



BREEDING DIGEST: NO SUBSTITUTE FOR DEPUTY

The two headline acts last weekend hardly required us to hold the front page to reveal Bernardini as a pretty good broodmare sire. Obviously their late damsire is not the only reason why **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) and **'TDN Rising Star' Nysos** (Nyquist) have achieved elite caliber, but we've previously explored the antecedents of both. And besides, both having won Grade IIs, top billing should strictly be reserved for a prize contested the same day at a higher tier.

Actually the GI Bing Crosby Stakes had the potential to enrich Bernardini's legacy more directly, with **Hejazi** representing one of his last remaining chances to reinforce a male succession that for now appears to depend on a couple of grandsons in regional programs.

Mind Control and Coal Front, both speed-oriented sons of Stay Thirsty, have done their best to catch imaginations. One is about to send his first yearlings to market from a debut book of 190 mares, a New York record. The other, though, quickly moved from Kentucky to Louisiana, includes fairytale Derby runner Coal Battle among half-dozen stakes winners produced at a better clip than any of his third-crop peers.

AFTER THIRTY YEARS, A FASIG-TIPTON SARATOGA FIRST FOR STAUTBERG

Caroline Stautberg has been selling her yearlings at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale for three decades now, but the Maryland breeder will record a personal first when the boutique auction opens next week. Through the Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services consignment, Stautberg's Willow Oaks Stable will offer the very first horse through the ring Monday when bidding starts at 6:30 p.m. Hip 1 is a daughter of Vekoma out of Tapit's World (Tapit) and a half-sister to graded winner Il Miracolo (Gun Runner).


"It's been 30 years since my first Saratoga sale and I haven't missed a year, but I've never been in the first 10 [hips],"
Stautberg said with a laugh. "So I guess it was my turn.
Thankfully, she is a filly with a nice page and I think she will sell herself.

Hejazi ran well enough at Del Mar to keep alive aspirations of retrieving at stud the \$3.55 million he cost at a 2-year-old sale. If

just short of the best sprinters around, he certainly had them in trouble when opening up, only to be run down late by a 7-year-old gelding at 18-1.

But let's show due respect to that gelding, as the first elite scorer by the stallion who has denied none other than Stay Thirsty a fifth Californian sires' championship in each of the past two years.

If Grazen is now approaching the evening of his career, at 19, then we have all the more reason to prize the access he salvages, as a grandson of Alydar, to a male line that has

largely faded away. (Actually Grazen's sire Benchmark channels equally precious blood from his mother, a Danzig half-sister to Tranquility Lake {Rahy}).

Like War Front, Grazen is out of a Rubiano mare. They met, incidentally, on the same farm--albeit meanwhile renamed--where Grazen is nowadays standing himself.

Grazen is sire of 28 black-type winners at a very wholesome

7% of named foals. He has certainly come a long way since being launched virtually as a private stallion by owner-breeder Nick Alexander, his track career having been abbreviated by injury.

Alexander actually bred Lovesick Blues, selling him privately not so long ago, but showing sporting delight last weekend for his purchasers. And this breakout, switching to dirt, shines a light on the fascinating pedigree that Alexander had put together.

As we see with Bernardini,

the phenomenon of a broodmare sire is always easier to observe than explain. **Cont.**



But the fact is that the dam of Lovesick Blues, Queenofher-castle, is inbred 2x3 to a real legend in this sphere. She's by one son of Deputy Minister, Ministers Wild Cat, out of a mare by another in Touch Gold.

While that formula didn't yield anything too exciting on the track--Queenofhercastle's three career wins came under diminishing tags--the intention was presumably to emulate an earlier impact on this family by Deputy Minister. For fourth dam Mme. Mitterand (Mr. Prospector) is an unraced half-sister to Deputy Minister's son French Deputy.

True to his sire's brand, French Deputy (who died in Japan only this year, at a venerable 33) was himself a strong distaff influence, his daughters having produced elite winners all around the world. I've often noted how sons of Deputy Minister have mirrored his own success as a broodmare sire, and how those that do produce male heirs tend to impart a corresponding forte--as, for instance, Awesome Again's son Ghostzapper.


Daughters of Touch Gold could hardly fail to be useful producers, his own dam additionally being by a distaff influence as potent as Buckpasser. Sure enough, his mating with Mme. Mitterand's daughter by Rahy produced the dam of two unusual achievers.

One is Queen Bee To You (Old Topper), whose GIII La Canada Stakes success--besides emulating that of Mme. Mitterand's own dam, 35 years previously--helped to qualify her as her sire's premier earner (\$658,770). The other is Queenofhercastle, who's quietly proving a similar overachiever. Her first foal is Lovesick Blues. Her second, also by Grazen, has been no more than a workaday operator, though the elevation of her page was artfully anticipated by those who last claimed her, for \$30,000, only in May. And her third, by Grazen's son Tough Sunday, resumes in black-type company at Del Mar on Friday after ending his first campaign winning the Golden State Juvenile Stakes.

Grazen's first elite scorer has arrived in a race once won by one of his sire's own stars. Tragically, Points Offthebench (Benchmark) subsequently suffered a fatal breakdown preparing for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Obviously Lovesick Blues will not be able to continue the line himself, as a gelding, but his striking course-and-distance rehearsal permits the hope that he might yet decorate it with a prize that slipped so cruelly out of reach in 2013.

Pride After a Falls

As mentioned, we've previously examined the Bernardini mare who produced Nysos, a granddaughter of GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Unbridled Elaine (Unbridled's Song).

Though Unbridled Elaine did produce some classy runners and/or producers, the two mares dividing her from Nysos have otherwise offered little to the page he will take to stud. That requires us to go back to a mare whose background--as a daughter of an In Reality sprinter named Taylor's Falls--remind us how variegated are the sources of that famous "hybrid vigor."

From this distance, the eligibility of Taylor's Falls for a stud career seems fairly obscure, even if he did win 14 of 30 races, crowned by the Beef State Handicap at Ak-Sar-Ben. In fairness, he did come up with Dazzling Falls to set a Nebraska-bred earnings record of \$904,621, also the first to represent his state in the GI Kentucky Derby. But the Alabama-bred Carols Folly, one of 11 named foals in his 1987 crop, more typically appeared to represent a further reversion to mediocrity in a maternal line that had mysteriously produced her fifth dam, Swoon (Sweep Like), to become the 1956 Broodmare on the Year through the Hall of Fame exploits of Swoon's Son.

