, "We are also conscious of ensuring that the race remains internationally relevant in an increasingly competitive global picture. These days, there are plenty of options for connections to run their horses worldwide and year-round, so it's vital that we find the right balance of prize-money and prestige. By making this announcement now we hope that connections will be able to start planning backwards from the race already.

"We are very conscious of the fact we need to continue to invest in prize-money across the programme at all levels and we look forward to making further announcements regarding 2026 in due course."