Though Carols Folly actually proved quite a competent runner, winning five of a dozen starts, including a stakes at Birmingham, she made no more than \$22,000 when sold carrying a first foal by Seattle Dancer. The resulting filly made \$4,000 as a weanling and, named Gwenjinsky, proved unable to break her maiden even when dropped to claimers. Yet she would later produce a series of black-type performers, headed by Lead Story (Editor's Note), a triple Grade II winner at Churchill Downs.

The next foal out of Carols Folly, a Glitterman filly, was another four-figure yearling yet, as Glitter Woman, won four graded stakes--including the GI Ashland--by an aggregate 32 1/2 lengths. Unfortunately she bombed as hot favorite for the GI

Kentucky Oaks before missing the rest of the year and, though consistent in good company, thereafter won only a Grade III.

At Keeneland that November her weanling half-sister, from the first crop of Unbridled's Song, brought \$230,000. But Unbridled's Elaine proceeded to bank \$1.77 million on the track before being cashed out to Sheikh Mohammed for \$4.4 million, carrying a Forestry colt that became multiple graded stakes winner Etched.

The emergence of Unbridled Elaine, meanwhile, prompted Glitter Woman's owner to send her to Unbridled's Song, a mating that produced GI Suburban Handicap winner Political Force. Unfortunately Glitter Woman died soon afterwards, but this hot cluster is surely where Nyquist has stoked the embers to produce Nysos.

So if you think you can explain Carols Folly--whether through Taylor's Falls, or the Bob's Dusty mare who produced her--then please don't tell anyone. For the rest of us, it is mysteries like these that make the game what it is. **Cont.**

Fappiano Running Every Which Way

Etched was one of the first signs that Unbridled's Song would himself become a notable broodmare sire and his daughters have since produced stars as varied as Contrail (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and the glistening young Claiborne stallion Annapolis (War Front). And last weekend another one produced Running Away (Gun Runner) to win the GIII Monmouth Oaks, her fourth win in her last five.

The first of those, a Churchill maiden, was the only one in the book when her dam Allez Marie (Unbridled's Song) was sold to Three Chimneys for \$750,000 through a Fasig-Tipton digital sale last December. But Allez Marie, herself groupplaced in Brazil, had already produced four stakes performers--making her much the best conduit of the blood that had helped her own dam Summerly (Summer Squall) win the GI Kentucky Oaks.

Running Away combines two lines of Fappiano, the grandsire of Unbridled's Song, as well as the founder of the more circuitous route, via Cryptoclearance, that has produced Gun Runner. But of course the latter also owes his celebrated granddam Quiet Dance to a third branch of Fappiano in Quiet American.

What an incredible legacy, for a stallion who died at just 13, only weeks after Unbridled won the 1990 Derby. And, having started off with a couple of imperilled male lines, let's remind ourselves that Dr. Fager--who notoriously failed to find an adequate heir--can instead claim a lasting legacy through his daughter Killaloe, the dam of Fappiano.

"And this is a sale that people are pretty well there when it starts," she said. "It's not like some of those sales that start at nine in the morning and you know nobody is there. I'm not jumping up and down about it, but it could be worse."

In addition to her graded-winning half-brother, the yearling is a full-sister to a now 2-year-old filly who sold to Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Plantation for \$575,000 at the 2024 Saratoga sale. The trio are out of graded-placed Tapit's World, who was acquired for \$175,000 at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton November sale.

Stautberg admitted that purchase a decade ago harkened back to the mare who provided her with her biggest success as a breeder, Fun Crowd.

Stautberg and her late husband, Jerry, purchased Fun Crowd for \$115,000 at the 2002 Keeneland November sale. Eleven yearlings sold out of the mare for over \$2 million, including Grade I winner Funny Moon (Malibu Moon).

"What a mare, that Fun Crowd," Stautberg said. "She was really a great mare. When she died, I got the prettiest tree that I could find and had a stone made and she is buried on the farm with a really, really pretty tree marking her stone. **Cont.**

"She was something else," she said. "I just didn't have any idea, really, of how lucky I was. Davant Latham found her for me. And he is still helping me pick out broodmares. She wasn't that

expensive because she hadn't raced. But she had a great pedigree and, man, did she produce."

Latham recalled that purchase when he and his client were bidding on Tapit's World in 2015.

"Davant and I watched her in the ring," Stautberg said of Tapit's World. "He said, 'The only reason you love her is because she reminds you so much of Fun Crowd.' And she did. She was a chestnut with a white blaze and a couple of white socks. She went through and she RNA'd, so I said,

'Come on.' We ran back to the barn and we offered the price they wanted and they took it."

With just seven broodmares, Stautberg will offer almost her

entire foal crop--four yearlings--at the two-day Saratoga sale next week.

"I sold one at the January sale and [Fasig-Tipton] accepted all

five I had left," Stautberg said. "But one of them had an abscess, so she is going to have to wait until fall."

The group, all consigned by Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services, includes four fillies and one colt.

"For the last two years, I've had all fillies and only one colt," Stautberg explained. "It happened again this year. You feel so sorry for that colt all by himself. I live in Monkton, Maryland, so he has to ship up by himself. My farm manager, Darin Martin, is bringing up the fillies, but

he can't come with them. He has to have his own transportation."

Other than the filly out of 15-year-old Tapit's World, the other yearlings in Willow Oaks' Saratoga offerings are out of mares Stautberg has acquired in the past two years. Hip 64 is a filly by Uncle Mo and is the first foal out of stakes-placed Champagne Ivy (Shackleford). She was purchased in utero for \$210,000 at the 2023 Keeneland November sale.

Hip 74 is a filly from the first crop of champion Epicenter out of graded winner Cosmic Burst (Violence). Stautberg acquired Cosmic Burst for \$260,000 at the 2023 Keeneland January sale.

Rounding out the group is a colt by Mandaloun (hip 147) out of multiple stakes winner Lucky Stride (Declaration of War). Lucky Stride was purchased for \$170,000 at the 2022 Keeneland November sale.

"I am 84, almost 85, and I keep saying I don't need to buy any more, but I just can't resist," Stautberg said of the recent purchases. "I get the catalogue and I see something and I say, 'I think I will hang around for that one.' I keep adding, but I think maybe this is it."

Stautberg sends her mares to Kentucky to foal and be bred back before mares and foals return to Maryland.

"I have watched them all grow up," Stautberg said of the yearlings she will offer at auction next week. "You get very attached to them. I went over this morning to Oklahoma [training track] and saw one that I sold last year, a Twirling

Candy filly, and she's so happy and doing so well. And that just makes you feel so good."


Stautberg and her late husband used to raise Black Angus cattle and steeplechasers on their 600-acre Willow Oaks Farm in Monkton, but a trip to Saratoga in the mid-1990s changed the trajectory of their operation.

"[The late steeplechase trainer] Tom Voss was a neighbor," Stautberg recalled. "My husband and I came up and stayed with Tom and [his wife] Mimi. "We went to the horse sale and ended up buying a yearling that Tom had picked out to be a steeplechaser. In the meantime, the Bluegrass Thoroughbred partners had a party where I met John Stuart and Peter Bance. So all of a sudden I said, 'I know a bloodstock agent'--this was probably 1994--and I said, 'Let's buy one.' My husband was an automobile dealer and he said, 'No, one won't do it. We need more than that.' So we ended up with four. I think my first sales were in '95."

Willow Oaks will be offering its 30th class of yearlings-beginning with the first hip through the ring--at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale next week and Stautberg's love affair with the upstate New York town is still going strong.

"I usually come up before the sales," Stautberg said. "I love the racing and I love the people and I love the restaurants.



I love everything about it," she said. "You are a person here, not just a number. I think the Fasig-Tipton people do such a good job and I am very happy here."

SARATOGA NOTEBOOK, PRESENTED BY NYRA BETS: JOSEPH HOPING FOR A REBOUND FROM WHITE ABARRIO IN WHITNEY

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y. - Two years ago, the GI Whitney Stakes was a whiteout. As in **White Abarrio** (Race Day), who crushed the field by 6 1/4 lengths.

Fast forward to now and White Abarrio is back for another run in Saturday's \$1 million Whitney, the premier race for older horses at the 40-day meet at Saratoga Race Course.

The 6-year-old horse will look to shrug off a disappointing fourth place finish in the GI Met Mile last month and prove to his trainer Saffie Joseph Jr. that he deserves a place among the elite of the older horse division.

Keeneland Entries close August 1

"You just have to have a short-term memory and move forward," Joseph said Wednesday morning at his Saratoga backstretch barn about White Abarrio's performance in the Met Mile. "He has been in that position before and has rebounded."

White Abarrio, owned by C2 Racing Stable, Gary Barber and La Milagrosa Stable LLC, started the year with a resounding 6 1/4-length win in the \$3 million GI Pegasus World Cup.

He followed that up with another score at his home track of Gulfstream Park, winning the GIII Ghostzapper Stakes by 5 1/4 lengths.

Then came the head scratcher in the Met Mile. The race was billed as a showdown between White Abarrio and Fierceness (City of Light), but they were both defeated by the since retired Raging Torrent (Maximus Mischief).

This was the second straight year that White Abarrio tossed in a clunker in the Met Mile. Last June, he was fifth, beaten 10 1/4 lengths by National Treasure (Quality Road).

Since that race, Joseph said that White Abarrio, who will be ridden by Irad Ortiz Jr., has trained well and looked like a horse about to give a solid performance.

"When he comes off a race that is below par, you are always a bit suspect," Joseph said. "You are like,'what did we miss?' We are happy with him. At the quarter pole [in the Whitney] we will know if he is moving forward." *Cont.*

Joseph will also run Skippylongstocking (Exaggerator) in the Whitney. The main goal for the 6-year-old, owned by Daniel Alonzo, is the \$1 million GII Charles Town Classic Aug. 22 in West Virginia. It's a race he has captured the last two years.

Before winning the Charles Town last year, Skipplongstocking finished fifth in the Whitney. He will be ridden by Jose Ortiz on Saturday.

Make no mistake, Joseph is not using the Whitney as a prep race. "If we did not think we could compete, we would not be running in it," he said. "Is it a tough race? Yeah, it's a really tough race. Of course, you would like it to be easier, but he is here. He has run fast enough on some days to win a Grade I. This kind of Grade I? It's unlikely, but you've got to be in it to win it."

Mo Plex Could be Pennsylvania Derby Bound

Following Mo Plex's (Complexity) fourth place finish in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes, trainer Jeremiah Englehart will be in no rush to bring his New York-bred back to the races.

His landing point could very well be Parx Racing for the \$1 million GI Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 20.

"If I had to choose from a timing standpoint, that is perfect," Englehart said while sitting in his office at his barn at the annex across from the Oklahoma Training Track Wednesday morning. "That would give him almost two months."

Mo Plex set the pace in the Jim Dandy before fading and being beat 10 1/2 lengths by Sovereignty (Into Mischief). Owned by Rick Higgins and Howard Read (R and H Stable), Mo Plex had

won the GIII Ohio Derby in his prior start and that gave the group reason to try the big boys in the Jim Dandy.

Englehart hasn't given up on the idea that Mo Plex can compete with the better horses in the division. He said he does not want to run Mo Plex in the \$200,000 Albany Stakes against state breds Aug. 21.

"He came out of [the Jim Dandy] fine," Englehart said. "I don't think I want to run him back in three and a half weeks. I just want to be real smart with the next start."

Englehart did some homework when researching the Pennsylvania Derby. The last two winners of the race, Seize the Grey (Arrogate) and Saudi Crown (Always Dreaming) ran in the Jim Dandy before heading to Parx. Seize the Grey was fourth in last year's Jim Dandy and Saudi Crown finished second in 2023.

Englehart said he would change his mind about the Pennsylvania Derby if Sovereignty or GI Haskell Stakes winner Journalism (Curlin) decided to head that way. Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott has not indicated any desire to go to the Pennsylvania Derby and Michael McCarthy has not said which way Journalism is going. Cont.

Mott Gives Updates on Arthur's Ride, Stars and Stripes

Sovereignty wasn't the only horse Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott had his eye on last Saturday. The stable star did his thing when he rolled to his third straight win in the GII Jim Dandy.

About three and a half hours before Sovereignty won the Jim Dandy by a length, Mott saddled Arthur's Ride (Tapit) for his first start since last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic when he finished 12th out of 14.

Mott was not happy with what Arthur showed him. The 5-year-old horse finished third in a 1 1/8-mile multi-conditional allowance race. He was defeated by 8 1/4 lengths as the 1-2 favorite.

"That was not acceptable, not happy," Mott said.

Mott said he could not comment on what might be next for Arthur's Ride until he talks with the horse's owners.

Arthur's Ride is owned by Glassman Racing LLC (Karl and Cathi Glassman). He won four of his first nine starts, the biggest being last year's GI Whitney Stakes, his first graded stakes try. He was then fifth in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup before the Breeders' Cup.

Another horse from the Mott Barn, Stars and Stripes (Not This Time), opened some eyes when he won an allowance race at Saratoga by 7 1/4 lengths July 17.

That came after he broke his maiden at Aqueduct June 15 by 10 1/2 lengths. That was his second career start.

Owned by Frassetto Stables LLC, Stars and Stripes might not be seen for a while, Mott said.

"He grabbed a quarter pretty good in the [July 17] race," he said. "I don't have anything picked out for him."

UNBEATEN GOOD CIVILIAN TOPS INGLIS DIGITAL USA JULY SALE

The Inglis Digital USA July Sale closed Wednesday with a pair of stakes-winning juveniles heading up the trade, topped by **Good Civilian** (Good Samaritan--Lei It On Me, by Benny the Bull), who was secured by Flurry Racing for \$240,000.

An impressive winner by 11 1/2 lengths at Horseshoe Indianapolis June 14, the gelding followed up with a score in the Prairie Gold Juvenile Stakes at Prairie Meadows. Good Civilian was previously raced by Southwest Racing Stables Inc.

Good Civilian was consigned by trainer Genaro Garcia, who made the horse available for inspection from his barn at Horseshoe Indianapolis in Shelbyville, Ind.

"I'm glad we were able to get him," said Staton Flurry of Flurry Racing. "He'll head to (trainer) Cipriano Contreras. I'm the biggest 'Cippy' fan there is, and he's stabled in Indiana. We'll point toward the Indiana-bred stakes with him, and just see where we go once that meet is over."

Bred in Indiana by Dawn Martin, Good Civilian is out of the Benny the Bull mare Lei It On Me, whose two foals to race are both winners.

Stakes-winning 2-year-old **Border Czar** (Beau Liam--Adalee, by Street Boss) was the second highest priced offering of the day, going to Zhenxi Li for \$185,000. The filly, who won on debut at Woodbine on June 7 returned to take the July 12 My Dear Stakes.

Barbara Minshall, Border Czar's owner and trainer, consigned the filly from her base at Toronto-area Woodbine.

"I had a very good experience selling on the Inglis Digital USA sale platform," Minshall said. "They were very helpful and informative as to what was required, and they kept me well informed as to the progress of the sale. Daily info sheets were

sent, and I felt my horse was given excellent exposure. I would definitely choose to sell again with Inglis Digital USA."

Border Czar, bred in Kentucky by Southern Comfort Farm, is out of Adalee, whose three winners from four runners also includes SW Feelgood Factor and multiple winner Sassy and Bold.

Wednesday's auction closed with 27 horses sold for revenues of \$537,500, and an average sale price of \$19,907.

"We knew going into the sale that the 2-year-olds were going to be popular, and we weren't disappointed," said Kyle Wilson, Senior Director of Sales and Recruiting for Inglis Digital USA. "We had some good trade at a number of levels, which we are pleased with. It was a solid sale, and we'll look forward moving into the fall sale season."

LIBRADO BAROCIO JOINS TDN WRITERS' ROOM PODCAST PRESENTED BY KEENELAND

Many involved with the sport probably know little about trainer Librado Barocio. But that could be about to change. His small stable has been on fire as of late and it recorded a milestone when **Lovesick Blues** (Grazen) upset his better known rivals to win the GI Bing Crosby Stakes Saturday at Del Mar. For the trainer who has been training off and on since 1999, it was his first Grade I win.

How did it feel? That was among the questions our team asked Barocio when he joined us on this week's *TDN* Writers' Room Podcast presented by Keeneland. Barocio was this week's Gainesway Guest of the Week.

"It's a blessing and it's a big blessing for my family," Barocio said. "I consider myself an underdog who is trying to play in this

arena. I found a horse that was an underdog, too. The horse did it all. For him just to accomplish that, it means a lot for my family. It means a lot for my parents."

Lovesick Blues is a 7-year-old veteran on the California circuit whose best surface appeared to be the grass. Barocio approached his owner, Nick Alexander, about purchasing another horse, **Desmond Doss** (Grazen), but when told that horse was not in serious training, he decided to buy Lovesick Blues.

The Bing Crosby is a "Win and You're In" race for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but Barocio will still need to pay \$100,000 to get in the race because the horse was not nominated for the Breeders' Cup.

Barocio said he was not sure which way to go until his son intervened. Also called Librado Barocio, the son is an assistant coach for the UCLA football team. He talked his father into committing to the Breeders' Cup.

"He said, 'Dad, you made it to the Super Bowl,'" the elder Barocio said. "Right now he's at UCLA, but two years back he was with the Washington Commanders and Coach Rivera. And of course, their goal was to get to the Super Bowl. And when he played football at UCLA, their goal was to get to the national championship game. He said, 'Dad, you're in the Super Bowl.' He equated this victory with the Super Bowl. I agreed with him. The Breeders' Cup is the Super Bowl of racing. He said, 'You have to go,' and I said, 'absolutely, you are right.'"

Barocio, who says he divides his time between racing and his business as film maker, had his best year in 2023 when he won 24 races. This year, he is 16-for-65, good for a win rate of 25%. Barocio won his first graded stakes race in 2024 in the GIII Senorita Stakes with **Visually** (Enticed).

"I have to give all credit to my help, my workers, my assistants," he said. "They work endlessly and they don't miss a beat. They do everything and sometimes they do it twice a day. We work on horses twice a day. I think the horses respond to that."

In our "Fastest Horse of the Week," segment which is sponsored by WinStar, the team went over the many reasons there are breed to WinStar stallion Heartland. The fastest horse of the week was none other than Lovesick Blues, who got a 105 Beyer for his win in the Bing Crosby.

Elsewhere on the podcast, which is also sponsored by 1/ST Racing, 1/ST TV, the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' Association, and West Point Thoroughbreds, the team of Zoe Cadman, Bill Finley and Randy Moss reviewed the big effort by **Sovereignty** (Into Mischief) in the GII Jim Dandy Stakes and lamented the fact that he skipped the Preakness in a year where he might have won the Triple Crown.

As for the 2-year-olds, 'TDN Rising Star' Brant (Gun Runner) was a hot topic. A horse that cost a record \$3 million at OBS March, he romped at first asking in a Del Mar maiden race, earning a 101 Beyer figure, the fastest number run by any 2-year-old this year.

The team also reviewed the GI Whitney Stakes, which attracted possibly the best field of older dirt horses assembled this year. The consensus was that **Fierceness** (City of Light) is the horse to beat.

1/ST RENAMES RACES IN HONOR OF LUKAS, CLEMENT

Graded races at Santa Anita and Gulfstream Park have been renamed in honor of the late trainers D. Wayne Lukas and Christophe Clement, 1ST, which operates both racetracks, announced Wednesday.

Beginning in 2026, the GII Santa Monica Stakes at Santa Anita will be renamed the D. Wayne Lukas Stakes, while the GIII La Prevoyante Stakes at Gulfstream Park has been renamed the Christophe Clement Stakes.

"D. Wayne Lukas and Christophe Clement were not just generational horsemen, they were top-class people," said 1/ST President Aidan Butler. "Santa Anita and Gulfstream were blessed to be their homes for many years. It is an honor to salute them for years to come at our tracks by renaming races that helped launch their success stories."

Lukas saddled Flack Flack to win the 1980 Santa Monica, then run as a handicap. It was the trainer's first Grade II race at Santa Anita Park and just his ninth graded stakes win since transitioning to Thoroughbreds from Quarter Horses. Lukas would go on to add five more Santa Monica's to his extensive resume with Parsley (1980), Bara Lass (1984), Pine Tree Lane (1987 and 1988) and the Hall of Fame filly Serena's Song (1996).

Only trainer Bob Baffert's seven wins bests Lukas's record in the seven-furlong race, which has been contested since 1957.

Lukas, who began his successful career based at Santa Anita Park in the 1970s-1990s, passed away June 28, less than three months before his 90th birthday.

The 1992 La Prevoyante provided Clement with just the second graded stakes win of his young career when Irish-bred Sardaniya won for His Highness the Aga Khan, coming less than a month after his first graded win at Gulfstream Park.

Currently run at Gulfstream over 1 1/2 miles on the grass for fillies and mares, the 1992 running at Calder was the first of Clement's six wins in the race, followed by Tampoli (1994),

EVERETT DOBSON OFFICIALLY ELECTED CHAIR OF THE JOCKEY CLUB

Everett Dobson has officially been elected by the board of stewards to be the next chair of The Jockey Club. Dobson succeeds Stuart Janney, III, who has served as chair of the organization since August of 2015.

"It's a great privilege to follow Stuart as chair of The Jockey Club," Dobson said. "Stuart has been an integral part of The Jockey Club as we strive to improve Thoroughbred breeding and racing. I will continue with our endeavor to develop initiatives that support and grow the sport."

Dobson has been a member of The Jockey Club since 2014. He served as a steward from August 2017 through August 2021 and was elected again in 2024. A longtime owner and breeder of Thoroughbreds, the Oklahoma native is owner of Candy Meadows Farm and races under Cheyenne Stables.

He serves on the executive committee of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and is immediate past chairman of the American Graded Stakes Committee. Dobson also serves as a member of the Breeders' Cup, in addition to being a trustee of the Keeneland Association.

Dobson is the executive chairman of Dobson Fiber, a telecommunications company based in Oklahoma City. He is also an investor in the NBA champion Oklahoma City Thunder team and serves on its board of directors.

Janney will continue to serve on The Jockey Club's board of stewards. *Cont.*



ATERRADORA HUMANELY EUTHANIZED AFTER LAKE GEORGE STAKES INJURY

Two days after the running of the GIII Lake George Stakes at Saratoga Race Course on Saturday July 26, the Mike Maker-trained Aterradora (Ire) (Starspangledbanner (Aus)) was humanely euthanized at Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital, the New York Racing Association said via a press release on Wednesday.

The 3-year-old owned by Pura Vida Investments LLC, who was making her eighth career start, was pulled up by jockey Ricardo Santana, Jr. in the gallop out after finishing fifth and was immediately attended to by on-track veterinarians. The filly was transported to the aforementioned medical facility for further evaluation and treatment.

Radiographs taken that same day revealed a slab fracture of the right knee, which was followed by a CT scan to allow for surgical planning. At the time of surgery, the extent of the injury was found to be more severe and complicated than previously identified. As a result, and upon the recommendation of

attending veterinarians, Aterradora was humanely euthanized.

According to the NYRA release, since the beginning of the summer meet July 10, Aterradora is the lone fatality during racing. There have been two equine fatalities during training--National Secret (American Pharoah) and Dazzle d'Oro (Bolt d'Oro).

NATIONAL REGULATORY RULINGS, **JULY 24-30**

Every week, the TDN posts a roundup of the relevant Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (HISA) related rulings from around the country.

The following rulings were reported on HISA's "rulings" portal and through the Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit's (HIWU) "pending" and "resolved" cases portals.

Among this week's rulings, Angel Sanchez-Pinero was suspended 30-days for a phenylbutazone positive stemming from February-the latest action amid a series of alleged offenses facing the trainer.

This includes another pending violation issued against Sanchez-Pinero this week concerning the alleged breach of rule 3230(b)(2), related to "Causing a Covered Horse to Violate its Provisional Suspension."

The horse in question is 3-year-old filly, Laguardia. HIWU provisionally suspended the then Sanchez-Pinero trained Laguardia after the filly had tested positive for bronchodilator Formoterol (Aformoterol)--a banned substance--after finishing second at Parx Racing Mar. 26. Cont.

HIWU officially posted this notice June 11.

Laguardia has since then started twice at Mountaineer-a track that being in West Virginia falls outside of HISA's jurisdiction--for trainer Juan Vazquez. When asked about the nature of Sanchez-Pinero's alleged breach of rule 3230(b)(2) with Laguardia, a HIWU spokesperson wrote that "Sanchez-Pinero oversaw a breeze by Laguardia while she was Provisionally Suspended. A Covered Horse cannot complete a Timed and Reported Workout (i.e., breeze) while Provisionally Suspended."

Sanchez-Pinero is facing six other separate pending violations under HIWU, five of which concern alleged Anti-Doping rule violations involving banned substances, and a separate controlled medication positive.

On May 8, HISA issued Sanchez-Pinero a provisional suspension and notice of violation, arguing that there was "clear and convincing evidence" the trainer's actions or inactions "present an immediate threat of serious injury or death" to licensed horses and riders.







SNOW FACE PRINCESS RELISHES SWITCH TO TURF, SCORES FOR PLETCHER

SARATOGA SPRINGS, N.Y.--As Hall of Fame trainer Todd Pletcher suspected, grass was the proper surface for Snow Face Princess (Midshipman).

Two months after making her career debut on the dirt at Aqueduct, she secured a victory Wednesday in the sixth race at Saratoga, a \$100,000 maiden special weight contest for 2-yearold fillies. Snow Face Princess and leading rider Irad Ortiz Jr. completed the 5 1/2 furlongs on the Mellon Turf Course in 1:02.27. Sent off as the 5-2 favorite in the field of nine, the dark bay or brown filly owned by Gary F. Lewin won by two lengths over Mackinac (Twirling Candy) and paid \$7.30.

"It was just one of those moves, typical Todd Pletcher moves," said Jacob West, Lewin's bloodstock advisor. "They're going to be fit. She was fit, and she was ready. And Irad rode her pretty incredibly well and it just resulted in a win.

Pletcher said Snow Face Princess got some seasoning in the dirt race, but decided to move her on the grass and added blinkers.

"It seems like Midshipman has had some successful turf sprinters, so it seemed like a logical try, Pletcher said. "Glad it worked out."

Pletcher said the equipment change was less of a factor in her success.

"I think the real key was switching to the turf," he said. Early on, she sat third, a couple of lengths off the pace of :21.40 and :44.39 set by Street Sue (Authentic) and moved to the lead entering the stretch. There was a claim of foul following a bumping incident in the stretch, but following a review the stewards did not change the order of finish.

Snow Face Princess was Pletcher's sixth winner in the top-level open maiden races for 2-year-olds at the meet. The 14-time Saratoga champ tops the trainers' table with 12 victories through 15 days.

West is a bloodstock advisor for Lewin, a California resident who has owned horses on his own and as a co-owner with Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners. Lewin paid \$110,000 for Snow Face Princess, who is out of the Honor Code mare Cruisin Alone, at the Fasig-Tipton October Sale.

"She's always just been a filly that since we got her--we sent her down to Susan Montayne at SBM down in Ocala--was always just straightforward, always acted like she was going to be precocious types. Gary has had a couple of horses with Todd over the years, and it just made sense to send her to him. The rest is history."

Snow Face Princess was a good student and quickly fit into the Pletcher program.

"She came in early to us at Palm Beach Downs back in I want to say early March, because she was precocious at the farm," Pletcher said. "She's learned her lessons pretty easily, and got a start on the dirt that wasn't bad, fourth beaten five lengths, and kind of kept running to the end. I thought that experience really helped today."

A familiar face amongst the stakes ranks, My Mane Squeeze has done nothing but collect checks in career spanning nearly two years and earnings well north of seven figures. This daughter of Audible has faced the best of her generation time and time again, winning the GII Eight Belles Stakes and the GIII Dogwood Stakes as a 3-year-old while running behind the likes

of Horse of the Year Thorpedo Anna (Fast Anna) in the GI Acorn. Third in both the GI Madison Stakes and the GII Ruffian Stakes to kick off her 4-year-old campaign, My Mane Squeeze was last an empty fifth as the favorite in the GII Chicago Stakes at Churchill June 21. While sticking with the same seven-furlong distance Wednesday, the even-money favorite dropped back into state-bred company for the first time since Feb. 2024 and was clearly the class of this group from the first strides. Ridden to the front by Luis Saez, she maintained a clear advantage over Tricky Temper who chased from second throughout. Kept to a hand ride once let loose into the stretch, My Mane Squeeze was never in any danger, leading in a strung-out group by over six lengths.

"The pace in the race scratched and she's laid fairly close in some of her other races, but I just left it up to Luis [Saez] to see how it played out when they broke," said winning trainer Michael Maker. "I thought it was a good performance and resembled our old 'Mane Squeeze."

Of a potential next start in the GI Ballerina Stakes August 23, a 'WAYI' for the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, Maker added, "Let's get through this one, but it's possible. I'll talk to the connections and go from there."

In Spite of Mama, a winning Speightstown mare, has seen plenty of success in her second career as well producing MSW/GSP Rotnee (Runhappy), SW Mama's Gold (Bolt d'Oro) and MSP Lookin for Trouble (Into Mischief) as her first three foals. Co-owner William Butler bought into the family a generation back, picking up second dam Mama Theresa (Carson City) for \$65,000 as an OBS April grad in 2005. While My Mane Squeeze does not have a 2-year-old sibling this season, she does have a yearling Honest Mischief half-sister and In Spite of Mama was served by Life Is Good for 2026.

But as that leader began to come back to the field at the half-mile pole, Snow Face Princess was ready to pounce and swung wide into the stretch for clear running room. A right-handed ride from Irad Ortiz, Jr. saw her drift in through the final furlong, a move which the stewards took a quick look at, but ultimately no change was made as Snow Face Princess was ultimately best by two lengths. First-time starter Mackinac (Twirling Candy) came home well to get second. Cruisin Alone is a half-sister to GSW's Wilburn (Bernardini) and Beethoven (Sky Mesa) along with the dam of 'TDN Rising Star' GSP Fort Warren (Curlin). Other half-sisters have produced the likes of GSWP Moonlight d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), MGSW Grand Sonata (Medaglia d'Oro) and GSW Ballerina d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro). QIRAT, KINGSCOTE AND BECKETT PULL OFF 150/1 SUSSEX SHOCK

Things like 150/1 pacemakers winning the G1 Visit Qatar Sussex Stakes aren't supposed to happen, but as a rare reminder of the vagaries of horse racing, on Wednesday Juddmonte's Qirat (Showcasing) pulled off the shock outcome as Field Of Gold (Kingman) failed to fire.

Only **Rosallion** (Blue Point) emerged from the pack of big favourites to threaten the upset late, but the Ralph Beckett-trained half-brother to Bluestocking kept producing to extend his Goodwood record to three-for-three. A neck separated them at the line, with 2 1/4 lengths back to **Henri Matisse** (Wootton Bassett) and Field Of Gold finishing 1 1/4 lengths away in fourth.

"That was very surreal," jockey Richard Kingscote said. "We set out to go an even pace, but when I looked around I was detached--on the rules of racing he was running on his own merits and likes the track, he's very well-balanced and a sweet horse who gave me a great spin. I could feel Rosallion coming, but he kept pulling out."

Gelded before his three-year-old campaign, Qirat, who is the latest billboard for his G1 Matron Stakes-winning dam Emulous (Dansili), had stepped outside of handicap company only once before being called upon for special duty here. Cont. p3

STARMAN'S LADY IMAN OVERPOWERS RIVALS FOR MOLECOMB TRIUMPH

Ger Lyons had sent just two prior runners across the Irish Sea for the Glorious Goodwood meet and the trainer struck for his first success when the third, **Lady Iman** (Starman), overpowered seven rivals, racing under a three-pound penalty, in Wednesday's G3 HKJC World Pool Molecomb Stakes. She had previously annexed the Listed First Flier Stakes and G3 Naas Fillies Sprint and embellished a banner season for her freshman sire with a decisive win in the five-furlong contest.

Lady Iman's victory comes with a free ticket to the \$1-million GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint and that's at the forefront of the trainer's mind. "The Breeders' Cup is where I'd like to go, but I don't own her," Lyons said. "We won it last year with Magnum Force, and as Ryan [Moore] said, if she gets a low draw at Del Mar, she wins it." Well-beaten in second in Nottingham's Listed Robin Hood Stakes in October, Qirat had previously shown prowess for this

unique circuit when taking two races in 2024 and in one of them he upstaged Witness Stand in August.

Obviously unimpressed by that peer's dose of one-upmanship in the Lennox 24 hours earlier, the homebred who had run second in the Victoria Cup and unplaced in first-time blinkers in the Royal Hunt Cup at Ascot so far this term was ready to make even bigger waves.

This was an exercise in how you can snatch a Group 1 at Goodwood without breaking 11 seconds for any of the furlongs, with the next five home easily

achieving that feat but to no effect. By the time Rosallion, Henri Matisse and the floundering 1-3 favourite began to try and turn it on three out, Qirat was still on par and in his own private race

with Ballydoyle's 'rabbit' Serengeti who he was able to master approaching the furlong pole. Rosallion's familiar rapid penultimate split got him closest to the race's infidel, but not

close enough with his 111% finishing speed contrasting to the winner's 107%.

"Richard has always been a very good judge of the clock and the last thing I said to him was 'keep going with this fellow, he could run really well'--he loves this place and I wanted to enter him because his work was really good," Beckett explained.

"He's always threatened to be a good horse and today he showed it. What about the mare? To come up with Bluestocking and him, she's been like a hole in the wall, like a cash machine."

"Ralph did say in the parade ring beforehand, 'this horse is going to run big', and he thought he could finish in the three," said Mahon. "He's a horse we always felt had a lot of potential. Ralph actually wanted to enter him for this race earlier in the year and in my wisdom I said 'don't be ridiculous', but we ended up having to supplement him."

"At the end of the day Juddmonte and the owners want to compete at the top level and want to win Group 1 races," he added. "Whilst it's not with the horse we thought it would be, we've still won the race, which is the most important thing. I've had people from America and Hong Kong and every sort of racing jurisdiction coming up to me inviting him to run, so hopefully the owners might want to travel him. Ralph knows a thing or two about winning a Breeders' Cup race, so maybe that's where he'll end up."

Of Field Of Gold, he said, "The rest of the field seemed to get detached from the two pacemakers, but I think ultimately William [Buick] felt he didn't handle the track and felt he was a bit flat today. We don't know why, but we all have off days-human and equines and all manner of beasts.


"Whether there's an issue there or something we're not sure, we'll have to investigate, but he's definitely not the Field Of Gold that we've all seen and know. I'm sure he'll be back and there'll be another day."

He added, "He's had a good enough break since Ascot, John and Thady have freshened him up and they've been happy with how he's trained. He looked good today and William said going to the start he felt very fresh, so maybe he was a little bit too fresh. We did give him a good break after Ascot and maybe we were a little bit kind on him. We'll get him home and check him out first and I think we'll have to make a plan after that."

Rosallion's jockey Sean Levey said, "I knew I'd be more forward than Henri Matisse and Field Of Gold today, but the winner was out and away. I thought the two in front had gone hard enough to come back, but that's not the way it played out. If I'd tracked up a little better, he'd have won."

Aidan O'Brien said of Henri Matisse, "Ryan was very happy, but he felt that as a three-year-old baby he found Goodwood a little bit 'different' although he kept coming. We think there's more to come and we haven't got it right with him yet, so he could go back to France for those mile races."

Qirat, who becomes the fifth Group 1 winner for his sire, is now the second of that kind out of the aforementioned Emulous in the space of two years after Camelot's Arc, Vermeille and Pretty Polly heroine Bluestocking. She also produced Desirous (Kingman), in turn the dam of Frankel's Listed Lyric Fillies' Stakes winner Sand Gazelle and War And Peace, who is responsible for the G3 Prix Chloe and G3 Oh So Sharp Stakes runner-up Cathedral (Too Darn Hot) and Lope De Vega's G3 Ballyogan Stakes runner-up Firebird.

Emulous's Listed-winning full-sister Daring Diva produced the G2 Ridgewood Pearl Stakes scorer Brooch (Empire Maker), who in turn is the dam of Into Mischief's Kentucky Derby and Haskell hero Mandaloun, as well as being the second dam of the Oh So Sharp winner Merrily (No Nay Never). The family also includes the GI Canadian International runner-up Alounak (Camelot). Emulous also has the unraced two-year-old filly Serenetta (Kingman) and a yearling filly by Frankel.

"I went there last year and I never got a thrill like it," Lyons added of a potential Breeders' Cup tilt. "If I can dance on that dancefloor again, I'm going as that is what racing is about for me. What an end of a season, what a show they put on and to be part of it and to win it, wow. Ryan says the [G1] Nunthorpe too, but I don't like taking on the older horses. You've got to listen to the experts and I wouldn't know the Nunthorpe if it bit me on the arse, but we'll get her home first. Lady Iman is pretty straightforward and I dropped the ball [last time]. She was doing everything I asked of her, and it took a good horse of Aidan's [Beautify] to beat her over six furlongs the last day."

"I genuinely don't think that man has trained better than he has this year," Lyons added of O'Brien. "His horses are stepping forward from race to race like I've never seen before and that's not fluke, that's pure talent. He's got some cracking two-year-olds and that Queen Mary winner [True Love], which we beat, she's a proper racehorse and to see the size of her, the scope of her and the temperament of her. I am walking into these monsters day in and day out, so it's nice to get this win.""

The 11-8 favourite, who was last seen finishing second behind Beautify (Wootton Bassett) in the G2 Airlie Stud Stakes, stalked the leaders in fifth through the initial fractions. Angled into the clear with a quarter-mile remaining, she powered to the front entering the final furlong and kept on strongly thereafter to comfortably outpoint G2 Duchess Of Cambridge Stakes third Argentine Tango (Mattmu) by 1 1/2 lengths. The pacesetting Dickensian (Pinatubo) rallied gamely once headed and ran on well to finish a half-length adrift in third.

RALPH BECKETT DUO SAQQARA SANDS AND TABITI SHARE OAK TREE SPOILS By Sean Cronin

Ralph Beckett enjoyed the perfect outcome in Wednesday's G3 HKJC World Pool Oak Tree Stakes when his two representatives, **Saqqara Sands** (Oasis Dream) and **Tabiti** (Kingman), could not be separated by technology in a photo finish to the seven-furlong contest at Goodwood.

"My daughter was laughing at me because I was going 'go on Rossa, go on Ryan, go on Rossa'," revealed Beckett. "I have definitely not been involved in a finish when two of my horses dead-heated before. William Easterby just told me his father [Tim] did it at Pontefract about 10 years ago, so I am in good company. It is one to remember. They are two really tough fillies and we got our tactics right for once.

"I am thrilled for the Deers. I fancied Saqqara Sands because she was in really good shape and worked very well at the weekend. I thought she was overpriced. John Deer has been breeding good horses for a long time and this filly has been really tough throughout. Tabiti looked like she was going west a bit on us. I wasn't overjoyed with her run in the [G1] Fillies' Mile last year and she didn't really show up early on this year. The blinkers have made a difference to her. I am not sure what we will do with them now. Tabiti may go up to a mile, while I am

not sure Saqqara Sands wants to. Tabiti could go travelling, she is well suited to that I would think."

Tabiti, last seen finishing third in Royal Ascot's Sandringham Handicap, set the tempo with her Listed Eternal Stakes-winning stablemate sitting second from flagfall. The pair locked horns passing the quarter-mile pole and engaged in a pulsating dingdong duel thereafter, hitting the line in unison as the closers failed to make an impact. **Cont. p8**

The winning dam Endless Charm, who was a 300,000gns purchase by Nawara Stud from the Godolphin draft at the 2021 Tattersalls December Sale, is a daughter of G3 Premio Sergio Cumani winner Whazzis (Desert Prince) who is out of a half to the operation's G1 Prix de Diane heroine Rafha. Therefore linked to the leading sire Invincible Spirit, the family features G2 Mill Reef Stakes-winning sire James Garfield (Exceed And Excel), last year's G2 Royal Lodge Stakes winner Wimbledon Hawkeye (Kameko) and the four-times Grade I-winning Breeders' Cup Mile heroine Uni (More Than Ready).

'SHE'LL LIKELY VISIT MORE THAN LOOKS' - YULONG BUYS A\$1.625M VELOCIOUS ON INGLIS DIGITAL

Yulong continued their streak of acquiring topline racemares for their broodmare band on Wednesday when paying A\$1.625 million for G1 Sistema Stakes winner **Velocious**, who was offered by Go Racing in the Inglis Digital July (Late) Sale.

The daughter of Written Tycoon becomes the second highest-priced filly to ever sell through the platform, after Funstar (Adelaide) realised A\$2.7 million in 2021.

Offered as a broodmare prospect after the failure of a tie-back operation at the start of her three-year-old season, Velocious attracted global attention from bidders, but it was Yulong, signing as Walnut Farm, who won out, making her the 13th lot to make seven figures in the auction platform's history.

"Velocious was a high-class two-year-old," Fairgray added.
"We own the mare [Parmalove] and she's carrying a full sibling to her now, so it's great to have Velocious joining the farm as well."

Go Bloodstock's Albert Bosma added, "It's just fantastic, we're really rapt and really grateful for all the work Inglis has done to help us get this result.

"When you get fillies of her value, there's really only a small amount of potential suitors, but we were thrilled with the interest. I thought the marketing on her was very good. She got put in front of all the buyers that were prospective buyers, realistically, and I really felt that was done superbly. We're thrilled with the price and I'm sure Yulong is thrilled to have her."
